ANEES SALE FALLS THROUGH

Two days after Prince Ahmed Salman referred to David Shimmon as a "gentleman and a scholar," Shimmon called off his deal with Salman to buy 50 percent of **Anees** (Unbridled) for \$6 million. With **Anees**, last year's Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner, expected to make his debut as a three-year-old on Sunday in the GII San Felipe S. at Santa Anita, Salman and Shimmon announced a deal Tuesday in which they would share ownership of the colt. But on Thursday, Shimmon told the prince that the deal was off. "There's nothing wrong with the horse, I want to emphasize that," said Bob Hess Jr., who is Shimmon's principal trainer. "He X-rayed beyond my expectations and vetted out with flying colors. But the parties couldn't get together on business terms. There was a difference in opinion regarding what the goals should be. (Who trained the horse) might have been part of it." In making the deal Tuesday, shortly after Shimmon had bought a Saint Ballado-What a Reality colt for \$2-million at the Barretts March Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Pomona, Calif., Salman had expected **Anees** to remain in the training care of his conditioner, Alex Hassinger Jr. "When **Anees** passed all the vet checks with flying colors, we assumed the deal would go ahead," said Richard Mulhall, who manages the Saudi Arabian prince's racing operation. "It came as a complete surprise when (Shimmon) notified the prince that he had changed his mind. **Anees** will continue to be pointed to the Kentucky Derby (with Hassinger)."

BLANKET FINISH IN THE BONNIE MISS

Cash Run (Seeking the Gold) quickly made the lead at the start of yesterday's GII Bonnie Miss S., then staved off the persistent **Deed I Do** (Alydeed) and late-charging **Bejoyfulandrejoyce** (Dynaformer) to remain unbeaten in three starts over the Gulfstream strip. A front-running winner of the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, the Lukas trainee returned to the winner's circle with a seven-length romp in the GII Davona Dale Feb. 20 and was hammered down to 2-5 in this short field of six. Clearing the field from her outside post, **Cash Run** clipped off snappy fractions as **Deed I Do** gave chase through three-quarters in 1:10 3/5, but was able to hold on down the lane. "I knew I was going fast, but I couldn't slow her down a whole lot," commented winning jockey Jerry Bailey. "It's better just to let her go rather than fight her when she gets like that." **Deed I Do** ran gamely in her first start at two turns, while **Bejoyfulandrejoyce's** late run carried her five wide on the turn. The winner will head to the Blue Grass state for her next start. "She [**Cash Run**] did her job today and tomorrow she flies out to Kentucky...her next race is likely to be in the (GI Apr. 8) Ashland at Keeneland. Then, if everything goes as planned, she'll run in the (May 5) Oaks at Churchill," said D. Wayne Lukas assistant trainer Barry Knight.

GULFSTREAM CONCLUDES WITH RECORD

HANDLE Gulfstream Park concluded its 63-day meeting yesterday with a Florida record total handle of \$714,686,297. On Mar. 11--Florida Derby Day--Gulfstream set a state record with a total handle of \$27,844,882, while the Florida Derby alone set a state record for a single race of \$5,026,048. Previously, Gulfstream set a North American single day record handle of \$100,336,230 when it hosted the Breeders' Cup Nov. 6. "I am extremely pleased with the public's response to Gulfstream's 2000 meeting," said Douglas Donn, Gulfstream Park chairman. "The record total handle underscores Gulfstream's status among the nation's leading tracks. On-track attendance and handle statistics compare favorably with last season, an accomplishment in an era when many tracks are reflecting downward trends."

SWINBURN IN WOLVERHAMPTON RETURN

Jockey Walter Swinburn returned to the saddle at Wolverhampton yesterday, but beat only one home aboard Diamond Flame (GB), finishing eighth in the closing handicap. The Irish-born rider was in contention until halfway, when his horse came under pressure, and then faded in the straight. If not providing the fairytale comeback, Swinburn was made to work and it will have sharpened him up for the start of the turf next week. "I have had a good blow, that was what it was meant for, and it is nice to get the first one out of the way," Swinburn told *Racing Post*. "Everything is working and I have just got to get race fit now." The winner of three Epsom Derbies and two Irish Derbies, Swinburn, 38, had not ridden a race since August of 1998 because of problems with his weight, but told *Racing Post*, "It was always the intention to come back. I have been riding out for about half-a-dozen trainers and it has taken time, but I am where I am, I have got there quietly and I will come on for the run."

HERE COMES TROUBLE AT CHELTENHAM

Looks Like Trouble (Ire) (Zaffaran {USA}), ridden by Richard Johnson, came flying up the hill to take yesterday's G1 Cheltenham Gold Cup by five lengths, giving trainer Noel Chance his second victory in the race in four years. The 9-2 shot had looked out of sorts earlier in the season when being pulled up in the G1 King George VI Chase in December, but here he readily reversed that form, outfinishing **Florida Pearl (Ire)** (Florida Son {GB}), who again was placed in the Gold Cup that has so far denied him. "He jumped the last brilliantly and his jumping won him the race at the last two," winning jockey Johnson told *Racing Post*. "He was always travelling well. Halfway up the straight he wasn't doing much...he was enjoying it as much as I was. He jumped the last very well and quick, and I just kept him going to the line." Added Chance, "He's a good horse and he proved it today." As for what's next, the trainer told *Racing Post*, "We'll play it by ear...where he goes next, he'll tell us that. He didn't have as hard a race today as he had in the Royal & SunAlliance last year, so that might just get him to Liverpool [for the Martell Cup]."

OCTAGONAL COLT TOPS PREMIER SALE

OPENER Crown Lodge trainer John Hawkes, who trained 10-time Group 1 winner Octagonal (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}), last night gave top price of A\$180,000 for a grey colt by that champion from the Vice Regal (NZ) mare Lady Eliza (NZ) at the first session of the Inglis Premier Yearling Sale in Melbourne. Lady Eliza is a half-sister to stakes winner and Group 1-placed The Cloisters (Aus), who is herself the dam of the promising three-year-old Vestry (Aus) (Marscaj {Aus}), a runner in Saturday's G2 Surround S. at Warwick Farm. A total of 146 lots grossed A\$6,549,500 for a first-session average of A\$44,680, which represents a 27-percent increase on last year. Victorian buyers dominated the sale, with Rick Hore-Lacy, who trained Redoute's Choice (Aus), buying an Unbridled's Song (USA) colt and a Thunder Gulch (USA) colt for A\$130,000 apiece. The second top priced lot, a Royal Academy (USA) filly, is a half-sister to G1 Blue Diamond S. runner-up Ponton Flyer (Aus) (Flying Spur {Aus}). The second and final session of the Premier Sale will be held today.

UNIRE APPOINTS NEW PRESIDENT

The Italian racing authority, UNIRE, have at last announced their new president. Guido Melzi d'Eril becomes the 11th president of the organization, taking the post after a year as temporary president. The Italian government nominated Melzi d'Eril Tuesday afternoon after one month's political discussion, and his appointment was given the seal of approval by Italy's Minister of Agriculture and Finances. The appointment was endorsed by almost all sections of the racing and trotting industries, who went on strike recently when his initial nomination was not officially ratified. Melzi d'Eril, a former amateur trotting driver and former manager at the Rome and Turin racetracks, was relieved to be at last given his new role. "I can now start work on the many things that urgently need to be done within the Italian racing and trotting industries," he said.

WORRY OVER MILAN TRACK CONDITION

There are no foreseeable problems for the first meeting of the season at Rome, which is due to stage the Listed Premio Signorino this weekend, but it is a different story as far as racing at Milan is concerned. The condition of the track is a source of worry to racecourse officials, as it has been rainless in northern Italy for the past four months and the course does not look in the best of health. The Milanese management decided some weeks ago to install an automatic watering system at the course, but the work is not yet complete. A delegation of trainers and jockeys inspected the course earlier this week, but decided to reserve final judgement until making a further inspection on Sunday, when it is hoped racing will be given the green light to go ahead.

MORNING PRIDE SIDELINED

Godolphin's **Morning Pride (Ire)** (Machiavellian {USA}), three-for-four as a two-year-old, will miss the May 7 G1 1000 Guineas due to a pastern injury. "Unfortunately, she will not be ready in time for the Guineas and will be prepared instead for a summer campaign," Godolphin Racing Manager Simon Crisford said.
