126th OAKS DRAWS FOURTEEN

A field of 14 fillies was entered yesterday for Friday's 126th renewal of the GI Kentucky Oaks at Churchill Downs. The field includes last year's Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies champ **Cash Run** (Seeking the Gold). In between fourth-place finishes in the Jan. 23 GII Santa Ynez and Apr. 8 GI Ashland, the D. Wayne Lukas trainee captured the Feb. 20 GII Davona Dale and Mar. 16 GII Bonnie Miss. Lukas will be looking for his fifth Oaks victory Friday. "It's really fast becoming one of those fixture-type races," the Hall of Fame trainer said of the race. "The Oaks is one of those coveted races that all trainers would like to win." Jerry Bailey, riding Cash Run on Friday and **War Chant** (Danzig) in Saturday's Derby, is the most recent jockey to complete the Oaks/Derby double when he won the 1993 Oaks and Derby with **Dispute** and **Sea Hero**, respectively. The Oaks field also includes, **Kumari Continent** (Kris S.). Narrowly beaten by one-time Derby hopeful **Surfside** in the Mar. 12 GI Santa Anita Oaks, she took to the turf to win the Apr. 1 **Providencia S.** last out. **Rings A Chime** (Metfield) chased **Surfside** throughout the winter in Southern California. Shipped east, the filly defeated **Zoftig** and **Circle of Life** to win the **Ashland S.** The winners of the last two runnings of the Oaks return to Churchill Friday. **Silverbulletday** (Silver Deputy) and **Keeper Hill** (Deputy Minister) will meet in the GII Louisville Breeders' Cup H. two races before the Oaks.

The Deputy On Track:

GI Santa Anita Derby winner **The Deputy (Ire)** (Petardia {GB}) skipped through a five-furlong drill yesterday in 1:00 at Churchill. The colt recorded splits of :24 1/5, :37, :48 2/5 and galloped out in 1:13. "A great move," jockey Chris McCarron commented after the work. "He was very cooperative. I asked him to extend his stride the last sixteenth and he did it readily. He galloped out very well. He's a very professional horse with lots of talent."

Captain Steve Works:

Captain Steve (Fly So Free) worked five furlongs in :59 2/5 yesterday at Churchill. The Bob Baffert trainee cut out fractions of :24 1/5 and :36 2/5. "He worked great," Baffert said. "He worked today without blinkers and he'll run Saturday without them. The last couple of times he ran, the riders said he seemed to get edgy and a little hot going to the gate. So we took the blinkers off for his workout the other day and left them off again today."

Classic Outlook

They've played out of town (so to speak), now all the three-year-olds converge on Churchill Downs and Newmarket this weekend. The weather report looks encouraging for Newmarket; it's finally more or less stopped raining and the sun's trying to come out--which is fine. Colleagues at Churchill Downs report Fusaichi Pegasus towers over his rivals...so it could prove, too. He does have a good enough pedigree: the dam was cut out to be a runner, she's by Danzig and a full sister to a Classic winner, and the family has produced real class in Ruffian and Icecapade (also a successful sire of sires, including Clever Trick--sire of Phone Trick and Wild Again). Oh, and he was a \$4-million yearling by Mr. Prospector. He's got the form and the numbers, too. He's run a Beyer 111--good enough to win most Kentucky Derbies--and the horse he beat in the San Felipe, The Deputy, came back to win the Santa Anita Derby (over Fusaichi Pegasus's stablemate War Chant), and has the second best winning fig of the Derby contenders. Fusaichi Pegasus will go off at 8-5. The last time we had a Triple Crown winner was in 1978, and it's about time we had another, don't you think?

Mind Games: Hyperion 2YO Speed

Meanwhile, across the Pond, the 1994 Royal Ascot five-furlong two-year-old winner Mind Games had his seventh winner from his first crop on Monday. This horse was a real speedball. Trained by the King of Speed, Jack Berry, Mind Games won the first two-year-old race of the year--the Brocklesby, at Doncaster in March--and went on to win five-furlong group races at two, three, and four. He's the best horse yet sired by Puissance, a son of Thatching, and it all provides an interesting pedigree twist. The once all-conquering Hyperion sire line now really only survives, at least in the Northern Hemisphere, through two speed strains which are mostly now based in Britain, Forli and Owen Tudor. Forli operates through two strains, Thatch (sire

of Thatching, sire of Puissance, sire of Mind Games) and Formidable. The winner of the 1977 Middle Park, Formidable was by Forli out of the Raise a Native mare Native Partner, making him a half brother to Fabuleux Jane (granddam of Arazi), and to Ajdal, from Ralph Wilson's great Dinner Partner family. Formidable sired the very good sire Efisio (himself sire of the promising but ill-fated Pip's Pride), and another successful sprint sire in Forzando. Interestingly, Efisio, Pip's Pride, and Forzando are all particularly good sires of mudlarks.

The other operative Northern Hemisphere Hyperion line descends from Owen Tudor. He sired Tudor Minstrel and Abernant. Tudor Minstrel in turn sired Sing Sing and Will Somers. Ironically, not so many years ago it seemed certain if any speed Hyperion would survive it would be Sing Sing, but now the best chance may be Cadeaux Geneux, who descends (through Balidar and the short-lived Young Generation) from Will Somers. There is still a remote chance of a Star Kingdom (Stardust)-line horse emerging from Australia, but they have been effectively swamped the last few years by dual-hemisphere stallions.

Bahri Moving On Up

One horse making his way up the corporate ladder is Sheikh Hamdan's F97 (first foals 3yo's of 2000) Kentucky stallion, Bahri, who had his first Group winner last Saturday when Sakhee outbattled previous Newmarket SW Pawn Broker to win the G3 Thresher Classic Trial at Sandown in heavy ground. Then on Monday, the filly May Contessa, a half sister to 1996 Norfolk S. (Royal Ascot, 5f, G3) winner Topsy Creek, won her second straight, a hot six-furlong conditions race at Kempton. Another well-bred filly by him, Alshakr (out of Give Thanks, by Relko), was an impressive maiden winner at the last Newmarket meeting, and is a probable for the Pretty Polly S. (Listed) this Sunday. Interestingly, Sakhee is out of the 1993 (soft-ground) Ribblesdale S. (Royal Ascot, 12f, 3f, G2) winner Thawaakib, a staying-bred filly herself, by Sadler's Wells--Tobira Celeste, by Ribot. Bahri himself was a crack miler, third in the 1995 English 2000 Guineas (behind Pennekamp and

Celtic Swing), and impressive winner of the St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot and the Queen Elizabeth II S., on the latter occasion defeating subsequent Breeders' Cup Mile winner Ridgewood Pearl under an inspired ride by the canny Scot, Willie Carson, "under the trees." Bahri subsequently failed to quite see out the 10 furlongs in the Champion S., but he is out of a Nijinsky II mare, which means Sakhee has two staying Northern Dancer crosses, plus a Ribot thrown in for good measure. Bahri's looking quite good value at this moment, at \$12,500.

DRYSDALE AND KRONE ELECTED TO

HALL OF FAME He has never started a horse in the Kentucky Derby, but the accomplishments of trainer Neil Drysdale during his 26-year career have earned him a spot in the National Museum of Racing Hall of Fame, which announced its 2000 class of inductees yesterday. Also inducted was the Drysdale-trained 1992 Horse of the Year A.P. Indy. Drysdale, who will make his first Derby appearance with Fusaichi Pegasus and War Chant on Saturday, is the trainer of five champions and five Breeders' Cup winners. Through 1999, his California-based stable registered 919 victories from 4,595 starts and earned more than \$50 million. Concerning his election, Drysdale said, "I'm very honored and humbled. It's not something you aspire to or think of when you are starting out as a trainer, but now that I'm in, I feel very honored." When reminded that Wayne Lukas won the Kentucky Derby last year only days after becoming a Hall of Famer, Drysdale replied, "I hope history repeats itself." In the jockey category, Julie Krone became the first female elected to the Hall of Fame. Krone's riding exploits, regardless of her gender, rank her among the sport's greats. In 19 seasons, she won 3,545 races from 20,470 mounts and earned over \$81 million. A winner of riding titles in New York and New Jersey, Krone registered her first victory aboard Lord Farkle at Tampa Bay Downs on Feb. 12, 1981. Her biggest career score came with Colonial Affair in the 1993 Belmont S. "To be in the Hall of Fame, that's the cake, the icing on the cake and the ice cream on top of the icing," said Krone. Horses elected to the Hall include A.P. Indy in the Contemporary Male category, Winning Colors in the Contemporary Female category and Needles as the Horse of Yesteryear. A.P. Indy topped the 1990 Keeneland July Sale, fetching a price of \$2.9 million. Racing in the colors of Tomonori Tsurumaki, he was scratched the morning of the Kentucky Derby due to a bruised foot, but came back to win the Peter Pan S. and the Belmont S. and stamp himself the leader of his generation. He then capped off his season with a victory in the Breeders' Cup Classic and was retired with eight wins from 11 starts and earnings of \$2,979,815. Winning Colors, a front-running roan filly

owned by Eugene Klein, became only the third filly to win the Kentucky Derby when she defeated Forty Niner in 1988. It was the first Derby victory for her trainer D. Wayne Lukas and jockey Gary Stevens. She finished her career with eight wins from 19 starts and \$1,526,837. Jack Dudley and Bonnie Heath's Needles won the Sapling and Hopeful S. at two and was named champion two-year-old in a *Daily Racing Form* poll, thus becoming the first champion bred in Florida. At three, the colt won the Flamingo S. and Florida Derby, then made a remarkable run from 24 lengths back to score a victory in the 1956 Kentucky Derby. He lost the Preakness but rebounded to win the Belmont S. and was the consensus champion three-year-old. Standing at Bonnie Heath Farm in Florida, Needles enjoyed a long career at stud, siring 21 stakes winners. A ceremony honoring the new members of the Hall of Fame will be held at Fasig-Tipton Company's Humphrey S. Finney Sales Pavillion in Saratoga Springs on Aug. 7 at 10:30 a.m.

RECORDS SET AT KEENELAND SPRING MEET

A record crowd of 29,687 helped increase Keeneland's on-track average daily attendance at the 15-day Keeneland Spring Meet by 3.3 percent. An average of 13,063 people attending the races each day. Average daily on-track wagering at Keeneland also reached record heights, with a daily average of \$1,558,917 put through the windows. LEVY BOARD ISSUES POLICY STATEMENT

The British Horserace Betting Levy Board will increase by £1.5 million the amount it will contribute to the Appearance Money Scheme, a program used to attract extra entries for races, it was announced today in the Board's 2000 Policy Statement. The Levy Board contribution to the program for the period between July 1, 2000 to March 31, 2001 will amount to £2,110,000. "We warmly accept the Levy Board's agreement to BHB's proposal that it supplement its Sunday Racing Appearance Money allocation for 2000," said British Horseracing Board Chief Executive Tristram Ricketts. "This will provide a much-needed boost to the opportunities for owners to earn business income which underpins the VAT scheme." The amount of the incentive is still under discussion and is to be taken up at the next meeting of the Levy Board scheduled for May 24. The Board will also make an annual £650,000 contribution to the Divided Races Fund. This amount should help defray a substantial portion of the costs to stage these extra races in 2000 and 2001. The Levy Board's total contribution to racing for this year is roughly £34 million, nearly 50 percent of total prize money offered in England. "The Levy Board's contribution to prize money is a very important one," commented Levy Board Chairman Robert Hughes. "Therefore, the need to find an adequate replacement to the levy system, once it ceases to exist, is paramount." The British Government has previously indicated its desire to abolish the Levy Board "in due course." The Board also reiterated its commitment to finding ways of reducing the duty on betting. The Policy Statement reads: "The Board will continue to support efforts to secure a further reduction in betting duty sufficient to enable British bookmakers to compete on a level playing field with overseas bookmakers." Currently, those overseas bookmakers offer duties as low as three percent, whereas duties charged to off-course punters by bookmakers can be as high as nine percent. There are also provisions for an increase in the amount of money the Board will contribute to the British Horserace Training Board. Of the roughly £361,000 committed for the year 2000/2001, approximately £63,000 has been allocated to the education program, which endeavors to introduce children to racing, with the assistance of training yards, studs, race courses, racing schools and the National Horseracing Museum.

PRIZE MONEY INCREASE FOR GOODWOOD

Goodwood racecourse is to offer record added prize money of £2,576,000 for the 2000 season, eight per cent up on last year's figure. Sponsor's contributions have increased by £100,000, while the racecourse executive will put in £890,000, and the Levy Board will provide in excess of £900,000. Rises in minimum prize money, and an increasing prize money structure with each meeting are other moves, while J. P. Morgan, the financial services firm, will sponsor the Goodwood Cup for the first time. Chairman of the Goodwood Group The Duke of Richmond, said, "Goodwood again increases prize money well ahead of the rate of inflation. Goodwood prides itself on the quality of its racing, and one of the best ways to attract top-class horses is to have excellent prize money. The staff at Goodwood racecourse have worked tirelessly to increase the levels of prize money, and thanks to the generosity of sponsors as well as major contributions from our own funds and the Levy Board, the millennium year promises to be most exciting at Goodwood." In other moves, the Friday of the Glorious Goodwood festival will feature a new race, the G3 Theo Fennell Lennox S., over seven furlongs, which has previously been known as the Beeswing S., run at Newcastle, and the G3 Lanson Vintage S. will be moved to support the G1 Sussex S. on the Wednesday.
