#### **QEII CUP TO HOME TEAM**

Industrialist (GB) (Rudimentary), who has only been based in Hong Kong since November, held off a furious late charge from 2-1 favorite Jim and Tonic (Fr) (Double Bed (Fr)) to take yesterday's G2 Audemars Piguet Queen Elizabeth II Cup at Sha Tin by a short head. "This horse is a real fighter who needs an aggressive ride to bring out his best," jockey Alan Munro, who recently revealed he will be taking a break from riding to pursue other interests, said. "I did not know whether I had won the race or not when we went past the post and when I looked at the replay, I thought that we were lucky to hang on." The winning trainer, Brian Kan, guipped, "I am very pleased to have won the race, especially after so much time and effort training the horse when I could have been on the golf course. The horse has won over HK\$10 million in just six months, and I love any horse that wins me that much money." Will the four-year-old be leaving Hong Kong to take on international competitors overseas? "I don't think so," Kan said. "The money is too good at home." Hong Kong horses also filled the third and fourth spots, with Housemaster (Ire) (Rudimentary) missing second by only a short head and Indigenous (Ire) (Mariu {Ire}), runner-up in the G1 Japan Cup last November, another 1 1/4 lengths back in fourth. Named Mensa when he competed in Britain, Industrialist has been in the money in all 10 Hong Kong starts, with wins in the Hong Kong Classic Trial and Hong Kong Gold Cup. Forced to rally into a slow pace, Jim and Tonic just failed to run his Hong Kong record to four-for-four--and lost out on a HK\$1 million bonus in the process. "We fell into a trap and it is very frustrating," trainer Francois Doumen said. "The pace was not a genuine one and they slowed it up in the middle of the race. Yet again we have finished second in another valuable race and it has cost us a lot of money." Doumen saddled Boca Boca (Ire) to finish second by three-quarters of a length in Saturday's G1 Nakayama Grand Jump in Japan. Iscan (Ire) (Caerleon) was sixth, beaten just over three lengths, and trainer Saeed bin Suroor commented that the Godolphin colorbearer needed more distance. American hopeful Thesaurus (With Approval) was wide throughout and finished seventh. (QEII Cup chart, p2)

#### OFF THE SCALE AT KEENELAND

"He's a lot of racehorse," said jockey Richie Migliore after guiding Richter Scale (Habitony {GB}) to a four-length victory in yesterday's GII Commonwealth Breeders' Cup S. at Keeneland. The six-yearold dashed through fractions of :44 1/5 and 1:08 4/5 before cruising home in a final time of 1:21 for the seven furlongs, just four ticks off the track record. The victory marked Richter Scale's fourth straight. Fifth in an Aug. 12 Saratoga allowance during the finale of an unsuccessful stint on the turf last spring and summer, he hasn't been beaten since, reeling off wins in the Oct. 16 Phoenix Breeders' Cup S. at Keeneland, Nov. 25 GII Fall Highweight H. at Agueduct and in his 2000 bow, the Mar. 10 GII Gulfstream Park Breeders' Cup Sprint Championship H. "I thought his performance in his last race was great, but this was unbelievable," Migliore continued. "He's is overpowering...superb...amazing. When I'm on him, I know that he is flying, but it doesn't feel like it. He is just so talented."

Boasting a two-for-two record coming into this race, "TDN Dark Horse" Samum secured a battling first Group race win from fellow "TDN Dark Horse" Indian Ruby to maintain his unbeaten record. Wazaro (Ire) (Alzao) led at a good pace from Global Dancer (Ger) (Shareef Dancer), with Samum reserved in a tight midfield and Indian Ruby travelling in rear. Siamo, followed by Global Dancer, took the lead as the field turned into the straight, but Samum came with his bid on the outside and took over inside the final quarter mile. He was challenged by Indian Ruby approaching the final furlong and the pair hooked up for a battle, but it was Samum who proved superior close home.

#### High Yield Exits Blue Grass in Fine Fettle:

High Yield (Storm Cat), who proved his mettle with a head win over More Than Ready in Saturday's GI Toyota Blue Grass, came out of the race in fine shape, according to trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "He's doing good this morning," said Lukas, who will bid for his fifth GI Kentucky Derby trophy with the colt. "He cooled out well after the race and is extremely strong today." Lukas won his fourth "Run for the Roses" with Charismatic last year.

#### Pletcher Points Quartet for Derby:

Trainer Todd Pletcher, who saddled More Than Ready (Southern Halo) to a game second-place finish in yesterday's GI Toyota Blue Grass and watched as his Graeme Hall (Dehere) came home first in the GII Arkanasas Derby--with stablemate Impeachement (Deputy Minister) in third--could have a four-horse entry on the first Saturday in May. He also handles the undefeated Trippi (End Sweep), who captured the GIII Flamingo S. last out. "It really hasn't sunk in yet," he said yesterday morning. "It is hard to get one horse to the Derby. To have three, maybe four, in the same year is really unbelievable to me. It's just been one of those years where everything has come together at just the right time and things have gone well. I guess we'll have a pretty busy Derby week, won't we?" Remarking on his Arkansas Derby pair, Pletcher said, "I think Graeme Hall earned a shot at the Kentucky Derby. He carried his speed over a route of ground and he ran a huge race, for sure. You have to give him a chance. I have not talked with [Dogwood President Cot Campbell] about Impeachment, but the Derby is certainly one option." Triple Threats cont. p3

#### No Explanation for Mighty's Poor Performance:

Trainer Frank Brothers said yesterday morning he was baffled by GII Louisiana Derby winner Mighty (Lord at War {Arg})'s seventh-place effort in the Blue Grass. "He's fine, perfect, couldn't be better," he said. "I'm not one to make excuses for my horses, but it could have been the racetrack, I guess. He didn't seem to feel comfortable running over it." As for the colt's status for the May 6 GI Kentucky Derby, Brothers said he would wait to talk to owners Adele Dilschneider and Claiborne Farm before deciding if the dark bay would run.

#### Hal's Hope Healthy After Blue Grass:

GI Florida Derby winner Hal's Hope (Jolie's Halo), who pressed the pace set by winner High Yield before dropping back to last in the Blue Grass, came out of the race without a scratch, owner/breeder/trainer Harold Rose reported. "I don't know what happened [in the race]," Rose said. "Maybe the [Florida Derby] took more out of him than I thought." Rose will take a few days before deciding on a run for the roses. "If he's OK, we'll see," he said.

#### Fusaichi Flies to Kentucky Today:

GII Wood Memorial winner Fusaichi Pegasus (Mr. Prospector), the 3-1 favorite in the final pool of the Kentucky Derby Future Wager which closed yesterday, will leave Aqueduct this afternoon at 2 p.m. to head for Louisville and the May 6 GI Kentucky Derby. Despite an eventful afternoon surrounding the Wood which saw him hold up both the start and the winner's circle ceremonies, the three-year-old was unperturbed after the race. "Nothing bothers him," groom Manuel Flores said. "After the race, he came back here and ate everything within 25 minutes."

#### Orseno on Fence With Red Bullet:

Trainer Joe Orseno was unsure yesterday whether Red Bullet (Unbridled), who suffered his first defeat when second to the eye-catching Fusaichi Pegasus in Saturday's GII Wood Memorial at Aqueduct, would go on to the Kentucky Derby. "There are a lot of people who would look at the Wood Memorial and say, 'Red Bullet was second, so he should go to the Derby,'" Orseno said. "But that may not necessarily be the best thing for the horse. That's what's under discussion, what's best for the horse." But he added, "If Red Bullet improves just a little bit off this race--and he will improve, because it was his first time around two turns-he will be a horse to be reckoned with."

# ONE FOR THE EMERALD ISLE By Martin Pearce

There has never been an Irish-bred winner of the Kentucky Derby, but The Deputy (Ire) could change that. The colt handed the previously unbeaten War Deputy his first defeat in last Saturday's GI Santa Anita Derby and will start as one of the favorites at Churchill Downs on the first Saturday in May.

Asked whether he would travel to Louisville to watch the Derby, the man responsible for The Deputy, 36-year-old Irish breeder John McEnery, replied, "You'd have to go. If this horse was running in the 2000 Guineas at Newmarket or the Derby at Epsom, of course you'd go, so it's the same for the Kentucky Derby. It's not every day you have the opportunity to go and watch a horse you've bred run in such a great race. I just hope I can get a ticket to get in! The Deputy is certainly the best by far that I've ever bred. He was always a smashing horse, a real standout."

McEnery runs Rossenarra Stud at Kells in County Kilkenny in Ireland, and the McEnery name is already well known in racing circles. It was entirely appropriate that on Grand National/Santa Anita Derby weekend, the man who bred the winner of the latter event should be the son of Martyn McEnery, the man who bred the legendary triple Grand National winner Red Rum (GB).

Red Rum was sold as a racing prospect at the Doncaster sales and is was to Doncaster's 1998 St. Leger yearling sales that McEnery junior sent two colts, one by Petardia (GB), the other by Fayruz (GB).

"It's a great place to sell horses, especially yearlings out of young mares who are just starting--it gets them into the system. Also, the Doncaster people look after you so well. I made the decision to sell the two colts at Doncaster way back in February that year," he says.

McEnery sold the Fayruz colt, subsequently named Master Fay (Ire), for 8,000 English guineas, and The Deputy for what looks like one of the bargain prices of all time, a mere 14,000 English guineas.

"It was great at the time," he says wrily. "I sold the mare Manfath (Ire) to America last year, but I have kept her Fayruz half-sister. I believe that Manfath is visiting Kingmambo this year."

The Emerald Isle has never before boasted a Kentucky Derby winner, but there was an Irish-bred, trained and ridden winner of the 2000 Grand National, so perhaps The Deputy can write a brand new chapter in the history of the "Run For The Roses."

WOOD WINNER TOPS FUTURE WAGER GII Wood Memorial winner Fusaichi Pegasus (Mr. Prospector) was bet down to 3-1 to top the third and final pool of the 2000 Kentucky Derby Future Wager, which closed yesterday afternoon. The colt rated the lowest odds ever in the two-year history of the bet, surpassing the odds of 7-2 on the mutuel field for the first pool this year. There was also heavy late action on GI santa Anita Derby hero The Deputy (Ire) (Petardia {GB}), who started Sunday at 11-1, had been bet down to 6-1 by the time the pool closed. Combined wagering on the three pools for 2000 was \$1,158,919, with a record \$387,206 bet on Pool 3. Last year's inaugural Future Wager saw a handle of \$676,233, with \$229,674 bet on its third and final pool.

The 6-1 shot showed early speed to establish a clear lead, set a slow pace and held on to win by 1 1/2 lengths.

#### Gulfstream to Close Stabling Area April 26:

Gulfstream now plans to close its backside on April 26, according to Hialeah president John Brunetti. In previous years, Gulfstream closed its backside on April 15, but Brunetti had said he would keep it open until the end of the meeting on May 22. It appears there are about 15 trainers with 250 horses left on the backside. "We offered to pay the expenses of any trainer that wanted to move to Hialeah," said Brunetti. "I understand that half of the trainers are going to Delaware and the other half will go to Monmouth."

UPDATE ON TEAM O'BRIEN It was in the opening race of last year's Sunday card at Leopardstown that trainer Aidan O'Brien took the wraps off an unraced son of Nureyev (USA) with a big reputation. His name was Fasliyev (USA), and he duly won by three lengths at 7-4 on. That price would eventually look long as the colt stomped his way through the two-year-old scene on his way to heading the International Classifications by a huge five-pound margin. Playing a supporting cast at the end of the season were Giant's Causeway (USA), Bernstein (USA), Mull Of Kintyre (USA) and Monashee Mountain (USA), just a few of the horses which made the 1999 season one to remember not just for connections, but for a racing public not spoilt in this fashion since the days of the might of Vincent O'Brien. What will Aidan O'Brien do for an encore? Yesterday, Tribal Drum (USA) (Tabasco Cat {USA}) initiated a treble for Ballydoyle at Leopardstown, and it was left to guessing how the stable's juveniles would fare in the wake of such success. In an interview with The Racing Channel, O'Brien was guizzed about a few of these burgeoning two-year-old hopes. He started off by warning: "They're nice, but it would be very hard to say they'd be as good as last year's bunch. They're a little bit behind, as their coats are behind, so obviously we don't really know, but we're happy enough." Of his March maiden winner at The Curragh, Modigliani (USA) (Danzig {USA})--first runner for O'Brien this year--he said: "We think he's a nice colt. He won well at The Curragh first time, and Michael (Kinane) was very happy with him. He just asked him to do what he had to do and we think he's going to improve." There is also the unraced Hemingway (Ire) (Spectrum {Ire}), a half-brother to Second Empire (Ire), who is well regarded. "We think he's very good," O'Brien said. "His work's been very good and he's got a good mind. We couldn't be happier with him." Norway (USA) (Storm Cat {USA}) is a half-brother to A. P. Indy (USA) and Summer Squall (USA). O'Brien said of him: "He's very well and everything's good. We haven't done an awful lot with him at the moment but he's strong and he's matured and he's shown speed-he's a strong two-year-old type." Keats (USA) (Hennessy {USA}) is one of his sire's first crop. "He goes really well and shows loads of speed, and he looks a natural runner at the moment," the trainer said. "He's early if we want him early--he will be whatever you want--and he's just maturing fast."
