READY OR NOT, HERE COMES MIGHTY

More Than Ready (Southern Halo) looked like a winner as they came down the stretch in yesterday's GII Louisiana Derby at the Fair Grounds. The colt, off at 5-1 in his two-turn debut, was three lengths in front at the eighth pole, but he couldn't hold off the late charge of 6-1 Mighty (Lord At War {Arg}), who went from last to first to win by a widening two lengths. The winner of the GIII Iroquois S. at Churchill Downs the same day as the Breeders' Cup, the ebony colt was looking to break a streak of three straight runner-up finishes in the Nov. 27 GII Kentucky Jockey Club S., Jan. 29 Lecomte S. and the Feb. 20 Risen Star S. He settled behind the field as More Than Ready cut out honest fractions, kicked it into gear as they headed into the far turn, swung wide for the drive and wore down the front runner after a sustained rally. "I was just hoping he would respond when I aksed him, unlike last time when he was hesitant," winning jockey Shane Sellers said. "But today, he gave it to me. It just takes him time to get going." Remarked trainer Frank Brothers, "I was a little concerned at the beginning because he has never been that far back, but Shane did a great job of getting him settled in. We'll have to talk, but I'm sure he'll be going to Kentucky." Todd Pletcher, trainer of More Than Ready, is also thinking first Saturday in May. "I couldn't be happier with the race," he said. "I hope this quiets some of the critics who say he can't go two turns. I don't think you'll find anybody who could say this wasn't the toughest prep for the Triple Crown. [More Than Ready] is absolutely ready to step up to the next level." Captain Steve (Fly So Free), the 2-1 favorite, was also rated well off the opening fractions and came running late, but couldn't get past More Than Ready and had to be content with third. "In the first turn, he got shuffled back," jockey Robby Albarado said. "He was in tight quarters for the first time...he definitely needed the experience. He should be a better horse next time out." Trainer Bob Baffert added, "He came into this only about 80 percent and I think he ran very well. I just hope he stays healthy and sound. No more setbacks and we should be OK." Exchange Rate (Danzig), an even fourth, remains in the Derby picture as well. "He really ran a big race," Mike Maker, assistant to D. Wayne Lukas, said. "He just couldn't get there. We're on our way to Kentucky." (Louisiana Derby chart, p2)

"SURF" ROLLS AGAIN AT SANTA ANITA

Sporting a nasal strip but without the benefit of Lasix for the first time since her third career start, Surfside (Seattle Slew) picked up her fourth consecutive gradedstakes victory, driving to a three-quarter length victory over Kumari Continent (Kris S.) in vesterday's GI Santa Anita Oaks. The bay filly gave trainer D. Wayne Lukas his eighth win in the event, but it wasn't easy. The 2-5 favorite raced head-and-head with 13-1 Rings A Chime (Metfield) through a half in :45 4/5 and six furlongs in 1:10 2/5, put that one away at the top of the lane, but had to fight off challenges from Kumari Continent and outsider Classy Cara (General Meeting). "I thought I could settle back behind the leader, but she got her feet under her and went after [Rings A Chime]," jockey Pat Day said. "My filly was starting to labor a little in the stretch. I had to get after her a bit. Hopefully, this will be good for her. She needs to keep stepping up to the plate and work hard to keep moving forward." But he added, "She'll improve off this. Her status is not diminished in my eyes. She keeps on winning. She's got those number ones by her name." Lukas, who sent out Winning Colors to win the Santa Anita Oaks before she bested the colts in the GI Santa Anita Derby and GI Kentucky Derby in 1988, will follow the same path with this filly. "I think we are getting good solid performances that are tightening her down," he said. "Obviously, for the next one, we'll try to do a little more, and we'll have to. It'll get tougher. She'll go in the Santa Anita Derby (Apr. 8). We've got grandiose ideas-whether they're fulfilled remains to be seen. We feel like we're on course. We're getting good seasoning and conditioning out of all this. She has gained weight through this whole process. Now we'll find out if she can beat the boys." Surfside's owner/breeder William T. Young, who captured the 1996 Kentucky Derby with Grindstone, is looking forward to another tilt at the twin spires. "From the beginning I've always thought, 'if she's good enough to run in the Derby, why not?' Three fillies have won it," Young said. "As a Kentuckian, I'd rather win a Derby than several Oaks." But the Overbrook Farm boss is not unrealistic. "We'll have to see how she runs in the next race," he said. "These races are getting tougher and tougher. If she gets beat in the Santa Anita Derby, then maybe we'd go in the [Kentucky] Oaks." (Santa Anita Oaks chart, p2)

The winner of the EBF Hoppings S. at Newcastle last June, Fictitious came off a five-month layoff to win her North American debut at Calder by 1 1/2 lengths. The racing surface changed when a Feb. 4 allowance was taken off the turf, but the result was still the same, with chestnut filly winning by two. With Tres Coronas setting a good pace, Fictitious sat reserved in fourth down the backstretch and rallied on the turn, but was forced to check when fourth-place finisher Dead of Night (GB) (Night Shift) came in on her. After recovering, she collared the leader near the sixteenth pole and drew off to victory. "She was nervous in the paddock, but very professional on the track," said jockey Jose Santos. Trainer Christophe Clement added, "The pace was very sensible and this filly rated beautifully. I was worried when she got in tight quarters turning for home, but (Jose Santos) was able to take her back and she came again and had enough to make a good late run."

XAAR RETIRED Xaar (GB) (Zafonic--Monroe, by Sir Ivor), Europe's champion two-year-old of 1997, has been retired. The bay will begin his stud career at Arrowfield Stud in Australia during the 2000 Southern Hemisphere season, standing for a fee of A\$22,500, then will return to Ireland to stand at Darley's Kildangan Stud in 2001. The five-year-old ended his juvenile season with a three-length victory in the G1 Prix de la Salamandre and a seven-length romp over future champion Tamarisk (Ire) in the G1 Dewhurst S., prompting trainer Andre Fabre to say, "He is more impressive than Zafonic. When you get a horse as good as this, it makes you dream." His three-year-old campaign included a win in the G3 Craven S., a third-place finish behind Swain (Ire) in the G1 Irish Champion S. and a fourth-place showing in the G1 English 2000 Guineas. He was Europe's highweighted three-year-old on the International Classifications (Intermediate). Xaar started just twice last season, running third in the G2 Prince Of Wales's S. and second, beaten just a neck, in his final start, the July 3 G1 Coral-Eclipse S. He retires with five wins, three seconds and two thirds from 11 starts and earnings of \$593,956. "Irish breeders will be very keen on Xaar," Kildangan Managing Director Joe Osborne said. "His pedigree is terrific and he will retire as the highest-rated two-year-old at stud in Ireland, bar none."

RUNNING STAG DEFEATED IN DUBAI Running Stag (Cozzene) could do no better than second in his prep for the Mar. 26 G1 Dubai World Cup, finishing 1 1/4 lengths behind Blue Snake (Gone West) at Nad al Sheba yesterday, but trainer Phillip Mitchell was not disappointed in the effort and still plans on sending the six-year-old on to the \$6 million main event. "I am very happy with the run, completely satisfied," Mitchell said. "The idea was for him to come here and have a prep race and he has done that and run well. The race was over 7 1/2 furlongs, which is 2 1/2 furlongs shorter than his best trip. He was there to win, but was beaten in the last few strides by a good horse. He was beaten by a very fit horse who raced last week." Running Stag, making his first start since running second in the Dec. 12 G1 Hong Kong International Cup, settled fourth of the five runners during the early stages of the race as Blue Snake set the pace and rallied wide to take the lead in the stretch, but the pacesetter came back to win it under jockey Frankie Dettori.

Future Plans for Florida Derby Runners:

GI Florida Derby winner Hal's Hope (Jolie's Halo) will go next in either the GI Blue Grass S. or the GII Wood Memorial Apr. 15. "If the Wood Memorial looks real easy and the Blue Grass looks real tough, I'll probably go to the Wood," owner/trainer Harold Rose said.

High Yield (Storm Cat), who finished second by a head as the even-money favorite, will go on to the Blue Grass. Postponed (Summer Squall), fifth in the Florida Derby, will continue along the Triple Crown trail in the Blue Grass as well. "He ran a good race," trainer Scotty Schulhofer said. "Obviously, I would have liked to have been closer, but my objective was to get a good race into him and I accomplished that. My main objective all along was to run in the Blue Grass and that's where he's going."

Sore Feet for Scottish Halo:

Scottish Halo (Jolie's Halo) grabbed both front quarters at the start and ended up sixth in the Florida Derby. "He stumbled coming out of the starting gate," trainer Paul Rizzo said. "They're not that bad, but that couldn't have helped him and I also think he needed the race and should benefit from it. I'm not sure where he'll run next. We have several options and one of them is to keep him here and run him in the Flamingo (GIII, Apr. 8)."

Another Derby for El Camino Real Winner?

GIII El Camino Real Derby hero Remember Sheikh (Sheikh Albadou {GB}) will try to add another Derby to his resume in his next start, which is expected to be in the \$250,000 California Derby at Golden Gate Fields Apr. 15. The late-closing colt tied up after his 1 1/2-length victory at Bay Meadows Saturday, but looked OK yesterday morning. "He cramped up a little [after the race]," trainer Lonnie Arterburn said. "It was no big deal. The vets gave him some electrolytes and he was fine. He looked good this morning."

Team Lukas Gains Confidence:

Trainer D. Wayne Lukas, who saddled 1999 GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness winner Charismatic to a second-place finish in last year's El Camino Real Derby, sent out **True Confidence** (Storm Cat) to run second in this year's edition. "He came out of the race great," Lukas assistant Randy Bradshaw said. "He keeps improving. Since he got here [in December], he's been getting better by leaps and bounds." Lukas will consider the Apr. 15 Gll Arkansas Derby at Oaklawn Park for the \$1.5 million yearling purchase.

DERBY POOL 2 SETS RECORD The second pool of the Kentucky Derby Future Wager, now in its second year, closed yesterday after achieving a record handle. A total of \$306,259 was bet on Pool 2, with \$144,965 wagered on Sunday alone. The mutuel field, including all three-year-olds other than the 23 named on the morning line, remains the slight favorite at 5-1 after ending Pool 1 as the 7-2 choice. Last year's second pool handled \$178,811. The combined wagering on the first two legs of the 2000 Future Wager is now \$771,713, already surpassing the \$676,233 bet on all three pools last year. "We couldn't be more pleased," Churchill Downs President Alex Waldrop said. "The wager was developed to help generate new and early attention on the Derby and the Visa Triple Crown and to give racing fans a new way to enjoy America's greatest race. We think it has reached and exceeded those goals." The third and final pool runs Apr. 13-16.

FLY SO FREE COLT BLAZES IN BARRETTS PREVIEW Hip #199, a colt by Fly So Free out GSW Heartlight (Majestic Light), jetted through a quarter in :20.98 to top the works for the distance at yesterday's training preview for the Barretts March Sale of Selected Two-Year-Olds in Training. Consigned by Seguel Bloodstock, agent, the chestnut is part of the 51-horse California-bred session of the sale. He had worked the quickest quarter during the first preview on Mar. 7 as well, going in :21.83. Sunday's second-fastest twofurlong breeze was turned in by Hip #121, a filly by freshman sire Hennessy out of Kirt's Pride (Kirtling {Ire}), who went in :21.28. Hip #44, a colt by Saint Ballado out of What a Reality (In Reality), posted the fastest time for one furlong during Sunday's workouts, but just barely. The dark bay, from the Jerry Bailey Sales Agency consignment, was clocked in :10 flat, but Hip #11, a filly by End Sweep out of Smoldering Embers (Raise a Man) went in :10.01 and Hip #154, a filly by Crafty Prospector out of Polish Sands (Polish Navy) named Whatdoyousaytothat, was timed in :10.02. Hip #94, a colt by Southern Halo who topped the first preview with an eighth in :10.13, just galloped yesterday. The one-day sale will be held Tuesday, Mar. 14, with bidding beginning at 2 p.m.



GERMANY, A BETTING COUNTRY? by Christa Riebel

With the emergence of Sisal Bookmakers onto the German betting market, there should be a few points mentioned. There is a sound number of bookmakers in most larger German towns, especially in the vicinity of racetracks. Now many other towns in this country are to be equipped with betting facilities.

Most of these additional betting shops are to be offered in restaurants and in "Kneipen," which are similiar to the English pub. The landlord of such a place will then be forced to install the necessary facilities and offer increased services at his own cost. Yet, the traditional German way of life could present a problem.

In Australia, for example, many punters spend their betting day in a pub on some weekends and betting on horses, for example, via the TAB, has quite a different standard. Moreover, travelling to a racetrack from the middle of nowhere would present a problem in any case.

In England and Ireland as well, racing and betting possess a much higher acceptance than in Germany.

In Germany, the weekend traditionally belongs to the family, and who would take their kids to the pub? Families would rather spend a day at the races, where most of the tracks offer special children's activities.

It can be expected that enthusiastic punters, a few newcomers and many single people will make use of the new facilities, but it is highly debatable whether the number will be sufficient to make it worthwhile.

Moreover, the traditional German sports are soccer, tennis and snow-related sports in the winter. Thoroughbred racing has increased its acceptance in the past years, but not really to that extent that the increased offering of betting shops could turn out to be profitable business. I can only hope that time will prove me wrong, especially for those who have to carry the costs.
