GREENWOOD LAKE OUT OF TRIPLE CROWN

Greenwood Lake (Meadowlake), who was at one time the winter-book favorite for the 2000 GI Kentucky Derby, was injured during a workout at Hialeah Monday morning and will miss the entire Triple Crown. The winner of the GI Champagne S. and GII Remsen S. in his last two starts at two, the bay had been off the board in his two appearances this year, most recently running fourth in the Feb. 19 GI Fountain Of Youth S. Prepping for this Saturday's GI Florida Derby, he worked five furlongs in 1:00 3/5, but came out of the breeze with a hairline condylar fracture of the left front ankle. Trainer Nick Zito said the colt would be shipped to Rood and Riddle equine clinic in Kentucky for surgery. Dr. Larry Bramlage will perform the operation. "The early prognosis is for a full recovery," Zito said, "but we'll cross that bridge when we come to it."

FLORIDA DERBY-GI, \$750,000, 3yo, 1 1/8m

Tahkodha Hills (Prospector's Halo), first or second in all but his very first start, worked five furlongs in 1:02 at Calder yesterday morning as his final prep for the Florida Derby. The dark bay was the runner-up in his latest, the \$75,000 Unbridled Purse on the GI Fountain Of Youth undercard Feb. 19. The winner of that race, Bare Outline (Broad Brush), could also run Saturday, subbing for stablemate Greenwood Lake after that one was injured in a workout yesterday. The Nick Zito trainee has won three of his last four starts, but would be making his stakes debut in the Florida Derby.

Scottish Halo (Jolie's Halo), winner of the GIII Laurel Futurity at two, had his final Florida Derby work at Palm Beach Downs yesterday morning, going five furlongs in 1:02 1/5. "It was more a maintenance move than anything else and I'm very happy with it," trainer Paul Rizzo said. The New York bred has started just once this year, running fifth against older horses in a turf allowance at Gulfstream Feb. 27. "He desperately needed that race and that's the main reason we ran him against older horses," Rizzo said. "We wanted a solid performance and that's what we got. It should set him up nicely for Saturday's race."

"We were able to run smoothly," said winning rider Shinji Fujita. "Even though I had to ask him earlier than I wanted to get into position, he ran strongly to the finish line. I'm looking forward to the (Apr. 17 GI Japanese 2000 Guineas) at Nakayama." Winning owner Fusaro Sekiguchi also owns Kentucky Derby hopeful Fusaichi Pegasas (Mr. Prospector).

There aren't too many stallions which manage to sire individual winners of each of the Triple Crown events, the last to do so being Alydar, thanks to Alysheba, Easy Goer and Strike The Gold. There is still a reasonable chance, though, that the magnificent Danzig will also complete this very difficult sequence. He already has the Preakness in the bag, thanks to Pine Bluff's 1992 win, and he has even supplied a winner of the mile-and-a-half Belmont S. in the shape of 1986's hero, Danzig Connection. Danzig is also responsible for the sire of a Kentucky Derby winner (Sea Hero's sire Polish Navy).

Although Danzig's best shot at winning the Kentucky Derby was back in 1985 when he was represented by both second and third, he still has the Churchill Downs Classic very much in his sights and appears to have plenty of ammunition for this year's race.

With a total of nine Triple Crown nominees, he shares with Deputy Minister, Tabasco Cat and Unbridled the distinction of having the largest representation and his nine include some very talented colts. Exchange Rate improved his record to three wins from five starts when he took the Risen Star S. last month and now War Chant has stretched his unbeaten run to three with his hard-fought victory in the GII San Rafael S.

If this pair make it to the Derby, they could meet several overseas challengers by Danzig. Aidan O'Brien's entries feature Mull of Kintyre and Brahms, the Danzig colts he sent on an exploratory mission to the Breeders' Cup Juvenile, and Godolphin's team includes the well-regarded Interrogate and the winner Borneo Boy.

War Chant has been the focus of a lot of attention, and no wonder. In addition to being by an exceptional stallion, he has the distinction of being the second foal of a champion racemare, Hollywood Wildcat. This daughter of Kris S. is inbred 4x4 to Nashua, an outstanding performer at two, three and four, and she followed her ancestor's example. After her record of four wins from five starts had earned her an Experimental Free Handicap weight of 117, Hollywood Wildcat developed into a champion at three, when her sequence of five stakes wins included a victory over Paseana (Arg) in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff.

This Florida-bred also did well at four, when the GI Gamely H. provided her with her second graded-stakes success on turf--something which will perhaps offer War Chant an alternative route to the top if he proves to have limitations on dirt.

War Chant is the latest good winner to advertise the virtues of blending Danzig with Kris S. A mare by Danzig has already produced the GI Super Derby winner Arch and his stakes-winning brother Alisios to Kris S. No doubt Danzig's record with mares from the Turn-to line in general, and with Roberto mares in particular, provided the incentive for breeders to experiment with sending mares by Roberto's son Kris S. to Danzig. Danzig's Grade I winners Furiously and Yashmak are both out of Roberto mares.

Danzig also has a rewarding relationship with Mr. Prospector, the sire of Hollywood Wildcat's dam Miss Wildcatter. His many foals out of Mr. Prospector mares include the Group 1 winners Dayjur and Pas de Reponse, and there are several talented colts bred on these lines among Danzig's current crop of three-year-olds, including Monashee Mountain (an unbeaten Group 3 winner in Ireland), Brahms (a fine second in the G1 Dewhurst S.), Polish Miner (weighted at 110 on the Experimental Free Handicap) and Interrogate.

The best winner produced by War Chant's third dam, Elizabeth K., was the Puerto Rican champion Marirv (by Sensitivo). Sensitiv Elizabeth, another of Elizabeth K.'s foals by Sensitivo, produced Triomphe, a Group 1 winner in Chile.

CAPE CANAVERAL SIDELINED GSW Cape

Canaveral (Mr. Prospector), scratched from Saturday's GII San Carlos H., is once again suffering from the shin problems which forced him to the bench for most of his three-year-old season and will be out of action for at least 60 days, the *Thoroughbred Times* reports. Now four, the dark bay captured the GIII San Miguel S. in his second career start, then missed nearly a year before coming back to be third in an allowance test at Santa Anita in December. He won a Jan. 15 Santa Anita allowance race in his most recent effort. Trainer D. Wayne Lukas will point the colt, three-for-four with earnings of \$128,640, for an East Coast campaign when he returns.

Coast Guard to Honor Jimmy Jones:

Trainer Jimmy Jones, who saddled Iron Leige and Tim Tam to back-to-back Kentucky Derby wins in 1957-58, will be honored by the Coast Guard in a ceremony at Gulfstream Park Mar. 16 at 1 p.m. During World War II, Jones, as a lieutenant junior grade, trained horses for the Coast Guard's Beach Patrol. Now 93, Jones divides his time between Florida and Missouri.

Hialeah Settles With Florida Horsemen:

Hialeah Park and the Florida Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association have reached a contract settlement. An addendum to the contract includes a provision to raise the daily purse distribution from \$113,500 to \$130,000, and an agreement to adjust the overnight purse schedule at the midpoint of the meet. In addition, Hialeah Racing Secretary Sean Greely has resolved to limit the number of overnight turf races to accomodate horsemen pointing for turf stakes, but expects to be able to begin carding turf races in all categories as the condition of the Gulfstream course improves, as has been the custom at Hialeah meetings in the past.

Josiah Hampshire Notches 2,000th Win:

Jockey Josiah Hampshire Jr. picked up his 2,000th career winner at Suffolk Downs yesterday afternoon, booting J R's Account to victory in the eighth race on the card. The 36-year-old Philadelphian won his first race at River Downs in 1982. "This is special," he said of the milestone. "When I first started, I visualized maybe getting to 1,000 wins. Now here I am at 2,000 and I don't know where the time has gone. I want to thank all of the owners and trainers in New England who made this happen, and most of all I want to thank all of my fellow riders who helped keep me safe over the years."

New Stakes at Rockingham Park:

Rockingham Park in New Hampshire will offer three new stakes this year--the July 2 \$25,000 Rockingham Park Oaks, July 3 \$25,000 Rockingham Park Derby and July 3 \$25,000 Rockingham Park Distaff. The track will also introduce the Brass Monkey series, seven races increasing in distance from a mile and a sixteenth to two miles and 40 yards and in purse from \$8,500 to \$12,000 over the course of the meet. Any horse which has started for a claiming price of \$5,000 or less in 1999-2000 will be eligible, and there will be a \$500 bonus to any trainer who runs in all seven races.

GODOLPHIN LEAVES NOTHING TO CHANCE

The entries for this year's Sagitta 1.000 and 2.000 Guineas, revealed yesterday, are peppered with potential contenders from the Godolphin camp. The Dubaibased operation account for 28 of the 99 entries for the colts' classic, run on May 6, and 20 of the 95 for the filly equivalent, run a day later. Among the more notable nominees are David Loder-graduate Dubai Two Thousand (GB) (Nashwan {USA}) and Inchlonaig (GB) (Nashwan {USA}), who took the Tattersalls Auction S. at Newmarket last year. In the filly ranks, Godolphin has ante-post favourite Teggiano (Ire) (Mujtahid {USA}) and the more fragile but equally talented Morning Pride (Ire) (Machiavellian {USA}). The English defence for that race is headed by 1,000 Guineas specialist Henry Cecil's High Walden (USA) (El Gran Senor {USA}). Ballydoyle has 12 entries for the 2,000 Guineas. Amongst them are Group 1 winners Aristotle (Ire) (Sadler's Wells {USA}) and Giant's Causeway (USA) (Storm Cat (USA)). Of course, they will all have strong ante-post favourite Distant Music (USA) (Distant View {USA}) to contend with, who showed his prowess in winning last year's G2 Champagne and G1 Dewhurst S. Latest odds offered by William Hill on the 2,000 Guineas make Distant Music 9-4 favourite, with Giant's Causeway at 9-2. A more open-looking 1,000 Guineas market is headed by Teggiano at 10-1, with High Walden at 12-1.

JOCKEY CLUB CHANGES NON-TRIERS RULE

The Jockey Club announced yesterday changes to the infamous Rule 151, the "non-triers" rule. Instead of having an all-encompassing rule, the Jockey Club has approved plans to introduce three new rules for categories of riding offence and to transfer the responsibilities of owner and trainer to a separate rule (Rule 155). The new Rule 156 will address errors of judgement by jockeys including dropping hands, mistaking a race distance and taking the wrong course. Rule 157 will cover cases where a horse is ridden with the intention of concealing its true ability or affecting the result of a race. Cases of schooling and conditioning in public, an ill-judged ride or prematurely easing an unplaced horse will come under Rule 158. Rule 151 now deals with walkovers whereas former Rules 156-159 concerning dead-heats have been compressed into one rule (Rule 159). The changes will take effect at the start of the Flat turf season at Doncaster Mar. 23.
