BLANKET FINISH IN BEN ALI

Midway Magistrate (Magisterial) got his nose on the line for his first graded victory in the Ben Ali S. at Keeneland yesterday. Winner of the Tri State H. on the Ellis turf last summer, the dark bay opened his 2000 season with a second to Blazing Sword at Gulfstream before capturing an allowance at that track Feb. 12. Entered in Gulfstream's GIII Creme Fraiche H. Mar. 11, he closed well for third, beaten only a length. Favored here, he saved ground in sixth under a patient Shane Sellers as Early Warning (Summer Squall) cut fractions of :46 2/5 and 1:10 2/5. Looking for room at the threesixteenths pole, he angled out five wide and shifted into overdrive, outkicking Liberty Gold (Crafty Prospector) for the victory. "I got him running, but I didn't know whether he got there or not," Sellers remarked. "He's a fighter and he really likes to get in there when it is tough." Winning trainer Rick Hiles thought the finish was too close to call. "I knew it [that he had won] when I saw them take down the photo sign and put the No. 2 up," he said. "It's a great thrill [to win a stakes a Keeneland], especially this way."

Indian Lodge showed progressive form to take two listed races at the end of last year, the Joel S. and Darley S., both at Newmarket. He bounced back this term to take the G3 Earl Of Sefton S. at the same course Apr. 19, winning with authority there. Here he carried on that winning run by turning in his best performance to date with an impressive display. Held up on the rail early in behind the leader Trans Island, Mick Kinane waited until the pace was wound up after the turn, when he made his move on the inside of the longtime leader with two furlongs remaining. He soon had the race under control, forging clear up the Sandown hill, never looking like he would be caught once he was let loose. Almushtarak was one of three horses to take to the far rail, and although he finished well clear of the others on that side, Indian Lodge, Trans Island and Warningford (GB) (Warning {GB}) had the better ground between them. Indian Lodge's part-owner Sir Eric Parker said afterwards, "He won two listed races at the end of last year and we were pleased with that, so we thought we'd step him up to Group races, and it's worked. He does like soft ground and he handles it well, but he'll go on anything."

FAST TIMES AT FASIG-TIPTON A Deposit Ticket filly, selling as Hip 57, recorded the fastest one-furlong breeze of :10 flat at the Under Tack Show of Fasig-Tipton's Preferred Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale. Hip 60, a chestnut filly by Mr. Greeley, worked a quarter and stopped the clock in :21 3/5. The quickest three-eighths trial was delivered by Hip 18, a Sultry Song colt who went in :34 4/5. The sale will be held Monday, May 1 at 2 p.m. at the Sports Spectrum in Louisville, Kentucky.

SANTA ANITA NUMBERS UP Santa Anita Park set new all-time records for total season handle, average daily handle, single day handle and total purses paid during its 1999-2000 season, which concluded Monday. The handle increased despite a decline in on-track attendance, mainly due to bad weather. More than seven inches of rain fell during February alone, leading to a total of 12.98 inches for the season. In contrast, 6.6 inches fell during all of the 1998-1999 season. Total handle rose to \$1,039,579,354, an increase of over \$19.7 million over the previous record. Average daily handle for the meeting was \$11,949,188. Santa Anita Derby Day (Apr. 8) set an all-time Santa Anita and California handle record (for a non-Breeders' Cup event) of \$25,782,789. "A multi-million dollar handle increase in light of largely weather-driven attendance decline definitely constitutes the highlight of the meeting and reflects a very resilient performance," said Brant Latta, Santa Anita's General Manager.

ELSWORTH BULLISH

Following the news that Richard Quinn would ride Scarteen Fox (Ire) (Foxhound {USA}) in the G1 2000 Guineas S. this week, David Elsworth was in confident mood about that horse's prospects when interviewed on *The Racing Channel*: "He has a wonderful chance. He'll be a lot better for the (2000 Guineas), and he's the sort of horse who keeps finding something and quickening. I believe him to be a good horse."

AWAY DAY FOR VALENTINO

G1 2000 Guineas S. contender Primo Valentino (Ire) (Primo Dominie {GB}) was an unfamiliar sight on the Newmarket training grounds yesterday morning. Making the journey from Hertfordshire, he appeared from his horsebox on Racecourse side, before working alongside the Rowley Mile track. He was led by Volontiers (Fr) in a strong workout under big-race jockey Pat Eddery, and he came through it with enthusiasm. Trainer Peter Harris commented, "I just wanted to give him a change of scene, and a proper racecourse gallop. They went a real strong gallop and he's ready now, so we'll just keep him ticking over." Later in the afternoon, Pat Eddery told Channel 4 Racing, "He went very nicely this morning, and I was very pleased with him. EASTER SALE FOLLOW-UP

Reg Inglis was thrilled with the results of the three day Inglis Easter Yearling Sale which saw 394 horses sold at an average of A\$153,736. "The median is \$110,000 -- this was a fantastic sale, the best we've ever had and it was a marvellous way to finish," said the Inglis managing director. "I would have been happy with a \$135,000 average," he said. He estimated 35 per cent of purchases were by offshore buyers. John Messara, chairman of Arrowfield Stud which stands the Danehill stallion Flying Spur, was also pleased. "It has been a good week," he said. A Flying Spur filly was taken for A\$700,000 during the last session of the sale, and breeders who patronised Flying Spur at a \$15,000 fee received an average return of around \$277,000. "Flying Spur is well and truly following in his father's footsteps," said Messara. "He has started off nearly as well as his father did in his first season with his runners and the market has spoken, they see him as the heir apparent and they are very keen on him." Messara praised the catalogue, calling it "the first of the truly international catalogues." Clarry Conners will train the for the same connections who raced triple Group 1 winner Mouawad (Zabeel {NZ}), who was also prepared by Conners. New Zealand Bloodstock consulant Joe Walls today revealed that the A\$1.5 million sale-topping Danehill--Sir Tristalove colt's owners include prominent NZ businessman Peter Walker, who raced Rosehill Guineas winner Tycoon Lil, as well as Bob Emery, Gerald Shand, Tim Bodle, Gene Tsoi and William Choi. Clarry Conners, who trained Mouawad to three Group 1 wins, will train the colt.

Reg Inglis also revealed a second sale of 450 yearlings, the Sires' Produce Yearling Sale, would be held over two days on the Sunday-Monday following the Easter sale next year. "Because we've knocked back so many from Easter over the past three or four years, we've moved the Broodmare Sale back in anticipation of this sale. It is for horses that haven't made it into the Easter catalogue that people don't want to sell in January," said Inglis, referring to the rival Gold Coast based Magic Millions sale company's major sale in January. Inglis also holds a January Classic Sale where the average is about one fifth that of Easter at about \$26,000 this year. The major European buyer at the Inglis Easter Yearling Sale, BBA Ireland chief Adrian Nicoll, is surprised more Northern Hemisphere buyers have not taken advantage of favourable currency rates to snare internationally appealing thoroughbreds here. "At the moment it is a tremendous advantage because the currency is so weak, the great thing is we spend A\$1 million and it works out under 400,000 pounds," he said. Nicoll reflected prevailing opinion when he said well conformed yearlings were highly sought after while less eye-catching youngsters -- even those with the most royal pedigrees -- were spurned by a discerning buying bench. "The good ones are making plenty -the market is very solid for a good horse, "he said. "I think not enough people are coming here; it is getting better by the minute and I know the place backwards because I have been coming here for a long time, 24 years actually." Nicoll bought six lots for almost \$1.7 million including a \$500,000 Danehill--Prawn Cocktail filly. "I am mainly interested in fillies and I am buying mainly for a partnership comprising an Englishman, a Scotsman, a Canadian and an Australian, horses that will race here with Peter Hayes and Lee Freedman. "We are mainly trying to buy fillies we can relate to in the northern hemisphere and for which, if they're any good, we have got a market up there. The Prawn Cocktail filly is out of a half-sister to Royal Academy and that is the family of Storm Cat, the leading sire in the world, and if she can win a stakes race then you've got a huge international market," he said.

Leading trainer Brain P.C. Kan Ping-chee recorded his 722nd winner Wednesday at Happy Valley to take the lead in all-time career training wins in Hong Kong. Mr. Kan eclipsed the record previously held by George Moore, who retired from training in 1986.

BASIL MARCUS LEAVES HONG KONG

Seven-time Hong Kong champion jockey Basil Marcus announced that he will return to England after the season and begin riding in the UK permanently. He made the decision due to Visa complications. "It's very hard to imagine Hong Kong racing without Basil Marcus," said Jockey Club Director of Racing Engelbrecht-Bresges.
