TWO TIMES SEVEN AT EASTER SALE

Sir Patrick Hogan's Danehill--Tristalove (NZ) (Sir Tristram (Ire)) colt became the first yearling in 11 years to fetch \$A1.5 million as the Inglis Easter Yearling Sale reached unprecedented heights during Wednesday's second session with a pair of seven-figure horses. "I am like an All Black Rugby player--I love to win," said Hogan, whose wife Justine listened on the phone as bidding began at \$400,000 and escalated through 10 bids to stop with New Zealand Bloodstock manager Joe Walls' \$1.5 million offer. New Zealand Bloodstock sold Hogan's NZ\$2.8 million Zabeel--Diamond Lover (Aus) colt at Karaka in January and Walls revealed he came only to buy the Danehill colt on behalf of a syndicate of Australian, New Zealand and Hong Kong investors. "Danehill has worked tremendously well as a sire of sires...but it is impossible for us to get Danehill blood and this was our one and only chance," said Walls. "I didn't think we would buy him; I thought the horse might have made \$2 million," he added. Interestingly, the three-year-old full-brother to yesterday's sale-topper is due to go under the hammer here Friday when horses owned by the late Michael Bastion are auctioned. Hong Kong based Bastion died in a fall from a balcony in Hong Kong on March 17 and his Thoroughbred interests will be sold. Eduardo Cojuangco's Gooree Stud representative Tic Trinidad emerged victorious after a stunning bidding war with Irishman Demi O'Byrne for the secondhighest priced colt of the day, a \$1.3 million colt by Danehill--Beach Gown (Aus) (Cerreto {Ire}). Beach Gown is also the dam of Australian Group 1 winner Wrap Around (Aus) (Bletchingly {Aus}). Trinidad revealed after the sale the colt had been purchased in partnership with Vinery Australia, along with a \$700,000 Flying Spur--Sworn Secret colt. "He is a good looking colt and our opinion, the best colt in the sale," Trinidad said. "Of course it is subjective, but he is by Danehill and he is an athletic, scopey horse from a mare who has produced good two-year-olds." The sale has grossed \$37,882,000 with 200 blueblood youngsters still to go under the hammer including 19 by supersire Danehill in today's final session. "It was an extremely strong session," Inglis managing director Reg Inglis said Wednesday. "This is far and away the best average ever; there has been terrific competition." (Top Five Lots p2)

TWO THUMBS UP

Drama Critic (Theatrical {Ire}) unleashed a strong late run to collect his first added-money score. The bay colt broke his maiden on the Aqueduct main and came back with a pair of allowance scores on the turf at Gulfstream over the winter. Stretched out to 12 furlongs at Keeneland Apr. 8, he caught a yielding course and was beaten only a neck by Dixie's Crown (Dixieland Band). Rating patiently under new pilot Jerry Bailey, he rallied five wide approaching the stretch and outfinished Craigsteel (Suave Dancer), despite brushing with that rival. "We lost a little [ground] on the turn for home, but I thought it was the easiest path to take," said Bailey.

SAPPHIRE RING DIES Sapphire Ring (GB) (Marju {Ire}--Mazarine Blue {GB}, by Bellypha {Ire}) collapsed and died in her stall at Churchill Downs last Saturday while being administered a dose of electrolytes. The five-year-old mare was receiving two liters of fluids, but during the second liter began to have an anaphylactic reaction and could not be saved by the veterinarian on hand. A multiple graded stakes winner in the U.S. and fourth as the favorite in the GIII Jenny Wiley at Keeneland Apr. 13, Sapphire Ring was owned by Prince Ahmed Salman's The Thoroughbred Corporation. Her death marks the second tragedy to hit the stable, following the recent death of 1999 Triple Crown veteran Desert Hero. Trained by Neil Drysdale, the bay won seven times from 22 starts with earnings of \$494,207.

McCarron Pilots The Deputy Through Solid Work: GI Santa Anita Derby winner The Deputy (Ire) (Petardia {GB}) worked seven furlongs Wednesday morning in 1:27 3/5 under jockey Chris McCarron, who flew in from California for the drill. The colt, owned by Team Valor, got his opening two furlongs in :25, the half in :50 2/5 and galloped out the mile in 1:42. "He got over the ground beautifully," McCarron said. "I was very pleased with the way he handled in footing-wise. He showed me some good signs." The Deputy spent his requisite 15 minutes at the gap before setting foot on the track, calm and collected all the while. "My horse couldn't be bothered," said trainer Jenine Sahadi, who is trying to become the first woman to saddle a Kentucky Derby winner. McCarron agrees that his mount's demeanor works in their favor. "With the size of the field, there's always the likelihood that some bad luck will happen. The more professional the horse is, the better the chance they have to overcome any misfortune," he said. The Irish bred is likely to have his final pre-Derby work

Mile Work for Anees:

Tuesday morning.

The Thoroughbred Corporation's Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner Anees (Unbridled) worked a mile vesterday morning in 1:43 under the watchful eye of trainer Alex Hassinger. With retired rider and now assistant trainer Gary Stevens in the irons, the bay worked in company, starting and ending at the 3/4 pole, and went in fractions of :24, :49 2/5 and 1:15 2/5. "We are very happy with the work," Hassinger commented. "Gary said at the wire is when he really asked him to go around the turn and he spurted away from the other horse. He wasn't blowing hard when he pulled up. Gary said he felt better than the Breeders' Cup." Elaborating on that point, Stevens explained, "He has matured. He is much more focused than what he was as a two-year-old. Obviously he needs to take some steps forward, but I am very excited." Hassinger said that Anees will likely have his last major pre-race prep Monday morning.

WHAT'S DOING DOWN UNDER

ON THE SCENE WITH ROBERT SANGSTER

While the movers and shakers of the Thoroughbred world were at Nad Al Sheba during last month's Dubai World Cup meeting, Robert Sangster was fishing off the picturesque little town of Port Lincoln. Fighting tuna in South Australia was more appealing to Sangster than watching Sheikh Mohammed's Dubai Millennium (GB) win a race in which he had no vested interest.

Sangster goes where the competition is.

"I love the stimulation of winning and losing. I want to win everything, whatever it is--horses or women or whatever," he declares.

But it wasn't just the sport fishing that brought him Down Under. While Sangster has 80 broodmares in Europe, about 20 in the U.S. and a string of horses with American trainer Pat Byrne as well as his expansive Manton training complex in England, he has revealed that he plans to expand his racing interests in Australasia.

The man who pioneered the shuttle stallion concept with Green God (GB) and Deep River (GB) in the 1970s seems very content shuttling himself from Collingrove Stud, where 24 impeccably bred youngsters including a Dolphin Street (Fr) half-brother to Testa Rossa (Aus) and a full brother to VRC Derby winner Blackfriars (Aus) are being paraded before this week's Easter Sale, to the races each Saturday.

"Now that I am a bachelor again I will probably come here more often," Sangster said. "Australia and England are very similar, but prizemoney here is much better."

Sangster's pervasive influence in Australia is such that it isn't an exaggeration to suggest he has a direct connection with at least half the stallions represented in this year's Inglis Easter catalogue.

Collingrove Stud NSW, 1500 acres tucked above the Hunter Valley, was purchased in 1989, standing Scenic (Ire) and Bluebird; in 1995, Collingrove Victoria, 900 acres more focused on stallions, opened its doors. Sangster also has substantial interests in Coolmore stallions as well as emerging stars like Red Ransom, and revealed he is trying to secure four-time Group 1 winner Testa Rossa for stud duties at Collingrove--competing, of course, with every other stud in Australasia for the honour.

He says speed and the ability to quicken are among his criteria for a stallion.

"And the eye of a horse--they've got to have the look of the eagle," he says.

He has always maintained Australian horses have an environmental advantage.

"Your cricketers, tennis players and rugby players are better than ours, and it is the same for horses," says Sangster. "You've got a better environment and yearlings are better developed here at the same stage than they are in the Northern Hemisphere. Whether they are superior on track we will never really find out because prizemoney here is too good."

He adds, "We have a very profitable business here. It will probably change a little in that I will have more involvement in the racing scene. Normally I would sell more than I plan to now."

The Sangster scene has changed over time. Recalling the early years, the owner said, "I decided that Vincent O'Brien was the best trainer in the world and John Magnier was potentially--he was only 23 when I met him--the best stud manager, so I set up a team. It was a lot of laughs and a lot of bad behaviour, but we attracted a lot of people to racing.

"It is about having fun. It is not about being miserable or long-faced. If you lose you come back and win next week. We have always had a lot of fun."

The fun went out of racing for a time last year, but Sangster is now smiling once again.

"I have got horses with Pat Byrne, who is the best trainer in the U.S., and with Aidan O'Brien, who is the best in Ireland, and now I have got John Gosden to train at Manton and make it fun again," he says. "It wasn't fun for me the last six months of last year. I couldn't put a finger on why. It wasn't working."

But the Sangster operation is back on track and ready to add to such memorable moments as the Epsom Derby wins of The Minstrel and Golden Fleece, the Arc de Triomphe successes of Alleged and Detroit (Fr), and his victory in the 1980 Melbourne Cup with Beldale Ball (GB).

But which moment does Sangster most savor? "Every day of my life," he insists.

PICK UP THE PHONE COLT TOPS OBS SESSION

A bay colt by Pick Up the Phone--Super Seniorita (El Baba) was hammered down for a final bid of \$230,000 to top the second session of the OBS Spring Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training yesterday afternoon. Consigned by Gold Crest Farm, the winning bidder was Tom Durant, Sold as hip 463, the half or full brother to three winners from as many foals to race clocked a co-fastest quarter mile in :21 3/5 at last Thursday's under-tack preview. Consignor Mark Casse had a busy afternoon, selling three of the top five lots. Hip 487, a full sister to SW Tempered Appeal brought \$110,000 from Jockey Club Farm; hip 318, a colt from the first crop of Valid Wager, was purchased by Buzz Chace for \$90,000; and hip 553, a Diablo filly, was taken for a similar amount by Lakland Farm. After the second session, the average of \$26,436 is up by 14.1 percent against last year while the median of \$20,000 is ahead by 33.3 percent. Buybacks are down from 25.7 percent in 1999 to 22.9 percent this year. The sale continues this morning at 10:30 a.m. (OBS Statistics p2)

RIZZI HEADS TO SEZ WHO Multiple graded stakes winner Rizzi (Afleet), 1999's Leading Freshman Sire by number of winners, will move to Sez Who Thoroughbreds in Ocala, Florida following the completion of the 2000 breeding season. From his first crop of 50 foals, 24 have won to date. Rizzi currently stands at Mocking-bird Farm for a fee of \$5,000. He has sired three stakes winners from his first crop, as well as graded-placed Valerie's Dream.

NANI ROSE CASE RESOLVED Trainer Pat Byrne and veterinarian Greg Fox, the principals in the illegal injection of Nani Rose prior to the running of the GII Lake Placid H. last Aug. 25, have been given separate suspensions for their involvement in the incident. Byrne will serve at least 45 days of a 180-day suspension from July 1 to August 14, covering part of the Saratoga meeting. He will be allowed to attend the Fasig Tipton Saratoga Yearling Sales held off the grounds of the racetrack. Fox will pay a \$2,500 fine and will serve at least a 60-day suspension May 1 through June 29 and is barred from treating any horse in New York State for one year. Both are banned from New York State racetracks during their suspensions. The then three-year-old Peteski filly was observed by officials of the New York State and Wagering Board being administered an injection, which was later determined to be a nutritional food supplement. The only race-day injection allowed in New York is Lasix. "I'm glad to put it behind us," Byrne told Thoroughbred Times. "It's unfortunate that it happened."

Possible Reduction in Florida Taxes:

A bill passed out of the Florida Senate's Regulated Industries Committee April 25 will reduce taxes for all pari-mutuels in the state. Of interest to the Thoroughbred industry in the omnibus bill is the part that reduces Gulfstream's tax on every wager from 2.25 percent to 0.5 and Calder's from 1.5 percent to 0.5. Hialeah's tax would remain at 0.2 percent. Included in the bill is a provision that Hialeah will not have to pay the double taxation imposed by the state's Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering when the track moved the meeting to Gulfstream this year. It amounts to a saving of \$2.6 million for Hialeah. The bill also included a reduction on intertrack wagering and simulcast taxes for Thoroughbred tracks and the elimination of the tax on admissions and parking. The bill moves on to the Senate Fiscal Policy Committee before going to the floor for a vote. Veteran Tallahassee watchers are convinced the bill will go through major changes before the full Senate gets a chance to vote.
