RUNNING STAG RETURNS IN WORLD CUP

PREP Running Stag (Cozzene), unraced since a runnerup finish behind Jim and Tonic (Fr) in the G1 Hong Kong International Cup Dec. 12, has been entered in a 7 1/2furlong conditions event at Nad al Sheba Sunday evening, a prep for the Dubai World Cup Mar. 25. "Running Stag is a definite runner for the World Cup," trainer Philip Mitchell said last night. A non-threatening seventh in last year's World Cup, Mitchell attributed that performance to a lack of preparation, something he will try to remedy this time around. "Last year we didn't realize that the heat would be so extreme. This opportunity came up to run under race conditions under the lights, so we shipped him out Monday night," the conditioner added. He is under the supervision of assistant trainer Roger Teal while in the desert. Mitchell is optimistic about his chances Sunday night, as well as for the near future. "This guy is 20 percent better than he was last year. He is bigger and even stronger," Mitchell said. "Hopefully we can run well Sunday night and put a scare into Sheikh Mohammed for the World Cup." The globetrotter, winner of the GII Brooklyn H. and the GII Saratoga Breeders' Cup H. last season, is likely to return to the U.S. after Dubai to contest the GI Pimlico Special May 13. That race could be followed with a start in either the GI Met Mile or the GII Mass Cap, followed later in the summer by the GI Arlington Million. The Breeders' Cup Classic is the ultimate goal for the sixyear-old. In other World Cup news, trainer Elliott Walden reported that Ecton Park (Forty Niner), third in Sunday's GIII New Orleans H., will be heading for Dubai on Saturday, provided all goes well this week.

More Than Ready Works:

More Than Ready (Southern Halo) drilled five furlongs in 1:00 3/5 Monday morning at Hialeah, his final major move before Sunday's GII Louisiana Derby. "Ultimately, we decided on the Louisiana Derby [instead of the Florida Derby] because it's 1 1/16 miles, not 1 1/8 miles," commented trainer Todd Pletcher. "It's a more gradual progression from his first race (the seven-furlong Hutcheson), not jumping a quarter mile further." When asked if he was concerned about the long stretch at Fair Grounds, Pletcher said, "1 1/16 miles is 1 1/16 miles. He handles turns well; we'll be careful not to move too soon." As for tentative plans following the Louisiana Derby, either the Apr. 15 GI Toyota Blue Grass or the Apr. 15 GII Wood Memorial are both under consideration. More Than Ready was scheduled to leave Florida by plane at 9 a.m. this morning.

Florida Derby Notes:

Winstar Farm's Elite Mercedes (Mercedes Won) completed his preparations for Saturday's GI Florida Derby at Gulfstream with a five-panel move in 1:04 4/5 at Payson Park. "Things have gone extremely well since we bought him in November," said trainer W. Elliott Walden of the third-place finisher in the GI Fountain of Youth. "He's as talented as Menifee or Victory Gallop, he's just got to put it all together."...GIII Holy Bull winner Hal's Hope (Jolie's Halo) breezed a half in :48 3/5 at Calder on Saturday. Jockey Roger Velez, aboard for each of the colt's seven starts, will have the mount in the Florida Derby. "Nobody knows the horse as well," noted owner/breeder/trainer Harold Rose. "Why would I want to have some name rider just getting to know the horse the day of the race?"

The Deputy Drills:

The Deputy (Ire) (Petardia {GB}), prepping for the Mar. 19 GII San Felipe S., worked seven furlongs at Santa Anita yesterday in 1:25. Jockey Chris McCarron was up for the work. "The track was sluggish from the recent rains and he'll get a lot out of this work," said trainer Jenine Sahadi. "He finished like a freight train, with Chris just sitting on him." The Deputy won the GII Santa Catalina S. in his main-track debut last time out.

The GII San Carlos H. was fought out by two tough old stable companions, Son of a Pistol and Kona Gold. The pair share more than a barn and a taste for a battle as both are the products of unfashionable pedigrees, which are also clever matings.

Eight-year-old Son of a Pistol is by Big Pistol, a tough and durable runner who won 14 of 32 starts for earnings of \$558,521, his most prestigious victory coming in the 1984 GI Haskell Invitational H. Big Pistol wasn't exactly a sensation at stud, but in addition to Son of a Pistol he is also responsible for the graded stakes-winning fillies Laura's Pistolette and Maggies Pistol.

Unlike Big Pistol, J. O. Tobin, the broodmare sire of Son of a Pistol, was once the height of fashion. Champion of his generation in England at two, conqueror of Seattle Slew in the GI Swaps S. at three, and champion sprinter at four, J. O. Tobin was a sales sensation with his first crop, but eventually proved to be a real disappointment as a stallion. This "fallen from favor" motif could also be applied to Son of a Pistol's immediate family. The third dam Juliet's Aria is a full sister to the tough stakes winner Run for Nurse and a half sister to Vosburgh H. victor Gallant Romeo and the talented filly Woozem. This branch of the family proved less fruitful at stud, Juliet's Aria and Montagues Lament (the granddam of Son of a Pistol) producing just one minor stakes winner apiece. Mood Swing, the dam of Son of a Pistol, never ran and Son of a Pistol is the only runner of note among her four foals.

Perhaps the key to Son of a Pistol's ability lies in his unusual pedigree. Montagues Lament is a daughter of turf champion T. V. Lark. Son of a Pistol's sire Big Pistol is by Romeo, a son of T. V. Lark, giving T. V. Lark 3x3 at the top and bottom of the pedigree. For good measure, Son of a Pistol also has the important mare Traffic Court 5x5 through her sons Traffic Judge and Hasty Road. Just to underline that this may be no coincidence, we can also note that Son of a Pistol's second highest-earning colt, Big Courage, has T. V. Lark 3x3 and Traffic Judge 4x4.

STAR DE NASKRA PENSIONED Star de Naskra (Naskra), champion sprinter of 1979, has been retired from stallion duties at the age of 25. "Star de Naskra's health is remarkably good for his age, but he is not functioning reproductively," explained John Phillips of Darby Dan, where Star de Naskra stood. "He has been a wonderful stallion for us and we have been honored to stand him. He will live out the rest of his years at Darby Dan in comfort." Star de Naskra sired graded stakes winners Sewickley, Dance Floor, Carr de Naskra, Storm and Sunshine, Pampered Star, Star de Lady Ann, Tenacious Tiffany and Chart the Stars. From 18 crops to race, the stallion produced 42 stakes winners and the earners of nearly \$28 million.

CITY ON A HILL INJURED, OUT OF GUINEAS

One of Godolphin's top threats for the English 2000 Guineas, City On A Hill (USA) (Rahy {USA}) has suffered a splint injury and has been ruled out of contention for the first English classic of 2000 at Newmarket May 6. It is hoped that he will be able to race again by midJune. Trained in his juvenile season by David Loder at Godolphin's French base in Evry, the chestnut colt won the Prix La Fleche at Chantilly in his second career start and bested Mull Of Kintyre (USA) by 1 1/4 lengths in a swiftly-run rendition of the G3 July S. at Newmarket July 7. Despite a disappointing seventh-place finish behind Fasliyev in the G1 Prix Morny Aug. 22, he was rated fourth on the year end International Classifications.

THE GLOBALIZATION OF RACING While stars of the international turf were participating in the Singapore Cup over the past weekend, British Horseracing Board Chairman Peter Savill was addressing an international audience of racing administrators at the Asian Racing Conference in Singapore, Racing Post reports. Savill called for the creation of a "world championship" of horse racing to take place once every two years on different continents and over a variety of distances, both turf and dirt. "We are currently the only sport which does not have a world championship. I find it hard to believe that there would be anything other than massive worldwide interest," Savill said. The chairman also suggested an annual world racing summit and development by each leading country of its "premier racing product."

TALKING PICTURE DIES America's Champion twoyear-old filly of 1973 and producer of numerous European black-type performers, Moyglare Stud Farms' Talking Picture (USA) (Speak John {USA}) was put to sleep at the end of last year due to the infirmities of old age. Bred and raced by Elmendorf Farm, Talking Picture was the winner of the GI Matron and GI Spinaway as a juvenile. Retired to stud in 1975, she was the dam of 1985 G1 Irish 1000 Guineas winner Trusted Partner (USA) (Affirmed {USA}) and Low Key Affair (USA) (Affirmed {USA}), a graded stakes winner in the U.S. and multiple listed winner in Europe. Additionally, Talking Picture is the granddam of Lisieux Rose (Ire) (Generous {Ire}), winner last weekend of the GII Orchid H. at Gulfstream Park in her American debut. Boarded since 1978 at Eaton Farms and in retirement since her final foal in 1995, she was buried at the farm.

French Report cont. VION BANNED

Jockey Vincent Vion has been handed a fifteen-day ban from March 12 to 26 inclusive by the stewards of France Galop following an inquiry at the organisation's headquarters in Paris. The Boulogne officials were not satisfied with Vion's explanation of the ride given to Dionello (Fr) (Le Glorieux {GB}) in the Prix Volandry, a conditions event for older horses, at Saint-Cloud's first meeting of the year March 1. Dionello had finished third to Bartex (Fr) (Groom Dancer {USA}), beaten a short head and a head, but would have won had Vion given his mount a more enterprising ride. Dionello, a five-year-old gelding owned and trained by Corine Barbe, has also been banned from running in handicaps from March 4 to May 2 inclusive.

PARADE AT WINTER DERBY

At the Bet Direct Winter Derby meeting Saturday, Mar. 18 at Lingfield Park, there will be a parade of retired racehorses in aid of Thoroughbred Rehabilitation and the local Moorcroft Rescue Centre. The parade will take place during the afternoon's racing which is to be televised by Channel 4 and features a card of jumping as well as Britain's first Listed race of the year, the £55,000 Arena Leisure Winter Derby. There is over £100,000 in prizemoney on offer for the seven race card which will also include the £20,000 Gold Cup Handicap Hurdle. Horses on show will include Grand National winner Rough Quest and other former top National Hunt runners Morley Street, Forest Sun, Katabatic, Moorcroft Boy, Deep Sensation and Mandy's Mantino. Andrew Parker-Bowles, a director of the racecourse's owner Arena Leisure, said, "It's a very apt occasion to come and meet these horses, especially now that the BHB are supporting this scheme to ensure these heroes have a life after racing."

DARK HORSES FOR 2000--PART ONE

The Italian season really gets into swing on March 19 when the last remaining major track, Milan, opens its gates for the first time this year. The major Italian races have been a source of steady income for many foreigntrained horses over the past few years and more recently German-trained horses have made a greater impact. Last season the Hano Blume trained filly Nagova (USA) (Goofalik {USA}) took the G1 Oaks d'Italia and Ungaro (Ger) (Goofalik {USA}) followed up his win in the 1998 G1 Gran Premio di Milano with a second place in the same race for the Herr Blume. In total, Germantrained horses bagged seven of Italy's 25 group races which compares favourably with the home team's total of only eight. Italian-trained horses will once again do their utmost to keep as many prizes at home and the list that follows is a team of dark horses which will probably include some of their best defence.

CALUKI (GB), c, 3, Kris (GB)--Chevisaunce (GB), by Fabulous Dancer (USA). O-Scuderia L3C; B-Az Agr Rosati Colarieti; T-Luigi Camici.

Originally trained at Chilivani in Sardegna by Gianaurio Muroni, Caluki easily won his three starts against weak local opposition. He was then switched to Rome under the tutelage of Luigi Camici and the handsome son of Kris impressed onlookers when easily accounting for the Premio Fiuggi. He is unbeaten in four starts and looks one of Italy's best prospects for the G2 Premio Prioli (Italian 2000 Guineas).

DAVIDE UMBRO (ITY), c, 3, In The Wings (GB)--Afreeta (Ity), by Afleet (Can). O-Scuderia Colle Papa; B-Razza Ascagnano: T-Emanuele Russo.

He was one of the highest priced yearlings at the ANAC sales in 1998 and broke his maiden at Rome's Derby meeting last May. Trained in Rome by the young Emanuele Russo, he did not show much on his next two starts and still looked green. Fitted with blinkers for a 1 1/16 mile conditions race in Rome, he defeated eight rivals in promising style. He will prove a different proposition this year and will do well if campaigned over middle distances.

INDIAN MARY (IRE), f, 3, Indian Ridge (Ire)--Mary Guard (Ire), by Home Guard (USA). O-Scuderia Briantea; B-Az Agr delle Groane; T-Mario Ciciarelli.

This fast filly showed plenty of guile in the early part of last season and broke her maiden over five furlongs at Rome, on her second start having finished second on her first racecourse appearance. She won her second race in October but suffered defeat on her last two starts albeit on soft ground. Her trainer is renowned for his gentle handling of his horses and he will have made sure we have yet to see the best of this attractive filly.

IRON EAGLE (IRE), c, 3, Mukaddamah (USA)--Kembla (GB), by Known Fact (USA). O-Scuderia Rencati; B-Az Agr La Vigna SRL; T-Luciano d'Auria.

He started his career with a claiming win for trainer Bruno Grizzetti but was claimed by Milan-based Luciano d'Auria. That proved to be a shrewd move as Iron Eafle went on to win a good conditions race at Merano and ended his freshman season with a second place finish to the useful Caluki in Rome. By Mukaddamah, a more than useful sire in Italy, out of the ultra tough mare Kembla, he is from a winning Juddmonte Farms family and is expected to do well at distances around a mile.

JASSIX (FR), c, 3, Linamix (Fr)--Jasm (USA), by Secretariat (USA). O-Mr R Casieri; B-SNC Lagardere Elevage; T-Bruno Grizzetti.

He ran only twice last season and followed up his debut third by breaking his maiden on very soft going at Milan in September. As a son of Linamix he showed an ability to handle mud and in his maiden win, showed aptitude for a battle. Considerable improvement is expected for this season and distances beyond a mile will see him at his best.

AUSTRALIA

Gold Brose's Stud Fee to Increase:

Hot NZ stallion Gold Brose (Aus) (Huntingdale {Ire}) will almost double this coming season from NZ\$8,000 to NZ\$15,000 following the phenomenal success of his first crop, now aged three. The Westbury Farm stallion has had 10 winners from 13 runners, and an incredible 12 black-type successes. His stakes winners have been dual Group 1 winner Buzz Lightyear, Catamarca, Party Queen, Joan's Best and Coup Wood. "And we intend to limit his book to 100 or fewer, which should place a premium on his progeny," said Westbury Farm stud manager Russell Warwick.
