CROWDED CLASSIC AT NEWMARKET

The European Classic season gets underway Saturday afternoon with no less than 27 three-year-olds lining up for the 192nd edition of the G1 Sagitta 2000 Guineas at Newmarket. Distant Music (Distant View) has been the long-time Guineas ante-post favorite, but he must overcome a troubled preparation. Undefeated at two, last year's G1 Dewhurst winner injured a foot in his first start this season and was beaten on the line in the Apr. 18 G3 Greenham S. at Newmarket, finishing a head behind Barathea Guest (GB) (Barathea {Ire}) in that test. He had drifted in the pre-Guineas betting after that defeat before hardening to favoritism with most firms once again. The colt looked exceptional when winning the G2 Champagne S. at Doncaster last September and, although he wasn't so impressive in the Dewhurst a month later, he nevertheless established himself as a top-class juvenile. The Juddmonte Farms homebred is currently 4-1 co-favorite (with Ladbrokes) after drawing stall 15. The undefeated Giant's Causeway (Storm Cat) shares the favorite's role. The Aidan O'Brien trainee, winner of the G1 Prix de Salamandre at two, came back this year with a victory over older horses in the G3 Gladness S. He breaks from stall 17. Barathea Guest, who trainer George Margarson said to be only 90-percent ready for his win in the seven-furlong Greenham S., drew stall 10 and is at 10-1 with Ladbrokes. Godolphin, which took last year's Guineas with Island Sands (Ire), has three chances to make it two in a row and three in the past five years. Fath (Danzig), 20-1 from stall 14, is the stable's best hope. A maiden winner at first asking at York last August, he has not been out since running second by a neck to Primo Valentino (Ire) (Primo Dominie {GB}) (20-1 from stall 18) in the Sept. 30 G1 Middle Park S. Fath will be joined in the gate by 20-1 Broche (Summer Squall), who has drawn stall 24, and 40-1 Zoning (GB) (Warning {GB}) from stall 19. (2000 Guineas field, p2)

FILLIES MAKE OLD KENTUCKY HOME

A day before their male counterparts run for the roses, 14 fillies take center stage today to run for the lilies in the GI Kentucky Oaks at Churchill Downs. The 4-1 morning-line favorite is Kumari Continent (Kris S.). The lightly raced Paco Gonzalez trainee, who narrowly lost to Surfside in the GI Santa Anita Oaks, is making her first start outside of Santa Anita, but she won at this distance on the turf last time out. Secret Status (A.P. Indy), 9-2 on the morning line, ran third behind Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies winner Cash Run (Seeking the Gold) in the GII Davona Dale and has been off since winning the Mar. 19 GIII Florida Oaks at Tampa Bay Downs. Circle of Life (Belong to Me) created a buzz when winning the GI Spinaway S. in her third outing last summer. Off six months after a third-place finish in the GI Matron, the filly returned to win a Mar. 5 allowance at Gulfstream before running third behind Rings a Chime (Metfield) and Zoftig (Cozzene) in the Apr. 8 Gl Ashland. Vivid Sunset (Mt. Livermore) is a perfect two-for-two around two turns. She makes her stakes debut off an eight-length romp in a 1 1/16-miles Keeneland allowance Apr. 16.

Globalize Out of Derby:

Globalize (Summer Squall) has been withdrawn from Saturday's Kentucky Derby after being kicked by his lead pony after a gallop yesterday morning. "[Globalize] is a bit of a tough one," said Renee Wilkins who was ponying the colt aboard her sixyear-old pony. "He tries to nibble on me or my horse all the time. Usually it's fine, but this morning he bit my horse a little too hard and he 'cow' kicked him." Globalize suffered a large gash on his left hind leg just below his hock and required stitches. It was the second Derby disappointment for trainer Jerry Hollendorfer who was pointing Event of the Year towards the 1998 Derby when that colt suffered a fractured knee two weeks before the race.

Wheelaway & Ronton Work:

Wheelaway (Unbridled) blew out three furlongs in :34 3/5 yesterday morning under jockey Richard Migliore. "I told Richie not to get after him, just to let him pick up his gallop gradually going into the workout," trainer John Kimmel explained. "I got his first eighth in :12 and at the eighth pole in :24. And he did it without much effort. It's gratifying to see how effortlessly he was traveling and how he was into the bridle and handling the track."

Ronton (Cryptoclearance), seventh in the GII Arkansas Derby, arrived at Churchill late Wednesday. Before leaving Santa Anita, the colt turned in an easy half-mile work in :51.

A champion at two and three, five-time Grade I winner Silverbulletday ended the 1999 season with a disappointing sixth-place finish as the 8-5 favorite in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff. The bay came back in the Apr. 19 Doubledogdare S. at Keeneland and won by a neck over Roza Robata. She is a perfect eightfor-eight at Churchill and undefeated in five tries at this distance. Heritage of Gold, six-for-10 last season with a third-place finish in the Breeders' Cup Distaff, hasn't been beaten in two starts this season, taking the Mar. 19 GIII Oaklawn Breeders' Cup S. and the Apr. 9 GI Apple Blossom H. The five-year-old is fivefor-six at a mile and a sixteenth. Bella Chiarra is also looking to keep her 2000 record unblemished. The five-year-old opened the campaign with an allowance win on the Gulfstream turf Jan. 21, added the Feb. 27 GII Rampart H. on the main track in her next appearance and ran away to a 13-length triumph in the slop at Gulfstream last time out in the Mar. 19 Columbiana H.

Ramruma makes her seasonal debut and will seek to add to her already impressive record. She won five of her six starts last year including three Group Ones. the G1 Vodafone Oaks, the G1 Irish Oaks and the G1 Yorkshire Oaks. She met with defeat in the G1 St Leger, at the hands of Mutafaweg, but lost no caste in defeat. She has the potential to be one of Europe's middle distance stars this year and will start as favourite. Border Arrow finished third in both the 1998 G1 2000 Guineas and 1998 G1 Derby. In his only race last season he finished third to Handsome Ridge in the Shergar Cup Classic at Goodwood. Although his lack of racing may be a worry, he is proven in the highest company and will have ground conditions to suit. Rhagaas is set to start the Godolphin pattern bandwagon rolling in England and his best form saw him finish third to Montjeu in last season's G1 Prix du Jockey-Club (French Derby). He is more than useful and has already shown his well being when finishing a running-on fourth to Fantastic Light in the G3 Dubai Sheema Classic at Nad Al Sheba Mar. 25.

WRITERS UP

A SYNDICATE'S DREAM by Tom Frary

The racing colours of Highclere Throughbred Racing are associated with the dash of the sprinter Tamarisk (Ire), who swept his way through the 1998 season, most notably taking the G1 Haydock Sprint Cup that year. Although this high level of success was a first for a syndicated horse in Britain, it was not an aberration and the year 2000 heralds a new chapter in Highclere's already impressive story.

Sir Michael Stoute's Petrushka (Ire) (Unfuwain) will take the Highclere silks to post as the deserved favourite for Sunday's G1 1000 Guineas S. at Newmarket. Held at 5-4 with Corals, she was bought for 110,000 Irish guineas at the Goffs Sale. The filly looked a force to be reckoned with at Newmarket last time out Apr. 18 when she quickened dramatically past seasoned performers in a quality renewal of the G3 Nell Gwyn S., and she has since thrived on the Heath.

Highclere, one of many such syndicates in Britain, bought its first yearlings in 1992 and had its first runners a year later. Now the leading ownership company in the country, it operates a number of partnerships of different sizes, offering from 20 to 90 shares in each.

Each member makes a one-time payment to buy a share in a group of two-year-olds, with the size of the payment determined by the original cost of the horses. If any of the group continue to race at three there is an additional fee, but it is considerably less than the initial investment. At the end of their racing careers, the horses are sold. Syndicate members share in both the purses earned and the sales price.

All of the syndicates are named for areas in Highclere Castle; Petrushka is owned by "The Library Syndicate."

The secret of Highclere's success is teamwork. John Warren and Harry Herbert, along with their bloodstock advisers, buy yearlings and divide them into the syndicates, while Tim Jones manages the partnerships.

Jones explains, "It is a team effort, with communication vital. We're extremely fortunate to have John Warren for select purchasing, with a major input from Harry Herbert.

"We work extremely hard at it, and we've been extremely fortunate. Our trainers are very professional and they help us to manage the horses, and our share owners put faith in us, giving us their financial backing. While we have to have a commercial eye open, we enjoy it."

Standing on the verge of what could be the first syndicate victory in an English Classic, it is worth considering that this type of enterprise could be the future of racehorse ownership in an increasingly competitive market.

Jones says, "This gives people the opportunity to compete at the highest level, which would be more difficult for the individual. This way we can make a sustained challenge, and it's taken on enthusiastically. I hope it's the way forward."

As for their chances in the 1000 Guineas, Jones says, "The lovely thing is that [in the Nell Gwyn], Petrushka showed lots of speed, the sort you can only dream of. She came out of the race and didn't turn a hair. She is very much on track."

The filly is in good hands at Freemason Lodge, too, and although Sir Stoute has not been shouting her name from the rooftops, he has seemed quietly confident since.

Jones says of the trainer, "I read recently that you learn more from what he doesn't say than what he does, and there's a lot to be said for that. He's always liked her, she's been held in high regard for quite a long time, but before the Nell Gwyn he didn't know where she stood in the big picture. Although he never makes comparisons, he's very happy."

Highclere also have a live outsider for tomorrow's G1 2000 Guineas S. in Mastermind (Ire) (Dolphin Street {Fr}), who beat Kentucky Derby hopeful The Deputy (Ire) convincingly in a Newmarket maiden last year. These are high times indeed for Highclere.

Roxelana had held the lead at every call but one in her first three starts, breaking third in her career debut on the grass at the Fair Grounds Feb. 7 before striding to the front en route to a 2 1/2-length maiden win. She powered to a 6 1/2-length score against allowance foes on the dirt Mar. 3 and was even more convincing in her most recent outing, taking an Apr. 13 Keeneland allowance by 8 1/2 lengths. The odds-on choice to make it four-for-four, the bay showed some versatility, breaking fourth and rating in second through a half in a blistering :44 1/5 before showing her heels to the field in an eyecatching victory. The final time was a stakes record, breaking the mark of 1:22 1/5 set by the great Cicada in 1962. "I asked her to run just a little today for the first time," regular rider Larry Melancon said. "I have been fortunate to ride some nice horses and I don't like to compare them, but this filly, she's special." Added trainer "Blackie" Huffman, "I was surprised how easily she won. I don't want to sound like I wasn't confident in my horse, I just wasn't sure [the bettors] would be so confident. She outran a great bunch today." No word on where the fleet filly will flash her speed next.

BLOOD SAMPLES STOLEN FROM ROME RACETRACK

Further reports indicated that Mario Masini of Scuderia Colle Papa, for whom Davide Umbro (Ity) (In The Wings {GB}) won the Parioli, has declared that if necessary he will give his share of prize money to the racecourse in order to organize a better security system. Masini, president of the Italian Owners Association, has recently been elected the new UNIRE council as thoroughbred racing's representative.
