KENTUCKY DERBY TRAIL HEATS UP

Kentucky Derby hopefuls will take to tracks across the country Saturday looking to get their books stamped for a trip to Louisville in three weeks. The \$4 million yearling purchase **Fusaichi Pegasus** (Mr. Prospector) will be the head liner at Aqueduct's GII Wood Memorial. The Neil Drysdale trainee has won three of four starts, most recently defeating **The Deputy** (Ire) in the Mar. 19 GII San Felipe S. "He's quite lightly raced, but he's improved off each race," Drysdale admitted. "He's got such a strong stride and he does things so easily." Drysdale claims his charge's hefty price tag does not carry any extra pressure. "I don't have the feeling of any pressure with this horse," the trainer said. "Once they get into training, it's irrelevant how much they cost." Jockey Kent Desormeaux has the mount on **Fusaichi Pegasus**, who will break from post five in the 12-horse field and is the 4-5 morning line favorite. Keeneland's GI Toyota Blue Grass S. drew a competitive field of eight yesterday, including GI Florida Derby first and second-place finishers **Hal's Hope** (Jolie's Halo) and **High Yield** (Storm Cat) and GII Louisiana Derby winner and runner-up **Mighty** (Lord at War {Arg}) and **More Than Ready** (Southern Halo). **Mighty's** last-to-first charge to win Fair Grounds's major Derby prep earned him 2-1 morning line favoritism Saturday. The GII Arkansas Derby at Oaklawn Park drew a field of 14 horses for only the third time in 26 years. The morning line favorite is GIII Rebel S. victor **Snuck In** (Montbrook) at 2-1. The 4-1 second choice **Elite Mercedes** (Mercedes Won) ran third in the Florida Derby before a second-place finish in the GII Spiral S. "He took the lead in the stretch and then stopped about 50 yards from the wire and we were all wondering about that," Elliott Walden assistant trainer David Fortner said of the grey's Spiral finish. "But then we discovered after the race that he had just a little temperature, so maybe that was the reason." Recognizing the rapid approach of the first Saturday in May, Fortner added, "If he's going on to the Kentucky Derby, he almost has to win this race." The weekend's three major Derby preps will be linked for the fourth year by the Big 3 Pick 3 wager. *Full fields p. 2-3*

SHOW ME THE WINNER'S CIRCLE

The versatile filly **Show Me the Stage** (Slew the Surgeon) has won stakes on turf and dirt and she had beaten the boys on the grass. Yesterday she beat them again on the main track, padding her resume with a wire-to-wire win in the GIII Count Fleet Sprint S. at Oaklawn Park. **Show Me the Stage** won the Feb. 20 GIII Las Flores S. before battling for the lead early and tiring to third in the Mar. 18 Victoria Lass H. at Fair Grounds last time out. The four-year-old was pressed on the lead yesterday, setting fractions of :21 3/5, :44 4/5 and :57 before gamely holding off the late-closing **Smolderin Heart** (Two Punch) by a half length in 1:09 3/5. "We decided about 10 days ago to come and take on the boys," said trainer and part owner Eric Guillot. "We go to Churchill from here and run in [Mamzelle] five furlongs on the grass May 4."

Although the first Group race run in Britain has a depleted look following the withdrawals of G1 1000 Guineas S. favourite **High Walden** and last year's G1 Cheveley Park S. winner **Seazun**, this year's renewal of the Guineas trial will no doubt offer more vital clues to the Classic in May. The likely favourite **Lahan**, winner of the 1999 G2 Rockfel S., is currently 16-1 for the 1000 Guineas with the Tote and should put up a bold show. **Total Love**, third in the Rockfel, seemed to be improving at the end of last year and must come into consideration. She was runner-up at Newmarket last year to **Out Of Africa**, who finished her two-year-old campaign with success in the Listed Rockingham S. at York. It will be interesting to see how Clive Brittain's **Crimplene** comes back from her unplaced effort behind **China Visit** in the UAE Derby in March, as she had smart two-year-old form, including a third in the G1 Cheveley Park S.

Defending champion **Jim and Tonic** has drawn just one shy of the wide outside for Sunday's test, but Xavier Doumen, representing his father, trainer Francois Doumen, said, "I was hoping for a middle position before the draw, and it is not ideal, but Jim and Tonic can usually take up the position that he wants. We will be looking to come from behind off a fast pace, so hopefully being wide will not be too much of a disadvantage." America's hope for the Cup, **Thesaurus**, worked five furlongs over the Sha Tin turf Wednesday with jockey Patricia Cooksey aboard. "I'm guessing that was about a minute and he went the last eighth in :12," she said after the breeze. "He felt real good." The field for the race was reduced to 13 when **Iron Horse (Aus)** (Zephyr Zip {NZ}) was withdrawn. "[He] was not right [Thursday] morning at trackwork," trainer John Morish said. "He has a little filling in his right off foreleg, and when I felt the leg he flinched under pressure. We had it X-rayed and there appears to be a small problem." The eight-year-old also had to be withdrawn from the G3 Dubai Duty Free H. at Nad Al Sheba due to an abscess in his near-hind foot. "It is a shame after the bad luck we had in Dubai to have something go wrong here, but that's racing for you," Morish said.

I've thought all along that she had a lot of talent." Of the long layoff, Bray added, "There was nothing wrong with her at all, but I just decided to stop and give her some time. She was a big three-year-old." Winning rider Corey Nakatani added, "She ran awesome. You just put them where you think they want to be and then call on them to run. I just knew that she was going to run a big race for me."

TTA Modifies Breeding Program:

The Board of Directors of the Texas Thoroughbred Association voted unanimously on Apr. 11 to modify the accredited Texas-bred incentive program in an effort to stimulate the state's breeding industry. The modifications will be less restrictive for mare owners and will provide financial incentives for owners of Texas-breds competing in open company. Previously mare owners were required to breed to Texas-based sires at least every other year to be eligible for the ATB program. The new proposal would allow Texas-based mares to be bred out of state every year beginning 2002, providing they return to Texas by Aug. 15 after they are bred. However, foals by these out-of-state stallions would only be eligible for 50 percent of the breeders' awards. Only Texas-bred foals by Texas-based stallions would be eligible for 100 percent of the breeders' awards. The proposals must be approved by the state legislature which meets next in Austin in 2001.

GRISLY DISCOVERY A LINK TO SHERGAR

CASE? The decomposed head of a horse found in a sack at the bottom of a ditch outside of Tralee, Co. Kerry may be that of champion **Shergar (Ire)** (Great Nephew {GB}), the *Sporting Life* on-line reports. Irish police said that DNA tests would be conducted on the skull to determine if it did indeed belong to the 1981 Epsom Derby winner, who was kidnapped by the IRA in 1983. The remains were discovered during the annual clean-up of a glen outside of Tralee. "There were two bullet holes in the head and it was definitely a racehorse's head," Councillor Tommy Foley, who made the discovery, told the *Press Association*. "I was there with a farmer's son, and he said it was not an ordinary horse. There is a possibility that it was [Shergar], because when he was abducted there was a Kerry connection." Shergar was kidnapped two years after his retirement, but four days after his disappearance his kidnapers cut off communication and, despite a nationwide search, his fate remained a mystery. An insurance policy was never paid because there was no proof the horse had died. Des Leadon, the head of clinical pathology at the Irish Equine Centre, was reported as saying, "There have been so many sightings over so many years that it is difficult to prejudge them. First we need to make certain that [the skull] is equine, then determine the age and other factors and then, if these things point to it being a racehorse, we would use DNA testing."
