DAY SETS KEENELAND MARK

Jockey Pat Day added to his growing list of achievements when he guided first time starter Unbridled Time to victory in yesterday's second race at Keeneland, giving the 46-year-old veteran a career best 717 victories at the Lexington oval. Don Brumfield had held the record since 1972. "To say the least, this is a tremendous honor," Day said. "At this point in my career, milestones have become very, very important and this is a milestone that I will cherish. I have the utmost respect for this industry, this racetrack and the man that held the record for such a long time," he added. For his part, Brumfield could not have been more pleased. "I held it (the record) for 28 years and that's a good long time. There is nothing to be sad about." Day closed the day with wins aboard King's Messenger in the fifth, Abita in the seventh and Nealski's Bro in the finale to up his total to 720 victories. Keeneland officials presented the jockey with a set of silver julep cups which will be engraved to mark the occasion. Speaking on behalf of the track, Keeneland President Nick Nicholson said, "We congratulate Pat on this wonderful milestone in his career at Keeneland. He is a great jockey and an even better human being." However, the afternoon nearly ended in disaster for Day. Following the finish of the ninth race, Day's mount stumbled, sending the rider to the ground. He was transported to the track's first aid room, but was released with no serious injuries.

ROSSINI TRIES TO CARVE CRAVEN FIELD

Rossini (Miswaki) was beaten only once from four starts as a juvenile, by Distant Music in the G2 Champagne S. at Doncaster, and boasts solid wins in the G3 Anglesey S. and G2 Prix Robert Papin. He will start as likely favourite, but faces a small yet competitive field. King's Best (Kingmambo) was impressive in his first two starts and is better than the form of his fifth-place finish to Distant Music in the G1 Dewhurst S. He raced too keenly that day and was reported to have run with his tongue over the bit. He has a solid chance. Summoner (Inchinor {GB}) will not be lacking in match fitness and is worthy of consideration based on his impressive win in a conditions event at Doncaster Mar. 25. Ekraar (Red Ransom) broke the track record at Goodwood when winning the G2 Vintage S. last July, but has something to find with Rossini on Champagne S. form.

'Deputy' Fires Bullet at Churchill:

Santa Anita Derby winner **The Deputy (Ire)** (Petardia {GB}) drilled a bullet five furlongs yesterday in :59 in his first workout over the Churchill Downs surface. The bay, owned by Team Valor, went in fractions of :23 4/5, :35 3/5 and :47, out six panels in 1:13 3/5. "I didn't know if he'd go quite that quick, but he was pretty fresh," trainer Jenine Sahadi commented. "He's been fresh since he got here. The trip took nothing out of him. He handled the track really well and my rider said he felt great." Sahadi, who will be saddling her first-ever Derby starter, plans to work The Deputy seven furlongs next week with jockey Chris McCarron expected to fly in for the work. Also at Churchill, GII Coolmore Lexington hopeful **Ben the Man** (Gulch) clocked 3/8 of a mile in :37 2/5.

Twice a winner in Listed company over Newmarket's July course last season, Indian Lodge was presented in superb condition by Amanda Perrett to win his first group race in impressive style at the expense of some useful yardsticks. He raced prominently in the early stages accompanied by Diamond White (GB) (Robellino) and Fairy Godmother at a dawdling pace. The bay colt still held a handy position as Sergeant York pulled to the front at halfway, but was sent to the front at the three-furlong marker. Afforded a tactically astute ride by Michael Kinane, Indian Lodge quickened into a race winning two-length lead approaching the final furlong and ran on well to score in easy fashion. A clearly satisfied Amanda Perrett enthused, "I'm absolutely delighted, he did it really well and I couldn't be more pleased. I think he improved so much from two to three and there was always hope that he would improve again as a four-year-old. I'm just delighted the owners kept him in training. I'll have to talk to them to see where we go from here but the trip will play a big role as to where we go." Last year's winner Shiva (Jpn) (Hector Protector) was a disappointment as the 11-10 favourite, but the slow early pace certainly did not aid her chances.

Bailey To Royal Ascot:

Top American jockey Jerry Bailey is planning to ride the Royal Ascot meeting this summer June 20-23. Bailey's agent Ron Anderson, who previously booked mounts for now retired jockey Gary Stevens, told England's Press Association, "When I became his agent earlier this year, one of the first things I said to him was that he must experience Royal Ascot. Gary thought it was fantastic and I'm sure Jerry will as well."

Silverbulletday Makes Successful Return:

Last year's three-year-old filly champion in America, **Silverbulletday** (Silver Deputy), made a victorious return to the races yesterday with a neck success in the Doubledogdare S. at Keeneland. In a field reduced from five to three, the Bob Baffert trainee, racing for the first time with front bandages, raced between horses, took over entering the stretch and proved narrowly best. The victory ended a two-race skid for the multiple Eclipse Award winner, whose last win came in last Spetember's Gl Gazelle H. at Belmont Park. Despite the narrow margin of victory, there is no cause for concern, according to winning jockey Jerry Bailey. "They're going to bring her back in 2 1/2 weeks and we wanted to run, but not gut her too much." That next start could come in the May 5 Gil Louisville Breeders' Cup H. at Churchill Downs going 1 1/16 miles.

TATTERSALLS OFF TO FLYING START A record-breaking opening day was seen at the Tattersalls Breeze-Up Sale in Newmarket yesterday, with sales turnover of 1,841,900 guineas, an increase of 36 per cent over last year. The average of 23,023 guineas represented a 26-percent jump and the median of 20,000 guineas was also ahead of last year by 33 per cent. A Pleasant Tap colt (lot 88) called Pro Dancer went for 90,000 guineas, the third-highest price ever seen at a European breeze-up sale. He will race in Hong Kong after Eamon Reilly of the Curragh Bloodstock Agency outpointed Ever Union Shokai of Japan. The Irish agent said, "He was a lovely colt and the pick this evening." The vendor Pat Doyle of Suirview Stables, County Tipperary, Ireland, who secured the colt for \$40,000 at Keeneland last September, had a great evening, selling three of the top five lots. Seamus Burns of Lodge Park Stud, County Kilkenny, went to 82,000 guineas to gain a Cadeaux Genereux colt (lot 71), consigned by another leading breeze-up vendor Malcolm Bastard. Burns said, "I had intended to buy a filly but I just loved this fellow--he had everything. You pay your money and take your chances." The underbidder was trainer Jamie Osborne. A Beau Genius colt, another from Suirview Stables, went for 57,000gns to agent Charlie Gordon-Watson on behalf of a client of trainer Ed Dunlop's Newmarket stable. Doyle had paid \$35,000 for him at Keeneland. Sir Peter O'Sullivan, the former BBC Television commentator known as the voice of racing, and his long-time friend the Marquesa de Moratalla will share a Spectrum (Ire) colt after trainer Philip Mitchell went to 52,000 guineas. The trainer, best known for Running Stag, commented, "I have not had a horse for Peter since Amigos in his Flat days, so it is good to have him back as an owner. This horse was my nap of the night." A Thunder Gulch colt, offered from Suirview Stables, was snapped up by trainer Michael Jarvis for 56,000 guineas, with Jamie Osborne again the underbidder. The sale continues this evening at 5:45 p.m.

THE MANE SAINT FASTEST AT OBS The Mane Saint (Saint Ballado) zipped a quarter mile in :21 2/5 to record the fastest two-furlong drill at the first of four under tack shows for the upcoming OBS Two-Year-Olds In Training Sale scheduled for Apr. 25-28. The colt, selling as hip number 44, is consigned to the sale by Ricky Leppala, agent. Three juveniles tied for the fastest eighth of a mile, each getting the distance in :10 2/5. Hip number 137, the filly Call Kris (Caller I.D.) is from the family of Wild Again and comes from the consignment of Eisaman Equine; hip 141, Oedy Riches (Rizzi), a filly, is consigned by Old South Farm; and hip 282, gelding Kamakou (Aloha Prospector) hails from the consignment of Sunrise Stables South. The fastest three-eighths drill was turned in by Stormy Way (Storm Creek), who stopped the clock in :34 flat. Selling as hip 305, the filly is consigned by Mark Casse, agent. The under-tack show continues this morning at 9:00 a.m. featuring hip numbers 307-612.

SLIGHT DECLINES AT OAKLAWN PARK

Oaklawn Park's 2000 meeting, which ended Saturday, showed slight declines in both attendance and handle. In figures released by the *Arkansas Democrat-Gazette*, the track's average attendance of 12,671 decreased 1.4 percent from 1999. The average daily handle of \$1,154,198 represented a drop of 1.9 percent from last year. The average handle from all sources was \$4.8 million. The track's first season of Instant Racing--a horse racing game which involves terminal wagering on races that have already been run--generated nearly \$232,000 in daily handle. The program was introduced to combat competition from nearby casinos. "Getting off to a good start means a great deal to what we're trying to do," Oaklawn general manager Eric Jackson told the *Gazette*. "I think the publicity and enthusiasm over Instant Racing had a lot to do with that as well. Ever since the casinos opened, Oaklawn and Southland both have been watching their businesses steadily erode, and the question has been is there a stopping point. The question that I'm hopeful that we answered this year is maybe we have turned the corner."

BUCKY TO BYPASS SAN JUAN CAPISTRANO

Trainer Noel Hickey has decided to take a pass on Saturday's GI San Juan Capistrano at Santa Anita with Buck's Boy (Bucksplasher). The 1998 Eclipse Award winner was assigned co-highweight of 121 pounds, a fact which led Hickey to his decision. "We kicked around the weights and don't want to fight the laws of physics," Hickey told *Daily Racing Form*. "We don't want to run as the highweight going a mile-and-three-quarters." Hickey told the *Form* that the seven-year-old would be aimed at the Arlington Million and Breeders' Cup Turf later in the year.

The two-time Eclipse champion Silverbulletday, making her first start since finishing sixth in the Breeder's Cup Distaff last November, was made the prohibitive favorite after the field was reduced to three by the scratches of Keeper Hill (Deputy Minister) and French Braids (Personal Flag). The three were tightly bunched from the start, with Pepita Ramjoe enjoying a slim lead. Silverbulletday forged to the front after three-quarters, opened a 1 1/2-length lead in the stretch and then held off Roza Robata for a narrow win. "I was just a passenger," said winning jockey Jerry Bailey. "The whole idea was to try to win today as easily as we could. Every time they [Pat Day and Roza Robata] came to us, she just took right back off on me again."

WRITERS UP

NORTON HEADS MILLS HOPEFULS

Terry Mills trains in the vicinity of one of the world's most illustrious and mystical racecourses on the Epsom Downs at Loretta Lodge. Mills doesn't know too much about traditional training backgrounds, being the former owner of a waste disposal company, but he knows about training good racehorses. Last year he brought All The Way (Ire) (Shirley Heights {GB}) close to glory in the G1 Epsom Derby, leading for most of the race before finishing fifth, and kept him sweet enough throughout the summer to finish fourth in the G1 St Leger at Doncaster before he was bought by Godolphin. This time around he is hoping to take closer order with some useful prospects. First among them is Norton (Ire) (Barathea {Ire}), who finished a good fifth on his debut in the significant Newbury maiden in September won by Scarteen Fox (Ire), just behind Wekiwa Springs (Fr), Zafonium (USA) and Misraah (Ire). He was out of sorts with a tooth abscess next time in the Listed Autumn S. at Ascot in October, but bounced back to take a Redcar maiden in November. Mills' son Robert explains: "As a two-year-old we thought he was better than All The Way, having the potential to be a really good horse. The maiden at the end of the year was just an exercise, so as to put him away with no bad feelings, and so that he could feel like the king of the castle. We'll see how he comes along, but his work is very pleasing and he has grown well. The weather hasn't helped, and the ground is a bit atrocious at the moment, so the majority of the horses are at the same stage. It depends on how much speed he's actually got, but he may go straight to the 2000 Guineas, and if he misses that then he'll go to the Epsom Derby." Mills also boasts the filly Issey Rose (Ire) (Bigstone {Ire}), who ran well in finishing second at Goodwood and third at Newmarket in some well-contested maidens before winning a maiden at Folkestone. Her best effort, however, came in her fourth in the G1 Fillies' Mile at Ascot behind Teggiano (Ire) in September, before finishing a disappointing last in the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac at Longchamp. Robert Mills said: "She's entered everywhere, but whether it'll come too early I don't know, as the fillies still have their winter coats. The 1000 Guineas, or the Irish 1000 Guineas is the first port of call, but we might step her up to ten furlongs or a mile-and-a-half, and she's in the G1 Prix de Diane Hermes." There are also two dark horses waiting in the wings with entries in the G1 Epsom Derby, Bid For Fame (USA) (Quest For Fame {GB}), and a German acquisition in Torrid Kentavr (USA) (Tremolino {USA}), who finished fourth in his only race in Milan last year: "Bid For Fame is pleasing enough, while Torrid Kentavr is a nice horse who is doing well, but he has a lot of growing and furnishing to do and while he's in the Epsom Derby, he's also in the Italian and German Derbies." Mills will be hoping that, metaphorically, as well as geographically, the winning post is within reach.
