DAVID BEATS GOLIATH AT GULFSTREAM

You could hardly be blamed for turning the television off at the top of the stretch of yesterday's GI Florida Derby at Gulfstream Park. When the \$1.05 million favorite from the high-powered barn of D. Wayne Lukas with Hall of Fame jockey Pat Day in the irons collared the less fashionably connected homebred, the outcome seemed a foregone conclusion. Apparently, Hal's Hope (Jolie's Halo) hadn't read the script. The three-year-old, owned bred and trained by Harold Rose and ridden by Roger Velez, stepped right out to lead the field of 10 with even money favorite High Yield (Storm Cat) in close attendance. Hal's Hope opened a clear lead leaving the backstretch, but once Day asked High Yield, the chestnut moved up and appeared ready to draw off easily. But Hal's Hope dug in and refused to be passed down the lane and, by the length of his head, reversed the order of finish of the Feb. 19 GI Fountain of Youth S. "Maybe they'll believe me now," exclaimed the octogenarian Rose, whose colt was given little respect despite a win in the GIII Holy Bull and his runner-up finish in the Fountain of Youth. "He doesn't want to let a horse pass him. Once he's in front, he won't let another horse by him. He has a lot of courage." Velez, enjoying one of the biggest moments of his career, added, "At the eighth pole, I knew Pat had a lot of horse. But I switched sticks and tapped my horse left-handed and he just exploded again. This is like a dream come true for me." Velez won the 1976 GI Whitney and the 1978 GI Matron. Day was one of many who thought High Yield was going to blow on by in the stretch. "The winner surprised me," the rider said. "I thought I had him on the turn and thought all I had to do was push the button on my horse and we'd be by him. But the winner hung tough." Although Rose didn't reveal future plans for Hal's Hope, High Yield may make his next start in the Apr. 15 GI Toyota Blue Grass. "I was pleased with his effort although I would have liked to have won the race," Lukas said of the runner-up. "It looks like these two horses are way above the other horses here in Florida." Saturday's handle of \$23,967,204 from all sources was a record for Florida Derby Day at Gulfstream Park. Betting on the Derby itself was a record \$5,026,048 from all sources. On-track handle for the race was \$909,716. The 2000 Florida Derby was beamed to a record 1,450 simulcast locations.

SURFSIDE FACES FOUR IN OAKS

Surfside (Seattle Slew) looks to take another step on the road to Louisville in today's GI Santa Anita Oaks at Santa Anita. The D. Wayne Lukas-trained filly has been a dominant force in her division, winning six of eight starts. She is unbeaten in three starts since running third in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies last fall, annexing the GI Hollywood Starlet by seven lengths, the GIII Santa Ysabel by eight and, most recently, the Feb. 12 GI Las Virgenes S. by 3/4 lengths over a muddy track. Lukas has already won seven Oaks titles, including an Oaks, Santa Anita Derby, Kentucky Derby triple with Winning Colors. He hopes to follow the same trail with Surfside. The filly at the other end of that 3/4-length margin in the Las Virgenes was The Thoroughbred Corporation's Spain (Thunder Gulch). After running fourth in the Breeders' Cup, Spain got the winter off and was making her three-year-old bow in the Las Virgenes. Rings a Chime (Metfield) couldn't match strides with Surfside when second in the Santa Ysabel, but was only 3/4 lengths behind Spain in the Las Virgenes.

Captain Steve, the morning line favorite, is just one of six stakes winners and three graded stakes winners in the 10-horse field. Exchange Rate, unbeaten in two starts this year, will try to repeat the Crescent City double he and stablemate Shawnee Country enjoyed at the end of February. Davona Dale winner Shawnee Country held up her end of the bargain by winning yesterday's Fair Grounds Oaks. In his half of the double, Exchange Rate took the Feb. 20 Risen Star S. at this distance despite hitting the gate at the start. The \$1.4 million KEEJUL yearling was second in last year's GIII Hollywood Juvenile Championship and GIII Best Pal. New York invader Country Only takes a four-race win streak into his graded stakes debut. The bay colt romped home a 5 1/2-length winner of the Feb. 12 Whirlaway S. at this distance in his most recent start. Local hopes lie with Mighty. The dark bay colt, winner of last year's GIII Iroquois, ended 1999 with a second behind Captain Steve in the Nov. 27 GII Kentucky Jockey Club and started 2000 the same way. He was second in the Jan. 29 Lecomte S. and in the Risen Star.

Forced wide early in the 21-horse field, jockey Dan Beasley dropped Miss Pennymoney behind the leaders and she hit the front with about a quarter remaining. "She's the best filly I've ever been on, and no doubt the best there is around at the moment. She was going too easily at the 400-metre mark. I had to let her go out by herself and she just raced away," said Beasley. Trainer Jim Conlan revealed Miss Pennymoney would either be set for the Cox Plate or a trip to the U.S. in the spring (Southern Hemisphere). "They might be pipe dreams, but she's easily the best filly in Australia," he said of the \$200,000 yearling purchase.

Trippi sped to an easy victory in his career opener at Gulfstream Jan. 29 and handled allowance foes with even less trouble last time out, dashing away to a 9 1/4-length triumph Feb. 19. Odds-on to make the jump into graded-stakes company, the bay shadowed Ultimate Warrior through a half in :44 2/5 while three wide, drove past the frontrunner in deep stretch and edged clear. "We thought it would be a good day to try him from off the pace, especially if [Ultimate Warrior] gunned it out of there," winning jockey Jerry Bailey said. "He rated nice for me and he responded when I asked. It was a hard race, but it was encouraging the way he finished. I think he'll go around two turns, but it's too early to say whether he can go a mile and a quarter." Trainer Todd Pletcher said, "He's done nothing wrong so far and we'll keep testing him."

The winner of the Nov. 2 GIII Tempted S. and third in the Nov. 27 GII Demoiselle S., Shawnee Country was off the board in a pair of stakes at Gulfstream Park to start Y2K and found herself a 28-1 outsider in her latest, the Feb. 19 GIII Davona Dale S. over this track. But the dark bay belied those odds, rallying to best champion Chilukki (Cherokee Run) by a half length. Chilukki was the odds-on choice to turn the tables this time, but after pressing the pace, she faded badly to be eighth. Shawnee Country, allowed to settle off the early pace while inside, came wide into the stretch and finished full of run to take the lead as they reached the eighth pole for her second straight graded score. "The race pretty much set up the same way the Davona Dale did, except without Chilukki [at the finish] this time," Mike Maker, assistant to winning trainer D. Wayne Lukas, said. "November Slew (Seattle Slew) [seventh in the Davona Dale for Lukas after showing brief speed] went to the front and Shawnee Country picked up the pieces." As for the favorite, her jockey, Robby Albarado, said, "She paced herself nicely and in mid-turn I tried to nudge her for a move, but she didn't respond at all."

A handicap winner at The Curragh in his European finale, Beckon the King shipped to the U.S. for a fall campaign last year and won at first asking this side of the Atlantic, rallying to take the Nov. 7 Steinlen S. at Gulfstream Park during Breeders' Cup weekend. The bay headed to the West Coast for his next outing, but bobbled at the start of the Nov. 28 GI Hollywood Derby and was never in the hunt, finishing 12th. Given a 2 1/2month respite following that effort, the Kentucky-bred came back to try dirt for the first time in a Gulfstream allowance race Feb. 17 and showed good speed en route to a 3 1/2-length score. Back on the grass here. he was sent off the slight choice and, after saving ground while sitting off the pace early, switched to the outside for the stretch run, caught Kettle Won late in the lane and drew clear.

A stakes winner at Delaware Park, the Meadow-lands and Laurel Park in three of her final four starts last year, the well-traveled Feisty Countess shipped into New York for her first effort of this season and was second by a neck in the Jan. 23 Busanda S. at Aqueduct. Sent out 7-4 favourite at her first trans-Tasman appearance this autumn, she held off a late charge by Adam (Aus) (Rubiton {Aus}) to win by a length. She will next contest the G1 Coolmore Classic over 1500 meters at Rosehill April 1, before defending her title in the G1 Doncaster H. (A\$2.5 million). Sunline, who has now won \$A3,648,076, could campaign in the U.S. next year after a tilt at the Dubai Cup, part-owner Thayne Green hinted. "We got invited to Dubai straight after Sunline won the Cox Plate and we looked at it very seriously; we were quite keen to go," he said in an interview on Radio 2KY. "But in reality, it's one race, against the world's best, and by the time she got out of quarantine both ways it would all take six months. So we decided maybe it was a year too early, and hopefully we will get an invitation next year. We haven't discussed it seriously, but we have had a very good approach from the U.S. for a deal either to purchase or a deal to race her in the U.S., put her to a leading sire there and bring her home. But we are here to race at the moment."

CATBIRD RETIRED

G1 Golden Slipper winner Catbird (Aus) (Danehill {USA}--Fitting {Aus}, by Marscay {Aus}) has been retired and will stand for \$A12,500 at Yarraman Park near Scone, NewSouth Wales.
