#### EASTER SALE STARTS TODAY

Only the top 500 foals of the 20,000-odd born in Australasia each year gain a prized berth into the benchmark for all Thoroughbred bloodstock auctions staged in the Antipodes, the William Inglis Easter Yearling Sale. The three-day event, which kicks off at 5:30 p.m. tonight at the Inglis Sale complex near Randwick, has attracted the most serious international buying bench ever. Inglis Managing Director Reg Inglis said, "There are people here from all over the world, all the trainers from Hong Kong, agents from South Africa and buyers from New Zealand and America, and there are people from Japan. It is a fantastic catalogue and it will be a strong sale, but there will be plenty of horses make under A\$100,000."

#### The Coolmore Collection:

When it comes to a reliable barometer to the marketability of any stallion serving Australian stud seasons, they don't come any more accurate than the Easter Sale. The 2000 catalogue indicates that the Coolmore shuttle stallions have never been more in vogue. The sons and daughters of Coolmore stallions Woodman (55), Danehill (47), Hennessy (20), Last Tycoon (Ire) (19), Royal Academy (18) and Thunder Gulch (17) collectively represent no less 35.2 percent of the entire auction. One who is likely to go close to topping the sale is Coolmore Stud's Woodman--All Grace (NZ) (Sir Tristram {Ire}) colt, a half brother to 1997 Australian Horse of the Year Saintly (NZ). Last year's Danehill--All Grace colt was knocked down to Patrick Biancone for A\$1 million.

#### **Danehill Domination:**

Cambridge Stud's Sir Patrick Hogan is confident he has the sales topper with his Danehill colt out of Tristalove (NZ) (Sir Tristram {Ire}), who is herself a half sister to the NZ\$3.6 million colt Hogan sold at Karaka in January. Lot 175, the colt will be offered during Wednesday's second session. Danehill's 47 lots last year averaged A\$318,000, compared with the overall sale average of A\$128,000. As for the sons of Danehill, there's no doubt Danzero (Aus)'s four youngsters will be in the spotlight after his son Fairway (Aus)'s all-the-way win in Saturday's G1 AJC Australian Derby. Siresons Danewin (Aus), Danasinga (Aus) and Flying Spur (Aus) have yearlings catalogued as well. Eclipsing their father may be impossible, but they may begin to edge closer.

#### THE SKY'S THE LIMIT IN SAN SIMEON

First or second in seven of his eight previous tries over Santa Anita's downhill turf course, El Cielo (El Prado (Ire)) was sent off the even-money chalk in yesterday's GIII San Simeon H. and came through for the crowd with a determined one-length victory. The lightly campaigned six-year-old had raced only 12 times previously, but had made each of his last seven starts over the course and distance. His only blemish on an otherwise sterling record was when he stumbled and lost his rider in an allowance test last March, but he rebounded with a four-length score last Apr. 11 before getting a vacation. Returning after an 8 1/2-month layoff, he took an allowance event Jan. 5, was runnerup by a neck in the Feb. 6 Reb's Policy H. and came back to win again in yet another allowance Mar. 11. The favorite to make it two in a row, he shadowed the front-running Scooter Brown (Fly Till Dawn) from the inside down the backstretch, switched to the outside as they headed into the turn, came out of the turn on even terms with the pacesetter and had plenty left to hold King Slayer (GB) (Batshoof {Ire}) safe to the wire.

#### **High Yield Heats Up Track:**

GI Toyota Blue Grass victor High Yield (Storm Cat) zipped a half mile in :46 3/5 over a fast track at Churchill Downs yesterday, easily the bullet move of the morning."I was a little concerned about the Blue Grass, because it was a tough race," trainer D. Wayne Lukas said. "The 48 hours after the race is when you have to observe and watch closely. But we're very pleased with what we see. He has done everything well since the race. I couldn't be more pleased where I am on Monday before the final week." Lukas said he will definitely saddle two for the May 6 GI Kentucky Derby, with GII Coolmore Lexington S. fourth Commendable (Gone West) set to join High Yield in the gate. Exchange Rate (Danzig), ninth in the GII Wood Memorial last time out, and True Confidence (Storm Cat), 13th in the GII Arkansas Derby, are on the fence. Exchange Rate was set to work yesterday, but was reluctant to break off for the breeze, finally putting in a slow half mile from the quarter pole. "It wasn't exactly what I wanted, but it wasn't that big a deal," Lukas said, but added, "I want to see this horse work in company with a little different program than I gave him today."

#### **Workouts for Pletcher Pack:**

Trainer Todd Pletcher sent out all four of his candidates for the Kentucky Derby to breeze yesterday morning at Churchill Downs. GII Arkansas Derby hero Graeme Hall (Dehere) went a half in :51 over the fast track, while the undefeated GIII Flamingo S. winner Trippi (End Sweep) and Arkansas Derby third Impeachment (Deputy Minister) together went seven furlongs in 1:30. More Than Ready (Southern Halo), the top pick in the quartet after his game second-place finish in the GI Toyota Blue Grass, came out after the break to go a half in :49. All four will have their final Derby preps next Monday. "I was happy with all four works," Pletcher said. "They all finished stronger than they started and they all seemed to get over the ground well. That is something that is always in the back of your mind here-how horses will handle the track." The trainer also confirmed that 1999 Eclipse Award winner Jorge Chavez would be aboard Trippi in the Kentucky Derby. He is still looking for a rider for Graeme Hall.

### **WHAT'S DOING DOWN UNDER**

#### MARKET FLUCTUATION

Stock market volatility both in Australasia and abroad won't affect the Southern Hemisphere's major yearling sale, the William Inlgis Easter Yearling Sale, according to William Inglis Managing Director Reg Inglis. But Inglis cautiously predicts only that last year's average of A\$128,282 will be maintained, despite the fact that yearling sales held so far this year have recorded stunning average increases.

The average soared by 36 percent, to NZ\$128,013, at New Zealand Bloodstock's major sale at Karaka in January, and the Magic Millions Premier Sale recorded a 20-percent average increase to A\$80,026.

An internationally bullish market was also reflected in Inglis' two major yearling catalogues to date--the Inglis Classic Yearling Sale average leapt by 43 percent to A\$26,805 while the Melbourne Premier Sale average was A\$42,500, up almost 20 percent.

In the Northern Hemisphere, Keeneland's September sale recorded an average increase of 30 percent on the previous year at US\$77,357 and major sales in England and Ireland recorded average increases of around 12 to 20 percent.

"I don't think what is happening in IT stocks will affect our sale," Inglis says.

Widden Stud General Manager Derek Field echoes the prevailing opinion around the sale complex when he said any impact from Australia's Information Technology stocks plummeting would be minimal.

"There might be one or two potential buyers who are affected, but overall I don't think there will be a noticeable impact," he says.

Since Karaka's stunning result earlier this year with its record NZ\$3.6 million Zabeel (NZ) colt, the mood of Australasia's thriving bloodstock industry had been rightly buoyant.

Australia has access to a smorgasbord of international stallions, boasting a line-up that isn't available in any other country as sires from Japan, Ireland, England, France and Kentucky make their way here every spring. And the sons of the big guns such as Danehill are now proving themselves as well.

But while the mood is one of ebullience, what is to say that spiralling bloodstock prices won't fall like they did in 1989? Record prices--a A\$1.5 million colt and A\$1.2 million filly--preceded the crash of '89 and it wasn't until 1997 that Easter returned a gross comparable with 1989.

In 1989, on the eve of the collapse, the Easter average was A\$106,832. The following year it was A\$51,485 and it crept steadily back to average over A\$100,000 for the first time in 1998.

Memorable fire sales were held as tax driven syndicates including Bart Cummings' "Cups King" scheme collapsed, leaving the trainer with a A\$20 million debt to work his way out of.

"It won't happen again," says Kentucky-based Australian agent Neil Bowden, "because in 1989 it was paper money. Real cash is changing hands now, real money. The market is very solid."

Collingrove Stud's Adam Sangster concurs, saying the market has been rebuilt on solid foundations over the past 10 years.

"It was tax driven, financial schemes, and the market went crazy. Now what is happening is in line with everywhere else in the world and we have rebuilt on solid foundations. We haven't seen spectacular average increases at Easter--it was 10 percent last year and about 14 percent up the previous year," he says.

The surest indicator of the bloodstock market's health is the fact the median last year was remarkably close to the average--A\$90,000 to A\$128,282--and has been for several years.

Unlike in 1989, when a few record sales pushed the average to more than double the median, the Easter Sale average is now genuinely the mid-price.

But Reg Inglis disagrees the market is invulnerable because it is cash driven.

"I believe we are certainly vulnerable to overall stock market fluctuations and in 1989 the stock market crashed and it affected our market," he says. "If there is a downturn in the stock market, historically, the bloodstock market tends to over-correct."

One of the unwritten rules of Thoroughbred breeding is that success tends to breed further success a few years down the line.

\$264,648. \*Full to Flaming Bridle, SW, \$224,607.

The explanation lies in the fact that most stallions retire to stud on the crest of a wave, only to find that their appeal is steadily eroded over the next few years, as newer--and commercially safer--young stallions come along. This decline in popularity often doesn't stop until the stallion's first runners make their mark as two-year-olds, after he has completed his fourth season at stud.

The great Danzig is a perfect example of this phenomenon. He sired nine stakes winners in his first crop and 11 in his second, but his figures then dropped to six in his third crop and five in his fourth, no doubt because the quality of his mares declined as memories of his brief-but-spectacular racing career began to dim. However, Danzig's remarkable first crop brought him greater opportunities, resulting in a fifth crop which contained no fewer than 17 stakes winners.

I have long suspected that Unbridled is going to be another incarnation of this type of fluctuating success.

Even though he won the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Breeders' Cup Classic, he wasn't immune to the declining-popularity syndrome--a fact highlighted by the way his fee fell from \$35,000 in his first season to \$30,000 in his second and then to \$20,000 in his third and fourth years at stud.

However, his fee started to revive in his fifth season in 1996, being set at \$25,000 before Unbridled's Song's victory in the 1995 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. By 1997 his fee had tripled to \$75,000, a reflection of the 1996 victories of Unbridled's Song in the GI Florida Derby and of Grindstone in the GIII Louisiana Derby and GI Kentucky Derby. As these Florida Derby and Louisiana Derby wins occurred in mid-March, they may well also have helped Unbridled during the 1996 covering season.

In other words, Unbridled's fifth and sixth seasons at stud probably represent his best chances so far of matching the exceptional early results achieved by the two Grade I-winning colts from his first crop. We will have to wait until later this year to see the two-year-olds from that sixth crop, which produced two seven-figure yearling colts, but the fifth crop is busily establishing itself as a very good collection and promises to play an important role in the Triple Crown events.

As many as nine of Unbridled's sons, headed by the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner Anees and the GIII Gotham S. winner Red Bullet, were among the original Triple Crown entries. Another son, Wheelaway, became a possible for Churchill Downs after his encouraging third in the GI Toyota Blue Grass S., and now Unshaded has won the GII Coolmore Lexington S. to present his owner, Jim Tafel, with the enviable problem of whether to supplement his rapidly improving colt at a cost of \$150,000.

Unshaded, described by rider Shane Sellers as a "big son of a gun," was one of Unbridled's cheapest yearlings at the 1998 sales, costing only \$27,000. Although his third dam, Pussy Toes, was a three-parts sister to the champion filly Silver Spoon, Unshaded's catalogue page didn't make especially impressive reading. His broodmare sire, Caucasus, was an ordinary stallion, but he was a very well-bred individual and he was highly effective on the track, winning the Irish St Leger over 1 3/4 miles, plus a couple of American Grade I races over 1 1/2 miles. This should guarantee that Unshaded will be suited by 1 1/4 miles, even though his first two dams earned their black type at up to a mile, and he surely deserves his chance of glory.

Last week's four days of previews produced some fast times; hip no. 44. The Mane Saint, a Florida-bred colt by Saint Ballado consigned by Ricky Leppala, agent, turned in the fastest quarter of the week, breezing the distance Wednesday in :21 2/5; Hot Luck, a colt by Fortunate Prospect consigned by Farnsworth Farm, topped those breezing three furlongs with a time of :33 4/5 during Friday's session. The sale continues through Friday.

**TOUT CHARMANT TO STONERSIDE** Grade | winner Tout Charmant (Slewvescent) has been purchased by Robert and Janice McNair's Stonerside as part of a package from the Robert H. Walters Trust. The four-year-old filly captured the GI Del Mar Oaks last August and was also second in the GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup at Keeneland, Gl Santa Anita Oaks and GI Las Virgenes S., also at Santa Anita. Overall, she has four wins and six seconds from 15 starts and earnings of \$487,659. Unraced since finishing eighth in the Nov. 28 GI Matriarch S., she is scheduled to make her 2000 debut in a few weeks. She will remain in trainer Ron McAnally's barn. Also included in the package is the eight-year-old broodmare Roujoleur (Red Ransom), a two-time stakes winner, and her 2000 Southern Halo colt. The mare will be bred back to General Meeting.

He had ridden some winners for me in 1980 and came here as our retained jockey that year. We enjoyed many marvelous moments together and I'll always savour that. I enjoyed him riding our horses and I wish him well."
