CHANGES AT INTERNATIONAL FEDERATION

The Executive Council of the International Federation of Horseracing Authorities, which includes representatives of Asia, Europe, South America and United States, announced a number of new appointments during a meeting in Paris last Friday. The organization re-elected Louis Romanet, chairman of the Federation since its inception in 1994, for a third term, until March 2002. Following a proposal from the Chairman, the Executive Council put in place a new framework, appointing two vice chairmen, a secretary general and a technical advisor. Christopher Foster, executive director of the Jockey Club of Great Britain, has been appointed vice chairman in charge of regulatory matters. Hans Stahl, president of The Jockey Club in the United States, has been named vice chairman in charge of commercial matters and will chair the newly created Wagering, Communication and Commercial Committee, which will include representatives of Asia (Australian Racing Board, Hong Kong Jockey Club, Japan Racing Association, Malayan Racing Association), the Americas (The Jockey Club, South American Organization) and Europe (British Horseracing Board, France Galop). Dominique de Wenden, head of International Relations Department at France Galop, is the new secretary general and Dr. Roland Devole, head of Identification and Veterinary Department of France Galop, has been appointed technical advisor on regulatory matters. The Executive Council also has fixed the agenda for the 34th International Conference of Horseracing Authorities, which will be held in Paris on Monday Oct. 2, with the delegates of 54 member countries attending. The Conference will include a tribute to Jean Romanet, who, for health reasons, has decided to retire from his position of honorary advisor to the Federation. Romanet created the International Conference of Horseracing Authorities in October 1967 and was its chairman until October 1993, when the Federation was created at his initiative.

Thirteen Join Triple Crown Trail:

Thirteen three-year-olds were added to the Visa Triple Crown nomination roster at the Apr. 1 deadline, bringing the total for this year's series to 400. Heading the roster of late nominees are Godolphin's UAE Derby winner China Visit (Red Ransom) and third-place finisher Curule (Go for Gin), GIII El Camino Real Derby hero Remember Sheikh (Sheikh Albadou {GB}), Tampa Bay Derby victor Wheelaway (Unbridled) and GIII Rebel S. runner-up Big Numbers (Numerous).

Captain Steve Speeds Through Santa Anita Derby Prep:

Captain Steve (Fly So Free), third in the GII Louisiana Derby last time out, worked five furlongs in a bullet :58 2/5 at Santa Anita yesterday morning, galloping out the six furlongs in 1:11 2/5. He makes his next start in Saturday's GI Santa Anita Derby. "He went very well, within himself," trainer Bob Baffert told Thoroughbred Times, adding, "At this point, I don't worry about the competition, I just worry about my own horse. And this horse is ready to roll." The winner of the GI Hollywood Futurity, GII Lane's End Breeders' Futurity at Keeneland and GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. at Churchill Downs at two, Captain Steve looks for his first win of 2000 in Saturday's \$1 million test.

Double Drill for Drysdale:

Trainer Neil Drysdale sent out both of his Triple Crown hopefuls for workouts yesterday morning. Undefeated War Chant (Danzig), pointing for the Santa Anita Derby, went six furlongs in 1:14. "He's coming to the race very well," Drysdale told Thoroughbred Times. "He always trains very well." As for the colt's prospects for Saturday, Drysdale said, "The Derby is coming up to be a strong race. I have a lot of respect for The Deputy (Ire) (Petardia {GB}), because he gave Fusaichi Pegasus (Mr. Prospector) some trouble and he was giving us weight." The Deputy was second to Drysdale's second Triple Crown candidate in the Mar. 19 GII San Felipe S. Fusaichi Pegasus was timed going six furlongs in 1:14 3/5 yesterday. He goes next in the GII Wood Memorial at Aqueduct Apr. 15.

As a rule of thumb, extravagant claims penned by advertising copywriters are best taken with a pinch of salt, but no one could take exception to Coolmore's claim that Danehill is "the world's first world sire." At the age of 14, this extraordinary son of Danzig is currently staging a bold bid to land his fourth general sires' championship in Australia and he has also firmly established himself as one of Europe's most prolific sources of black-type performers.

While his Northern Hemisphere achievements are generally considered less impressive than his efforts "Down Under," Danehill has been represented by 28 Northern Hemisphere Group winners (including two in Japan and one in Hong Kong). There are six European Group 1 winners, and may well be a seventh before too long because the Prix Ganay is the target for Indian Danehill, winner of Saturday's G2 Prix d'Harcourt.

One of the interesting aspects of Danehill's success is that he has done well with mares with Northern Dancer blood, even though (or perhaps because) he is inbred 3x3 to Northern Dancer's dam Natalma.

He sired the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas and G1 Irish Derby winner Desert King (Ire) from a daughter of Nureyev and has enjoyed notable success in Europe with mares from the Nijinsky branch of the Northern Dancer line. The broodmare sire of his Group 2 winner Daneskaya (GB) is Nijinsky's son Niniski, while the group-winning brothers Indian Danehill and Indian Jones are out of a mare by Green Dancer.

Green Dancer's son Mas Media (GB) was responsible for the dam of the Group 2 winner Sheer Viking (GB) and it was another of Nijinsky's grandsons, Kahyasi (Ire), who sired the dam of the Classic-placed Dansili (GB). Nijinsky also appears as the sire of the second dam of the Group 2 winner Johan Cruyff (GB).

These good performers have three lines to Natalma, and it is reasonable to wonder how much more of this blood can safely be added to this successful mix. I find it significant that some very successful breeders, including Daniel Wildenstein, have already sent daughters of Sadler's Wells to Desert King, who is inbred 4x4x4 to Natalma.

Another son of Danehill with three lines to Natalma (this time 4x4x5) is the handsome Flying Spur (Aus), who retired to stud in Australia with three Group 1 wins to his name, including the Golden Slipper S. These concentrated bloodlines appear to be helping Flying Spur as a stallion, because this first-crop sire ranks second to Danehill on the list of leading sires of two-year-olds in Australia (to Mar. 29). Although it's still early days to be judging Danehill as a sire of sires, he has made a very promising start, with another of his Australian sons, Danzero (Aus), ranking seventh on the general sires' list with only two crops of racing age. Two other sons, Danewin (Aus) and Danasinga (Aus), have also wasted no time in proving they can get group performers.

If Indian Danehill continues to progress, he too will be a popular stallion one day. He had a lot to live up to on the racecourse because his brother, Indian Jones, had looked an outstanding prospect when he won the G3 Prix La Rochette by four lengths from Goldmark in 1994. That effort led to Indian Jones starting odds-on for the G1 Grand Criterium, but he suffered a mortal injury in the race (won by none other than Goldmark).

Indian Danehill has a pedigree worthy of a potential Group 1 winner. His dam Danse Indienne is a three-parts sister to Aryenne (Fr), a Classic-winning French filly who bred the Derby-winning Quest For Fame (GB). Both mares are by Green Dancer and Danse Indienne is out of Aryenne's very successful half-sister Apachee (Fr).

Apachee's grandson Poliglote (GB) was a fine second in the 1995 G1 French Derby, so this is truly a Classic family.

PIMLICO INTERLOPER GETS PROBATION Lee

Chang Ferrell, who stunned the crowd and the television audience on Preakness Day, 1999, when he made his way onto the track during the running of the GIII Maryland Breeders' Cup H., has been sentenced for his actions, according to published reports. Ferrell, 23, jumped the fence and stood in the middle of the track as the horses raced down the stretch, taking a swing at 1999 champion sprinter Artax as he ran by. A native of Korea who was abandoned by his family as a child and spent a couple of years in an orphanage before being adopted by Americans, the young man was handed a three-year suspended sentence and five years' probation, and was also ordered to continue psychological counseling and enroll in a vocationalskills training program. However, the court ruled he would not have to reimburse the Maryland Jockey Club for the money lost in refunded wagers on Artax.

PENNSYLVANIA HORSEMEN LEAVE NTRA The

Pennsylvania Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association has informed the National Thoroughbred Racing Association that it is no longer a part of the organization, the *Thoroughbred Times* reports. The PTHA ended its membership with the NTRA as of Saturday, stating in a letter to Commissioner Tim Smith that, in part, the NTRA had failed to follow-up on a meeting last fall regarding TVG, did not support their promotional campaign and did not include them in a national cooperative to purchase bedding, feed and supplies.

BHB GRANT FIXTURES TO NEW COURSES

The British Horseracing Board has paved the way for the first new British racecourses since 1927. At its Mar. 27 meeting, BHB decided in principle to grant fixtures to both London City Racecourse and Pembrey Racecourse for 2002 and beyond. London City Racecourse offered the highest investment and prizemoney input of the eight applications submitted to the BHB. The new track will be granted a number of all-weather track floodlit evening meetings with the intention of developing evening racing outside the current period (late April to late August) which will attract significant crowds and add exciting new betting opportunities. This marks a new stage in the development of AWT racing, with sufficient outside investment to provide both races of higher quality and the new opportunities which can help meet the competition of AWT programmes emerging in Europe and Dubai. Pembrey Racecourse, situated in South Wales, will provide racing with a new audience and corresponding economic growth. The BHB hopes to be able to find 10 fixtures on turf to grant Pembrey Racecourse which can meet the needs of racegoers, the betting industry and horses and their connections. The BHB's decision in principal to grant fixtures is only the beginning of detailed development of the proposals, which must include finding and placing suitable fixtures, approval from the appropriate Planning Authorities, licensing of the racecourse by the Jockey Club and securing funding support from the Levy Board.

REAPPOINTMENTS TO LEVY BOARD

Sir John Robb has been reappointed by Home Secretary Jack Straw as a Member and Deputy Chairman of the Horserace Betting Levy Board for a further two years, commencing Jan. 1, 2001. By the end of his current term, December 31, 2000, Robb will have served eight years on the Board. The Home Secretary also reappointed Keith Elliott as a Member of the Levy Board. Elliott will complete his first term of three years July 31, 2000, and he has been reappointed for a further three years to July 31, 2003.

Although there are no firm plans as yet for Travelmate, who finished fifth in last season's G1 Fosters Melbourne Cup at Flemington, trainer James Fanshawe has indicated a return trip to Australia could be on the cards if he performs as well as last year. Taufan's Melody, who became notorious down under when he was controversially allowed to run and then won the G1 Caulfield Cup. will make his first start since finishing a close fourth in the 1998 Melbourne Cup. Travelmate will start as the likely favourite and Taufan's Melody will likely be the main opposition in the market.

YORK IMPROVEMENTS

York's 15-day 2000 campaign, which begins with the traditional three-day May Meeting, will treat patrons to improved facilities and increased purses. The continuous programme of improvements for racegoers is highlighted by the £1 million refurbishment of the Champagne Terrace area overlooking the Parade Ring. There is an increase in prize money across the racing programme, with several big races receiving a boost, courtesy of sponsors and the York Race Committee. York's most valuable race, the G1 Juddmonte International S. in August, now has a total prize fund of £450,000. The opening May fixture, the G3 Dante S., now carries prize money of £145,000. Increases are also in line for the Merewood Homes Yorkshire Cup (£135,000), and the Duke Of York Victor Chandler S.
