### FROM RICHES TO RAGS AND BACK AGAIN

Voice of Destiny (Mane Minister) pulled an openingday upset at Golden Gate yesterday afternoon, leading virtually from flagfall to finish at 8-1 to win the GIII Berkeley H. One of the top juveniles in Northern California in 1998, the four-year-old closed his freshman campaign with a one-length victory in the Stanford S. at Bay Meadows in his two-turn bow and victory by a similar margin in the GIII California Juvenile S. Seventh in the GIII Golden Gate Derby, his form went awry and after a 6 1/2-month absence, was fourth against \$16,000 company. The dark bay began the new year with three tallies for ascending claiming tags, before finishing a neck second in Bay Meadows' San Carlos H. at this trip Mar. 4. Away swiftly from his inside post, Voice of Destiny raced as a team throughout with Mr. Doubledown (Alwuhush), as the pair set legitimate splits. Inseparable to the top of the stretch, the latter stuck a head in front at the eigth pole, but destiny was in his younger rival's hands, as Voice of Destiny inched clear late for the win.

# ☆TRIPLE THREATS☆

Scottish Halo (Jolie's Halo), winner of last year's GIII Laurel Futurity, had his first workout since a sixth-place finish in the GI Florida Derby, going five furlongs in 1:00 4/5 yesterday at Gulfstream Park. "He came out of the work just fine and we'll be pointing at the (GII) Arkansas Derby (Oaklawn Park, Apr. 15)," said trainer Paul Rizzo. Plans call for the New York-bred to breeze one more time in Florida, before shipping to Hot Springs Apr. 5, according to the conditioner. "We'll also blow out once at Oaklawn around Apr. 10 or 11," Rizzo added.

Aptitude (A.P. Indy), a somewhat troubled second behind undefeated Red Bullet in the GIII Gotham Mar. 19, posted his first breeze since, getting an half mile at Hollywood Park in :50 2/5 yesterday morning for trainer Bobby Frankel. He makes his next start in Aqueduct's GII Wood Memorial on Super Saturday Apr. 15.


Team Valor's The Deputy (Ire) (Petardia {GB}), a close second behind Fusaichi Pegasus in the GII San Felipe Mar. 19, worked five furlongs Wednesday at Santa Anita in 1:00 1/5, in advance of his next start in the GI Santa Anita Derby Apr. 8. "He finished up (the last quarter mile) in :23 4/5. He worked great," said trainer Jenine Sahadi. "He was just going nice and easy."

Archer City Slew (Slew City Slew) is scheduled to make his next start in the California Derby at Golden Gate Apr. 15 and Rushaway S. winner Ronton (Cryptoclearance) slated to contest the Arkansas Derby.

LEXA RETIRED Lexa (Fr) (Sanglamore) has been retired from racing and will be bred to Unbridled's Song at Three Chimneys Farm in Midway, Kentucky. The six-year-old won the G3 Prix Corrida at Lyon, France, and the G2 Prix Royallieu in her final European start on Arc weekend 1998 while racing for her owner and breeder Baron Thierry van Zuylen de Nyevelt. Shipped to the U.S., the chestnut won two times from seven starts, including the GII Buena Vista H. in her penultimate start Feb. 26. She was seventh in this past weekend's GII Santa Ana H. Purchased by B. Wayne Hughes and trained in the U.S. by Ron Ellis, Lexa retires with six wins in 16 starts and earnings of \$309,709.

#### FOREST WILDCAT FILLY TOPS FASIG-TIPTON

TEXAS A filly by Forest Wildcat--Pele Dancer (Raise a Native) brought a final bid of \$375,000, surpassing the sale's record set during Monday's first session, to top Tuesday's Fasig-Tipton Texas Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale at Lone Star Park. The filly was purchased by James Mayer's Pepper Tree Farm from the consignment of Florida sales agent Murray Smith. "Certainly you've got to respect the pedigree," said Mayer. "When she worked in :10 3/5, she did it with no help from the rider." The second highest price of the session was the \$330,000 bid by the Ackerley Brothers for hip number 455, a daughter of Rubiano--Magari (Quack). "If there is a Grade I winner out of this sale, I think this is it," said Steve Asmussen, who will train the filly. "I was here Sunday and watched the filly work. I was quite impressed." The two-year-old recorded the fastest work--:10.1--in the under tack show. At Tuesday's session, 111 horses were reported as not sold. The two-day sale established new records in Texas for gross and average at a juvenile sale. The average increased 17 percent from the 1999 figure.

HERE COMES THE JUDGE Judge T C (Judge Smells--I'm Pretty, by Secretariat), a MGSW of \$826,826, has been moved to Brereton Jones' Aridrie Stud near Midway, Kentucky, from his previous home at Upson Downs Farm in Goshen, KY. Raced by Robert and Bea Roberts, the nine-year-old stallion has a total of 140 horses from his first two crops, with 51 two-year-olds set to hit the track this year. The winner of the GIII Rebel S. at three, Judge T C bested Alphabet Soup among others in the 1995 GIII Clark H. His stud fee will remain at \$20,000.

# WRITERS UP

#### DERBY DRY SPELL AT AN END? By Bill Christine

Although trainer Neil Drysdale has never run a horse in the Kentucky Derby, he knows what the hullabaloo of Derby Week is all about. In spades.

Drysdale came as close as a trainer can to running in the Derby without actually doing it. In 1992, he had A.P. Indy, the Santa Anita Derby winner, primed to run for the roses. The owner of the \$2.9-million yearling, Tomonori Tsurumaki, was flying in from Japan to watch the race.

But on the day before the Derby, disaster struck. After a 1 1/2-mile gallop, A.P. Indy came back with a bruised foot. Drysdale and veterinarians worked all night long that Friday, trying to nurse the foot, but by Saturday morning the trainer told Churchill Downs stewards that he was going to scratch the Seattle Slew colt.

A.P. Indy was the 7-2 second choice on the morning line, but many thought he would have been too good for favored Arazi, whose reputation had been reduced by double knee surgery after his spectacular Breeders' Cup win at Churchill Downs the year before. Arazi was also going into the Derby with only one prep as a three-year-old--in France--and as it turned out, he wasn't even good enough to beat the lightly regarded Lil E. Tee.

As for A.P. Indy, Drysdale resisted the temptation to run him in the Preakness, two weeks after the Derby. But three weeks later, A.P. Indy won the Belmont S., the start of a second-half campaign that led to victory in the Breeders' Cup Classic at Gulfstream Park and the Horse of the Year title.

Drysdale may be going back to the Kentucky Derby with two horses this time--Fusaichi Pegasus and War Chant--but having been burned in 1992, the veteran trainer is taking nothing for granted.

"I won't know I'm there until they get in the gate," he guardedly said.

Drysdale has the luxury of being able to split up his Derby horses before their likely first meeting at Churchill Downs on May 6. War Chant is scheduled to run in the Santa Anita Derby on Apr. 8; Fusaichi Pegasus will run Apr. 15, in either the Blue Grass at Keeneland or the Wood Memorial at Aqueduct.

"Fusaichi Pegasus is the bigger horse of the two, the kind that should find Eastern tracks more favorable," Drysdale said. "War Chant is a lighter colt, the kind that should do better at Santa Anita." Drysdale, 53, has won five Breeders' Cup races, one of them with Hollywood Wildcat, the dam of War Chant. He has won dozens of other stakes races, and besides A.P. Indy and Hollywood Wildcat has trained champions Princess Rooney and Tasso. He's on the Hall of Fame ballot this year, along with Richard Mandella and the late Willard Proctor, yet the A.P. Indy experience was his only brush with the Kentucky Derby.

"It hasn't been for lack of trying to get there," he said.

Drysdale goes slowly with his horses, to the point where he has been accused of underracing them. Wayne Lukas, who has won the Derby four times, including last year with Charismatic, frequently faces the rap that he overraces his stock.

Last year, Lukas won the Derby a few days after the announcement that he had been voted into the Hall of Fame. This year, the same scenario could be in place with Drysdale. And even if he finishes behind Mandella and/or Proctor in the voting, there's a chance that A.P. Indy, who's also on the ballot, could be elected.

After Tasso won the Breeders' Cup Juvenile in 1985, he was on his way to the Derby in 1986. At Aqueduct for the Wood Memorial, he was spooked by a construction worker one morning before the race and kicked himself. He aggravated the injury in the Wood, ran poorly and never got to Louisville.

With two horses this time, Drysdale has more margin for error.

"They're both sound, healthy and very talented," he said.

He had never trained a horse for Fusao Sekiguchi, the Japanese businessman who bought Fusaichi Pegasus as a yearling for \$4 million, the most paid for a horse at Keeneland's July sale in 13 years. Drysdale, who didn't attend the sale, was contacted by Sekiguchi through a mutual friend and asked to train the colt.

In winning the San Felipe at Santa Anita Mar. 19, Fusaichi Pegasus never felt jockey Kent Desormeaux's whip.

"He hasn't been hit yet," Drysdale said. "The one thing we didn't want to do in that race was wind up on the lead. My horse settled and relaxed perfectly. I'll let the weather decide whether we run him next at Keeneland or in New York."

Fusaichi Pegasus has three wins and one second in four starts while War Chant, winner of the San Rafael on Mar. 4, is undefeated in three starts. Desormeaux has been riding both horses, and Drysdale would have been comfortable with that situation through the final Derby preps, but Irv and Marjorie Cohen, who own War Chant, preferred Jerry Bailey for their horse in the Santa Anita Derby. Bailey will be leaving Anees, whom he rode to a third-place finish in the San Felipe.

If War Chant wins the Santa Anita Derby, he would be that rare horse that goes into the Kentucky Derby undefeated. Since 1915, the Derby has had 15 undefeated starters, only four of them winning the race. The last undefeated horse to win the Derby was Seattle Slew in 1977.

This is all ancient history for Drysdale, who prefers the Derby present to the past. "If we get there," he said, sounding like he's been listening to Yogi Berra, "I hope it's not deja vu again."
