#### CHALLENGE SWEEPS TO BIG CAP VICTORY

Golden Eagle Farm's General Challenge (General Meeting) bided his time towards the rear of the field early, then swept past ultra game Budroyale (Cee's Tizzy) in deep stretch to win the \$1 million GI Santa Anita H. Saturday at Santa Anita. The homebred gelding scored an easy three-length victory in the GI Pacific Classic last summer, was rested and came back with a narrow defeat at the hands of Budroyale in the Oct. 16 GII Goodwood Breeders' Cup H. Tenth in the Breeders' Cup Classic, the chestnut was a narrow winner of the Dec. 12 GIII Native Diver H. and was a troubled fourth in the GII San Fernando Breeders' Cup Jan. 15. Jockey Corey Nakatani took over the reins for the GII Strub S. and circled the field turning for home en route to a 9 1/2length shellacking. Sent off the slight 2-1 favorite over Cat Thief (Storm Cat, 2.20-1), General Challenge was taken in hand and saved ground from seventh as Cat Thief towards the rail and Budroyale dueled over the "good" going. Nakatani gave the Bob Baffert pupil the green light entering the far turn, shifted out four wide and loomed up menacingly as the field turned for home. Cat Thief hoisted the white flag and the race was down to the two Cal-bred geldings, but General Challenge had the momentum and gradually inched away from Budroyale late. Puerto Madero (Gallantsky) was along late for third. For Nakatani, second in last year's Big 'Cap aboard Golden Eagle's Event of the Year, redemption was sweet. "It's nice to win one. My horse was a little on his toes coming up to the gate. My key was to get him to break decently and try not to leave him with to much to do turning for home." Baffert was quoted earlier in the week as saying that the white-stockinged General Challenge does not enjoy getting dirt kicked in the race and praised Nakatani's mid-race decisions. "He (Nakatani) called an audible and dropped back and made one run. The horse relaxed unbelievable for him." Ted West, trainer of the runner up, commented, "He ran his race. Our horse ran as good as he could. We just keep picking up these seconds in Grade I races, but we'll get there." Cat Thief reported home a well-beaten sixth. "On this particular racetrack when it gets some moisture, he doesn't seem as comfortable," said trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "Pat (jockey Day) said the same thing, that he didn't get a hold of the track." General Challenge becomes the ninth horse to complete the Strub-Big Cap double and is the sixth leading Cal-bred money earner, just behind Budroyale. (Big 'Cap Chart p2)

## **BUCKING A TREND**

"Three-race losing streak" are words not commonly uttered by the connections of Buck's Boy (Bucksplasher), but that was exactly the situation coming into Saturday's GII Pan American H. The winner of this event in 1998, Buck's Boy raced only three times in 1999, scoring an easy victory in a Woodbine allowance before disappointing when second in the GIII Sky Classic at the Toronto track, but redeemed himself and defended his crown well when third to Daylami in last year's Breeders' Cup Turf over this surface. Most recently, the gelding was run into the ground in the GIII Mac Diarmida Jan. 9 and finished seventh of eight. With jockey Edgar Prado in the irons, the bay was on the lead after half a furlong and dictated realistic fractions of :47 4/5 and 1:12 for three quarters. Still on the engine but surrounded by Thesaurus (With Approval) and Epistolaire (Alzao) at the quarter pole, Prado called on his reserves, got away from the field and held off Thesaurus for the victory. Beautiful Dancer, who came out and caused Monkey Puzzle to take up near the eighth pole, was disqualified and placed sixth. "Everything went according to plan," Prado commented. "He made the lead then relaxed for me. Near the end I heard that other horse coming, so I tapped him a couple of times. He responded and that was it."

Der-by, Der-by. That is the chant emanating ever louder from the Neil Drysdale barn as War Chant, out of the 1993 juvenile filly champion Hollywood Wildcat, made the transition to graded-stakes company a success with a hard-earned victory in the GII San Rafael. Well fancied in his career bow and only start at two at Hollywood Park Nov. 28, the dark bay rated professionally while four wide, took over at the eighth pole and crossed under the wire two lengths the best. Given some time off, the Cowan homebred returned to make his two-turn debut at Santa Anita Jan. 16, leading through well-measured fractions and drawing off at will to win by five lengths. The least experienced of the septet, War Chant broke alertly and settled along the rail while stalking the pace of GII San Vicente winner Archer City Slew. The Triple Crown wrested a short lead from that one after four furlongs and dueled with him for the duration, finishing narrlowly in front, despite ducking out a bit nearing the sixteenth pole. "I did have to move a little early," said winning jockey Kent Desormeaux. "When we turned up the backside, the leader came off the inside and that's all this horse needed. He went up in there, pricked his ears and said 'Okay, jock, I'll take it from here." Trainer Neil Drysdale was equally pleased with the effort. "It was a good race for him because he needs to get some serious racing under his belt," he commented. "It wasn't a perfect scenario when he had to start moving on him a half mile out. He really responded." The Santa Anita Derby Apr. 8 is next for the winner.

The grand old Son of a Pistol returned to form with a game victory over his superstar stablemate Kona Gold. Now eight, the chestnut had last graced the winner's circle when taking the GIII Los Angeles H. at Hollywood last May, and had been third behind Hollycombe (Capote) in his most recent outing, a money allowance at Santa Anita Jan. 15. Primed for his return with a series of five-furlong breezes, he pressured Kona Gold throughout, finally putting a head in front nearing the line. "He really ran gamely," said winning rider Garrett Gomez. "This was more like the old horse we know. I didn't know if I could beat Kona Gold or not. But when they straightened away, his old self showed up and he fought back and showed why he is such a good horse." Bruce Headley, trainer of the top pair, was not hard to please. "This time, I didn't care too much how the photo went," he said. "After the Los Angeles H. last summer, he nearly died when he choked on some hay and it really messed up his throat. I think it has really just taken him a while to completely get over it, but he obviously has now. I think we'll come back with both him and Kona Gold in the Potrero Grande (GII, \$100,000, 6.5f, Apr. 8), if they come out OK."

Taken for \$35,000 by his current connections out of a two-length victory at Belmont July 14, he was second for \$50,000 next out. The 5 1/4-length winner of a main track allowance Nov. 19, the bay was third next out before dropping into state-bred company to win the Alex M Robb H. two back. Frankie Dettori, rider of Goldolphin's alsoran Sea Wave (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), said, "Sea Wave wasn't too convinced about racing for the first two furlongs, then when he decided to race we ran into a pocket and I couldn't stop him and we clipped heels with the horse in front. We managed to finish the race but my chances were gone after that incident."
