KEENELAND APRIL SALE SET FOR TODAY

Trainers Nick Zito and John C. Kimmel, who have spent most of the spring trying to get their three-yearolds to the Kentucky Derby, will have a little different agenda today. Instead of working with the likes of Rollin With Nolan and Wheelaway, they will turn their attentions to the potential stars of the future at the annual Keeneland April Two-Year-Olds In Training Sale. "I think you're always on the lookout for a horse that you think might develop," said two-time Kentucky Derby winner Zito, who has become a prolific buyers of young horses for a variety of clients. "I don't know if you can go in there and at this stage say, 'This is a Kentucky Derby winner.' But I do think you can go in there and say, 'This guy has a chance to become a real, real, real good horse and maybe, with the right development, become a contender.' That's what you're looking for--a horse with the conformation, the looks, the demeanor and the action. If they have that, then you've got a chance. And you know what. I think there's a few in this sale that have a chance." The Keeneland April Sale has already produced a number of horses that had that chance--and came through. During its brief eight-year history, the venue has already graduated Kentucky Derby winner Thunder Gulch, Kentucky Oaks winners Gal In A Ruckus and Keeper Hill, and last year's Champion Older Mare Beautiful Pleasure. "It looks like it can be another top sale," said Kimmel, who buys and trains horses for clients which include his father Caesar Kimmel. "There are several in there that we have our eyes on. We'll just have to wait and see who else shows up and what the interest level is going to be. But I think there are some good horses that have a real chance to make outstanding racehorses." The list of sires represented at this year's sale may be the strongest in the history of the event. There are three by A.P. Indy, two by Danzig, five by Deputy Minister, three by Gone West, one by the late, great Mr. Prospector, one by Nureyev, one by Seattle Slew, four by the great Storm Cat and three by Unbridled, "Any time you have a sale at Keeneland, you'd better be interested," said Zito. "This is where the world comes to buy horses." Last year's auction set April records for gross sales (\$18,560,000), average (\$150,894), and highest price for a colt (\$2 million) and for a filly (\$1.25 million). This year's one-day session, with 245 horses catalogued, will begin at 1:30 p.m.

Red Bullet out of Derby:

Despite a creditable second-place finish in Saturday's GII Wood Memorial, Frank Stronach's Red Bullet (Unbridled) will pass the May 6 GI Kentucky Derby, trainer Joe Orseno announced yesterday. "We don't feel he'd get a fair shake in the Kentucky Derby, with a 20-horse field and his lack of seasoning," Orseno said. "It was a tough decision. There aren't one or two other owners in the world who would not consider running in the Derby in our situation. You've got to give them a lot of credit for taking the stand they have and doing what's right by the horse. Everybody involved is putting their egos behind them." Unraced at two but undefeated going into the Wood, Red Bullet will make his next start in the May 20 GI Preakness, Orseno said. "If he's as good as we think he is, there shouldn't be any problem training up to the Preakness for five weeks," he said. "We're trying to have a three-year-old champion. We'd like to win the Preakness and maybe beat the same horse (Fusaichi Pegasus) who beat us in the Wood Memorial." Stronach may still have a Kentucky Derby starter, if Ben the Man (Gulch) can punch his ticket to the race with a good showing in Saturday's GII Coolmore Lexington.

Santa Anita Shippers Sharp at Churchill:

Captain Steve (Fly So Free), third in the Gl Santa Anita Derby last time out, drilled a half mile in a bullet :47 1/5 over a muddy track at Churchill Downs Monday. War Chant (Danzig), second in that race, went three furlongs in :37 2/5 over the Churchill strip Sunday.

Surfside Still in Derby Picture?:

Trainer D. Wayne Lukas yesterday told *The Blood Horse* that top filly **Surfside** (Seattle Slew), fifth against colts in the Gl Santa Anita Derby, may yet make it to the Kentucky Derby. "I made no comment [on her Kentucky Derby status] except to say that Overbrook and their group would ultimately make the decision on that and everybody read into it that they earmarked her for the Oaks," Lukas told *The Blood Horse*, adding, "She never liked the racetrack [at Santa Anita]. She won those races on class, but she struggled with it." Surfside reeled off victories in the GIII Santa Ysabel, GI Las Virgenes and Gl Santa Anita Oaks before finishing 8 1/2 lengths behind The Deputy (Ire) last time out.

4--MORE THAN READY (c, Southern Halo--Woodman's Girl, by Woodman) DI: 2.11. Showed readiness with gutsy second in Blue Grass, and has already experienced the Derby Day drama after winning the '99 WHAS-TV S. on the first Saturday in May. O-James Scatuorchio; B-Woodlyn Farm, Inc (KY); T-Todd Pletcher; J-John Velazquez.

5--WAR CHANT (c, Danzig--Hollywood Wildcat, by Kris S.) DI: 2.67. Perfect record was scratched with a second-place finish in Santa Anita Derby, but that race's runner-up has won two of the last three at Churchill-Silver Charm in '97 and Real Quiet in '98. O/B-Irving & Marjorie Cowan (KY); T-Neil Drysdale; J-Jerry Bailey.

6--CAPTAIN STEVE (c, Fly So Free--Sparkling Delite, by Vice Regent) DI: 3.57. Needs to rebound afters thirds in the GII Louisiana Derby and in the Santa Anita Derby. Only one Kentucky Derby winner has sired two--Bold Venture ('36) sired Assault ('46) and Middleground ('50). O-Caesar P. Kimmel & Philip J. 10--TRIPPI (c, End Sweep--Jealous Appeal, by Valid Appeal) DI: 3.50. Four-for-four after winning the GIII Flamingo S., he would be the fifth three-year-old to capture the first leg of the Triple Crown while undefeated. Air Shakur ended his two-year-old campaign with a win in the Dec. 26 Hopeful S. and returned this year to run second in the Mar. 5 G2 Yayoi Sho S. As favored Daitaku Riva set the early fractions, the winner settled near the back of the pack. Jockey Yutaka Take asked him to move forward around the third turn and they caught the leaders at midstretch and inched away from Daitaku Riva in the final yards. "He was pretty relaxed and broke cleanly," Take said after the victory. "My strategy was to let him show his good turn of foot in the stretch, even if it meant running wide. I am looking forward to the [G1] Japanese Derby." Take will be seeking his third straight win in the May 28 Derby at Tokyo. Rugger Regulus (Jpn) (Sakura Chitose-Oh {Jpn}) reared at the start, unseating his jockey.

He laboured to win the Dewhurst, but impressed many previously with a breathtaking effort in the G2 Champagne S. at Doncaster. If handling the prevalent track condition he will be hard to beat. **Barathea Guest** will not be inconvenienced by the ground and will give no quarter to the likely favourite. He was a shade unfortunate to be demoted when first past the post in last season's G1 Grand Criterium at Longchamp, and trainer George Margarson has been openly bullish about his star colt's well-being.

The sale of a young stallion is frequently prompted by one of two contrasting reasons. Either his early results have failed to live up to expectations, making him harder to market to mare owners, or he has done so well that his owners have be foolish not to cash in on their good fortune. The weekend's results provided examples of both these phenomena.

Dehere, the champion two-year-old of 1993, unfortunately fell into the first category. The numerous progeny from his first two crops had failed to win anything more important than a couple of Grade IIIs by the time the Japanese made a successful bid for him last fall. However, this handsome horse may yet make amends, judging by the success of his son Graeme Hall in the GII Arkansas Derby and the victory of his Australian daughter Belle du Jour (Aus) in her country's top juvenile prize, the G1 Golden Slipper S.

The stallion in the second category is End Sweep, who was sold by Mockingbird Farm in Florida to shuttle between Australia and Japan not long after he taken the title of 1998's leading freshman sire. In addition to taking first place by progeny earnings, End Sweep also established a new record for the number of juvenile winners--33--in a single crop.

The question which remained to be answered was whether End Sweep was simply another example of a Florida stallion who makes a name for himself with an impressive percentage of first-crop winners, only to fade into obscurity. For example, whatever happened to An Eldorado (19 winners in 1982) and Lawmaker (30 winners in 1986)?

Only two of End Sweep's 33 winners--Musical Sweep and B. L.'s Sweep--were deemed good enough for inclusion on the Experimental Free Handicap, and they were rated 109 and 106 respectively. Another fact to consider was that End Sweep himself won nothing more important than a Grade III event (the Jersey Shore Budweiser Breeders' Cup H.) during an 18-race career.

In the circumstances, could anyone blame Harry Mangurian Jr. for accepting an attractive offer from Arrowfield in Australia, especially when Mangurian is gradually dispersing all his breeding stock? He had been well served by End Sweep, who remained at Mocking-bird Farm long enough to complete his fifth season at stud, having covered over 400 mares in his first four seasons.

I'm pleased to say that the 14 months following End Sweep's sale have confirmed that he is more than just a prolific sire of winners. His second crop produced three qualifiers for the latest Experimental Free Handicap (Precise End, Endlessly and Sweeping) and also includes Alluring Act, a Group 3 winner in Japan. This crop is doing even better this year, with Swept Overboard winning the GIII San Miguel S. and undefeated Trippi taking both the GIII Swale S. and the GIII Flamingo S. Now Precise End has made an impressive three-year-old debut in the GIII Bay Shore S., to set up a tilt at the GIII Withers S.

Harry Mangurian may no longer own End Sweep, but the leading breeder of 1999 has the satisfaction of having bred all three of his stallion's graded-stakes winners this year and he still owns Precise End. This promising colt has now won half of his eight starts.

He still has some way to go, though, before he matches the winning tally of his dam, Precisely, a winner of 13 of her 64 starts, including a minor six-furlong stakes. Precisely is by the GI Belmont S. winner Summing, whereas the next dam, Crisp 'n Clear, was by Cold Reception, a minor winner by Secretariat.

Precise End's third dam, Ring O'Bells, was a stakes-winning sister to Purple Mountain (GII Fall Highweight H.) and another Grade II winner from this family is Call Me Up, a granddaughter of Ring O'Bells which won the GII Schuylerville S. in 1998.

UNBRIDLED'S SONG COLT TOPS KEENELAND

PREVIEW Hip #86, a colt from the first crop by Unbridled's Song out of GSW Broad Dynamite (Broad Brush), zipped one furlong in :10 1/5 over a sloppy strip at Keeneland, the fastest time for the distance during vesterday's preview of today's Keeneland April Two-Year-Old in Training Sale. From the Kirkwood Stables consignment, the gray had put in an eighth in :10 2/5 during the first under-tack show Apr. 12. Three babies tied for the fastest quarter-mile work, with Hip #15, a colt by Deputy Minister; Hip #232, a filly by Devil's Bag; and Hip #239, a colt by Hennessy, getting the distance in :21 2/5. The first, from Niall Brennan Stables, agent, is a half brother to GSW and GISP Smooth Runner. The filly, from the Robert N. Scanlon consignment, is out of SP Proud Caitlin (Proud Appeal), while the colt from Hennessy's first crop is also from the Brennan collection. The workouts were marred when Hip #101, a colt byWoodman, fractured his left front cannon bone during his breeze and had to be euthanized. The exercise rider was uninjured.

A LOOK AT THE UNDEFEATED SAMUM by Christa Riebel

In the first German Pattern event for three-year-olds this season we may have witnessed the emergence of at least two well above-average colts and three better quality ones with great hopes for the future. The eventual winner Samum maintained his unbeaten record after wearing down the unrelenting Indian Ruby. Samum raced twice as a juvenile, breaking his maiden first time out at Gelsenkirchen, which is a track with a long straight. Upon his second outing, the colt had to give everything to hold his opponent, but did so in style, demonstrating heart and a strong will to win.

Samum is a member of that highly successful young sire Monsun's first crop. Monsun ended his initial season in 1999 as the undisputed leading firstseason sire in Germany as well as being second to Big Shuffle on the list of sires of two-year-olds. Monsun, a treble Group 1 winner over 12 furlongs, is arguably the best representative of the proven cross of Konigsstuhl onto mares by Surumu. Other top class performers carrying this cross are the German Derby winners Pik Konig and Lavirco; the latter will be represented by his first runners this year.

Konigsstuhl is still Germany's sole Triple Crown winner. His sire Dschingis Khan was a Classic winning champion miler and represents a great influence for speed in any pedigree. Germany's outstanding sire influence Surumu became Gestut Fahrhof's first German Derby hero in 1974 and is the sire of three Derby winners himself. These include Acatenango, who in turn has sired Lando and Borgia as winners of this premier Classic.

Surumu's influence as a damsire is greatly respected and unsurpassed in Germany. Monsun and Lomitas are the country's two hot young sires, and both are bred from mares by Surumu. Bred by Gestut Karlshof, Samum is the first foal produced by the unraced Old Vic mare Sacarina. The Irish and French Derby hero Old Vic was one of Sadler's Wells' best sons on the track, but never met proper support at stud. From a German point of view, the interesting factor is that he is closely related to the champion and leading sire Acatenango, the best son of Surumu.

Samum's pedigree thus not only combines Konigsstuhl with Surumu on his sire's side, but also connects Surumu with the dam line that produced his very best son. Sacarina's second foal is a two-yearold colt by Platini, and her yearling filly is a full sister to Samum. This year, she foaled a filly by the Elegant Air horse Dashing Blade.

Sacarina's dam is the Ridan mare Brave Lass, whose four wins at two include victories at Newmarket and Ascot, Interestingly, Ridan comes from the same family as Old Vic's sire Sadler's Wells, which gives Samum's pedigree two strains of that influential broodmare Rough Shod. Brave Lass' other progeny include the juvenile winners Brave Owen (by Welsh Pageant) and Lady Member (by Saint Estephe), who were Group placed in England and France, respectively.

The next dam is the German 1000 Guineas winner Bravour, who ran third in the Preis der Diana (German Oaks). This daughter of Surumu's grandsire Birkhahn was exported to England. She is a half sister to the dual Classic winning champion filly Brisanz and represents a top-class female line which traces back to the imported Bunch Grass. This dam line has produced many a top-class performer in this country, and Gestut Bona is named after their foundation mare Bona who, by the way is the ancestress of another Derby hopeful by Monsun, the colt Borsato.
