#### SWEET SIXTEEN FOR PEGASUS

GII Wood Memorial winner Fusaichi Pegasus (Mr. Prospector) drew post 16 for Saturday's 126th running of the GI Kentucky Derby and has been installed as the 9-5 morning line favorite by Churchill Downs oddsmaker Mike Battaglia. The imposing bay, whose every move has been documented since his arrival in Louisville, will break from the six-stall auxiliary gate, a fact which does not particularly concern his trainer. "I picked it (post 16) to keep him out of trouble," said Neil Drysdale. "He's really a good gate horse, but why keep him standing for a long time." The right to make the first choice of post positions after the pill draw fell to the 1998 Kentucky Derby winning team of trainer Bob Baffert and owner Mike Pegram for their GI Hollywood Futurity winner Captain Steve (Fly So Free). Pegram's grandson Gator proceeded to hang a placard bearing Pegram's colors in slot number eight, the same gate from which Real Quiet broke en route to his victory two years ago. Trainer Todd Pletcher will be represented by his first runners in the Kentucky Derby and with the fourth overall pick teamed with owner James Scatuorchio to choose the 10-hole for GI Blue Grass S. runner up More Than Ready (Southern Halo). "The ten was our first choice," Pletcher said. "We wanted the middle of the gate and they are going to double load, so we shouldn't have to wait so long." More Than Ready, who won the WHAS S. on Derby Day last year, is 10-1 on the morning line. GI Santa Anita Derby hero The Deputy (Ire) (Petardia {GB}) is the second pick on the morning line at 4-1. Owner Barry Irwin of Team Valor chose to break from post number 15, the first stall in the extra gate. "We wanted to be closer to the middle so we took it," Irwin commented. Sheikh Mohammed added a lighthearted twist to the proceedings when choosing a slot for his UAE Derby winner China Visit (Red Ransom). He approached the board bearing the silks of Captain Steve and feigned that he was going to replace his silks in that spot, before moving over to post position number 12. Together with stablemate Curule (Go For Gin), the entry is offered at 50-1. The top representative of the D. Wayne Lukas stable is Blue Grass winner High Yield (Storm Cat), whose connections drew the 18th pick and were left with post 18. "Let's redraw it," Lukas jested. Last year's winner Charismatic won from post 17. Post time for the 126th Derby is 5:27 p.m. EDT.

#### Aptitude Displays His Aptitude:

Juddmonte Farms' GII Wood Memorial third-place finisher Aptitude (A.P. Indy) had his final pre-race drill yesterday morning, getting four furlongs in a swift :47 1/5 beneath Robby Albarado. "I thought it was a good work," said Albarado, who will pilot Captain Steve in Saturday's main event. "He impressed me last week and again today. He came off the track bouncing both times." Alex Solis will have the mount on Saturday.

#### Harlan Traveler Officially Withdrawn:

Harlan Traveler (Harlan), most recently third behind Unshaded in the GII Coolmore Lexington Apr. 22, was withdrawn from Derby consideration yesterday morning by trainer Ray Lawrence. "I'd really love to run him," Lawrence said, "but I'm behind the eight ball with him. I just don't have enough into him." The conditioner indicated that his charge could instead be rerouted for the GII Illinois Derby at Sportsman's May 13.

#### Godolphin Duo In:

After days of uncertainty, delayed travel and plans B, Shiekh Mohammed's UAE Derby winner China Visit (Red Ransom) and UAE Derby third Curule (Go For Gin) both made the final field of 20 runners. China Visit was out for work yesterday morning, clocking six furlongs in 1:13 2/5, according to Churchill clockers. Trainer Saeed bin Suroor timed the drill in 1:01 2/5 for five furlongs. "I was pleased with the work," bin Suroor said. "He is doing very well and I am happy with him." The trainer has named Marlon St. Julien to pilot Curule in the big race. Curule arrived from New York Tuesday and will gallop up to the race.

#### **Unshaded Just Misses the Party:**

Owner James Tafel's Lexington S. winner Unshaded (Unbridled), who impressed on the track during the past week, was left out of the final field, though the owner was ready to supplement the gelding for \$150,000. Before the draw, trainer Carl Nafzger said, "If 20 enter, we're in; if 21 enter, we're out and we get our money back. Nafzger's original plan was to run Unshaded in a Keeneland allowance, the day before the Lexington, but it did not fill. "We wouldn't have this problem if that allowance race had filled,' Nafzger continued. "I'd just have a nice horse with three straight wins and be looking for a spot." The conditioner did not indicate where Unshaded would be pointed next.

Orchestra Stall had smart form in 1997, when he won the G3 Curragh Cup and G3 Prix Gladiateur, and was runner-up to Classic Cliche (Ire) in the G2 Prix Kergorlay. He had leg problems thereafter and was fired, but connections kept their faith and managed to bring him back to run a respectable sixth to Yavana's Pace (Ire) in the G3 John Porter S. at Haydock Apr. 22. Here he was held up at the back early as a fast pace was set by Jaseur (Lear Fan). His rider moved him up to mid-division before the turn into the straight, where he had to be switched to the outside to chase Persian Punch, who had stolen a lead. Ridden strongly, he got up late in a thrilling finish to win by a short head. Winning trainer John Dunlop, who also trains the third and fourth-place finishers, said, "I was delighted with Orchestra Stall, as fired horses seldom come back on the flat. I'm thrilled to bits with Celeric too, and (his rider) said he was as good as he was when he won the 1997 G1 Ascot Gold Cup. He'll go for the G2 Yorkshire Cup (York, May 18)."

TIME WARNER, DISNEY CALL TRUCE In the shadow of the wire, Time Warner and Disney, parent company of ABC Television, have come to a temporary agreement to restore ABC networks to the cable system. The dispute had jeopardized Saturday's broadcast of the Kentucky Derby to over 3.5 million Time Warner subscribers. The two parties, while not officially settling their differences, agreed to extend cable coverage through July 15 while negotiations continue.

#### **EXCELLENT MEETING RETURNS SUNDAY**

Golden Eagle Farms' MGISW Excellent Meeting (General Meeting), unraced since a ninth-place finish in the GI Del Mar Oaks last Aug. 22, makes her return to the races in Sunday's GII Hawthorne H. at Hollywood Park. The four-year-old, winner in 1999 of the GI Las Virgenes and GI Santa Anita Oaks, also accounted for the GII Fantasy S. before going postward in the Kentucky Derby as part of the 9-2 favored entry with stablemate General Challenge, a race in which she finished fifth. Sidelined since undergoing surgery to remove an ankle chip following her Del Mar performance, the bay has trained forwardly for her return, including a bullet six furlongs May 2 in 1:11 4/5 at Santa Anita. Corey Nakatani has the mount for trainer Bob Baffert in the 1 1/16-mile event.

## HOCK INFECTION SIDELINES KELLY KIP For the second time in as many years, crack sprinter Kelly

Kip (Kipper Kelly) has been sidelined by a hock infection, Daily Racing Form reports. The six-year-old had made four starts this year, since returning from his injury and was most recently second in the GIII Bold Ruler Apr. 15. "The hock was doing so good; it was almost normal in size," said trainer Allen Jerkens. The injury will cost the bay a spot in this weekend's GI Carter H.

#### **COLOMBIA TO WEDGEWOOD STUD**

Colombia (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}), arguably the highest profile Australasian thoroughbred never to race, will stand at Wedgewood Stud in New Zealand's Matamata this season at a fee of \$NZ4,000. The full brother to Australia's all-time highest stakes earner Octagonal (NZ) and triple Group One winner Mouawad (NZ) was the last foal of wonder mare Eight Carat (GB) and brought the second highest-priced Australasian yearling in history when he brought \$NZ1.6 million at Karaka in 1998. But after a dull barrier trial for trainer Lee Freedman in February, a veterinary examination revealed Colombia had lesions on his thoracic vertebrae that would prevent him from racing but would not affect his stud career. "He was a nice type of colt and he showed good ability," Freedman said. "Unfortunately his setback meant he never got to show us on the track what we believed he had." Vinery Australia Principal Dr Tom Simon said it was vital Colombia stood at a stud where he would maximise his chances of success in his crucial first season, and Wedgewood Stud fitted the bill perfectly. "What better place than in the heartland of New Zealand's breeding area where Colombia's own sire and his grand-sire, Sir Tristram, were so successful," said Dr. Simon. "He is competitively-priced and he is an outstanding type with the most sought-after pedigree in the southern hemisphere." Wedgewood Stud principal Robert Lithgow said Colombia would cover around 75 mares in his inaugural season.
