EXPLOSIVE EASTER SALE ENDS

The William Inglis Easter Yearling Sale concluded yesterday near Randwick, Australia after showing a 19.8-percent gain in average, a 22.2-percent increase in median and a 10.8-percent improvement in gross from the 1999 sale. Tabbed by Inglis Managing Director Reg Inglis as "the best we've ever had," the three-day auction was led by the sons and daughters of the great Danehill, who had 36 yearlings, including the three sales toppers, purchased for an average of A\$340,417, up from his '99 Easter average of A\$318,000. Coolmore's Woodman led the shuttle stallions represented by their first crop to sell, with his 33 lots averaging A\$206,893, while freshman sire Unbridled's Song had 18 sell for an average of A\$155,277. Overall, Danehill's son Flying Spur (Aus) was the second-leading sire with his 17 yearlings, including the closing session's topper, averaging A\$272,941.

BEWITCHING SEAS

The Seven Seas (El Gran Senor) rallied from the back of the pack for her first added-money victory. A winner over 12 furlongs in the French provinces, she had been running at shorter distances since shipping stateside. After winning a Santa Anita allowance in her first U.S. start, she finished third in the Gll La Canada S. on the main track Feb. 6 and prepped for this outing with a second in a grassy optional claimer at Santa Anita April Fool's Day. Settled in last early, the chestnut bowled along under wraps to the far turn, where she unleashed a very wide run. She seized command at the eighth pole and edged clear. "She was excellent today," commented winning rider Alex Solis. "As soon as the leaders went out there, we just relaxed and dropped down near the rail. We were real patient and just waited for our time. It opened up real nice for us and she was real responsive. When she got her chance to run, she ran."

The winner of last season's G2 Prix du Conseil de Paris over this course and distance, First Magnitude once again displayed the ability to handle testing ground to succeed in atrocious conditions. Heavy rainfall produced a bog-like course and the winner gamely fought his way to the front inside the final furlong for a deserved success. The speedy Mayaro (Fr) (Saumarez {GB}) went straight to the front as First Magnitude was afforded a patient ride from the rear. Crillon took over at the top of the straight as the pacesetter began to fade and, with First Magnitude coming with his challenge, the race developed into a two-horse affair. Olivier Peslier got to work approaching the final furlong and his vigorous effort paid dividends in the last 100 yards as First Magnitude grabbed a lead he never relinquished.

☆ TRIPLE THREATS ☆

Chief Seattle to Miss Derby:

Chief Seattle (Seattle Slew), second in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile, will miss the Kentucky Derby. The Godolphin colt arrived in Kentucky late Tuesday night and had an elevated temperature. He will now be prepared for other North American races, including the June 10 GI Belmont S. Stablemate **China Visit** (Red Ransom), winner of the UAE Derby, arrived at Churchill Downs on Thursday after being released from quarantine. Another Godolphin Derby hopeful **Curule** (Go for Gin) will arrive at Keeneland from Dubai on Sunday.

Aptitude Works:

Juddmonte Farm's **Aptitude** (A.P. Indy), working in company with 1998 GI Kentucky Oaks winner **Keeper Hill** (Deputy Minister) worked six furlongs in 1:12 4/5 in company yesterday at Churchill. Clockers caught fractions of :12 2/5, :36 1/5 and :59 4/5. Aptitude was nearly two lengths clear of Keeper Hill at the wire. "I thought he went well and I'll probably do a little something two or three days before the race," said trainer Bobby Frankel. "He has been galloping well over the track and I wanted to see him work over it. He jumped right into the bridle, so that's a good sign. He was into the bridle the whole way." The colt is coming off a third-place finish in the Gil Wood Memorial.

Captain Steve Works:

Captain Steve (Fly So Free) worked six furlongs yesterday in 1:11 4/5, setting fractions of :35 3/5 and :59 2/5, in company. "When he went off he was really relaxed and just was cruising around there," commented exercise rider Dana Barnes.

Fusaichi Shenanigans:

Early Kentucky Derby favorite **Fusaichi Pegasus** (Mr. Prospector) jogged in orderly fashion yesterday, but caused a ruckus while being led off the track. The colt reared, tossing exercise rider Nuno Santos, while losing his balance and crashing to the racetrack on his backside. He rose to his feet, somewhat "startled," according to trainer Neil Drysdale and was led off the track peacefully. "Some mornings he's a perfect gentleman, some mornings he's feeling so good he doesn't know what to do with himself," explained Drysdale. When asked if the comotion of Derby day would get to his charge, Drysdale added, "I think 130,000 people may get his attention. He's fascinated by people."

Several of these will relish the prevalent heavy conditions. Looking for his fourth straight, the progressive **Indian Lodge**, who ended his 1999 campaign with back-to-back Listed stakes wins at Newmarket, comes off a win in the G3 Earl Of Sefton S. at Newmarket Apr. 19, with 1998's top British two-year-old, G1 Dewhurst S. winner **Mujahid**, almost three lengths away third. Three-for-four at two, **Mujahid** was held winless in six starts last year, but did run third in the G1 Sagitta 2000 Guineas. Making his seasonal bow here, **Trans Island** won the G2 Prix du Rond-Point at Longchamp Oct. 3, beating **Sugarfoot** by a short neck, and came back to be third, beaten only a length, in the Oct. 17 G1 Prix de la Foret in his most recent effort. **Handsome Ridge** attempts a repeat win in this event. The four-time Group winner, making his first appearance since running second behind Elle Danzig (Ger) in the Nov. 7 G1 Premio Roma, usually runs well early in the season.

WEATHER WREAKS HAVOC WITH BRITISH RACING In what can be loosely termed as the monsoon season, the British weather continues to wreak havoc on the flat race programme, with further abandonments announced as early as yesterday for some of the scheduled weekend cards. Meetings at Southwell, Catterick and Beverley had fallen foul of the weather earlier this week and the Saturday cards at Ripon and Leicester have now been added to the casualty list. Nick Lees, clerk of the course at Leicester, said: "The track is waterlogged, it is absolutely sodden, and the stick goes in about a foot. We have had five-and-a-half inches of rain during April so far and there is more forecast for Thursday and Friday. That is about a quarter of our annual average rainfall in just one month." Leicester was due to stage the G3 Leicestershire S. but, in a first for British racing, Doncaster has stepped in to stage a replacement meeting. The Doncaster card will host the Leicester Group 3 event, renamed the G3 Levy Board Leicestershire S., on a program that consists of a mixture of the scheduled Leicester and Ripon races. Sandown is due to stage flat racing Friday, including the G2 KLM UK Mile, and this meeting is also under threat. Should this meeting be called off, and there is a precautionary inspection at 7.30 a.m. this morning, the British Horseracing Board have given approval for the Group 2 race to be transferred to Sandown's Saturday fixture. There has been no rain in the Sandown area since Wednesday, but the forecast is an unfavourable one. Clerk of the Course Andrew Cooper explained: "We are OK at present, but we are due to have a lot of rain on Thursday night and Friday morning. If we get hefty quantities of rain, we could be under threat." Ireland has not escaped the effects of the weather, with Saturday's and Sunday's cards at Navan also having to pass a precautionary inspection, scheduled for 7:30 a.m. this morning.

CORRECTION: The Listed Dansk Jockey Club Cup at Klampenborg, Denmark, previewed in yesterday's *TDN*, will be run today. The result will be included in tomorrow's *TDN*.

He explained: "Shibboleth came out of his first race well, but after discussing the Guineas with his owner Khaled Abdullah (also owner of current favourite Distant Music {USA}), it was decided that it wasn't in the horse's best interest to go for the Classic."

REID FINDS THE RIGHT SEAZUN

Trainer Mick Channon has announced that John Reid will ride his G1 Cheveley Park S. winner **Seazun (Ire)** (Zieten {USA}) in the G1 Sagitta 1000 Guineas. Reid has twice been successful in the race, aboard On The House (Fr) in 1982 and Las Meninas (Ire) in 1994. Channon said: "John's a top man and has ridden some good winners for me, so I'm delighted to get him." Reid's booking was necessary as Seazun's regular partner, Frankie Dettori, is likely to be claimed to ride by his retained stable Godolphin for the first distaff Classic. Channon, who may also be represented in the 1000 Guineas by **Miletrian (Ire)** (Marju {Ire}), added: "The way some people are talking you would think the other Guineas runners are wasting their time [against Godolphin.] I'm not going to say any more about the race and will just let my filly do the talking next week."
