On the board in her first three starts, Maltese Superb came through with her maiden win in her most recent appearance Dec. 12 and was making her stakes debut off the three-month layoff. The filly chased Olive Crown to the far turn, then swept past to win going away. "She rated kindly," jockey Yoshitomi Shibata said. "And, although she won at five furlongs last time, the nine furlongs was more suitable for her." Favored Gaily Funky, away from the gate slowly, closed well in the stretch, but had to settle for third.

WHAT'S DOING DOWN UNDER



Vinery principle Dr. Tom Simon has announced the consolidation of Vinery Australia, with a 100-percent takeover of Roselands in Victoria. Simon, an Austria-based barrister, is set to play a more active role in its Australian affairs.

In his first ever Australian interview, Simon told Thoroughbred Daily News he has applied for Australian residency and citizenship and hopes to base himself in Victoria.

Simon first invested in Australian bloodstock with Lynden Burns, who worked in advertising in Adelaide, and the pair struck gold early when A\$25,000 yearling purchase Kenvain (Aus) (Kenmare {Fr}) won the G1 Oakleigh Plate and earned champion three-year-old honours before going to stud.

Five years ago, Simon purchased a property about 130 kilometres from Melbourne and Roselands was created. The property was transformed into a lavish private farm with a broodmare band comprised of Australia's most sought-after mares.

"I researched Europe and the U.S. before investing here and I made the right decision. The industry here is very healthy, you get the best return on your investment and Europe is dominated by two players--Coolmore and the Maktoums," he said.

"There are a wide range of people involved in Australia and the Asian market is very promising. You can buy horses with international pedigrees for reasonable prices here. And I believe the U.S. market will become more and more interested. Our Danehill--Miss Bold Appeal colt is a good example. Probably this year, if not next year, you will see a group of U.S. investors come via Vinery to buy in Australia and syndicate horses, taking them to the U.S. if they are good. It is starting already."

Simon conceded restructuring his global bloodstock operation was "a little bit stressful." He added that it is likely the Roselands name will be dropped and all of Simon's bloodstock interests will operate under the Vinery banner.

"I will have four top guys--two in the U.S. and two in Australia--in a joint management team. I want to be here, but I don't want to be on the front page," he said.

The historic property with its convict-built sandstone buildings, founded as Segenhoe Stud in 1816, has endured a turbulent period with high staff turnover at every level, and Simon says regaining trust and proving stability are among immediate goals. Sold by Michael Sissian in April 1998--along with half its breeding stock and its entire 1997 foal crop--to George Hofmeister, the coveted Hunter Valley farm initially operated as Stone Lodge. Then Hofmeister bought into Vinery and the stud became Vinery Australia. The property underwent its fourth ownership change when Roselands purchased Vinery's 245 Kentucky acres (Vinery has since relocated from Midway to Northridge Farm in Lexington) as well as its Australian holdings last September.

Roselands also purchased interests in dual hemisphere sires Red Ransom, Gilded Time, Langfuhr and Sandpit (Brz). This season, Woodman horse Way Of Light, Summer Squall's brother Saithor and Octagonal (NZ)'s unraced NZ\$1.6 million brother Columbia (NZ) will stand at Vinery Victoria, while Red Ransom and Hofmeister's horse Real Quiet will head up a roster of eight at Vinery NSW. Australian sires Naturalism (NZ) and Citidancer (Ire) will be relocated.

"Maybe we will have one more shuttle stallion, but I can't discuss it at the moment," Simon added.

Vinery's to-die-for broodmare band comprises Golden Slipper winner Bint Marscay (Aus), a A\$500,000 purchase whose filly Mannington (Aus) races in Roselands' colours. Mahaya (Aus), Lady Jakeo (Aus) and four-time Group 1 winner Tracy's Element (Aus) were purchased for A\$1.9 million collectively. The stud has Miss Pennymoney (Aus) and Merlene (Aus)'s stakes-winning sister Compulsion (Aus), who is in foal to Torrential. And Roselands is home to Group 1 winner Zacheline (NZ), \$700,000 purchase Euphoria (Aus), Rose Of Danehill (Aus), Klokka (Aus) and Beachside (NZ). Roselands gave just A\$300,000 for the U.S. mare Miss Bold Appeal in foal to Nureyev at a Sydney sale before her filly Jersey Girl captured three Grade I wins, then sold her back to North America to Richard Santulli in a deal valuing the mare at A\$2.6 million, retaining her Danehill colt.

Simon knows rebuilding trust is vital to Vinery's Southern Hemisphere future and says it is a priority. Several of his yearlings, including a Woodman--Bint Marscay colt, will be offered at the Easter Sale.

"I will put a reserve on them, but I don't want to keep or race colts," he said. "I want to build a reputation as an honest seller."

As for Burns, who is known for his outspoken opinions, he said in a statement that he may return to Adelaide to build his own business.

Last year, Arthur Hancock's Stone Farm supplied the winner of one of the main trials for the GI Kentucky Derby when Menifee took the GI Blue Grass S., and now he has done it again with Fusaichi Pegasus, the GII San Felipe S. winner which Hancock bred in partnership with Robert and Janice McNair.

Fusaichi Pegusus has already established himself another treasure from the rich seam mined by the Hancock family ever since his sire, Mr. Prospector, moved to Claiborne 20 years ago. It has been a case of "like father, like son," as Mr. Prospector topped the 1971 Keeneland Summer Sale at \$220,000, some 27 years before Fusaichi Pegasus helped revitalise this sale with his sale-topping price of \$4,000,000.

While it mustn't be forgotten that the 3/4-length winner was receiving six pounds from runner-up The Deputy (Ire), I can't resist wondering what Fusaichi Pegasus will be worth if he improves enough to provide Mr. Prospector with his first win in the Kentucky Derby. Several other July sales toppers, such as Nureyev, A.P. Indy and Royal Academy, have become very valuable stallion prospects after scoring at the top level.

Fusaichi Pegasus' dam, Angel Fever, received a weight of 106 on the '92 Experimental Free Handicap when she followed up her winning debut with a second in the 5 1/2-furlong Colleen S. As she never raced again, Angel Fever possibly inherited some of the fragility which restricted her sire Danzig to three starts, but her brother Pine Bluff was more durable, managing 13 starts in the space of just under 12 months.

To his credit, Pine Bluff was tough enough to tackle all three legs of the Triple Crown. After finishing fifth behind Lil E. Tee (a colt he had beaten into second place in the GII Arkansas Derby) in the Kentucky Derby, Pine Bluff bounced back to take the GI Preakness, in which he finished strongly to catch Alydeed. He also led with a furlong to run when he finished a length third to A.P. Indy in the GI Belmont S., running well enough to suggest that he stayed 1 1/2 miles.

Pine Bluff probably has his broodmare sire Halo to thank for the stamina which came to his aid in the Triple Crown events. Fusaichi Pegasus' second dam, Rowdy Angel, was also responsible for Demons Begone, who started favorite for the 1987 Kentucky Derby only to bleed badly.

Fusaichi Pegasus' third dam, Ramhyde, was a sixfurlong stakes winner by Rambunctious, a fast performer who raced only as a juvenile. Interestingly, Rambunctious appears in conjunction with Mr. Prospector in the pedigree of the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint winner Gulch (sire of the 1995 Kentucky Derby hero Thunder Gulch). Although very fast, Gulch won the GI Wood Memorial and wasn't disgraced in finishing sixth in the Kentucky Derby, fourth in the Preakness and third in the Belmont.

Fusao Sekiguchi's colt is no doubt already guaranteed a place at stud whatever his fate at Churchill Downs, and breeders will appreciate the fact that his fourth dam, Castle Hyde, was a half-sister to Shenanigans. In addition to being the dam of Ruffian, Icecapade and Buckfinder, Shenanigans ranks as the second dam of Private Terms and Blue Ensign and as the third dam of Coronado's Quest (a grandson of Mr. Prospector).

The question now--apart from whether he is good enough--is whether Fusaichi Pegasus will be suited by the extra 330 yards of the Kentucky Derby. There has to be some doubt, even though Mr. Prospector sired winners of the Preakness S. (Tank's Prospect) and Belmont S. (Conquistador Cielo), plus several Grade I winners over 1 1/4 miles, such as Forty Niner, Rhythm, It's In The Air, Seeking The Gold, Miner's Mark and Jade Hunter. His next appearance, which is likely to be over nine furlongs, should tell us more.

PIMLICO GETS OK TO RACE Pimlico Race Course will be able to open for business Mar. 29, the Blood-Horse reports. The track had been cited for several violations by the Baltimore Department of Housing & Community Development, including a lack of sprinklers and fire alarms, but Maryland Jockey Club officials have drafted a plan to make the changes necessary to comply with fire-safety codes. As long as the plan is put into action, the BDHCD has given Pimlico the go-ahead to hold its upcoming meet, and to proceed with plans for improvements such as new barns and skyboxes at the Maryland oval. "Of the 10 violations, eight are met or are being met as we speak," MJC Executive Vice President Bob DiPietro told Blood-Horse. "And the other two issues we will continue to work on. Everything is going along fine. By Preakness Day, we will be in good shape." Added Zack Germroth, a spokesman for the housing department, "They are making significant progress." Pimlico will host the second leg of the Triple Crown, the GI Preakness S., on May. 20.

OBS SALE STARTS TODAY The 2000 Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's Selected Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale, which last year produced gradedstakes winners Summer Note (Notebook), B L's Appeal (Valid Appeal) and Wolf Alert (Wolf Power {SAf}), gets underway this morning in Ocala, Florida. A half sister to B L's Appeal, winner of this year's GIII Spectacular Bid S. at Gulfstream Park, sells as Hip #13. The daughter of Diablo, named Diablo's Girl, is consigned by Mark Casse, agent. A total of 472 juveniles by such top sires as Belong to Me, Carson City, Cherokee Run, Dehere, End Sweep, Gilded Time, Gulch, Kingmambo, Meadowlake, Mt. Livermore, Phone Trick, Pine Bluff, Seeking the Gold, Southern Halo, Summer Squall, Thunder Gulch, Unbridled and Woodman have been catalogued. There are also representatives of promising freshmen stallions like Forest Wildcat, Hennessy, Honour and Glory, Pioneering, Roar, Signal Tap and Unbridled's Song, A filly by second-year sire You and I, selling as Hip #431, set a track record at the Ocala training track during Sunday's preview, going a quarter mile in :20 4/5. Bidding for the two-day sale begins at 11 a.m.

CIGAR TO APPEAR AT TURFWAY Two-time Horse of the Year Cigar (Palace Music), who retired after becoming the leading American money winner of all time, will make an appearance at Turfway Park Saturday afternoon. The hero of the 1995 GI Breeders' Cup Classic and the inaugural G1 Dubai World Cup in '96, the Allen Paulson colorbearer put together a 16-race winning streak from October 1994 to August 1996. Overall, he won 19 of his 33 starts and bankrolled \$9,999,815. The 10-year-old stallion was prevented from taking up a stud career by fertility problems and now resides at the Kentucky Horse Park in Lexington. He will be paraded prior to Saturday's Bourbonette S. at approximately 3:15 p.m.

Florida Horsemen Ink Contract with Hialeah:

The Florida Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association and Hialeah signed a contract Saturday which guarantees the horsemen \$130,000 a day in purses. The purse figure is good through the first 29 days of the meeting; at that point they will look at the daily handle and adjust the figure up or down. While the contract may not have been valid during the first two days of the meeting, through the first four days of Hialeah-at-Gulfstream, the purses have averaged just \$102,000 a day, creating a daily shortfall of \$28,000. By contract, the track has to make up the difference at the beginning of the second week of the meeting.

Arrested Dreams Retired:

Arrested Dreams (Dehere--Moment To Buy, by Timeless Moment), a four-time stakes winner who finished second by a nose in the 1998 GI Matron S., has been retired. The four-year-old filly was sidelined for 7 1/2 months last year after having surgery to remove chips from both knees. She won three of five starts after returning last August and had started just once this season, finishing third in a Fair Grounds allowance Jan. 27. She goes to the breeding shed with eight wins from 12 starts and earnings of \$319,969.

Yagli Back in Explosive Bid?

Yagli (Jade Hunter), who was the top turf horse during the first half of the '99 season after taking three straight Grade I wins, but ended the campaign with four consecutive off-the-board finishes, may make his 2000 debut in Sunday's GIII Explosive Bid H. at Fair Grounds. The seven-year-old, a winner of more than \$1.6 million, has not been out since running fifth in the Dec. 4 GI Hollywood Turf Cup. He has been assigned co-high weight of 121 pounds for the 1 1/8-mile test.

MAGIC MILLION PERTH YEARLING WRAP-UP

Singapore buyers were prominent at last week's four-day Magic Millions Perth Yearling Sale at which 362 yearlings from a catalogue of 530 were sold for an average A\$17,479 and aggregate A\$6,327,500. A total of 213 from 310 catalogued sold for a gross of A\$4,889,500 at an average of A\$22,955 at the first session with the theme of a fairly high pass in rate of 15 percent continuing through the sale. First session top price was A\$125,000 for a Bletchley Park (Ire)--Sovereign Lady (Aus) colt purchased by J Money of WA. At the second session, the average fell to A\$9,651 for 149 sold from 220 catalogued, with a gross of A\$1,438,000 and top price of A\$36,000 for a colt by Don't Say Halo (USA) from Zaadini (Aus) purchased by David Harrison of WA. Buyers including WA businessman Keith Biggs, who raced Melbourne Cup winner Doriemus and Melbourne Triple Crown winner Dignity Dancer, and leading Singapore trainer Malcolm Thwaites were active. Queensland-based Prophet Lodge gave top price of A\$24,000 for a colt by Skilful Star from Regent Rose (NZ) at Sunday's one-day Magic Millions Tamworth Yearling Sale in central NSW. A total of 114 lots were sold for a gross of A\$716,500 and average of A\$6,285.

National Yearling Sales Results:

On the second day of the South African National Yearling Sales at Gosforth Park, Germiston, Johannesburg, the spotlight shone brightly on the Sadler's Wells stallion Fort Wood (Ire), sire of last season's sensational three-year-old Horse Chestnut (SAf), now retired to Claiborne Farm in Kentucky. Bloodstock agent John Freeman, Jr. paid R. 400,000 for Wilgerbosdrift Stud's Fort Wood colt Killarney, who is out of the multiple-winning mare Kenmare Belle (Aus) (Kenmare {Fr}), while prominent owner Mary Liley paid the same sum for Joshua Tree, another colt by the champion sire. Another member of the Wilgerbosdrift draft, Joshua Tree is out of the winning mare Langoustine (SAf) (Northern Guest {USA}). Fort Wood was also responsible for the third highest-priced lot on the day, Starston Stud's colt Babylon, who sold for R. 390,000. The bay colt is out of the South African Group 3-winning mare Lady Lexington (SAf), a daughter of the Seattle Slew (USA) stallion Kentucky Slew (USA). After the second day of the three-day sale, 265 yearlings had grossed R. 23,956,000 for an average of R. 90,400, up almost seven percent on last year.

On the third day of the sale, English agent Paul Arnold, acting for Global Thoroughbred Racing, topped the previous highest price at this year's sale of R. 400,000 when paying R. 430,000 to secure the Fort Wood (Ire) filly Fort'Over (SAf), another member of the Wilgerbosdrift Stud draft. The bay filly is out of the six-time winner Over Flame (SAf) (Averof {GB}).
