THANKS A LATTE

On the heels of a narrow stakes victory at Maisons-Laffitte last July 1, Caffe Latte (Seattle Dancer) shipped to the U.S. and made an immediate impression, finishing a solid second in the July 31 GII Santa Barbara H., but disappointed when eighth in the GI Del Mar Oaks in her next start. Second behind Spanish Fern (El Gran Senor) in the GI Yellow Ribbon at this trip Oct. 2, the bay was fourth, beaten only a length in the Breeders' Cup Filly/Mare Turf in her final 1999 outing. A 1 1/4-length winner of her seasonal debut going a mile Apr. 6 when adding blinkers for the first time, Caffe Latte was made the second choice by the wagering public. Favored Happyanunoit (Yachtie {Aus}), winner in her 1999 finale of the GI Matriarch, broke uncharacteristically sharply and set a methodical pace as the field stacked up behind her with Caffe Latte tracking from the rear early on. The Bob Baffert trainee turned up the heat on the front runner at the quarter pole, stuck a head in front with a furlong to run and outgamed her New Zealandbred foe to score her first graded-stakes victory. "This is a special filly," commented winning rider Corey Nakatani. "I knew Happyanunoit was a tough filly and that she wasn't going to give it up. I wanted to make sure that I had enough horse for a battle, knowing the other one wouldn't give it up. I was very fortunate to get the job done."

RHENIUM BENEFITS FROM ARISTOTLE'S DO

Rhenium (Ire) (Rainbows For Life) was awarded a race of considerable drama as Aristotle (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) was brought home first, only to lose the race in the steward's room. Last year's G1 Racing Post Trophy winner was settled well in a cat-and-mouse game early with Sobieski (Ire) (Polish Precedent), which lasted until after the final bend. As the favourite floundered on the rail, Aristotle started to dominate the race, but then inexplicably lurched left, and continued to do so all the way up the straight. He interfered with the Boutron (Fr) (Exit to Nowhere) and lost several lengths by going across the course, but was still too strong for Rhenium, who had a less volatile run up the rail. Winning trainer Rouget said, "I always thought that (Rhenium) had ability and I ran him here to test him. He had shown liking for heavy ground previously, but it is certain also that the result of the race would have been different if the Irish horse had gone straight." Mick Kinane said of Aristotle, "He is a nice horse and will stay further than that but I don't know what happened. I tried everything I could to keep him going straight but he went in and out again. He was the best horse in the race." The winner could be back for the G1 Prix Lupin May 14.

Berine's Son came into this race with merely a conditions success to his name, having won well at Maisons-Laffitte Mar. 21, but he was not inconvenienced by such lack of experience, impressing with his attitude as he beat more battle-hardened rivals. Settled at the back of the field which was taken along at a sedate pace early by Crystal D'Ass (Fr) (Northern Crystal {GB}), Berine's Son coasted until the sprint began after the home turn. Weaving his way through the field, he quickened and covered the ground well, hitting the front with 100 yards remaining before winning with something in hand from the unlucky-in-running Premier Pas, earning a chance to go for the G1 Poule d'Essai Des Poulains here May 14. Jockey Christophe Soumillon, recording his first Group win, said afterwards, "The intention was to travel much closer but he broke slow and I had no other choice. He went smoothly throughout and when I found an opening, he jumped and quickened very nicely. He is definitely a very good horse and I am thrilled to win my first Group race for Mr. Fabre."

Lady of Chad took an undefeated record into this Easter Sunday event, having won an allowance event in September and the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac in October--both at Longchamp--in her only prior two outings. Making the first start of her three-year-old career, Lady of Chad settled in second early tracking the leader, her pacemaker Saone Et Loire (Fr) (Always Fair). The eventual winner was always travelling well, and when jockey Gerald Mosse asked her to quicken, she took a while to get going in the ground, but kept on gamely from the fast-finishing Texalina. Winning trainer Richard Gibson said, "She had a twisted ankle this winter and didn't have an ideal preparation. But she showed today that she has lost nothing of her quality. I feel that she has improved a lot physically and that she will improve more off that run. She settled well in second and with only three races under her belt, she is still learning." Victorious owner John Martin added, "Gerald gave her a great ride and I think the pacemaker did a good job as well. This was only a trial though so we will have to see how she gets on in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches (French 1000 Guineas) May 14." The runner-up Texalina will now go to the G1 Prix de Diane Hermes (French Oaks) at Chantilly June 11.

Placed in both starts as a juvenile, including a second to Subiaco (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}) at Dusseldorf in October, Kallisto broke his maiden here in impressive style, winning by four lengths Mar. 26. Settled towards the rear of this field early on as Kalimas (Ger) (Lomitas {GB}) set a good pace, the colt, joined by Sweet Brief and Abalon, moved to the front around the final turn. Sweet Brief was unable to quicken, but Kallisto and Abalon engaged in a brief duel before the winner assumed command and quickened away. Favourite Subiaco, who clearly failed to handle the track contours, drifted wide on the first turn, dropped back to last and nearly fell, but came again in the straight and finished well for fourth.

WAR CHANT TO THREE CHIMNEYS A 50-percent interest in GI Santa Derby runner up War Chant (Danzig) has been sold by owners Irving and Marjorie Cowan to Robert Clay's Three Chimneys Farm near Midway, Kentucky, The Blood-Horse Online reports. The deal to stand the three-year-old son of 1993 Champion three-year-old filly Hollywood Wildcat was completed was completed Saturday, according to Clay. "He'll continue to race in the Cowans' colors," Clay told The Blood-Horse Saturday from Keeneland. "Mr. Cowan will remain the racing manager and I'll be the syndicate manager." Neil Drysdale will continue to train the horse. While financial details of the deal were not divulged, Clay did say that Robert McNair's Stonerside Farm is a "significant partner." There has also been interest expressed by Arrowfield Stud in Australia to stand the dark bay during the Southern Hemisphere season.

SUNLINE UPSET IN DONCASTER Getting 13 pounds from the New Zealand champion, three-year-old Over (Aus) (Dr. Grace {NZ}) battled the length of the stretch to beat 11-4 favorite Sunline (NZ) (Desert Sun {GB}) by a neck in Saturday's G1 Doncaster H. at Randwick in Australia. But despite the narrow margin of victory, winning jockey Darren Gauci claimed to be confident of the outcome. "I was just holding [Over] together, waiting for the last 100 metres because he had the weight advantage and I knew [Sunline] would continue to fight on," Gauci told the Sydney Morning Herald. "We kept on level terms until about the 100" when I gave him everything and he pulled clear." An 8-1 chance in the Doncaster, Over captured a pair of Group races last season, but was notching his first Group 1 score. He goes next in the G1 All Aged S. at Randwick Apr. 29. Steve McKee, co-trainer of the runner-up, was not disappointed in his gallant filly, who was defending her title in the Doncaster. "She ran her heart out as she always does, but it all proved too much in the end," he told SMH.

FAIRWAY FLIES TO AJC DERBY WIN Let go at 12-1 despite winning eight of 10 previous outings, Fairway (Aus) (Sanzero {Aus}) and jockey Brian York went right to the front in Saturday's G1 AJC Australian Derby at Randwick and led every step to win by two lengths over 11-2 Shogun Lodge (Aus) (Grand Lodge). Rebounding from a subpar performance over a wet track in the G1 Rosehill Guineas two weeks ago, the colt set all the pace and opened up at the top of the stretch to gain his third Group 1 success. "He's a good horse, this one," York told the Sydney Morning Herald. "He has a great cruising speed and although I wasn't sure whether he'd run the mile and a half out, I'm sure he's a Caulfield and Melbourne Cups horse next spring." York may not partner the colt in future events, as he has decided to give up his spot as trainer Jack Denham's number-one rider to concentrate on free-lance opportunities. Purchased for NZ\$40,000, Fairway has now earned more than A\$2 million.

ELLERTON EARNS FIRST GROUP 1 WIN Young trainer Matthew Ellerton earned his first Group 1 win at Randwick in Australia Saturday, sending out Black Bean (Aus) (Raami {GB}) to take the G1 Galaxy S. by a short head from Commands (Aus) (Danehill). Ellerton had to sweat out first the photo finish and then a claim of foul by the runner-up before claiming his prize. "That would have been a character builder," Ellerton, 26, told the Sydney Morning Herald after the decision. "To think I'd finally got a Group 1, and then almost had it taken away. What a feeling." Off at 10-1, Black Bean was a two-time Group 3 winner last year and was second in this season's G1 Newmarket H. The four-year-old was rated near the back of the pack early, but came flying up the inside to get up in the final strides. He heads next to the G1 Stradbroke H. at Brisbane.

Commendable Continues on Derby Trail:

Despite his fourth-place finish in Saturday's GII Coolmore Lexington S., the D. Wayne Lukas trained Commendable (Gone West) will continue to be pointed at the Derby, the trainer reports. "I was not that discouraged at all," Lukas said of Saturday's race. "I didn't think we had any chance to show what we could do and it might be a blessing." Commendable was bottled up through much of the Lexington and was beaten only 3 1/2 lengths by Unshaded (Unbridled).

Ben The Man, Cocky Out of Consideration:

Lexington also-rans Ben The Man (Gulch, seventh) and Cocky (Valiant Nature, sixth) have been removed from Derby consideration by their respective connections. "We're going to regroup," said trainer Joe Orseno of Ben The Man, a \$1.25 million yearling. "I'm going to take him back to New York and run him in some smaller races. Mentally, he's just a little slower coming around than I'd like." Cocky, previously sixth in the Santa Anita Derby, is going to be freshened, according to trainer Bobby Frankel.

PRADO REPLACES SANTOS ON 'KID' Trainer Scotty Schulhofer has replaced jockey Jose Santos with Edgar Prado aboard 1999 Belmont and Travers S. winner Lemon Drop Kid (Kingmambo), for what the trainer deemed a questionable ride in a dead-heat victory in a money-allowance event at Aqueduct Apr. 15. Santos, who picked up the mount from John Velazquez following last year's Blue Grass S., told Daily Racing Form, "I wish them luck. I'll brush it off and look for another good one." The four-year-old colt, owned by Jeanne Vance, is scheduled to start next in Prado's former stomping ground in the May 13 GI Pimlico Special in Baltimore.

NAKATANI GOES SIX FOR EIGHT Jockey Corey Nakatani recorded six winners from his eight mounts yesterday afternoon at Santa Anita, including the featured sixth race, the GII Santa Barbara H. aboard Caffe Latte. The 29-year-old also recorded victories in races two, three, four, eight and nine riding horses who returned mutuels of between \$2.80 (Beach Bum, third race) and \$14.40 (Dream Counter, fourth). Of his six winners, only two were favored. Nakatani, who clinched the winter riding title, had previously ridden five winners in one day Feb. 17, 1996.
