LONELINESS OF LONG-DISTANCE RUNNERS

A short field of six will go forward in the 61st running of the San Juan, America's longest Grade I event. Following the defections of highweights Buck's Boy and Dark Moondancer (Ire), Single Empire (Ire) (Kris (GB)) will go postward in defense of his title, a race which marked his last victory. The last San Juan double was achieved by Niarkos in 1967-68. Single Empire fell a nose short of Dark Moondancer in the 12-furlong GII San Luis Rey Mar. 18 and has been training smartly since that effort. "I thought he may have needed the race a bit," said trainer Neil Drysdale. "But we needed to run there if we were to run again in the San Juan, and he gave a good account of himself." His main challenge will come from his own shedrow, with Drysdale also sending out Sunshine Street (Sunshine Forever). Third in the 1998 G1 St. Leger over Doncaster's extended 14 furlongs, he acquitted himself well later that year when fifth in Buck's Boy's GI Breeder's Cup Turf. The bay horse has captured both 2000 starts, including an optional claimer over this course Apr. 2.

STONERSIDE CAPTURES BEAUMONT GOLD

Stonerside, sponsoring the GII Beaumont S. for the first time, took home the money when their Sahara Gold (Seeking the Gold) put forth a determined effort to capture her first graded victory. "People don't understand how hard that is to do," remarked winning jockey Jerry Bailey. "It doesn't work out that way very often." A stakes winner at two, Sahara Gold was a flat fifth in Gulfstream's GIII Forward Gal over seven furlongs to open her 2000 season, her lone try at the distance. She returned with a three-wide trip when second in an Aqueduct allowance April Fool's Day. Breaking from the rail, the bay filly rated off the pace as Swept Away (Mystery Storm) and Asher (Mountain Cat) duked it out through fractions of :22 1/5 and :44 3/5. Checked on the turn. she angled out four wide and collared Swept Away at the eighth pole and outfought that rival to the wire. "She tried to run going around the turn, but there was absolutely nowhere to go," Bailey explained. "I was able to move out a little and it worked out." Second-choice Darling My Darling (Deputy Minister) looked a bit lackadaisical in the early going, but finished strongly for the show spot.

Fourth in the GI Spinaway and third in the GI Frizette S. while still a maiden. March Magic cruised to an 8 3/4-length score over maidens at Aqueduct Nov. 4 and ended the season in the Nov. 27 GII Demoiselle S., finishing second by a head to Jostle. She picked up a Gulfstream allowance on her three-year-old bow Feb. 27 and missed by just a neck as runner-up in her latest appearance, the Mar. 19 GIII Florida Oaks. The favorite in her return to New York, the bay tracked Southern Sandra (Dixie Brass) and Jostle through six furlongs in 1:11 1/5, came with a three-wide bid at the top of the lane and outfinished Jostle for the score. "She had to work pretty hard, but she got the job done," trainer Rick Violette Jr. said. "I think she is a cut below the best three-year-old fillies, but she is still improving." As for what's next, he said, "We'll look at the Black Eyed Susan (May 19, GII at Pimlico) or the Selene (May 22, GI at Woodbine)."

An octet of three-year-olds looking for tickets to the May 6 GI Kentucky Derby, they are headed by Rollin With Nolan, from the stable of two-time Derby winning trainer Nick Zito. "I really think that he's ready to run the best race of his life," said Zito. By the sire of last year's Derby hero Charismatic (who also prepped for the "Run for the Roses" in this race), the chestnut defeated GI Toyota Blue Grass third Wheelaway in a Gulfstream allowance test Feb. 19, then tried stakes company for the first time and finished third behind Globalize after pressing the pace in the Mar. 25 GII Turfway Spiral S. The Spiral S. winner has won five of his eight career starts, including the GIII California Juvenile at two and the Golden State Mile in his second start this year. Commendable ships out of California for the first time after finishing fourth, a length behind War Chant, in the Mar. 4 GII San Rafael S. and fourth again, this time four off Fusaichi Pegasus, in the Mar. 19 GII San Felipe S. He looks for his first win since breaking his maiden at Del Mar last August. Cocky cruised to a 13-length tally in the an off-the-turf maiden affair Feb. 11and came back to be third, beaten only three-quarters of a length, in the San Rafael, but showed little in his latest. Off at 16-1 in the Apr. 8 GI Santa Anita Derby, he was wide throughout and finished sixth.

Snow Polina, a Listed winner and Group placed in France, has won two of her five U.S. starts, taking a Belmont allowance last May and a Gulfstream allowance two starts back Feb. 11. Fourth to champion Soaring Softly in the 1999 GII Sheepshead Bay H., she tried stakes competition again in her latest outing and was second in the Mar. 4 Bayou Breeders' Cup H. at Fair Grounds. Neptune's Bride, another import, captured three of her last four French starts, including a pair of Listed events. The four-year-old made her American debut last time out and rallied to be third in the Bayou Breeders' Cup. Champagne Royal, three-for-six at this distance, hasn't won since carrying Julie Krone to victory in the 1998 Statue of Liberty S. at Monmouth, but has been on the board in five of her last six tries. She missed by only three-quarters of a length in her most recent effort, the Mar. 5 GII Orchid H. at 1 1/2 miles.

Down The Aisle came back after a nine-month layoff to take the Mar. 25 GIII Bougainvillea H. by a half length over Mi Narrow, with Grade I winner Honor Glide another half length back in third. The seven-year-old, who missed the entire 1998 season, has been on the board in 12 of his 13 career starts, with a second-place finish behind champion Chief Bearhart in the 1997 GI Canadian International. He is undefeated in four starts over the Gulfstream turf course. Beautiful Dancer, a Group 1 winner in Brazil, was off the board in the GI Man o'War S. and GI Canadian International last fall and came back to be fourth, beaten eight lengths by Royal Anthem in the Feb. 12 GI Gulfstream Park Breeders' Cup H. He showed signs of life in his latest, finishing third by a length to Buck's Boy in the Mar. 4 GII Pan American H., but was disqualified and placed sixth.

China Visit Maintains Derby Course:

Snetterton (GB)

The main colts race of Godolphin's Nad al Sheba trials was taken, not surprisingly, by Kentucky Derby hopeful China Visit (Red Ransom), who confirmed the form of the UAE Derby by beating Curule (Go For Gin) by 3 1/4 lengths, covering the 1 1/16 miles in a time of 1:44.20. China Visit lacks graded stakes earnings, which makes his Kentucky Derby status questionable, but he will ship to Louisville Tuesday from Dubai. If more than 20 horses are entered in the Derby, preference will based on graded stakes earnings.

Anees Breezes:

The Thoroughbred Corp.'s Anees (Unbridled) had his first breeze under the Twin Spires, getting five furlongs in 1:03. "I think at this point it was exactly what we needed," said trainer Alex Hassinger. "He's eating all of his oats and doing everything you could ask him to do." Last year's champion will have two more breezes for the May 6 Derby. "We're going to probably have a serious seven-eighths of a mile work, a good long work," Hassinger said. "Then he'll have kind of a blowout...a half-mile or five-eighths or something. We'll just go one work at a time."

Chief Seattle Disappoints:

Godolphin's **Chief Seattle** (Seattle Slew) finished a non-threatening fourth in a trial race at Nad al Sheba, eight lengths behind winner **China Visit** (Red Ransom), *The Blood Horse* reported. The dark bay colt, third in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, stumbled at the start and failed to make an impact thereafter. He is scheduled to accompany China Visit when that colt ships Tuesday.

CLASSIC PICTURE CLEARER AFTER DUBAI

TRIALS Godolphin's trials at Nad Al Sheba took place again yesterday, with the results likely to have significant consequence on running plans in the Classics. The G1 1000 Guineas S. contender Teggiano (Ire) (Mujtahid) was swept aside in the fillies' trial by Bintalreef (Diesis {GB}), who now enters calculations for that Classic, being cut to 6-1 by William Hill. Teggiano is now a 16-1 chance in their books. Fath (Danzig {USA}), who was runner-up in last year's G1 Middle Park S., remains a 16-1 chance with the same firm despite winning his trial narrowly, while Farfesheena (Rahy), a maiden after one run at Ascot last year, took the second fillies' trial, and is now available at 16-1 for the G1 Epsom Oaks S. Of the older horses. Aliabr (Storm Cat) showed his mettle by accounting for Diktat (GB) (Warning {GB}) by two lengths in a time of 1:37.70.

DISTANT MUSIC LAME Distant Music (Distant View), winner of last year's G1 Dewhurst S. and former favorite for the May 6 G1 2000 Guineas S. at Newmarket, was found to be lame after he lost his unbeaten record when second in Newmarket's G3 Greenham S. Tuesday, it was announced by his trainer yesterday. "Distant Music returned from his Newmarket run and was found to be lame on his off-fore foot the following day," said trainer Barry Hills. "There was some congealed blood in the foot, which could explain his display. There has been significant improvement in him during the last 24 hours. Hopefully, we will be able to get a shoe back on him on Sunday or Monday."

RACING AGAINST THE WIND AT OBS Some fast times were recorded at the third day of the Under Tack Show for the Ocala Breeder's Sales Company's 2000 Spring Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training despite a steady 14 mph headwind, with gusts up to 25 mph throughout much of the session. Hip 717, a Fortunate Prospect colt from Farnsworth Farms, agent, zipped three-eighths in :33 4/5 to top the session. A Crusader Sword filly selling as Hip 641 from the Eisaman Equine consignment recorded the fastest eighth, stopping the clock in :10 2/5. Three juveniles shared the top quartermile breeze with a time of :22 flat. They are Hip 704, a Montbrook half brother to graded winner Cold Execution, sells from the Ocala Stud Farms consignment; Hip 763, a Kipper Kelly filly offered by Eisaman Equine, agent; and Hip 671, an End Sweep filly from the McKathan Farms, agent consigment. The Under Tack Show resumes today at 9:00 a.m. when Hip No.'s 919-1221 will breeze. The Spring Sales is scheduled to run from Tuesday, Apr. 25 through Friday, Apr. 28. All sessions will begin at 10:30 a.m.

SHOW ME THE MONEY Eric Guillot, trainer of multiple graded-stakes winner Show Me the Stage (Slew the Surgeon), has challenged the connections of undefeated Hallowed Dreams (Malagra) to a match race. Show Me the Stage defeated colts in the GIII Count Fleet Sprint H. at Oaklawn Park in her last outing. "I faxed the challenge to the Evangeline Downs racing office," Guillot said. "Let him bring his filly up here to Lone Star Park and run against Show Me the Stage in a match race. I've proposed that we put up \$25,000, [co-owner Lloyd Romero] puts up \$25,000, and it's winner take all."

CONFIDENCE GROWS FOR HANNON HORSES

After the success of Richard Hannon's Cape Town (Ire) (Desert Style {Ire}) in the Listed European Free H. and Umistim (GB) (Inchinor {GB}) in the G3 Craven S., both recognised G1 2000 Guineas S. trials, this week, another stable contender, Mana-Mou Bay (Ire) (Ela-Mana-Mou {Ire}) has been shortened by William Hill from 40-1 to 20-1 for that Classic. The colt is set to make his reappearance in today's Listed Easter S. at Kempton, a race his trainer virtually made his own in the 90s, having won it five times. He looked a prospect when taking last year's Listed Washington Singer S. at Newbury. Hannon has won the G1 2000 Guineas S. three times, and this year seems to have considerable strength-in-depth among his three-year-old colts.

PULLED MUSCLE FOR ROYAL HIGHLANDER

John Hills' Royal Highlander (Ire) (Foxhound {USA}) returned with a pulled muscle over his quarter on his offside after his disappointing run when favourite for the Listed European Free H. Wednesday.

JUVENTUS BUY RACECOURSE

Italian football giants Juventus have bought Turin Racecourse and the area surrounding it as part of a development plan which includes a shopping centre and other sports and entertainment facilities. The thoroughbred track will be located beside the trotting track, just outside Turin on the Tangenziale, close to the stables and hunting pavilion. Tommaso Grassi, the President of Societa' Torinese Corse Cavalli, who manages the course and is a shareholder of the company who owned the land, said that the offer, thought to be in the region of £10 million, was too good to be refused. Despite having the fourth-highest prize money levels in the country behind Rome, Milan and Naples, racecourse attendance at Turin has been limited to date, but developers are hoping that not only locals, but tourists as well, will be attracted to the new complex. The construction will force the closing of Turin beginning next summer, leaving 100 horses and their connections with the problem of relocating. Milan will also be affected, as most of the horses racing at Turin come from the San Siro training centre.

TELLINI HEADING DOWN UNDER?

Prominent Italian jockey Max Tellini may be heading to Australia shortly, where he is considering three offers at the Victoria training centre. Tellini spent this past winter in Macao, where he won seven races and impressed the local trainers and agents. The 24-year-old currently rides for Scuderia Zaro in Milan, and it was from this base that he won last year's G2 Premio Parioli (Italian 2000 Guineas) in Rome with Alabama Jacks (Ire) (Magical Wonder {USA}). He is also planning to apply to the Hong Kong Jockey Club to ride there next winter.

BOOKMAKERS CHANGE MIND ON FUND

Ladbrokes, Wiliam Hill and Coral have reversed their position and will contribute to the Rehabilitation of Racehorses Fund, according to the *Sporting Life Online*. The fund, whose targeted budget is £200,000, will be used to suppport three centres in the UK: the Thoroughbred Rehabilitation Centre in Cumbria, the Moorcroft Racing Welfare Centre in Sussex, and the Greatwood Centre in Devon. The *Sporting Life* called their earlier decision not to support the fund "a public relations disaster which they have now taken steps to rectify." Bookmakers Victor Chandler, Done Brothers and Bet Direct had already pledged £10,000 each to the fund. The paper quoted Fund organiser Andrew Parker Bowles as saying, "A contribution from the three biggest bookmakers will be very welcome."
