SONNY HINE PASSES AWAY

Trainer Hubert "Sonny" Hine, who was born in the Bronx, rode match races as a teenager, attended Yale University, served in the Air Force, worked for the State Department in Hong Kong and went on to train 1998 Horse of the Year Skip Away, passed away early yesterday morning in Florida after a long illness. He was 69. Jockey Jerry Bailey, who rode Skip Away during his Horse of the Year season, told the Thoroughbred Times vesterday, "I'm sad. We were friends for a long time. You know, I was reflecting a little this morning, and not only was the game better for Sonny being in it, but I thought the world was a little better place." The son of a clothing merchant who also trained horses on the Maryland/West Virginia circuit, Hine headed to Charles Town after graduating high school and trained his first winner that same year. He put his training career on hold to go to work as a fingerprint specialist for the FBI, then went on to college, attending Yale for a year before enlisting in the Air Force. After his stint in uniform, he was in the pre-veterinary program at Penn State when the State Department, looking for people who spoke Chinese, hired him as a special investigator and sent him to Hong Kong. When he returned from the Far East, Hine returned to the racetrack, becoming a fulltime trainer in 1957. He developed the 1981 champion sprinter Guilty Conscience as well as stakes winners such as Amber Pass, Cojak, Dawn Quixote, Skip Trial and Technology, but his greatest success came in the twilight of his career with the great Skip Away. A birthday present for his wife, Carolyn, the \$22,500 purchase once put together a nine-race winning streak, accounting for seven Grade I races over that span. The champion three-year-old of 1996, he was also the Eclipse Award winner as top older horse in '97 and again during his Horse of the Year campaign in '98, retiring with earnings of more than \$9.6 million, second only to Cigar. Trainer Bob Durso, who sent his stakes winner Frisk Me Now out against Skip Away in the '98 Donn, was friends with Hine for more than 35 years. "Sonny was the same through the Skip Trial and Skip Away years as he was when I first met him," Durso said. "He never changed. He always had his sense of humor." A graveside service will be held Sunday at 2:30 p.m. at Nebo-Kendall Memorial Garden, 5900 SW 77th Ave., Miami, Florida. For directions, call 800-758-1151.

DARK HORSE IN SAN LUIS REY

Dark Moondancer (GB) (Anshan {GB}) put in his claim as Southern California's top long-distance grass runner with an authoritative score in the GII San Luis Obispo H. over this course Feb. 21, and he will try to add to his credentials in today's GII San Luis Rev S. at Santa Anita. The five-year-old has trained smartly since that effort. Ninth in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf in his stateside debut, the bay missed by just a head to Public Purse in the 10-furlong GII San Marcos H. Jan. 22, and is the 4-5 favorite on the morning line. Foggy Day (Fr) (Pistolet Blue {Ire}), co-third choice at 4-1, is riding a three-race streak against lesser foes, including a game neck score in the Turf Paradise Breeders' Cup H. Feb. 5. Claimed for \$100,000 last October, he is undefeated for his new connections. "My horse has never beaten horses like Dark Moondancer or Single Empire (Ire) (Kris (GB)), but he's better now than he was before his last race, and that day he was better than in December," trainer Jose Silva said. "This horse can come from off the pace if he needs to now. We're ready." Last year's winner Single Empire has been entered to defend his title, but hasn't visited the winner's circle since capturing the GI San Juan Capistrano last April. Third in the GI Hollywood Turf Cup in December, the chestnut was seventh in the San Marcos H. last time out. "His training has been held up by the rain," trainer Neil Drysdale said. "He's a little short, but we need to run in this race if we're going to think about running in the San Juan."

ROUGH START FOR HIALEAH 2000 The state of Florida hit Hialeah with the bad news on the first day of their 2000 season. Opening day at Hialeah--the real Hialeah, not the meet being held at Gulfstream Park-was a bust. Nearly 300 patrons showed up at the Grand Dame for simulcasting of the racing from Gulfstream, but couldn't place a bet after Autotote was warned that it was against a state statute to send the signal from Gulfstream back to Hialeah. "Failure to be in compliance with the above mentioned statute may result in administrative action being taken by the Division," wrote Paul Kirsch, director of the Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering. The state also has told Hialeah that it will have to pay a tax rate of 4.4 percent on every dollar wagered, as opposed to the 0.2 percent it paid last year. The penalty was imposed because a law, instituted a couple of years ago to protect Hialeah by preventing Gulfstream from running outside of their dates, was used against them. Citing that law, the state also has penalized Gulfstream a double tax for its 2000 season, but a clause in the contract which allows Hialeah to use the Hallandale Beach track for its current meet calls for Hialeah to pay the Gulfstream penalty. The total tax and penalty to Hialeah would be in excess of \$3.5 million. In addition, the Florida Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association is still without a contract with the track. The organization came to an agreement with Hialeah on a contract calling for \$130,000 a day in purses, excluding stakes, but FHBPA President Scott Savin said they are still waiting for Hialeah owner John Brunetti to sign it. The only good news yesterday was that the state has agreed to allow a day of turf races each week back at Hialeah. Gulfstream President David Romanik said he expects to talk with Brunetti about the turf schedule soon, but if the plan is approved, it will take two weeks to set it in motion.

The Gulfstream Park meet which ended Thursday with a record handle saw a total of 653,490 fans come through the gates, down 3.88 percent from 1999. Jockey Jorge Chavez took the riding title for the second straight year with 77 wins, while Bill Mott led the trainers for the fifth time in six seasons with 30 victories, five more than Frank Passero Jr.

IRISH STRONG IN DERBY ENTRIES The

resurgence in the class of Irish-trained horses was evident again yesterday as entries at March 7's first forfeit stage were announced for the G1 Epsom Derby in June, revealing a total entry of 171 horses. Although Godolphin holds the highest number of entries with 22, they appear to lack the firmness of the Irish, and in particular, the Ballydoyle challenge, of which there are 20. In fact, of the 11 entries who have recorded a Group success already, 8 are Irish-trained, with 7 representing Aidan O'Brien. Those are Aristotle (Ire) (Sadler's Wells {USA}), Ciro (USA) (Woodman {USA}), Giant's Causeway (USA) (Storm Cat {USA}), Lermontov (USA) (Alleged {USA}), Monashee Mountain (USA) (Danzig {USA}), Mull Of Kintyre (USA) (Danzig {USA}) and Royal Kingdom (Ire) (Fairy King {USA}). Alongside them sits the Aga Khan's Sinndar (Ire) (Grand Lodge {USA}), trained by John Oxx, who claimed the G1 Aga Khan Studs National S. at the Curragh. The Godolphin entries are unexposed, dark types, with only 6 of them having run, and of those only 4 have won a race. However, Best Of The Bests (Ire) (Machiavellian {USA}) heads the list, along with Inchlonaig (GB) (Nashwan {USA}, while Dubai Two Thousand (GB) (Nashwan {USA}) is also amongst them, and he will be under the spotlight in his preparation, such is his reputation. Pascal Bary's Ocean Of Wisdom (USA) (Mr Prospector {USA}) ploughs a lone path as a French Group-winning entry, one of only eleven from his country to be left in. Of those, Andre Fabre, who criticised the race last year, has just two colts. Sir Michael Stoute and Henry Cecil hold Newmarket's biggest hand, with 14 and 10 entries respectively, amongst them notably Cecil's Beat Hollow (GB) (Sadler's Wells {USA}) and Stoute's King's Best (USA) (Kingmambo {USA}). John Gosden, newly moved to Robert Sangster's Manton yard, has left in ten horses. Most startlingly, over 100 of the entries are maidens, and most of those are unraced. Distant Music (USA) (Distant View {USA}), rated only behind the retired Fasliyev (USA) (Nureyev {USA}) in the two-yearold classifications last year, has not been entered as yet, and would need to be supplemented at the second stage on April 12.

"We are not entirely satisfied that this matter was completed within the rules of racing. There will be further analysis of the rules," Whittenbury told the Age. The issue is believed to revolve around the ruling of when the late payment of \$50,000 was paid for Road To Success to be included into the Blue Diamond field. Connections of Road To Success received \$629,500 for winning the Blue Diamond while Ponton Flyer earned \$190,000 for her second placing. Ponton Flyer is the 7-2 second favorite for today's G1 VRC Sires' Produce S.
