#### "HIGH" HOPES FOR FLORIDA DERBY

The winner of the Feb. 19 GI Fountain of Youth S., Triple Crown hopeful High Yield (Storm Cat) breaks from the rail as the favorite in today's GI Florida Derby at Gulfstream Park. The chestnut schooled in the paddock during the sixth race Thursday. "I wanted him to get familiar again with the paddock and some of the crowd noise that he can expect on Saturday," trainer D. Wayne Lukas said. Worse than third only once over his 10-race career, High Yield teamed with jockey Pat Day for the first time in the Fountain of Youth and led every step en route to a 3 1/4-length score. It was his second start with blinkers on, and his trainer said, "He seems to be more focused." With the inside post position, you might expect him to try to take this field from gate to wire as well, but Lukas cautioned, "He's the kind of horse that can either go to the lead or come from off the pace." Hal's Hope (Jolie's Halo) chased High Yield around the track last time out before finishing second, and adds Lasix for the Florida Derby. Bare Outline (Broad Brush), who subs for the injured Greenwood Lake, also has solid speed, setting all the pace on his way to a 1 1/4-length victory in the Unbridled allowance purse on the Fountain of Youth undercard. "[Jockey] Corey Nakatani has gotten a lot of run out of him," trainer Nick Zito said. "He's two-for-two on the horse. I can't compare anything I have at this time with Greenwood Lake. He was fabulous. But you always have hope. The main thing I would love to see [today] is a real solid effort." Nakatani suffered a minor injury to his hand at Santa Anita Friday and took off all his mounts; he was having precautionary X-rays taken. Postponed (Summer Squall) also comes off a Gulfstream allowance victory, rallying to win by a half length Feb. 12. The bay ended his two-yearold season with a sixth-place finish in the Rhythm S. at Gulfstream over Breeders' Cup weekend. Trainer Scotty Schulhofer said, "He had trained well going into that race and I was surprised at his dull effort, so I backed off on him a little. But this is a nice colt and I knew he was going to run well in his first start this year. I would have preferred an easier spot [than the Florida Derby], but he's ready to run. My ultimate goal with him is the Kentucky Derby." Ten Florida Derby winners have gone on to take the Kentucky Derby. Thunder Gulch, trained by Lukas, was the latest to accomplish the feat, scoring the double in 1995. (Florida Derby field, p2)

#### CAPTAIN LEADS LOUISIANA DERBY CHARGE

Captain Steve (Fly So Free) has been installed as the 2-1 favorite facing nine rivals in Sunday's \$750,000 GII Louisiana Derby at the Fair Grounds. The Bob Baffert trainee disappointed in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, finishing 11th, but bounced back to end the campaign with a 5 3/4-length tally in the GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. at Churchill Downs and a four-length victory in the GI Hollywood Futurity. He has started just once this year, running third behind The Deputy (Ire) and Florida Derby favorite High Yield in the Jan. 30 GII Santa Catalina S. Jockey Robby Albarado, currently the leading rider at the Fair Grounds, was aboard for Captain Steve's last two wins and will be back in the saddle tomorrow. Why did Baffert ship his colt in from California for this race? "I think Bob's main reasoning was the wet weather they have had in California," assistant April Mayberry said. "Plus, this track is great. He has worked well here." Jerry Bailey, who was aboard Captain Steve last time out, will ride Tribunal (Deputy Minister) for Baffert this time. Unplaced in his lone start at two, the chestnut broke his maiden by five lengths at Santa Anita Jan. 23 and ran second behind the highly touted Fusaichi Pegasus in an allowance over that track Feb. 19. Risen Star S. winner Exchange Rate (Danzig) is the second favorite on the morning line at 7-2, while More Than Ready (Southern Halo), making his two-turn debut, is the third choice at 5-1. The winner of the Louisiana Derby will be eligible for the "Great Post Challenge," a \$500,000 bonus if he can go on and win the GI Kentucky Derby on the first Saturday in May.

Richter Scale was expected to start his stud career at Wafare Farm in Midway, Kentucky this season, but trainer Mary Jo Lohmeier explained, "We...were close to retiring him last year, but he ran so well in the fall that we decided to try him again this year." Tried on the turf for the first five starts of 1999, the bay was off the board in three straight, then took a two-month breather. He came back to win the Oct. 16 Phoenix Breeders' Cup S. and the Nov. 25 GII Fall Highweight H. Making his first appearance since that impressive 5 3/4-length score, the six-year-old went right to the front, sped through a half in :44 4/5 and six furlongs in 1:09 4/5 and had enough left to hold on for the victory. "He's got bad feet and a bad back and sometimes he's bothered by both of them," Lohmeier said, but added, "When he's right, he's a real tough horse and he was right today." As for the future, she said, "We'd like to get a Grade I win and we're looking to run him in the Carter H. [GI, May 7 at Aqueduct]...but we're also looking at the Commonwealth [Breeders' Cup H., Gll, Apr. 16] at Keeneland. He'll run in one of them, if his feet and back let him." Favored Forty One Carats chased the winner from the start, but couldn't get past him in the stretch and had to settle for second. "Every time [Forty One Carats] came close, he seemed to let out another notch," winning jockey Richie Migliore said. "I can't take a lot of credit other than being able to cross reins and hang on to the mane."

The first European group race of the season boasts 11 runners with some high-class individuals among them. Dubai-bound Group 1 winner Caitano makes the trip from Germany and has the necessary credentials to figure prominently. He was successful in two of his three starts last year, winning both the G2 Idee Hansa-Preis at Hamburg in June and the G2 Grosser Preis der Baden-Airpark at Baden-Baden, beating Tiger Hill (Ire), earlier the same month. Amilynx is the only other Group 1 winner in the field, having won last season's G1 Prix Royal Oak over 1 15/16 miles at Longchamp. He had previously garnered the 1 7/8 mile G2 Prix Hubert de Chaudenay, but this 10-furlong trip could be too sharp. First Magnitude, a stablemate of Amilynx, may prove to be the yard's number-one hope and confirmed the promise of a third place to Montjeu (Ire) in the G2 Prix Niel by winning the G2 Prix du Conseil de Paris last October. He finished last in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf at Gulfstream Park, but can be forgiven that fruitless endeavour.

## GERMANY

WINTER RACING TAKES HOLD IN GERMANY by Christa Riebel

Only some 10 years ago, winter racing was practically non-existent in Germany, with Dortmund the only track even offering a sand track as an alternative. By contrast, there are now two tracks with complete winter racing schedules--Dortmund and Neuss, offering racing each weekend. German racegoers have taken to winter racing guite well, especially since both tracks improved their facilities, making them warm and comfortable. Hendrik Pape, Dortmund's managing director, said he believed that winter racing had undergone a gradual improvement each year for several years before leveling off recently. The Dortmund racing calendar treats summer and winter racing equally, yet Pape said he felt that the acceptance of sand-track racing in the winter months is not yet that strong, especially where big trainers and the leading yards are concerned. Reinhard Bochmann, Neuss's managing director, said he felt it would be interesting to have an interactive event between England, France, Germany and the Scandinavian countries. He noted that this past winter saw an increased number of runners from countries such as Belgium, the Netherlands and Scandinavia. Now that Germany's Roymillon (Ger) (Milesius {USA}), the winner of the Sandbahn Classic at Neuss, is being aimed at Lingfield, Bochmann hopes that English trainers might now consider sending horses to Neuss. He said that while the market has to be developed gradually, once most trainers realise that you can run horses on sand more often and that their form is much more stable, winter racing should have a good and sound future.

## NEW MAN AT THE CURRAGH by Tom Frary

At the end of April, The Curragh racecourse in Ireland, as well as all the training grounds, will come under the management of Jason Morris, stepping from the raceplanning department of the British Horseracing Board into Brian Kavanagh's shoes. As with Kavanagh before him, Morris will be 31 when he takes over the running of the racecourse and training grounds. Born in October, 1968 in Malta, where his famous father, the TV presenter Desmond Morris, was living at the time, his interest in racing was to blossom on his arrival in England at the age of five. Upon graduating from Oxford University, where he studied Egyptology, Jason Morris thrust himself into the racing world with a position as private handicapper to the talented trainer Henrietta Knight. This is where he gained his first sight and sound of racing. "It was a fantastic grounding, working for one of the most intelligent trainers in racing, and dealing with stable staff on the one hand, and the richest of owners on the other," he recalled. This ability to communicate effectively at all levels led to him taking a post on the first day of the BHB's inception, in June, 1993. Here he further developed his skills in diplomacy, always building up relations between all sections of the racing industry, as well as providing vital background data and statistical information. Morris then applied for the position at the Curragh when it became available. "Racecourse management had always been a possible option at the back of my mind, but I was only going to do it at a top racecourse. The position offered a wonderful opportunity, and was too good to miss." If, as suggested, the notion of an Englishman in an Irish job could offer problems, Morris is certainly not aware of this. "I don't feel there is any prejudice," he said. "It will be a rude awakening, managing a major international course, but I'm very used to dealing with trainers in this country, and I deal with a lot of complaints. However, I enjoy it, and trainers have a genuine point to make. I am looking forward to it. The Curragh saw employing me as a big positive--a bonus." Of the challenges ahead, he says: "The existing management, under Brian Kavanagh, have made a tremendous success of the re-development of The Curragh. Irish racing is in a very positive state, and I am very well aware of the challenges of the future financing of it, as well as building up an international profile. The potential redevelopment of The Curragh over the next five years is another step further." Morris looks the ideal man to build on the success of the racecourse, continuing its development in the international sphere.
