Trainer Ken McPeek sent his two Spiral hopefuls out to work yesterday at Churchill Downs. Nature (Valiant Nature) worked five furlongs in 1:00 1/5. Deputy Warlock (Silver Deputy) went the same distance in :59. "They were two good, solid moves," said McPeek.

Archer City Slew (Slew City Slew) worked a half mile Tuesday in :47 1/5 and galloped out five furlongs in 1:00 2/5 at Turfway Park. "He took to the track well, and that's the most important thing," trainer Vladimir Cerin said of the GII San Vicente S. winner

Gateman (GB) (Owington {GB}) worked five furlongs in 1:01 1/5 at Churchill yesterday.

High Yield Works:

High Yield (Storm Cat), second in the GI Florida Derby, breezed four furlongs in :48 3/5 yesterday at Churchill Downs. The D. Wayne Lukas trainee is expected to start next in the Apr. 15 GI Toyota Blue Grass S. at Keeneland. Stablemate Exchange Rate (Danzig), winner of the Risen Star S. at Fair Grounds, went five furlongs in 1:02 3/5. He is expected to start next in the Apr. 15 GII Wood Memorial.

NOTE: The American Graded Stakes Committe has reinstated the Grade III status of Saturday's Everglades S. at Gulfstream Park. The race initially lost its grade when it was taken off the turf.

Japanese three-year-old champion of 1999, T.M. Opera O was runner-up in the G2 Stayers S. Dec. 4 and third in the G1 Arima Kinen Dec. 26 before getting a rest. The chestnut resurfaced to win the G2 Kyoto Kinen in his seasonal debut Feb. 20 and was the slight favorite for this event. Settled in fourth in the early stages of this marathon event, some 10 lengths off the front runners, T.M. Opera O advanced into contention on the final turn, overtook the eventual runners-up at the eighth pole and drew clear. Winning jockey Ryuji Wada commented, "He had plenty of energy left in him at the final turn. He is now getting more mellow mentally and physically." The winner goes next in the G1 Tenno Sho Spring at Kyoto Apr. 30.

Daitaku Riva punched his ticket to the Japanese 2000 Guineas Apr. 16 with a hard-fought victory over pacesetting Purple Ebisu. The winner of the G3 Shinzan Kinen in his last racetrack appearance Jan. 9, the chest-nut colt was settled in the middle of the pack as Purple Ebisu set leisurely fractions. Turning for home, jockey Ryo Takahashi sent the race favorite wide into the stretch, ran down his nemesis inside the final eighth and inched away to the victory. "I intended to ask him a bit early as the pacesetter was running on his own pace. He was struggling to catch (the leader), but with more training, he'll be all right," said the winning rider.

Sunday was a day of Unbridled success. Claiborne Farm stallion Unbridled collected two potentially significant Derby trials when his sons Red Bullet and Wheelaway (c, 3, Unbridled--Cuidado, by Damascus) took the GIII Gotham S. and Tampa Bay Derby. In addition, another son Anees (c, 3, Unbridled--Ivory Idol, by Alydar) showed he was still in the Derby picture when finishing third to Fusaichi Pegasus in the GII San Felipe S., his first start since his victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile last November.

Both Red Bullet and Anees--members of Unbridled's fifth crop--are definitely on the Derby trail, and it is worth noting that Churchill Downs has proved a happy hunting ground for Unbridled. Not only did he win the 1990 GI Kentucky Derby by 3 1/2 lengths, but he is also the sire of Grindstone, winner of the 1996 running of the Derby (a race in which another son of Unbridled, Unbridled's Song, was favored). In addition to Grindstone and Unbridled's Song, members of his first crop, Unbridled also sired the outstanding fillies Banshee Breeze and Manistique in his third crop. Unbridled's second crop produced GIII Ladies H. winner Unbridled Hope, but in all, only five graded stakes winners have appeared from Unbridled's first four crops of 176 foals (although Red Chili Pepper recently won the graded Laurel Race Club Sho Nakayama Himba S. Japan).

This rather "all or nothing" record is almost certainly the result of Unbridled being a very unusual horse in terms of both physique and pedigree. He is a horse of considerable size, measuring nearly 17 hands and is not perfect in front. His pedigree features inbreeding to the Tartan Farm strains of Rough 'n Tumble and Aspidistra (sire and dam of Dr. Fager), but also has a "wedge" of outcross blood in the center through the French Derby winner *Le Fabuleux. In part, his recent upsurge in success might in part reflect that trainers and breeders getting a better idea of how the Unbridled's need to be handled (patiently) and what sort of mares suit him.

Pedigree Perspectives cont.

Oddly enough, Unbridled has actually crossed successfully with mares by stallions both big (Caro, Nijinsky II, Drone) and small (Nureyev, Known Fact) suggesting that proportion rather than size may be the key from a physical standpoint. From a pedigree aspect we can note that he has succeeded with reinforcements of the Tartan Farm strains (in his stakes winners Banshee Breeze, Unbridled Hope, Scenic Point, Famously Free, Tap Your Heels and Red Chili Pepper) or when crossed with mares which are far more of an outcross. One wouldn't want to ignore the potential influence of Le Fabuleux in his pedigree, as Unbridled has done well with strains which have an affinity for Le Fabuleux most notably Nureyev, the broodmare sire of Manistique.

Red Bullet falls into the outcross category. His dam Cargo is by Caro, which suggests that the mating (which took place in 1996) may have been inspired by the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile victory of Unbridled's Song (also out of a Caro mare) the previous fall. Cargo, who was twice graded-stakes placed, is out of Aerturas (Fr), a mare who was imported to North America and peaked as a five-year-old, winning the Spectacular Bid H. and taking two graded-stakes placings at that age. Aerturas' dam Amiel (Ire) was a full sister to the top-class English miler Noalcoholic (Fr), being by champion miler Nonoalco out of Alea (GB), champion two-year-old filly in Italy in 1969 and winner of the Italian 1000 Guineas the following season.

The success of Unbridled with mares by Caro may not be entirely coincidental. Caro was a horse who has combined successfully with Tartan Farm strains on more than one occasion. For example, Caro sired Grade I winner Dr. Carter and stakes winner My Dear Frances out of a half sister to In Reality (sire of Unbridled's second dam). Caro's son With Approval is the sire of graded stakes winner Zanetti out of a mare by Fappiano (sire of Unbridled) from Unbridled's immediate family. Another son of Caro, Cozzene, sired graded stakes winner Halissee out of a mare by Fappiano.

The main key to a Caro affinity with the Tartan strains of In Reality and Dr. Fager would seem to be the presence of Relic, broodmare sire of Caro's own sire Fortino (Fr). Relic is by War Relic (who is 3x3 in the pedigree in In Reality). Relic's dam has some strong pedigree connections to In Reality's family and to Dr. Fager's broodmare sire Better Self. We would certainly expect the Caro strain to continue to work well with Unbridled.

Incidentally, there is also a War Relic link in the pedigree of the other Unbridled weekend stakes winner, Wheelaway. He is out of a mare by Damascus, a horse whose sire Sword Dancer has a full sister to War Relic as his third dam. Note that there does seem to be a marked affinity between In Reality and Sword Dancer, the pair appearing within the first four generations of the better part of 50 stakes winners.

PEDIGREE SHORTS

We note a very well thought out pattern in the pedigree of Maltese Superb (f, 3, With Approval--Primedex, by Deputy Minister), winner of G3 Flower Cup in Japan. Her sire is a half brother to Touch Gold, one of the best runners sired by Maltese Superb's broodmare sire Deputy Minister. This gives inbreeding to Northern Dancer (sire of With Approval's granddam), something seen in four other With Approval stakes winners (two out of mares by Deputy Minister's sire Vice Regent). Maltese Superb also has a daughter of Northern Dancer's sire Nearctic as her fourth dam, and the three-parts related Tom Fool and Spring Run (through her son Red God) 4x5.

Winner of the G1 Lerena S. in Argentina over the weekend Mi Surena (Arg) (f, 3, Southern Halo--My Swinger, by Groovy) has an unusual pedigree. She is inbred to Northern Dancer through daughters--Northern Dancer appearing as the broodmare sire of both Southern Halo and Norcliffe (sire of Mi Surena's own broodmare sire Groovy). What is equally worth noting is that Mi Surena's dam is a great-granddaughter of Buckpasser. Buckpasser appears in at least eleven Grade 1 winners by Southern Halo, and is also in the pedigree of More Than Ready, a multiple graded stakes winner from Southern Halo's first Northern Hemisphere crop.

RECORD COLT TOPS OBS A colt from the first crop of graded stakes winner Forest Wildcat brought a sale's record final bid of \$600,000 to top yesterday's first session of the Ocala Breeders Sales Company March Sale of Selected Two-Year-Olds in Training in Ocala, Florida. The chestnut colt is out of the stakes-placed mare D'Enough (D'Accord) and was purchased by trainer Bob Hess on behalf of David Shimmon, Shimmon also purchased the sale's topper at last week's Barretts March Sale. Sold as hip number 72, the OBS juvenile was consigned by Hartley/De Renzo Thoroughbreds, agent. The \$600,000 price tag was the highest ever at an OBS sale. The sale average is up 13.3 percent over last year's first session and the median price is up 8.6 percent. The percentage of buybacks decreased from 35.4 percent a year ago to 32 percent this year. "It looks like we're rebounding nicely after a little dip in last year's sale," said OBS general manager Tom Ventura. "As always, records are nice and it looks like we're on pace to break all of our March Sale records with another strong day tomorrow." The sale's final session begins today at 11 a.m.

HIALEAH TURF RACES START NEXT WEEK

Starting March 31 and continuing, hopefully, through the end of its meeting May 22, Hialeah will hold one day of turf racing each week, at Hialeah. The Hialeah at Gulfstream meeting got permission from the state Tuesday to stage 10 races once a week using its turf course. Because of the wear and tear on the Gulfstream turf course over its 64-day meeting, it wasn't clear when the first turf race could be run under the Hialeah banner. Now that they have permission to run races at Hialeah. the concern over Gulfstream's turf course is negated. Gulfstream president David Romanik, who has been working with Hialeah, said, "We got written permission from the state today for turf racing at Hialeah. There are a couple of conditions. One, we have to give the signal on the dark day (Thursday) and the turf races to Miami and Dania Jai Alai, Flagler and Hollywood Greyhounds and Pompano Harness. The other is, Hialeah can't use its facility for patrons to bet from. We hope to start on March 31 (Friday), but it's contingent on Teleview getting its equipment in place." When contacted at its headquarters in Hialeah, Teleview's Dean Merten said he had "no comment," on the March 31 deadline. Teleview has to set up the timing equipment for both the main track and the turf course, install cameras for the stewards, patrol judges and simulcast outlets plus provide sending equipment for the signal to be relayed to a satellite for re-broadcasting. In the event the turf races are rained out, the races will be run on the main track. Trainer Tom Skiffington, who is stabled at Hialeah said, "If they run the turf races at Hialeah I'd stay to support it. I have enough turf horses to enter one in each of the 10 races." Ralph Nicks, assistant to Bill Mott, stabled at Gulfstream said, "We would run turf horses at Hialeah. We're planning on sending some to Keeneland, but the others could run there (Hialeah)."

MARTIN EARNS WIN 2,000 Jockey Eddie Martin, Jr. earned the 2,000th victory of his career Monday at Fair Grounds. "This is special," Martin said after reaching the plateau. "I hoped it would come here (New Orleans) because I am from here and I actually rode my 1,000th winner here." The 36-year-old jockey rode his first winner at Delta Downs in 1979. His mounts have earned more than \$23 million.

CATRAIL COLT TOPS DUNSTALL PARK SALE

Yesterday's Dunstall Park Breeze-Up Sales at Wolverhampton racecourse were the first of their kind to be timed in Europe and it was the fastest juvenile on show, a colt by Storm Cat (USA)'s son Catrail (USA), who topped the price list. Offered by jockey turned sales agent Jamie Railton for the Kingpin Bloodstock syndicate, the youngster recouped his Ir8.200gns foal price when Lingfield trainer Gay Kelleway finally got the better of a battle with Lincolnshire handler James Given at 30,000gns. "I don't have an owner but he's a lovely scopey horse who I should not have too much trouble selling on," said Kelleway of the colt who had returned home from Doncaster in October having made just 4,200gns. There was a similar story behind a son of first-crop stallion Tagula (Ire) (Taufan {USA}), offered from the Oaks Farm Stables of Mark Dwyer. This colt had come back after making Ir£7,000 at Goffs five months ago and was sent to Dwyer's Yorkshire base by Gervin Creaner in February. Connections were rewarded with a 24,000gns sale when the BBA's Joss Collins signed the buyer's ticket on behalf of Les Evre's stable near Thirsk. Kelleway was underbidder on this occasion. Doncaster's managing director Henry Beeby was pleased with the day's events and predicts a rosy future for the sales venue. He said, "This sale has got the most potential for growth of any in Europe because the facilities at Wolverhampton are outstanding. Sectional timing was an unqualified success and added a new dimension to European breeze-ups." This was also the first sale at which no indication was given as to whether a reserve had been reached through the absence of phrases such as "on the market", "selling" and "being sold"--and Beeby felt that his had been a successful decision. He continued, "We felt it worked very well today. It has been a universally popular move and simplifies the process of selling horses, benefitting both purchaser and vendor."

HARMONISATION BEGINS

The attempt to harmonise rules and procedures with other countries in Europe has begun, with the changing of two rules from the start of the turf Flat season tomorrow. Firstly, the availability of minimum penalties to local stewards will be reduced, meaning they can issue cautions and one-day bans, and this will help eradicate the possibility of the Jockey Club imposing harsher fines at the bottom end of the range. Also, any jockey banned for two days or less who has an engagement to ride in a Group 1 race abroad can appeal to Portman Square for the period to be altered. The second change follows in the wake of Ray Cochrane missing out on the Melbourne Cup last year due to a two-day ban. These changes derive from the seminar on European harmonisation held last year. Malcolm Wallace, the Jockey Club's director of regulation, said, "Racecourse stewards will now have complete flexibility to match the punishment to the crime, and we are probably the only turf authority that will permit the period of a two-day suspension to be changed to allow a jockey to ride in a foreign Group 1 race." Other significant changes include, from April 1, the loss of riding fee upon disqualification for intentional interference or reckless riding, and the setting of markers on the turf after the start to ensure jockeys ride to their draw.

ASCOT SALE SET FOR TODAY

Today's Ascot March Sale, run by auctioneers Russell Baldwin & Bright, will offer just under 50 lots, made up of both flat and jumping stock. Amongst the flat-bred stock is the five-year-old horse Rainstorm (GB) (Rainbow Quest {USA}), who has won or been placed on four occasions on all-weather tracks. When the five-year-old comes under the hammer, his price tag may well be influenced by the exploits of a rather talented younger half-sister in Halland Park Girl (Ire) (Primo Dominie {GB}). As Richard Hannon's filly took the Listed Intercell Communications Doncaster S. in October 1999, she was reaching the pinnacle of a steep climb from Nursery company to being the joint top-rated juvenile from these shores (rated 112 in the International Classifications at the end of the year). As well as that success, she had also taken the Tattersalls Breeders S. at The Curragh in August, and was runner-up in the Weatherbys Super Sprint at Newbury in July, achieving a level of consistency so lacking in most of the other two-year-old fillies around her. Speaking of her prospects this year, Hannon said, "She's not over big, but she has improved, and we're hopeful as she's done well. If all goes well, she'll go for one of the trials, probably the G3 Fred Darling S. or the Listed European Free Handicap."



DUBAI WORLD CUP--FOUR DAYS AND COUNTING

British pair Running Stag (USA) (Cozzene {USA}) and Lear Spear (USA) (Lear Fan {USA}) must be getting quite close by now, so much time have they spent together. Yesterday they worked together over 1400 metres, at first steadily, and then quickening up well, Running Stag covering the last 800 metres in 47.2 seconds, while Lear Spear did the same in 46.1 seconds. Richard Hannon's \$1,000,000 Dubai Golden Shaheen runner, Bold Edge (GB) (Beveled {USA}), impressed in his workout with fellow Sprinter Rudi's Pet (Ire) (Don't Forget Me {GB}). G3 Dubai Duty Free hope Golden Silca (GB) (Inchinor {GB}) and Late Night Out (GB) (Lahib {USA}), who goes for the Listed \$250,000 Godolphin Mile, arrived from Britain on Monday evening. Sole German G3 Dubai Sheema Classic entry Noel (Ger) (Acatenango {Ger}) also arrived yesterday.

BOMB ALASKA MAY SWITCH TO DONCASTER MILE

It was originally thought that Toby Balding's Bomb Alaska (GB) (Polar Falcon {USA}) would take his chance in the Lincoln H. at Doncaster Saturday, however, his trainer is now thinking of switching him to the Listed Doncaster Mile at the same meeting. Balding explained to The Racing Channel yesterday, "The trainer has got the panic on over the ground and probably equally as importantly, on the ground, running in the Lincoln he'd be giving everything in the race from nine pounds up to two stones (28 pounds). I'm much more inclined to run him on Thursday where he's entered in the Doncaster Mile. He has won on good to firm and he won the Newbury spring Cup on fast ground. But I think in the Lincoln they'll go flat out from start to finish." Bomb Alaska has already taken to Listed company well, having landed the Ben Marshall S. at Newmarket at the end of October last year.

GRAND NATIONAL SECOND FORFEIT STAGE

Recent trends have been reversed today as the second forfeit stage for the Martell Grand National Chase saw 64 horses left in, with 41 left in the handicap proper, compared to figures of 51 and 19 respectively last year. Top weight is Young Kenny (GB) (Ardross {Ire}), carrying 168 pounds, and his stable are hoping for wetter weather between now and 8 April, for both Young Kenny and Niki Dee (Ire) (Phardante (Fr)). Trainer Peter Beaumont said yesterday, "I wouldn't swap my horses. I hope there will be rain as Young Kenny likes it very soft and Niki Dee is fine if it is on the soft side of good. I am a bit worried about the weight he (Young Kenny) has in the Grand National, but he is a big strong horse and has carried it before." Also in the field is Suny Bay (Ire) (Roselier {Fr}), the game grey who finished runner-up in 1997 and 1998, and last year's winner Bobbyjo (Ire) (Bustineto {GB}), who is set to carry 160 pounds. Towards the lower end of the handicap at this stage are the Irish Micko's Dream (Ire) (Buckskin {Fr}) and Hollybank Buck (Ire) (Buckskin {Fr}), as well as Martin Pipe's young chasers Royal Predica (Fr) (Tip Moss (Fr)) and Cheltenham scorer Dark Stranger (Fr) (Iveday {Fr}).

The Curragh holds the first card of the Irish flat season Sunday, and among the possibles for the Listed Loughbrown S. are the Aidan O'Brien pair Monashee Mountain (USA) (Danzig {USA}), winner of the G3 Killavullen S., and Brahms (USA) (Danzig {USA}), runner-up to Distant Music (USA) (Distant View {USA}) in the G1 Dewhurst S. last year. Although on the face of it this appears to be a benefit race for Ballydoyle runners, last year's European sprinting champion Stravinsky (USA) (Nureyev {USA}) was beaten in the very soft ground in this very event twelve months ago. NEW RECORD AT SOUTH AFRICAN SALES

There was a sensational climax to the three-day South African National Yearling sales at Gosforth Park in Johannesburg, when Lot 549, one of the last yearlings to go through the ring, set a new sales record price of R. 675,000 when bought by trainer Louis Goosen on behalf of a new, but unnamed client. Almost inevitably, the new record holder, the filly Sepia, is a daughter of stallion sensation Fort Wood (Ire) (Sadler's Wells {USA}) and came up from Mary Slack's Wilgerbosdrift Stud. She is out of the four-time winner Water Colours (SAf), a daughter of Waterville Lake (Ire). After the three days, 459 yearlings had been sold for a gross of R. 41,955,000, compared to last year's figure of R. 39,132,000, when 461 were sold. The average of R. 91,405 was up 7.6 percent on last year's figure of R. 84,885. Fort Wood, winner of the 1993 G1 Grand Prix de Paris and G2 Prix Noailles when trained in France by Andre Fabre, was responsible for the top five lots at the sale and his 14 yearlings which sold grossed R. 4,235,000 for an average of R.302,500. The top four lots in the sale all came in the draft from Wilgerbosdrift Stud, whose owner, Mary Slack, is daughter of Harry and Bridget Oppenheimer, who stand Fort Wood at their Mauritzfontein Stud and who bred and raced the South African champion Horse Chestnut, retired to Claiborne Farm in Kentucky after winning the GIII Broward H. at Gulfstream Park earlier this year.
