GOLDEN APPLE BLOSSOM

Heritage of Gold (Gold Legend) served notice that she belonged with the big girls when she ran a close third to champion Beautiful Pleasure (Maudlin) in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Distaff. She made good on that promise yesterday, winning the first Grade I victory of her career in the Apple Blossom H. at Oaklawn Park. Off four months after her Breeders' Cup run, Heritage of Gold prepped for the Apple Blossom with a dominant win in the Mar. 19 GIII Oaklawn Breeders' Cup H. Beautiful Pleasure, making her first start since the Breeders' Cup, was the prohibitive 4-5 favorite, while Heritage of Gold was the second choice in the seven-horse field. The 35-1 outsider Runaway Venus (Runaway Groom) ran clear of the field early while Heritage of Gold traveled along in second. The bay mare gained control at the top of the stretch and held on for a one-length tally. Beautiful Pleasure, off slowly and squeezed at the start, raced erratically into the first turn and down the backside and came home fifth. "She didn't break as sharply as she can and she dropped behind the others early," said the champ's jockey Jorge Chavez. "I think she needed this race. It had been five months since her last start and that is probably the reason she wasn't that ready." Shane Sellers, aboard the winner, added, "When Beautiful Pleasure didn't break, I knew exactly what I had to do with my filly. She is very professional and has real good tactical speed. We sat right behind the leader, real chilly. When they will wait for you until the eighth pole and then kick in with a big stretch move, they are hard to beat and that is just what she did today."

LONGSHOT TAKES SAN BERNARDINO

Early Pioneer (Rahy), an effective sprinter last year, found success going long yesterday with a narrow victory in the GII San Bernardino H. at Santa Anita. The gelding showed promise routing when he finished second behind Elaborate (Gilded Time) around two turns in the Ack Ack S. at Santa Anita Dec. 27. He then came back to win an allowance going a mile at Santa Anita Feb. 18. Sent off as the longest shot on the board vesterday, the chestnut chased the moderate pace set by David (Mt. Livermore) as prohibitive favorite General Challenge (General Meeting) trailed the leader by 10 lengths. Early Pioneer bid for the lead coming into the stretch, acquired it a little past midstretch and was all out to prevail by a head. General Challenge was closing late but was never a threat to the top two. Winning trainer Vladimir Cerin, explaining his change of course with Early Pioneer, said, "Rahys are bred to go two turns. I tried him two turns once on the grass and he just hated the grass. I never went back to it because he was a successful sprinter. There were no sprints, so I thought I'd give him one chance (the Ack Ack) to go long. He ran well, then won the next time." Cerin added that his current plan is for Early Pioneer to run in the July 9 GI Hollywood Gold Cup. Of the beaten favorite, trainer Bob Baffert said, "You could tell he was never comfortable out there. He had his head in the air. He was never into the bit. He just wasn't General Challenge."

The winner of his only start as a juvenile, TDN Dark Horse Kutub produced a performance that was more than pleasing to the eye to claim his first group race and mark himself as a serious contender for the Classics ahead. He was settled in rear as Ciro held a commanding lead from Monte Carlo (Ire) (Rainbows For Life {Can}), Snolow (Fr) (Snurge {Ire}) and Lord Flasheart. Ciro still held a healthy lead at the quarter-mile marker but Lord Flasheart became a serious danger with a determined bid on the outside while Kutub, wider still, was making eyecatching progress from the rear. Lord Flasheart went to the front at the distance but was immediately challenged by Kutub who, in an instant, quickened and settled the issue in a matter of strides. Kutub ran on well to record an impressive victory with Lord Flasheart far from disgraced in second and Ciro battling on bravely for the show. Freddie Head, who won this race seven times as a jockey, explained, "I have always held this horse in high esteem and ever since he joined my yard he has shown nice things at work. After he won first time out last year he could not run again as he coughed so I was unable to build up his experience. He is a small horse, very much like his sire, and you would probably want to see him stronger. He is very strong in his head and has a lovely attitude. I have ridden a lot of horses at Longchamp and I have rarely seen a horse finishing so strongly, coming from behind. You have to be impressed and he might return here for the G2 Prix Hocquart May 8, or the G1 Prix Lupin six days later, but I will have to discuss it with Sheikh Hamdan.

SALT LAKE TO JOIN AUSSIE SHUTTLE RANKS Salt Lake (Deputy Minister--Take Lady Anne, by Queen City Lad) will shuttle to Widden Stud in New South Wales, Australia this season, standing at a fee of A\$17,500 (\$10,475) as the first dual hemisphere horse sent by Walmac Int'l to Australia. "Apart from being champion first-season sire, Salt Lake was runner-up to A.P. Indy as champion second-season sire and runner-up to A.P. Indy again as champion third-season sire," said Widden Stud Marketing Manager Antony Thompson. "He has progeny earnings of more than \$8.3 million, with champion filly Fantasy Lake and Grade I winner Ordway." The 11-year-old stallion, the leading U.S. freshman sire of 1996, has sired 15 stakes winners and the earners of more than \$14 million from his five crops to race. "Salt Lake is a fantastic sire of speed two-year-olds who, like their sire, train on at three," said Walmac's John T.L. Jones, Jr. "Salt Lake is a very attractive individual--very well-conformed, well-balanced and well-muscled with a lot of strength. We've visited Australia on several occasions and I feel confident Salt Lake is the right sire to suit Australian conditions. Walmac has been interested in Australia for some time and we're thrilled to have an association with a stud like Widden."

In her first start against males, Surfside set the pace in the Santa Anita Derby but had little to offer in the stretch and finished fifth, beaten 8 1/2 lengths.

Trainer Aidan O'Brien confirmed that Mull Of Kintyre (Danzig) will definitely not run in the Kentucky Derby. "We'll take him to America later in the year," he said.

Hal's Hope Works:

GI Florida Derby winner Hal's Hope (Jolie's Halo) worked four furlongs at Keeneland yesterday in :46 1/5 and galloped out five furlongs in :58 4/5 and pulled up in 1:14. It was the fastest half-mile work of the day at Keeneland and the five-eighths time would have been the best time of the day, as well. "He was a handful," said jockey Roger Velez. "I just had to hold him, he wanted to go so badly. He is on top of his game right now. Just after we got started, I reached down and gave him a tap on the shoulder just to get his attention and let him know that we weren't playing around and he got real serious in a hurry. He really let it out the last quarter." Hal's Hope is scheduled to start in next Saturday's GI Toyota Blue Grass S.
