DANEHILL FILLY TOPS EASTER SALE

San Miguel Chairman Eduardo Cojuangco, fresh from a treble on Monday at Randwick, dominated the first session of the Inglis Australian Easter Yearling Sale at Newmarket near Randwick Tuesday night. He spent A\$1,860,000 on four of the top five horses sold, including the sale-topping filly, a daughter of Danehill--Nuwirah (Pleasant Colony) for A\$800,000 and a filly by Royal Academy--Shimmering Snow (Frosty the Snowman) for A\$400,000. The pair were offered by Coolmore Stud. Asked what he liked about the saletopping filly, widely considered the pick of her sex from a catalogue of 500, Cojuangco's representative Tic Tic Trinidad laughed and said, "She's a Danehill." He added, "She is a lovely filly. Conformation-wise, she is faultless, the filly of the sale, a little light on pedigree, though." Coolmore Australia spokesman Brett Howard said the filly was a lovely type. "She has everything you look for in a yearling, good size and strength with plenty of scope, a good conformation and very good temperament," he said. "She is a high-class filly." Fillies were the flavour of the day, accounting for all of the top five lots. Competing buyers pushed the session average to an astonishing A\$144,695 for 74 sold. The median for the sale was not far behind at A\$110,000 with 10 withdrawn and 16 failing to reach reserve, for a first session gross of A\$10,707,500. The other notable purchase last night was by BBA Ireland's agent Adrian Nicholl, acting on behalf of European buyers. He gave A\$500,000 for a Danehill filly from Prawn Cocktail (Artichoke), a half sister to Royal Academy. Inglis managing director Reg Inglis, commenting on the relatively high pass-in rate early in the sale, said some vendors had to adjust their expectations and re-assess the market. The three-day sale continues today.

War Chant Works:

War Chant (Danzig) breezed an easy four furlongs in :52 at Churchill yesterday. "It was very nice," trainer Neil Drysdale said of the work. "We just wanted to stretch his legs a little bit. The track was kind of greasy this morning, so we just held him together." Drysdale also confirmed that Fusaichi Pegasus (Mr. Prospector) worked an easy three furlongs Friday, but the drill was not picked up by the clockers. "He breezed at dawn, slightly before dawn," the trainer said. "He breezed in company and went an easy three furlongs. Just cruising."

Deputy Warlock Drills:

Deputy Warlock (Silver Deputy) worked five furlongs in company at Churchill Tuesday in 1:02 1/5. The colt set fractions of :23 2/5, :35 4/5 and :48 4/5, galloping out six furlongs in 1:17 1/5. "He did exactly what we wanted," said trainer Ken McPeek. "We weren't looking for any bullet work."

EURO 3YO'S: SOFT GROUND FORM

As usual, the first Classics of the year take place on the first weekend in May--the Kentucky Derby and the English 2000 Guineas (colts) on Saturday, the 6th, and the English 1000 Guineas (fillies) on Sunday, the 7th. After unseasonably good weather in February and March, which enabled European trainers to get some good grounding in their charges, it has rained for most of April in Britain and Europe. Trainer Mick Channon told me there had been seven inches of rain in Lambourn in the first three weeks of April, and it's been raining since he told me that at Newmarket, where the going was good-to-soft for last week's Craven meeting. Consequently, nearly all the important three-year-old trials have been run on ground ranging from good-to-soft to nearly unraceably heavy. The penetrometer read 5.6, which is way past heavy at Longchamp last Sunday, and that was before racing. It rained all through racing, too.

So, as Mark Twain would have said, we need to take the results so far with a few tons of salt. Of course, it might stay soft for the next 10 days, in which case the trials form should bear some resemblance to the Guineas form; but, if it quits raining and the ground firms up, we could see a few surprises on Guineas weekend.

Let's review the trials, starting with the 2000 Guineas, which right now looks a really open race. The likely favourite is Giant's Causeway, an unbeaten Storm Cat colt (bought in utero) who runs in Sue Magnier's colors, and is likely to be Mick Kinane's choice of rides for the powerful Coolmore axis. Giant's Causeway went three-for-three last year and won on both good ground and soft. In his final race last year he won the G1 Pr de la Salamandre, defeating Race Leader (winner of the Thirsk Classic Trial this year, and Barry Hills' second string for the 2000) and Bachir (second to China Visit after setting the pace in the UAE Derby). This year he beat olders over seven furlongs in the G3 Gladness S. at The Curragh. Aidan O'Brien will likely saddle Bernstein, another Storm Cat colt, who will run first up in the Guineas, and he could also run Monashee Mountain, an unbeaten Danzig colt, who has also won this year.

The seven-furlong Greenham S. (G3) is Newbury's big prep race, but was transferred to Newmarket last Tuesday after Newbury was washed out. Unbeaten Guineas favorite Distant Music was confidently expected to win the Greenham, but was upset by Barathea Guest, who won the G1 Grand Criterium in France last year, but was DQ'ed. Barathea Guest is very much a soft-ground horse, though, and Distant Music came out of the race with a minor injury in a foot. His best form is on firm ground, as was his sire's, and if the ground comes right for him, Distant Music could very well win the Guineas.

Richard Hannon won the other two recognized Guineas trials at Newmarket with the 1-2 finishers in last year's Horris Hill S.(run over seven furlongs on soft ground at Newbury last October). Horris Hill winner Umistim (Inchinor) wore down King's Best (Kingmambo) in last Thursday's one-mile Craven S., with Ekraar (Red Ransom) third and the Coolmore 'sighter' Rossini fourth; the previous day, Horris Hill second Cape Town (like Bachir, from the first crop of Green Desert's son, Desert Style) had scored impressively in the seven furlong European Free H. (L). Both will run in the Guineas, but I wouldn't be surprised if King's Best beats them both. He ran a real big race on ground probably softer than he'd like, sweeping impressively to the lead but getting run out of it in the closing stages.

Add into the mix the Godolphin runners, which could include their Trial 1-2 Fath (Danzig, second in last year's Middle Park) and Broche, and Bachir, and a couple of others who go straight to the race, including last year's Middle Park winner Primo Valentino (by Primo Dominie, trained by Peter Harris). It's likely to be a good-sized field, and the winner is sure to be a pretty decent colt, but whether on firm or soft ground, we don't yet know. Giant's Causeway, Distant Music, and King's Best are my idea of where the winner will come from if the ground gets good.

The 1000 looks more straightforward. Petrushka, an Unfuwain filly trained by Michael Stoute for one of Harry Herbert's Highclere syndicates, won the G3 Nell Gwyn impressively eight days ago and swept to Guineas (and Oaks) favoritism. The second favorite for the 1000 is Bintalreef, a Diesis filly who beat Teggiano, last year's top British two-year-old onemile filly, in the Godolphin trial last Friday. Nell Gwyn second Seazun, a Zieten filly who won last year's Cheveley Park (G1, 6f), and the Coolmore operation's Amethyst, a full sister to King of Kings who won the Leopardstown 1000 Guineas Trial, are the other major contenders on the short-list. Last year's top French two-year-old one-mile filly, Lady of Chad, by Last Tycoon and impressive winner of the Pr Marcel Boussac on Arc day, returned with a good win in the G3 Pr de la Grotte, but is heading for the French 1000 rather than the English version. She's seriously good, too.

Rollin With Nolan (Summer Squall) underwent emergency eye surgery Sunday to repair a laceration trainer Nick Zito thinks may have happened during Saturday's GII Coolmore Lexington S. "He went through recovery fine," Zito said. "Now, we're just to the point that it is going to take five, and maybe more like seven days to find out just how good he's going to be. It might be that he recovers fully and has utilization of his eye, or it may be that he ends up even losing the eye altogether." The colt ran fifth in the Lexington.

Snuck In (Montbrook), winner of the GIII Rebel S. and second in the GII Arkansas Derby, worked five furlongs Tuesday at Churchill in 1:03 2/5, but will probably skip the Kentucky Derby.

SAINT BALLADO TOPS OBS OPENER A coit by Saint Ballado--Metromane (Metrogrand) brought a final bid of \$270,000 to top yesterday's opening session of the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company Spring Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training in Florida. The colt, who worked a quarter mile in :21 2/5 at the under tack preview April 19, was consigned by Ricky Leppala, agent, and Kevin and J.B. McKathan signed the ticket on behalf of Gary Garber's Marlee, Inc. Bob Baffert will train the youngster. The buyback percentage at yesterday's opening session of the four-day sale was 25.1 percent, down from the corresponding figure of 33 percent a year ago. A total of 18 two-year-olds sold for \$50,000 or over yesterday, compared with 14 in last year's opening session. "It looks like we're off to a good start," said OBS General Manager Tom Ventura. "There was no shortage of buyers and, as always at this sale, the consignors with the best athletes were rewarded." The auction continues today at 10:30 a.m.

LANE'S END FORGOES JULY CONSIGNMENT

Lane's End Farm will not offer a consignment to the Keeneland July Yearling sale, *The Blood-Horse* reported. Perennially ranked among the top sellers at the July sale, the Versailles, Kentucky farm will now switch its focus to the Keeneland September Yearling sale. Lane's End expects to offer approximately 50 yearlings during the select sessions of the September sale and an additional 100 later in the auction. Among the horses that Lane's End has sold at Keeneland July are the \$13.1 million world record yearling Seattle Dancer, Horse of the Year A. P. Indy and Preakness winner Summer Squall.

Surgery for Adonis:

Adonis (Kris S.), winner of the 1999 GII Wood Memorial, underwent ankle surgery Monday to repair a hairline fracture. The injury was discovered after the colt worked a half mile in :52 on Monday at Keeneland. Adonis finished last in an Apr. 16 turf allowance in his most recent trip to the post. "It was very, very minor," explained trainer Nick Zito. "There was a slight fracture. There was a tiny line that showed up and there was no space in it at all. Just to help the horse heal better, Dr. [Larry] Bramlage performed the surgery. He should be out of action for about two months, they think."
