BEAUMONT OCTET

Swept Away (Mystery Storm) will try to earn the first graded victory of her career in today's GII Stonerside Beaumont S. at Keeneland. The filly's lone loss in five career outings was a game runner-up finish in the seven-furlong Jan. 30 GIII Forward Gal S. She returned from that defeat to win the Mar. 10 Jeano S. at Gulfstream in her last start. **Darling My Darling** (Deputy Minister) was 3/4 lengths second in the GI Matron last fall and lost the GI Frizette by only a head behind Surfside. Off three months after a fifth-place outing in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, she returned to win a Feb. 20 Gulfstream allowance at this distance in her last start. **Trip** (Lord at War {Arg}) has been unbeaten since finishing fifth to Swept Away in her debut last June at Churchill. After a pair of Fair Grounds wins this past winter, the filly scored a two-length victory in the Mar. 25 Bourbonette S. at Turfway last time out.

TATTERSALLS CONTINUES UPWARD TREND

The 2000 Tattersalls Breeze-Up Sale broke all records, with turnover reaching 3,843,500 guineas--the first time the 3-million guineas barrier had been broken. There was also the first six-figure transaction in the history of European breeze-up sales. A filly by champion sire Sadler's Wells, consigned by Con Marnane of Bansha House Stables in Co. Tipperary, Ireland, sold for a final bid of 125,000 guineas to agent Jimmy Byrne. Don Brothwell, on behalf of Malaysian interests, was the underbidder to Byrne who was acting for a client of Denis Mahony, father of the Tattersalls chairman Edmond. Another agent, Peter Doyle, swooped to secure the next most expensive lot, a grey son of Cozzene for 74,000 guineas, beating off James Delahooke. The colt was 'reserve not attained' for \$42,000 at Keeneland in September and will now race for a client of trainer Richard Hannon. Tattersalls Chairman Edmond Mahony, commenting on the overall strength of the sale, said, "The steady evolution of the Tattersalls Breeze-Up has been one of the features of our sales calendar in recent years. The sale has gone from strength to strength, based not only on sale-ring returns, but also more importantly on racecourse performances of graduates from the sale. We knew that vendors had presented us with a serious catalogue, and the figures very much suggest that this was the highest quality breeze-up seen in Europe to date." **Top lots p. 2**

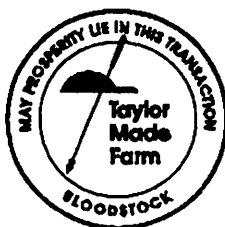

CRAVEN S.-G3 results cont.

Umistim's finest hour as a two-year-old came in his defeat of stablemate Cape Town (Ire) in the G3 Horris Hill S. at Newbury in October. When that horse won Wednesday's Listed European Free H., it was a strong pointer to that form, and so it proved as Richard Hannon enjoyed more success here. Placed in second early by Richard Hughes as Adilabad (Gulch) set a fast pace, he looked beaten as King's Best moved smoothly to the front with two furlongs remaining, but he rallied well, and despite being carried wide by the drifting leader, got on top with 100 yards to run to win a shade comfortably in the end, earning a 14-1 quote for the G1 2000 Guineas S. with William Hill. His trainer said, "We can't tell the difference between him and Cape Town at home, but he'll come on a lot as he's not quite there, and he's having a good blow. He'll improve a lot but he definitely wants rain [between now and the 2000 Guineas]."

Surfside Definitely Out of Derby:

GI Santa Anita Oaks winner Surfside (Seattle Slew) will not be in the line-up for the Kentucky Derby or the Kentucky Oaks. The filly underwent surgery to remove a chip in her ankle yesterday at the Rood and Riddle Equine Hospital in Lexington, Kentucky. The chip was discovered when x-rays were taken during a routine examination of the filly. "Dr. Copelan takes a routine look at all of the Overbrook horses every five or six weeks," said trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "She had checked out perfectly and [veterinarian] Bob [Copelan] just said, 'Well, let's take a few pictures.' That's how we found it." Surfside showed no signs of discomfort from the injury. "You could have knocked me over with a feather when I saw the picture," Lukas said. "I've never trained a sounder horse."

MARSHALL NAIFY DEAD Marshall Naify of 505 Farms in Lexington, Kentucky, died Tuesday in a San Francisco hospital. He was 80. Naify campaigned champion Bertrando and multiple Grade I winner Manistique. In addition to his breeding operations, Naify was chairman of Toddao, a Los Angeles-based movie production company. His father founded United California Theaters in the 1920s. Merged with United Artists Theater Circuit in 1963, Naify and his brother were in control of the company until selling it in 1986. Plans for services have not been finalized.

LORD AT WAR FILLY SWIFTEST AT OBS A filly by Lord at War (Arg)--Wanda Kaye (Timeless Native) posted the fastest one-furlong work of yesterday's under tack preview of the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company Spring Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training in Ocala, Florida. Hip number 572, consigned by Robert McElroy, Agent III, covered the distance in :10 2/5. Two juveniles tied for the session's fastest quarter-mile work of :21 3/5. They were hip number 463, a colt by Pick Up the Phone--Super Seniorita (El Baba) and hip number 553, a filly by Diablo--Value Added (Far Out East). The fastest three-furlong time of :34 4/5 was shared by hip number 330, a filly by Fit to Fight--Secretorose (Secreto), and hip number 537, a filly by Rizzi--Twigazuri (Dixieland Band). The under tack show resumes Friday morning at 9 a.m. with hip numbers 613-918 scheduled to breeze. The OBS sale will be held April 25-28 with sessions beginning at 10:30 a.m.

SHAWNEE COUNTRY RETIRED Shawnee Country (Chief's Crown--Mi Lucia, by Icecapade) has been retired from racing after suffering a bone chip. The three-year-old filly captured the Gill Davona Dale and Gill Fair Grounds Oaks in New Orleans this past winter. The Overbrook Farm colorbearer is expected to be bred to Storm Cat later this spring. Shawnee Country won last year's Gill Tempted S. and finished third in the Gill Demoiselle S. She retires with five wins in 11 starts and earnings of \$430,660.

Albarado Wins Number 2000:

Jockey Robby Albarado won the 2,000th race of his career in yesterday's ninth race at Keeneland. "One of my goals is to beat his record," Albarado said with a nod in the direction of Pat Day, who became Keeneland's all-time leading jockey on Wednesday. Day has won 717 races at Keeneland. The ninth race was Albarado's 76th trip to the Kentucky track's winner's circle.

Beautiful Pleasure Works:

Champion Beautiful Pleasure (Maudlin) breezed five furlongs in 1:00 3/5 over Keeneland's main track yesterday. The five-year-old mare, winner of last year's Breeders' Cup Distaff, was a disappointing fifth in her 2000 debut in the Apr. 9 GI Apple Blossom at Oaklawn. She is expected to start next in the May 5 GI Louisville Breeders' Cup at Churchill Downs where she will likely meet champion three-year-old filly Silverbulletday (Silver Deputy).

Show Me the Stage to Lone Star Park:

Show Me the Stage (Slew the Surgeon), originally expected to start next in the May 4 Mamzelle S. at Churchill Downs, will instead make her next trip to the post in the May 29 Wild Flower S. at Lone Star Park. The four-year-old crack sprinter beat the boys in the Apr. 13 GIII Count Fleet S. at Oaklawn Park in her last outing. "By waiting for the Wild Flower, she will be fresh for the \$400,000 [GIII] Princess Rooney at Calder [July 15]," explained trainer Eric Guillot. Guillot also issued a challenge to Lloyd Romero, co-owner and trainer of Hallowed Dreams (Malagra). A three-year-old filly, Hallowed Dreams is undefeated in 12 starts, while ducking the top competition. "Instead of running against allowance horses at Evangeline, I'm challenging Lloyd to run Hallowed Dreams against Show Me the Stage in a match race," Guillot said. "We'll take him right here at Lone Star Park."

If spectators felt before now that what they have seen this week at Newmarket is not quite Classic-winning material, they will perhaps not be surprised to find that Ladbrokes make Aidan O'Brien's **Giant's Causeway (USA)** (Storm Cat {USA}), who had his trial at home in the G3 Gladness S., the new 9-4 favourite for the G1 2000 Guineas May 6. **Distant Music (USA)** (Distant View {USA}), for so long the solid favourite for the race, is available at 3-1 with the same firm, although he remains the first choice of the Tote at 5-2. His conqueror in Tuesday's G3 Greenham S., **Barathea Guest (GB)** (Barathea {Ire}), is still available at 7-1 with William Hill, while **Misraah (Ire)** (Lure {USA}), who did not produce the display many were expecting on Tuesday, is 8-1. Although Henry Cecil's **Western Summer (USA)** (Summer Squall {USA}) let down ante-post plungers in the Listed Fielden S., finishing a well-beaten fourth, it was the trainer's **Shibboleth (USA)** (Danzig {USA}) who really impressed on Thursday, albeit in a maiden. Although his trainer said he did not want to rush him after the race, connections may now be tempted to go to the 2000 Guineas, and he is 8-1 with Coral and Ladbrokes to do so and win. The successful Richard Hannon pair **Cape Town (Ire)** (Desert Style {Ire}) and **Umistim (GB)** (Inchinor {GB}) are on offer at 8-1 and 14-1 respectively for the Classic with William Hill.

MARKETING GO-AHEAD

The Levy Board yesterday heard a presentation of the Three-Year Marketing Plan for Racing and Betting by the three marketing consultants who had prepared it. The plan, which will see vigorous marketing of both racing and betting, was supported by the Levy Board and its implementation will be overseen by Sir John Robb, who heads the Levy Board's Marketing Sub-Committee. Details will be published in May. The Levy Board agreed to spend up to £3 million in 2000/2001 in support of the Plan. The Board agreed earlier this year that at least £10 million would be needed to support marketing over the next three years.

Following a meeting of the Industry Committee (Horse Racing) Ltd, held Dec. 9, it was agreed that the Federation of Bloodstock Agents (GB) along with the Thoroughbred Breeders' Association, the National Trainers' Federation and the Thoroughbred Auctioneers (UK), should review current working practices. As a result it has been agreed that in order to assist their clients, and particularly the non-professional horse buyer, with the way in which auctions operate, both companies are producing their own "Guide to Sales" for the benefit of all participants. The Guides are in the course of preparation and will be available before the commencement of the yearling sales later in the year.

NEWBURY RACECOURSE ANNOUNCES PROFIT

Newbury Racecourse plc returned a profit after tax of £146,000 for the 12 months to December 31, 1999, compared with a loss of £313,000 in 1998. The Hon. Sir David Sieff, the Newbury Racecourse Chairman, attributes this mainly to the cost-cutting measures which happened at the start of 1999. The construction of the new £8.6 million Tattersalls Grandstand started in November, 1999, and is on schedule to be finished in time for the Hennessy Meeting November 24 and 25, 2000. No dividend will be paid by Newbury Racecourse plc because of the need to conserve cash during the construction period and to optimise the company's tax position. Sieff concluded his remarks by saying, "Without everyone's enthusiasm and hard work, we could not have achieved the progress made. There is still much to be done, but we are very excited by future prospects. My thanks to all our supporters, including annual members, owners, trainers and their staff, to all racegoers, and all who use the racecourse facilities--we welcome your comments."
