“LAD” ASSERTS HIMSELF AS SLIPPER CHOICE

A sparkling barrier trial by morning-line favorite **Assertive Lad (Aus)** (Zeditave {Aus}) yesterday affirmed that trainer Gai Waterhouse is on target to snare her first G1 Golden Slipper S. trophy at Rosehill Saturday. “He’s only missed one piece of work due to a minor hoof injury and he won his trial well-held by Shane Dye,” reported Randwick clocker Craig Thompson. “It was as nice a trial as they could have hoped for. Assertive Lad couldn’t be fitter, he is tight as a drum. I have clocked hundreds of horses and I don’t think this year’s two-year-olds are right up there with the best two-year-olds, but Assertive Lad is the best of them.” The colt has been under scrutiny after his pre-Slipper campaign disrupted by a virus and a nagging hoof injury. He won twice in Sydney en route to January’s Magic Millions victory and returned Mar. 25 to be beaten a nose by **Kootoomootoo (Aus)** (Danewin {Aus}) in the Skyline S., but hasn’t raced since. Gooree Stud Manager Andrew Baddock hopes “the Freedman factor” and “the Danehill factor” will assist homebred filly **Crowned Glory (Aus)** (Danehill) to give her sire and her trainer Lee Freedman a fifth Slipper win. She firmed to 9-2 second favorite from 7-1 after drawing barrier three at yesterday’s draw.

CALLER WON THE LAFAYETTE

Caller One (Phone Trick) made a victorious return to the graded stakes ranks yesterday at Keeneland with a four-length tally in the GII Lafayette S. After winning back-to-back outings in Southern California last July, Caller One tired to fifth in the Aug. 18 GIII Best Pal S. at Del Mar. Off six months after that effort, the James Chapman trainee stormed home to a 10-length victory in the Mar. 25 Hansel S., an effort that made him the 6-5 public choice yesterday. The bay made every pole a winning one and finished much the best under a hand ride. After the victory, jockey Robbie Davis admitted, “That was a whole lot of fun out there today. I’m glad they spaced his races out. I’m just now getting over the wind burn from when I rode him in the Hansel. He ran a gigantic race that day and he ran another one today.” Davis did have some excitement when Caller One began jumping shadows at the top of the stretch. “He jumped some shadows three times in a row,” the jockey explained. “So I gave him a tap or two. I wanted him to keep at his task, so I got after him a little. That’s an awful habit to get into. I keep remembering when Dayjur did that in the Breeders’ Cup and it cost him the race.”

Mr Ross led throughout in garnering his first graded score. The Oklahoma bred ended last season with a win in the Governor's Cup H. at Remington Park. Third in his seasonal bow in the GIII Essex H., he was beaten only 2 1/2 lengths when third in the GIII Razorback H. over this strip Mar. 18. The chestnut secured the advantage on the first turn and set comfortable fractions before drawing away in deep stretch. "This is his third race back from a layoff and, applying the three-race rule, figured to be his best one," commented winning trainer Donnie K. Von Hemel. "He showed speed today as when he won the stakes at Remington. We might have to change his running style."

Starting as favourite off the back of her win in last year's G3 Prix des Reservoirs, Volvoretta was given a confident ride throughout and drew clear in the closing stages for an easy second Group 3. The filly maintains her perfect three-for-three record and will now point straight to the G1 Prix de Diane (French Oaks) at Chantilly June 4. Sadler's Flag led at a steady pace, gradually building up the tempo as the race wore on. Volvoretta sat fourth early, but as they turned into the straight it became apparent she was travelling best of all. The odds-on choice was eventually eased into the lead inside the final quarter mile and readily drew clear in the final furlong for an impressive success. Reve d'Oscar weaved through the field in the straight and ran on well to take second without troubling the winner as Sadler's Flag kept on at the one pace for third. Winning jockey Thierry Thulliez said: "She is much more mature than she was last year, and less green. She has obviously wintered well and has gotten stronger. She has powerful acceleration and really won easily today, being quite fit going into the race."

FAVORITE TRICK TO SHUTTLE Collingrove Stud will stand 1997 Horse of the Year Favorite Trick (Phone Trick--Evil Elaine, by Medieval Man) at its Victorian property in Australia this Southern Hemisphere season. Retiring with earnings of \$1,726,793, Favorite Trick was a perfect eight-for-eight during his two-year-old campaign, with wins in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile and GI Hopeful S. Overall, he won 12 of his 16 starts. The five-year-old stood his first season at Walmac Int'l in Lexington, Kentucky in 1999. He will stand in Australia for a fee of A\$27,500 plus GST, payable on a 45-day positive foal test, or A\$32,000 plus GST, payable May 1, 2001.

FREE HOUSE DECISION MAY BE REVERSED

California administrative law judge Ralph Dash has recommended that the disqualification of **Free House** (Smokester) from the 1998 Gil Bel Air H. be reversed, according to the *Thoroughbred Times On-Line*. Free House won the Bel Air, but was disqualified after he tested positive for clenbuterol. If the recommendation is adopted by the California Horse Racing Board, it could be a landmark interpretation of the trainer responsibility rule, in which a trainer is absolutely responsible whenever a horse tests positive for a banned substance. The judge's recommendation suggested that the trainer's liability should be adjusted to take into account the circumstances of the test and its potential impact on a horse's performance. Two weeks after Free House won the Bel Air, the CHRB informed owners Toffan and McCaffery and trainer Paco Gonzalez that the gray colt had tested positive for a trace amount of clenbuterol. Trainers had been informed earlier that year that a new "supertest" could detect medications to a picogram (a trillionth of a gram), and that there would be zero tolerance of clenbuterol. Gonzalez stated that he did not keep the drug in the barn and did not use it on Free House, and that the barn was guarded at night. A split sample sent to Industrial Laboratories in Denver also tested positive, but could not be confirmed since that lab was not approved for clenbuterol tests. Judge Dash said that the owners were not required to forfeit the Bel Air purse of \$63,660 since the original positive was not definitively confirmed by the split sample. He also ruled that Gonzalez "made every reasonable effort to protect Free House from tampering by unauthorized individuals...and thus established a defense to the 'trainer as insurer' of the horse's condition," reported the *Times*. "This is a modification [of the trainer's responsibility] rule that I think is rational," Neil Papiano, counsel to Toffan, McCaffery and Gonzalez, told the *Times*. "It says that if you have done everything you can and the [positive samples] couldn't possibly affect the horse's performance, then you cannot put a blight on that trainer's record." The next meeting of the CHRB is scheduled for May 2.

MEDAALY JOINS DARLEY SHUTTLE RANKS **Medaaly (GB)** (Highest Honor {Fr}--Dance of Leaves {GB}, by Sadler's Wells {USA}), winner of the 1996 G1 Racing Post Trophy, will join Darley stallions Cape Cross (Ire), Saratoga Springs (USA) and Xaar (GB) in shuttling to Australia for the 2000 Southern Hemisphere breeding season. The six-year-old, a winner of three of his six career starts, will stand at Inverness Stud for a fee of A\$8,000. He stood the 2000 Northern Hemisphere season at Haras du Logis in Normandy, France for a fee of FF15,000. His first foals from a large first crop--he covered 111 mares in 1999, a French record--are arriving this spring.

ASCOT TO ADD SALES RACE Ascot racecourse has announced that next year's Festival meeting will include a new sales race for fillies, the Thoroughbred Breeders' Association Sales Race, to be run Sept. 29, 2001 over 6 1/2 furlongs for a guaranteed minimum purse of £250,000. Replacing the Blue Seal S. on the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. undercard, the race is open to all two-year-old fillies sold as yearlings at any specified sale in the UK. It will cost £300 to nominate a filly on 17 January 2001, and, after forfeits in April and July, a total of £1,000 to run. The weights will be determined based on sales price, with penalties for juveniles which have won previously. Gavin Pritchard-Gordon, executive director of the TBA, said: "The TBA are thrilled to have been the catalyst for this valuable new fillies race at Ascot in 2001. It is an exciting initiative which should be a significant boost to the British breeding industry. This race has been targeted specifically in response to calls from TBA members and will hopefully provide a stimulus to the yearling filly market later this year. Commercial breeders find it very difficult even to recoup the cost of producing filly foals. We hope owners will now consider more closely the advantages of racing fillies."

This year's Tattersalls Breeze Up Sales, set for Apr. 19-20, boast an impressive array of bloodstock, with sires such as Indian Ridge (Ire), Sadler's Wells (USA) and Woodman (USA) represented. However, it will be a slightly lower-profile sire in Petorius (Ire) who will provide a great deal of excitement. His progeny, lot number 44, is a half-brother to "TDN Dark Horse" **Kutub (Ire)** (In The Wings {GB}), the very impressive G2 Prix Noailles winner Apr. 9. Quoted as low as 20-1 now for the G1 Epsom Derby, the colt struck a lasting impression with the manner of his latest victory, with his jockey Davy Bonilla describing him in no uncertain terms as the best he had ridden. Tattersalls Marketing Manager Jimmy George said: "We would have to be delighted with the quality of the catalogue--the sale is very much on the upgrade and has been for the last 4-5 years. This year we hope to step up on the record-breaking sale last year. The ingredients are in place."

SANDOWN FOR HISTORIC LOAN

The Horserace Betting Levy Board has agreed to its largest interest-free loan ever, lending £8.5 million to aid Sandown racecourse in its £23-million redevelopment project, the biggest ever of its kind in Britain. The project will begin in May this year and last until Dec. 2001, so as to minimise disruption to the racing calendar. Robert Hughes, the Levy Board chairman, said: "Sandown Park is one of Britain's leading racecourses and the redevelopment is good news for racing. The Levy Board has supported improvements to racecourse facilities for many years and it is delighted to be helping this major project." Andrew Wates, the chairman of the United Racecourses, added: "The redevelopment is designed to take Sandown forward for the next 25 years. It is very exciting for us and our customers." The work will include the rebuilding and enlarging of the corporate facilities, as well as refurbishing the grandstand and improving access and parking. The course itself will also come in for improvements, from widening to levelling and straightening. The 2000 flat season will offer a 20-percent improvement in prizemoney on last year as well, with new and boosted handicaps; the G1 Eclipse S. has had its purse raised to £300,000. **British Report cont. p2**

OLD-TIMER RETURNS

Orchestra Stall (GB) (Old Vic {GB}), a three-time Group winner who has not raced since posting a five-length score in the G3 Prix Gladiateur at Longchamp Sept. 7, 1997, will be back in action Saturday at Newbury, *Sporting Life* on-line reports. The eight-year-old gelding, with six wins, three seconds and two thirds from his 15 prior starts, is entered in the Watership Down Stud John Porter S. Marcus Hosgood, the racing secretary to trainer Jonh Dunlop, was reported as saying, "He's an intended runner at the moment. He's had a tendon problem, but it has been so far, so good with him this year. With anything like that, one is always holding one's breath, but he's been training well."

PERKS AT NEWBURY

Racehorse owners will gain free admission to all but one of Newbury's Flat fixtures this year through the widespread use of the Racehorse Owners' Association's Owner's Pass Card System. Members of the System will be allowed free entry to the Members' Enclosure, even when they do not have a runner, on all days except May 20; they can also hire private boxes at special rates. Lisa Ward, marketing manager of the racecourse, said: "Newbury is particularly committed to looking after owners and is delighted to announce this extension of the Owners' Pass Card System." Michael Harris, chief executive of the Racehorse Owners' Association, commented: "It is excellent news that Newbury is looking after owners so well. Owners contribute a huge amount to racing and it is good to see Newbury recognising this."

NEWBURY ANNOUNCES NEW SPONSORSHIPS

Britain's two leading bloodstock auction houses join the list of sponsors at Newbury this year, with Tattersalls and Doncaster Bloodstock Sales sponsoring races in July and August, respectively. In addition, Robert Sangster's Swettenham Stud will now back the Listed Radley S. in October, and Grundons are sponsoring the Listed Aston Park S. May 20.

NEW SPONSOR FOR DANTE

The G2 Dante S. at York, set for May 17, will be sponsored by locally based JWE Telecom Plc for the first time.
