#### **SUNLINE TO U.S.?**

New Zealand champion Sunline (NZ) (Desert Sun (GB)) will return home from Australia Tuesday, skipping Saturday's G1 Queen Elizabeth S. but more than A\$1 million richer for her four-start autumn campaign that netted a Group 1 double and a Group 2 win. Her connections now may plot a U.S. campaign. "She'd be very competitive in America, even on dirt, because of her high cruising speed," co-trainer Steve McKee told the Thoroughbred Daily News. "Her action should suit dirt, and because she races near the lead she won't have to worry about dirt coming back in her face. The final decision is up to (part-owners) Trevor (McKee) and Thayne Green, but it would be an interesting exercise. I don't think she's got any more to prove here. We could do the same thing again in the spring, like winning the Cox Plate, but we would like to prove her on a different playing field. I think she would be very competitive in some big races in the United States." New Zealand Thoroughbred Marketing spokesman Mark Player said his organization was keen to back a U.S. tilt for Sunline. "She is a fantastic mare and would be a great ambassador for the New Zealand racing and breeding industry," he said. "We've already had informal discussions about it." McKee has indicated Sunline is unlikely to target Breeders' Cup races because of hefty entry fees. Options could include the distaff turf circuit in California in the fall. Co-owner Thayne Green said, "We are hopeful that is where we are going to end up. We looked at going to Dubai very seriously, but decided maybe it was a year too early and hopefully we will get invited next year. We thought our four-year-old mare was better suited here than overseas--but it would be nice if she could race and then maybe breed in the States. We have had a very good approach from the U.S. for a deal either to purchase her or to race her, then put her to a leading sire and then bring her home."

#### VIRGINIE RETIRED

Brazilian champion Virginie (Brz) (Legal Case {Ire}--Misty Moon {Brz}, by Baronius {Brz}), undefeated in her native country and never worse than second during her short career, has been retired. The six-vear-old, who was imported to the U.S. after capturing Brazil's filly triple crown, added last July's GI Beverly Hills H. to her resume in her third stateside start, but was sidelined after that effort. She came back after nearly nine months to be second by a half length in the Mar. 26 GII Santa Ana H., but a chip was discovered at the top of the sesamoid in her left front ankle after that race. Owned and bred by Rio Claro Thoroughbreds, she goes to the breeding shed after winning nine of her 11 starts for earnings of about \$400,000. It has not yet been decided if she will be bred this year.

#### Final Prep for Anees:

Last year's champion two-year-old Anees (Unbridled) had his final Kentucky Derby prep Monday morning, going five furlongs in 1:00 2/5 under ex-jockey Gary Stevens. Stevens, who has himself won the Derby three times, said of the move, "He was aggressive going off to the pole, probably more so than in any of his prior works. I planned to break off four or five lengths behind [his workmate], but he dragged me right up next to him." He added, "We were experimenting with a new style of blinkers, an aerodynamic type. I didn't like the way he reacted with them. He needs to see a little bit more... so we'll go back to the old blinkers."

#### **Pletcher Patrol:**

Trainer Todd Pletcher sent out three of his four Derby prospects to work yesterday. More Than Ready (Southern Halo) and Impeachment (Deputy Minister) worked in company, going five furlongs in 1:00 4/5 and galloping out the three quarters in 1:14 2/5. Jockey Craig Perret, who rides Impeachement, said, "He's learning and growing every time I get on him. He's smarter and stronger each time." Graeme Hall (Dehere) went out of his own, getting his five furlongs in 1:01 with Shane Sellers in the saddle. "He felt good," Sellers said. "He finished strong--I'd guess he came home in :24 or so. I got a good feel for him and from him in the last part."

# Triple Threats cont. War Chant Works:

War Chant (Danzig), stablemate of the celebrated Fusaichi Pegasus, looked sharp in his final Derby breeze, getting six furlongs in 1:13 4/5 at Churchill yesterday morning and going out seven furlongs in 1:27 4/5. The colt was wearing blinkers for the first time in the drill. "At the eighth pole, [exercise rider Marcelino Olguin] asked him, just to allow him to stretch his legs," trainer Neil Drysdale said. "It was perfect, excellent. Marcelino said he was much more focused with the blinkers. You'd have to be delighted with the way he worked."

#### Also on the Work Tab:

Deputy Warlock (Silver Deputy), fourth in the GI Toyota Blue Grass S. last time out, went a half in :49 1/5 Monday morning. "He worked better than I thought he would," trainer Ken McPeek said. "This horse has a lot of energy right now." Globalize (Summer Squall), winner of the GII Turfway Spiral S. and the runner-up in the GII Coolmore Lexington S., went five eighths in 1:02 with jockey Mike Smith up. "He didn't work great, but he didn't work bad," said Smith, who flew all night after riding at Hollywood Park Sunday and didn't get to the track until 9 a.m. "I think it was just what he needed." Added trainer Jerry Hollendorfer, "He's fit. He's been doing well here and he's coming up [to the race] right." Lexington winner Unshaded (Unbridled) went five furlongs in 1:01 3/5 after the break Monday. The gelding would have to be supplemented to the race. Trainer Carl Nafzger said, "The supplement doesn't have to be in until 9:59 Wednesday morning, but I don't think I'll have to make that decision because I don't think we'll even get in." If Unshaded doesn't make the cut, Nafzger said he would skip the May 20 GI Preakness as well, pointing instead for the GII Peter Pan S. at Belmont Park May 27. Harlan Traveler (Harlan), third in the Lexington, was clocked going five furlongs in 1:01 3/5. Trainer Ray Lawrence Jr. said, "Right now I'm 70-30 to run this horse Saturday. Since we've come back to Kentucky, he's just doing great. He's improving and improving, which is why I'm considering him for this race. I'll see how he eats up and feels [Tuesday] morning, then I'll probably know what we're doing.

The seeds sown during a fine 1999 season have at last blossomed for Dansili, who took his second group race of the year in superb fashion and, with Kingsalsa in second, provided trainer Andre Fabre with a pleasing one-two. Having won the G3 Prix Edmond Blanc over this course and distance Apr. 5, Dansili showed his true versatility to lead from pillar to post under an excellent ride from the fast-maturing jockey Christophe Soumillon. Without a recognised pacesetter in the field, the kind hands of Soumillon allowed Dansili to bowl along in front from the keen German raider Jashin (Ire) (Soviet Star). As the field rounded the home turn Soumillon began to gradually wind up the pace as Kingsalsa and Double Heart staked their claims. Dansili was ridden to maintain his advantage from the quarter-mile marker and he quickened again at the distance to settle the race in an instant. Kingsalsa could not quite manage to get on terms, but ran with distinction to finish second. Teddy Beckett, Prince Khalid's racing manager, said, "Dansili is a horse who has matured and strengthened during the winter, and he doesn't pull like he used to. He settled well in front today and quickened nicely. He is not in the G1 Lockinge S. [at Newbury], but the G1 Prix d'Ispahan at Longchamp [May 21] is a possibility." Stakes Results cont. p3

Monashee Mountain, winner of the G3 Killavullan S. at Leopardstown in October and the Listed Loughbrown S. here Mar. 26, took his unbeaten record to a perfect four-for-four with this smooth victory. In rear until half-way as Last Call (Ire) (Salse) led, he made easy progress towards the front as Legal Jousting took over two furlongs out and within a few strides was in command. He was pushed out under a hands-and-heels ride to win comfortably. Trainer Aidan O'Brien said, "You never know what might happen to Giant's Causeway or Bernstein, but this horse is an unlikely runner at the moment in Saturday's 2000 Guineas at Newmarket. Those two are both well and we're happy with them."

Carnegie Daian was touted as a Classic contender after winning the first two starts of his career last October, but was off four months with an injury. He returned to finish ninth in the Feb. 26 G3 Arlington Cup and sixth in the Mar. 19 G2 Spring Cup. Settled in mid-pack early, he responded to jockey Shinji Fujita's urgings at the top of the stretch to take charge, and drew off the wire. "I felt like he was ready when I worked him last time, so I was confident we could win," said Fujita. "He showed a good turn of foot and is now back in form. I look forward to riding him in the Derby [at Tokyo May 28]."

Exactly how pervasive Northern Dancer's influence has become in Europe was underlined by several of last week's Group races. The G1 Prix Ganay went to Indian Danehill (Ire), a colt inbred 3x4 to the legendary Windfields stallion; the G2 KLM UK Mile was won by Indian Lodge (Ire), who is inbred 4x3; the G3 Prix d'Hedouville was taken by First Magnitude (Ire), an Arazi colt inbred 3x3; the G3 Prix Vanteaux fell to an Arazi filly named America (Ire), who is inbred 3x4; and the G3 Thresher Classic Trial was won by Sakhee, who is inbred 4x3.

As many as four of these five owe one of their lines to Northern Dancer to the exceptional Nijinsky II, who was responsible for First Magnitude's dam Crystal Cup and for Green Dancer, the broodmare sire of Indian Danehill and America. Nijinsky also sired the dam of Bahri, the stallion responsible for the promising Sakhee.

Bahri retired to Shadwell Farm in Kentucky at the end of 1995, with many of the colt's admirers wishing that he had been installed instead at Shadwell's English branch. However, Bahri's location was probably decided by the fact that his breeder, Hamdan Al Maktoum, already had Lahib, another Group 1-winning miler by Riverman, at his Irish stallion station, Derrinstown Stud.

Coincidentally, both these sizeable sons of Riverman carried Sheikh Hamdan's colors to victory in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S., Lahib in 1992 and Bahri in '95.

I would have said that Bahri's pedigree was more attractive to European breeders than that of Lahib, as his dam Wasnah (who went on to produce Bahhare, one of the best European juveniles of 1996) is a daughter of Highest Trump, a champion juvenile filly in Ireland. However, with chronology in Lahib's favor, Bahri left for Kentucky after a thorough testing on the track.

Bahri was officially rated 1995's best miler and he was considered only one pound inferior to Lammtarra, the champion three-year-old. Certainly Bahri was a very hard horse to beat over a mile when at his best, as he showed with his four-length victory over the likes of Charnwood Forest (Ire), Vettori (Ire) and Atticus in the G1 St James's Palace S. and his six-length triumph over Ridgewood Pearl (GB) (subsequent winner of the Breeders' Cup Mile) in the Queen Elizabeth II S. It must be said, though, that Bahri benefited from a very clever ride in the latter contest.

Despite his achievements, Bahri faced an uphill struggle when he arrived in Kentucky. He was untried on dirt and he is by a stallion hardly regarded as a successful sire of sires, despite Irish River's fine record.

I liked Bahri when I saw him at Shadwell last September, but he isn't without his faults. For example, he is rather light of bone below the knee, as was Riverman, and his hocks are well behind him, as were Riverman's. Although I failed to convince any of my clients that he was well worth using, I suspect that I will have no such trouble before the 2001 season.

Bahri's first two crops each number fewer than 30 foals and his third season saw him sire 13 live foals from a book of only 18 mares. Fortunately, lack of numbers hasn't prevented him making his mark. He scored an impressive double at Newmarket last month when his daughters May Contessa and Alshakr (GB) won good quality maiden races. May Contessa has gone on to win well at Kempton and Bahri has another good prospect in Qamous, a Newmarket winner last year.

Qamous recently received a glowing report from trainer Ed Dunlop, who said in the *Racing Post*: "His work is very encouraging and he does appear to have a very high cruising speed. He...could be pretty exciting."

So too could Sakhee, who has now won the last three of his four starts and is likely to continue to advertise Bahri's talents.

#### FOREST WILDCAT FILLY TOPS FASIG-TIPTON

A filly from the first crop by freshman sire Forest Wildcat (Storm Cat) brought a final bid of \$240,000 as the sales topper at yesterday's Fasig-Tipton Preferred Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale at the Sports Spectrum in Louisville, Kentucky. Consigned by Cecil and Ojia Stewart, agent, the dark bay is out of stakes-placed Kombat Kate (Fit to Fight) and is a half sister to stakes-placed Kombat Kat (Future Storm). She was purchased by Indiana owner Robert McCullough. More than 50 percent of the juveniles offered went unsold, with 30 of the 58 lots failing to reach their reserves. Last year, 40 of the 85 two-year-olds offered, or 47 percent, were unsold.

#### BLACKOUT THREATENS DERBY TELECAST

The subject of a black-out by parent company Walt Disney Co., the ABC network is not currently available in those households which are part of the Time-Warner Cable system. Disney pulled the ABC signal from Time-Warner yesterday morning and if the dispute between the two companies is not resolved by Saturday, approximately 3.5 million homes affected by the black-out will miss out on the broadcast of the GI Kentucky Derby. The problem arose when Time-Warner declined to meet Disney's demands regarding its family of channels.

TURF CHALLENGE BACK FOR 2000 The Trainers' Turf Challenge, which offers trainers the chance at a total of \$200,000 in bonuses, has been renewed for 2000, it was announced yesterday. The Challenge consists of two divisions--one for three-year-olds and one for three-year-old fillies--with three turf stakes in each division. Calder Race Course, Churchill Downs and Hollywood Park will each host one race per division. The fillies will compete in the June 4 \$150,000 GIII Regret S. at Churchill, the Oct. 21 \$200,000 Calder Oaks and the Nov. 19 \$125,000 Matiara S. at Hollywood, while the colts and geldings will go in the June 10 \$250,000 Jefferson Cup at Churchill, the Oct. 28 \$200,000 GIII Calder Derby and Nov. 19 \$500,000 GI Early Times Hollywood Derby. Trainers can enter more than one horse per race, and different horses for each leg of the series, but only the horse which earns the most points over the course of the series will be counted for the bonus. The horse which earns the most points in each division will net his trainer \$50,000, with \$30,000 for the runner-up and \$20,000 for the third-highest point getter. Points are determined by the number of horses in each race: if there are 10 horses in the field, the winner gets 10 points, the second horse gets nine, down to the last-place finisher, which gets a point for participating.

#### **Increase for Woodbine Purses:**

The Ontario Jockey Club and the Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association yesterday announced that the overnight purses for Thoroughbred racing at Woodbine will be raised effective May 5. A total of C\$7 million will be added to the purses over the balance of the 2000 season, which closes Dec. 3. Purses are now expected to exceed C\$57 million, more than double the amount distributed in 1997. Claiming races have been capped, with the winner's share of the purse not to exceed the claiming price. Purses for claiming races which have not reached that ceiling and for allowance races will go up 20 percent. "Our growth in Thoroughbred racing, with the successful implementation of slots at Woodbine, enables us to institute yet another purse increase," David Willmot, the OJC's president and CEO, said. "This new purse structure and our multi-million dollar plant upgrades position Woodbine as one of the leaders of Thoroughbred racing in North America."

# THE KYL BILL - AN NTRA UPDATE By Greg Avioli

The House of Representatives reconvened yesterday after their Easter recess. As early as this week, the House is expected to vote on the Internet Gambling Prohibition Act (known as the "Kyl/Goodlatte" bill). Passage of this bill in its current form should be a priority to all economic stakeholders in our industry. The bill would outlaw substantially all forms of wagering on the Internet in the United States, but would specifically allow account wagering on horseracing via the Internet, provided the wagering met certain technical requirements and complied with applicable state law.

Passage of the bill in its current form has become doubly important due to the extreme position the Department of Justice has taken, vigorously opposing horseracing's exemptions. Here is an excerpt from the Justice opinion:

"Simply stated, the Department of Justice does not understand why the pari-mutuel wagering industry should be allowed to accept wagers from people in their homes, when other forms of gambling have rightly been prohibited from doing so. The same concerns that we have expressed about children and compulsive gamblers having unfettered access to gambling via the Internet is true whether the betting is on horse races or casino games."

Of even greater concern, the Justice Department's opposition to the Kyl/Goodlatte bill has extended to publicly questioning the legality under the federal Wire Act of interstate common-pooled simulcasting.

Simulcasting now accounts for approximately 80 percent of the \$14 billion in total handle wagered on horseracing in the United States each year and at least 50 percent of that amount is derived from interstate common pooling. If the Justice Department successfully pursues criminal actions based on its current position, it could effectively cripple the Thoroughbred racing and breeding industries.

The NTRA and the American Horse Council have been working diligently in Washington since the first of the year lobbying for passage of the Kyl/Goodlatte bill. Tim Smith and I personally met with officials at the Justice Department to explain the legal framework under which horseracing has legally conducted interstate common pooling and to point out the potentially dire consequences of Justice's current position.

We will keep the *Thoroughbred Daily News* readers and all of our industry's stakeholders apprised of ongoing developments in this area. #### PINS TO STUD

Melbourne Triple Crown winner Pins (Aus) (Snippets {Aus}) has been retired and will stand at Waikato Stud in New Zealand during the upcoming Southern Hemisphere breeding season. "There was certainly plenty of competition for him and there has been plenty of to-ing and fro-ing in the past week, but we've got him," said Waikato Stud Manager Mark Chittick. "Pins suits us very well, he is a lovely looking horse and a very good racehorse and we have got 100-percent New Zealand ownership and that is very important to us." Waikato Stud is owned by New Zealand Racing Industry Board Chairman Garry Chittick. A decision on whether the new stallion will be syndicated and what his fee will be is to be made soon, he said. The three-year-old overcame a hoof problem to claim a A\$250,000 bonus with his triple-crown victory, which culminated with the A\$1 million Australian Guineas at Flemington Mar. 13., but went amiss after finishing sixth by 1 1/2 lengths in the Apr. 8 G1 George Ryder S. in what turned out to be his final appearance. Pins retires with seven wins and three seconds from 14 outings and earnings of A\$1,438,395.
