**BIG 'CAP OCTET** A talented field of eight, headed by 1999 GI Pacific Classic winner General Challenge (General Meeting), has been entered for Saturday's 63rd renewal of the \$1 million GI Santa Anita H. at Santa Anita Park. General Challenge, coming off an impressive 9 1/2-length win in the Feb. 5 Gll Strub S., was installed as the 9-5 morning line favorite and will break from post position two. "I was hoping for an outside post," trainer Bob Baffert commented on his charge's draw. "But you don't know until the gates open what will happen. Last year with Silver Charm, we thought we might be on the lead and we weren't. You don't know what's going through the jockeys' heads and it's up to them at that point." In 1997, Richard Mandella became the first trainer in Big 'Cap history to sweep the top three spots in the historic race when Siphon (Brz), Sandpit (Brz) and Gentlemen (Arg) came home one-twothree. On Saturday, Mandella will send out 1998 Big 'Cap winner Malek (Chi) (Mocito Guapo {Arg}) and 1999 GI Donn H. winner Puerto Madero (Chi) (Gallantsky). "With Malek, it's just a matter of fitness," Mandella said of the seven-year-old who has been off since last summer's Pacific Classic. "We know he gives his all out there, and we would have preferred not to come into this race off a layoff, but it has been an interesting challenge. He's doing very well." Puerto Madero has not visited the winner's circle since his Donn win, but Mandella hopes two afternoon workouts have put his charge on the right path. "By working him during the races, it is more like an acutal race and it really gets his blood pumping," Mandella explained. "We've got to get his head right, and we've made a lot of changes. So far, he's responding." Malek, 8-1, will break from post four and Puerto Madero, 15-1, breaks from post five. The talented field also includes last year's Breeders' Cup Classic winner Cat Thief (Storm Cat), 7-2 on the morning line. The four-year-old is coming off a runner-up finish in the GII San Antonio H. where he was beaten by Budroyale (Cee's Tizzy). Budroyale will look for the first Grade I win of his career on Saturday. "I thought I'd always participate in this race as a spectator and just love it for the great race that it is," said owner Jeffrey Sengara, who claimed Budroyale for \$50,000 in 1998. "To come in like this with Bud; he just has a way of making dreams come true. I'm the luckiest guy on Earth." The Big 'Cap, second leg of the NTRA Champions series, will be televised on FOX from 2 p.m. to 3 p.m. (PST).

ON-SITE RULE FOR BREEDERS' CUP The Breeders' Cup will now require all horses to be on the racetrack grounds at least 24 hours before first post on the championship-day card, according to *The Blood-Horse*. The rule will take effect with this year's Breeders' Cup at Churchill Downs on Nov. 4. The rule change was accepted at a Breeders' Cup board meeting Wednesday in Florida. The rule comes on the heels of a bizarre event prior to last year's Breeders' Cup when Classic favorite Behrens was followed by private investigators as he was being vanned from Payson Park to Gulfstream Park on the afternoon of the race. "One of the most obvious reasons is we would like to mitigate against the possibility of having a well-regarded runner not make the event in the case of a flat tire or some other problem," said Breeders' Cup President D. G. Van Clief.

#### INTERNATIONAL CUP preview cont.

Hours after President S R Nathan officially opens the Singapore Racecourse at Kranji, a competitive international field of 14 will line-up for the inaugural International Cup. Connections of the contenders had nothing but praise for the new facility. John Reid, who will pilot English invader Monsajem commented, "It's an absolutely fantastic track. Everything's been done to a very high standard and I have to say I'm really impressed. Monsajem seems in very good form." The likely favorite will be the well-traveled Jim and Tonic (Fr). The six-year-old delivered an impressive performance to win the G1 Hong Kong International Cup last December and jockey Gerald Mosse was impressed again after Jim and Tonic's work Wednesday. "The horse felt perfect and so did the track," Mosse said. "He felt just like he was before Hong Kong." Godolphin challenger Sea Wave, a graded stakes winner in England, impressed onlookers with a work over the turf course yesterday. French trainer Jean de Roualle pronounced G3 Prix Exbury winner Barbola ready for Saturday's race after his charge cantered over the fibresand track yesterday. "Over the last couple of days, the horse has really come to himself," de Roualle said. "He's regained the weight he lost travelling here and I am starting to feel a little optimistic."

Dubai Millennium, who followed up his lone defeat in the G1 Vodafone Derby last year with wins in the G2 Prix Eugene Adam, the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois and the G1 QE II Mile, made his first start on dirt a winning one in Round Three of the Maktoum Racing Challenge. Breaking from post one, Dubai Millennium tracked the pacesetters early, easily took over coming into the stretch and ran away from the pack to win by 4 1/2 lengths despite being geared down near the line. After proving he can compete on the main track, the winner will lead the Godolphin brigade into the Mar. 25 G1 Dubai World Cup. "This was his test to see if he could handle the dirt," said jockey Frankie Dettori. "I eased him behind the leaders, I let him get all dirty and then pulled him to the outside and he proved what a champion he is."

#### FROM THE PUBLISHER

In the spring of 1972, two college students with little equine experience...okay, none, if you don't count betting on horses...wandered through the stable gate at Aqueduct looking for summer jobs. Starting at the end by the receiving barns, Al Goldberg and I worked our way through the stable area, but still had had no luck by the time we arrived at Barn 5 (this despite the fact that we had decided that our desire to learn was so great, we would offer to work for no pay.) Lefty Nickerson, the trainer in Barn 5, said, 'I really can't use any help, but if he hears you're working for free, there's a guy across the way who will have a spot for you.' He took us over to Barn 4, where we met Walter Kelley. For the next year and a half, we were the recipients of his time, knowledge. quidance, friendship and kindness. (And we didn't even have to work for free--he paid us \$75 a week...) We acquired a lot of horse knowledge, but most of all, we acquired his incredible enthusiasm for the sport, still on display after 40 years in the business. To this day, when I hear people talk about mentors, I think of Mr. Kelley, and can only imagine how different my life would have been had I run into anyone but that incredibly special person that day in May. Eighteen years later, on the most important day of our careers, Mr. Kelley was our guest at Safely Kept's Eclipse Award dinner, and his presence was unquestionably the highlight of our evening. I was glad that night to be able to thank him in front of the entire industry for all that he had given to us and to the sport. I would like to offer him one final thanks today for introducing the two of us to the world that became our love and our life, and for imparting enough of that enthusiasm to carry us a long, long way.

BAILEY BAILS ON FRIEZE One of the oldest, most successful jockey-agent tandems broke up Thursday when Hall of Fame rider Jerry D. Bailey dropped Bob Frieze. At Santa Anita, Ron Anderson, another top agent, said that he will begin booking Bailey's mounts when the Keeneland meet opens on April 7. "I found out this morning," Frieze said when asked about the end of his partnership with Bailey. "Jerry just said that he wanted to make a change. He's thinking about retiring in two or three years, and he wanted to make a change. So, as they say, I'm unemployed." Bailey, 42, has been working with Frieze for almost 15 years. Bailey has won three Eclipse Awards and was voted into the Racing Hall of Fame in 1995, the first of three straight years that he won the Eclipse. Bailey led the country in purses three times, his \$19.4 million in 1996 being the record until Gary Stevens, with the help of money from Dubai, broke the record with \$19.6 million in 1998. Bailey finished second to Pat Day in purses last year as his mounts earned \$17.6 million. This year, though, Bailey is off to a slow start: through Tuesday, he was 14th on the national money list with purses of \$1.3 million and he's fifth in wins at Gulfstream Park. This week, Prince Ahmed Salman of the Thoroughbred Corp. announced that Bailey would take over on Anees (Unbridled), the lightly-raced champion juvenile who is one of the early favorites for the Kentucky Derby. Anderson was the agent for Gary Stevens until he retired on Dec. 26, and he also had the book of Chris Antley, who recently ended a three-month absence when he resumed riding at Santa Anita.

#### \$1 MILLION LONE STAR BONUS UNVEILED

Lone Star Park will try to lure some of the country's best three-year-olds to the Texas track with the offer of a \$1 million bonus for any horse who parlays a win in the Apr. 22 \$300,000 Lone Star Derby into a victory in a Triple Crown race. The bonus will be worth \$750,000 to the horse's owner and \$250,000 to the trainer. The Lone Star Derby is run at 1 1/16 miles on the main track. "Lone Star Park always strives to bring worldclass racing to Texas," said Larry Craft, Lone Star Park's director of racing. "The creation of this bonus, along with the purse of \$300,000, should position the Lone Star Derby as a lucrative stepping stone to the Triple Crown races. We are excited about the prospect of attracting some of the country's elite three-year-olds to our race."

#### TOTE TO BE SOLD TO BRITISH RACING TRUST

The Tote will be sold to a "Racing Trust" comprised of all the relevant British horseracing interests instead of being privatized through an auction or public stock offering, Sporting Life Online reported yesterday. The announcement was made by Home Secretary Jack Straw and received praise from racing's leaders. Straw's decision to sell the Tote was helped by the agreement of the racing industry to operate the Tote in a way that all of the profits will be used for the benefit of racing. British Horseracing Board Chief Executive Tristram Ricketts told the Sporting Life, "The Racing Trust proposal put forward last November has the unanimous support of the racing industry and the Tote board and we now look forward to constructive discussions with government on the key issues which remain to be determined, particularly the price to be paid for the Tote, the terms of the exclusive licence and the timing of the necessary legislation." The current market value of the Tote is estimated to be £200 million. Rhydian Morgan-Jones, chairman on the Industry Committee (Horseracing) Limited, told Sporting Life, "This is a great day. The government has given racing a tremendous opportunity."

#### STRAW PROPOSES ABOLITION OF LEVY BOARD

The Sporting Life reported yesterday that Home Secretary Jack Straw has called for the abolition of the Horserace Betting Levy Board. His decision follows a report which found that most of the Levy Board's functions no longer need to be carried out in the public sector. The report also stated that the racing industry should answer the question of how it collects monies from bookmakers. Peter Savill, chairman of the British Horseracing Board, called for the abolition of the Levy Board two years ago. "I welcome the government's request for the BHB to prepare a realistic plan to show how racing would operate without a statutory levy," Savill told Sporting Life. The Levy forged a £61 million agreement with bookmakers last November. Levy Board Chairman Robert Hughes pledged to help find the best way to strengthen racing's finances. "It will not be easy to replace that level of income in the short term by commercial means. But I look forward to (identifying) the best way by which racing may be funded without a statutory levy," said Hughes. "The three independent members of the Levy Board intend to play a full part in ensuring that the future funding of racing is secure. In the meantime, it's business as usual."

#### **AMBITIOUS PLANS AFOOT**

Ambitious plans are afoot for the construction of training complexes in or around the two major centres of Italian racing at Milan and Rome. Proposals have been made for a horse village to be built approximately 30 miles from Milan, with stabling for some 1500 horses, grass and sand training tracks as well as residential buildings with full amenities for trainers and stable staff. Proposals along similar lines are also in place to redevelop Rome's training facilities. The coastal tourist resort of Fregene, close to the capital, has been pinpointed as the likely base for Rome's complex.

#### GROUP RACE DATES STILL TO BE CONFIRMED

The Italian racing authority, UNIRE, has still not released the full official list of Group and Listed races and dates for the forthcoming season even though entries for the Classics closed Jan. 31. However, they have announced that both the G2 Premio Parioli (2000 Guineas) and the G2 Premio Regina Elena (1000 Guineas) will take place on the same day, Apr. 28. Both races are worth L330 million before entry fees are added to the gross pool. The G1 Derby Italiano will benefit from a purse increase of L380 million (not withstanding entry fees) from L500 million to L880 million. This year will see racetracks staging better races on the same day to increase the profile of individual racedays. For example the G1 Oaks d'Italia will be run at Milan on May 21, the same day as the G2 Premio Emilio Turati. San Siro will play host to good meetings on Jun. 18, which will include the G1 Gran Premio di Milano, and Oct. 22 when the card will include the G1 Gran Criterium, the G1 Gran Premio del Jockey Club and the G3 Premio Bagutta. The Italian season will officially get under way when Milan stages its first meeting on March 19.
