DERBY DIVINING ROD

No less than 14 Kentucky Derby winners, including the last three in a row, have used the GI Santa Anita Derby as their stepping stone to the "Run for the Roses." Today's 63rd renewal of the 1 1/8-mile test has drawn a small field, but any one of the Santa Anita sextet could be a contender at Churchill Downs. Surfside (Seattle Slew) will try to follow in the hoofsteps of fellow Team Lukas delegate Winning Colors, who became the only filly to win the Santa Anita Derby in 1988 and went on to defeat the colts again on the first Saturday in May. Adding blinkers for the first time and getting Lasix again after winning the Mar. 12 Gl Santa Anita Oaks without benefit of the medication, Surfside bids for her fifth straight graded-stakes win. "Despite winning, she has been kind of hanging and waiting on competition in her last two races," said trainer D. Wayne Lukas, who goes for his fifth Santa Anita Derby victory. "Hopefully, the blinkers will help her focus." The filly will have to focus to beat these boys. Last year's champion two-year-old Anees (Unbridled) makes his second start since his victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. The Thoroughbred Corp. colt was third behind Fusaichi Pegasus and fellow Santa Anita Derby candidate The Deputy (Ire) (Petardia {GB}) in the Mar. 19 GII San Felipe S. and gets jockey Corey Nakatani in the irons for the first time. Jerry Baily, aboard the Eclipse winner in the San Felipe, shifts his saddle to undefeated War Chant (Danzig), half-length winner of the Mar. 4 GII San Rafael S. The Deputy, who started his career on the turf in Britain, captured the Jan. 30 GII Santa Catalina S. in his dirt debut before missing by three-quarters of a length in his latest. Captain Steve (Fly So Free), who already owns a stakes win at Churchill, looks to rebound after back-to-back starts as the beaten favorite. Third in both the Santa Catalina and the Mar. 12 GII Louisiana Derby, Bob Baffert's shot at a third Kentucky Derby trophy (in the past four years) has been working sharply. Cocky (Valiant Nature) races with nasal strip off after finishing third, three-parts of a length behind War Chant, in the San Rafael, which was his stakes debut. (Santa Anita Derby field, p2)

BATTLE ROYALE AT OAKLAWN

Budroyale (Cee's Tizzy), first or second in 12 of his last 14 starts, takes on K One King (Apalachee), first or second in eight of nine lifetime, and last year's GI Breeders' Cup Classic hero Cat Thief (Storm Cat) in today's GI Oaklawn H. Budroyale, runner-up in the Classic, came back to beat the "Cat" by 1 1/4 lengths in the Feb. 6 GII San Antonio H. and most recently finished second to General Challenge in the Mar. 4 GI Santa Anita H. Claimed for \$50,000 just over two years ago, the seven-year-old has won nearly \$2.6 million for owner Jeff Sengara. "I guess you could say it was a little like hitting the lottery," Ted West Jr., assistant to his dad, said. Overbrook Farm's homebred Cat Thief has bankrolled more than \$3.5 million, but he has been known to throw in a subpar performance on occasion, as he did when sixth in the Santa Anita H. last time out. The four-year-old worked five furlongs in :59 1/5 at Santa Anita before shipping to Arkansas, but Randy Bradshaw, assistant to trainer D. Wayne Lukas, cautioned, "This horse always seems to work well. Ultimately, it's a matter of which horse shows up for the race." K One King finished off the board for the only time in his career in last year's Kentucky Derby, running a troubled eighth but only 4 1/2 lengths behind Charismatic. He came out of the Derby with chips in his knee and was out of action for nearly 10 months, but came back running, winning an allowance race at Gulfstream Feb. 24 by 3 3/4 lengths. Allen's Oop (Nines Wild) will try to prove that his one-length win at 45-1 in the Mar. 5 GIII New Orleans H. was no fluke. The five-year-old gelding goes for his fourth straight stakes score.

COOLMORE AUSTRALIA ADDS TOP-CLASS

TRIO Coolmore Australia will add three new stallions to its roster for the 2000 Southern Hemisphere season. Three-year-old Fasliyev (Nureyev--Mr. P's Princess, by Mr. Prospector), a European champion at two who was undefeated in five starts--including last year's G1 Heinz 57 Phoenix S. and G1 Prix Morny--started his stud career at Coolmore Ireland this year. His racing career was cut short by a paddock accident, but not before he was rated at 125 pounds on the International Classifications. Four-year-old Orpen (Lure--Bonita Francita, by Devil's Bag), who took the Prix Morny in 1998 and was third in the '99 G1 Irish 2000 Guineas, was also retired to Coolmore Ireland this season. A champion in Ireland at two, he is out of a three-parts sister to Machiavellian's dam, who also won the Prix Morny and placed in the Irish 2000 Guineas. Established stallion Southern Halo (Halo--Northern Sea, by Northern Dancer), who started his breeding career in Argentina and was the perennial leading sire in that country, will shuttle from Ashford Stud in Versailles, Kentucky. The 17-year-old has been represented by more than 70 stakes winners and 28 individual Group 1 winners in South America and has a 2000 Triple Crown candidate in More Than Ready. Southern Hemisphere stud fees for the trio have not yet been announced.

MORE PROBLEMS FOR INTERNET GAMBLING

BILL? With the exemptions for pari-mutuel wagering still in place, the Internet Gambling Prohibition Act cleared the House Judiciary Committee by a vote of 21-8 Thursday and is now expected to go to the U.S. House of Representatives. But the Harness Tracks of America newsletter reports that the news is not all good. Committee members who had proposed amendments to the bill which would have removed racing's exemption withdrew those amendments on the condition that Rep. Bob Goodlatte (R) of Virginia, who sponsors the bill in the House, would address their objections. According to the HTA newsletter, the Las Vegas Review-Journal's Washington correspondent said, "The bill's next step is unclear. It would normally head to the House floor for further votes, but the House Commerce Committee may ask to review it first and possibly makes changes."
