SCALING NEW HEIGHTS AT GULFSTREAM

Gulfstream heads into its final weekend with a showcase of some top older sprinters in the GII Gulfstream Park Breeders' Cup Sprint Championship. Richter Scale (Habitony {GB}) was scheduled to enter stud at Wafare Farm this season, but caused a change of plans following a 5 3/4-length romp in the GII Fall Highweight H. at Aqueduct on Thanksgiving. In his only seven-furlong start, he ran fifth. Honorifico (Arg) (Southern Halo) captured two of his first three U.S. starts before finishing third to Affirmed Success and Adonis in the GI Cigar Mile Nov. 27. The Argentine-bred, winner of five of eight starts at today's distance, has been working bullets at Hialeah, including a half in :48 on Monday. The hard-luck Young At Heart (Ferdinand), second in last year's renewal to Frisk Me Now, ships in off a halflength loss to Affirmed Success in the GII General George H. at Laurel Feb. 21. The chestnut's last win picture came in 1998 at Del Mar at the expense of subsequent sprint champ Reraise. Forty One Carats (Tactical Advantage) went wide when second to Deep Gold (Olympio) in the GIII Deputy Minister H. Feb. 6 and should be in the thick of things with a better trip. Morning-line choice Kelly Kip (Kipper Kelly) returned from a serious hock injury with a fourth in the GIII Hallandale, then posted a victory in a five-furlong allowance over this strip Feb. 3. The six-year-old, a multiple graded stakes winner, has failed to hit the board in five seven-furlong starts.

FLORIDA DERBY-GI, \$750,000, 3yo, 1 1/8m

Postponed (Summer Squall), a surprise entrant in the Florida Derby, worked a half mile Wednesday in :48, the fifth best time of the 38 horses working that distance at Gulfstream. "He went real well," said jockey Jose Santos. "And was well within himself." Trainer Scotty Schulhofer said his charge may still start in a Saturday allowance. "If that allowance goes on Saturday, then I'll run him in it, if not then I'll run him in the Florida Derby," the conditioner said. "My ultimate goal with him is the Kentucky Derby and how best to get him ready for it." In his only start this year, Postponed captured a Feb. 12 Gulfstream allowance.

FAIR GROUNDS OAKS-GIII, \$350,000, 3yo, f, 1 1/16m Chilukki (Cherokee Run), last year's champion two-year-old filly, heads a field of nine. The Bob Baffert trainee, made the 6-5 morning line favorite, will break from the far outside in her second start as a three-year-old. In her 2000 debut, she was second over this track in the GIII Davona Dale.

HALL OF FAME CANDIDATES ANNOUNCED

Julie Krone became the first female jockey ever nominated for induction to the National Thoroughbred Racing Hall of Fame when the candidates were announced vesterday by National Museum of Racing President John von Stade. Krone, the winningest female iockey in the history of the sport, is joined be fellow rider candidates Earlie Fires and the late Jack Westrope. In the trainer category, the nominees are Neil Drysdale, Richard Mandella and Willard Proctor. A.P. Indy, Precisionist and Unbridled are listed as candidates in the contempory male horse category. In the contemporary female horse category are Flawlessly, Mom's Command and Winning Colors. In the horse of yesteryear category are Bowl of Flowes, Cougar II and Needles. One nominee from each category will be selected for inclusion in the sport's Hall of Fame. A panel of more than 140 racing writers, broadcasters and historians will elect the inductees. who will be announced during Kentucky Derby week. The Hall of Fame Induction ceremony will be held on Aug. 7 at the Fasig-Tipton Sale Company pavilion in Saratoga Springs, NY.

DESERT HERO DEAD Desert Hero (Sea Hero), winner of last year's GII San Rafael S. and third in the GI Santa Anita Derby, was euthanized on Mar. 1 after a severe bout of equine protozoal myelitis (EPM). In his only start this year, the four-year-old captured a Jan. 29 Santa Anita allowance contest. "Several days after Desert Hero won his last start, [trainer] Richard Mandella called to say he was concerned the colt was having some real co-ordination problems in both his hind and front limbs," explained Richard Mulhall, president of The Thoroughbred Corporation. "When the condition showed no signs of improvement, Desert Hero was moved to the care of Dr. Barrie Grant at the San Luis Rey Equine Hospital. Despite the most aggressive course of treatment for EPM, the colt did not respond and Dr. Grant's recommendation to put him down was reluctantly accepted." Desert Hero won three of eight races and earned \$324,000.

DEL MAR STAKES WORTH \$6.1M IN 2000 The Del Mar Thoroughbred Club will present the richest stakes schedule in its 61 summers of racing this year when it offers 28 stakes worth \$6.1 million. As always, the highlight of the meeting will be the Aug. 26 renewal of the \$1 million GI Pacific Classic. "We've added a major race, enhanced another and fine-tuned several more," said Del Mar Director of Racing Tom Robbins. "Not only is this our richest stakes schedule ever, it could be one of our most exciting." The schedule features the inaugural running of the \$125,000 Solana Beach H. for California-bred fillies and mares run at one mile on the turf on Sept. 3. Of the 28 Del Mar stakes, 19 are graded--five are Grade I, nine are Grade II and five are Grade III. Other Grade I races on tap are the July 30 \$400,000 Eddie Read H., the Aug. 27 \$250,000 Del Mar Oaks, the Sept. 2 \$250,000 Del Mar Debutante and the Sept. 9 \$400,000 Ramona H. The 43-day Del Mar season begins on July 26 and ends Sept. 13.

Rate Hike for Hialeah-at-Gulfstream?

The decision for Hialeah to run at Gulfstream Park could prove costly in terms of taxes. Last year, Hialeah paid an estimated \$59,000 in state taxes on its handle, based on a rate of 0.2 percent. By moving their meet to Gulfstream they could be forced to pay a penalty tax as high as 4.4 percent. Based on last year's on-track handle, this new tax could total as high as \$1.25 million this year, and conceivably could go much higher if the meeting is successful. There is also a Florida regulation which states that if "a permit holder conducts performances during more than one time period" they could be taxed at double the normal rate. With Hialeah running its meeting at Gulfstream Park, that rule could be interpreted to mean Gulfstream is running back-to-back meets, an interpretation which would be sure to be argued in court. Gulfstream President Doug Donn said there is a clause in the Hialeah contract covering just such an event. If Hialeah has to pay Gulfstream's penalty, based on 1999's on-track handle, that tax would be in the area of \$2.3 million. Hialeah Vice President John Van Lindt said he talked to Paul Kirsch, director of the Florida Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering, about the possibility of a double taxation. "They haven't told us anything officially," said Van Lindt, "but they hinted at it. I don't know when the state will hand down the ruling. We might not get it until we have started our meeting." Van Lindt said Hialeah would probably run its meeting at Gulfstream in any case and go into court for a decision on whether the state's interpretation of the rule is correct. Kirsch also told Van Lindt unofficially that Hialeah couldn't send its signal from Gulfstream back to Hialeah, and that, again unofficially, they would not be permitted to run turf races using Hialeah's grass course and transmit the signal back to Gulfstream.

HIGHER PROFILE FOR PROVINCES?

France Galop General Manager Louis Romanet has suggested that French Provincial racing should get the recognition it deserves and that more meetings will be staged at the higher-profile provincial tracks. Romanet also would like to see the Quinte bet available on more occasions. The Quinte bet, which asks punters to pick the first five finishers in a race, has proved to be a roaring success since it was introduced to the provinces four years ago. The wager, which is heavily advertised, has become the main source of income from betting for French racing, targeting the public at large much like a lottery, rather than just racing fans. Betting turnover has continued to rise this year with Quinte races already having been staged at Pau, twice, and Cagnes-sur-Mer five times throughout January and February, and France Galop is keen to strike while the iron is hot. Romanet said, "To bring racing closer to the racing fans, especially in the Provinces, we will continue to stage more race meetings at major provincial courses, with the famous Quinte bet on the card. We started at Lyon in 1996 and will have 18 of them this year all around France. These meetings are very popular among local racing fans and betting is excellent. It is certainly more expensive to travel for trainers based in Paris, but we could not continue with an exclusive priority to racing in Paris. We will also continue with simulcast betting at two different meetings on certain days where betting figures are up. The racing fans are getting used to and appreciate the simulcast meetings and we will have a 35 of them this year." Whilst promoting the provincial cause, France Galop is also making a concerted effort to attract new fans to the Parisian scene. They are to create specialist information centres and will also promote the training grounds at Chantilly and Maisons-Laffitte as places to visit.

EURYANTHE TO REMAIN IN GERMANY

Business tycoon Gary Tanaka acquired the four-year-old Euryanthe (Ire) (Royal Academy {USA}) some weeks ago with the idea of sending the dual group-placed filly to Amerca, but there has been a change of plan and she will remain in Germany for the time being. Lippe Lippe is a highly regarded half-sister to Italian champion Bardonecchia and broke her maiden on her third start. That was a 7½ furlong event in soft going at Milan which she won well, but she disappointed connections in the Listed Criterium Femminile at Rome. Lippe Lippe is a scopey sort who was just not strong enough last season, but is expected to improve a lot from two to three. She could prove a serious contender for the G2 Premio Regina Elena (Italian 1000 Guineas) although she has some way to go to match her illustrious half-sister.

RIO PARANA (ITY), c, 3, Efisio (GB)--Meadow Flowers (USA), by Private Account (USA). O-Astutillo Malgioglio; B-Razza Ascagnano; T-Piero Billeri.

Trained during his juvenile campaign by Stefan Ibido in Milan, but Rio Parana has been transferred to the care of Piero Billeri. He was beaten on his first start, over ten furlongs, but showed plenty of ability when breaking his maiden over seven furlongs at Milan in October. He followed up in good style over 7½ furlongs but still looked green. He has the scope to do well from eight to ten furlongs and, like a lot of Efisio's progeny, he likes soft going. He has made an immediate impact as a three-year-old and won on his seasonal debut in Rome last Sunday.

STRACCH (GB), c, 3, Polish Precedent (USA)--Cradle Of Love (USA), by Roberto (USA). O-Scuderia Rencati; B-Stratford Place Stud; T-A & G Botti.

He looked an immature type as a juvenile but showed alot of ability when winning his first two starts. He opened his account over ten furlongs in September and confirmed the promise of that run when winning a 1 1/16m conditions race two weeks later. It was probably asking too much when he ran in the Listed Premio Campobello, his third race in a month. He was unplaced in that race but he looks the right type to develop into a middle distance horse.

SWEET ILMA (USA), f, 3, Golden Act (USA)--Fairways Girl (GB), by Young Generation (GB). O-Ignazio Boi; B-Stoneriggs Farm; T-Gianpiero Ligas.

This U.S.-bred didn't make her debut until Dec. 22 at Naples when trained by Ovidio Pessi. She looked weak for a 1 1/16 mile contest, but finished well to secure second place. She has since been transferred to Gianpiero Ligas and made has made up for lost time by running four times in January and February. She has displayed her well being by winning a good conditions event at Naples only last week and, if getting her favoured fast ground, could well prove to be a lively outsider for the G2 Premio Regina Elena.

TORNADO MITCH (USA), c, 3, Hazaam (USA)--Chiroquacktress (USA), by Quack (USA). O/T-Ovidio Pessi; B-Heidi L Leonard.

One of Ovidio Pessi's inexpensive and successful Florida-bred imports, Tornado Mitch looked a big scopey sort as a two-year-old and ran only three times, suffering defeat on his debut at a rain-sodden Rome in September. He broke his maiden on better going over a mile, but was tested by his trainer on his final start when he finished fourth in the G2 Premio Guido Berardelli, staying on strongly in soft conditions which he disliked. He has a bag of improvement in him and could be one of the better middle distance prospects this season.

★ BRITAIN ★

TRAINERS FINED £4.000 EACH

Trainers Paul Webber and Simon Sherwood have each been fined £4,000 by the Jockey Club after being found guilty of bringing racing into disrepute. The two trainers were said, in a recent High Court judgement, to be involved in collusive bidding over the purchase of Pru's Profiles at Doncaster in 1995. In that case, owner Gary Heywood was awarded damages of £51,480 against the Curragh Bloodstock Agency, who Webber was employed by at the time, and the CBA decided not to appeal the judgement. Webber and Sherwood's representative, Justin Wadham, did not offer any evidence on the trainers' behalf. In a prepared statement the trainers said, "The (High Court) judgement was wrong in every material detail, it should have been appealed (by CBA) and we are in no doubt that, had it been appealed, we would have been completely exonerated of all wrongdoing. As we were not even parties to the proceedings, but mere witnesses, we not only have no right of appeal but we had no say in whether an appeal took place." Webber, who still acts as racing manager to Prince Faisal Salman, did not feel let down by the CBA's decision not to appeal the High Court judgement and added, "Prince Faisal has shown me his absolute support as have all previous clients and all current clients."
