DERBY 126: A LEGEND IN THE MAKING

Not since 1981 had a winner of the Wood Memorial gone on to victory in the Kentucky Derby. Not since 1979 had the favorite worn the blanket of roses. Not since 1967 had a horse which failed to win at two improved so dramatically that he proved to be the best three-year-old in the land on the first Saturday in May. But Fusaichi Pegasus (Mr. Prospector) doesn't have time for history. Sent off as the 2-1 favorite in the 126th Kentucky Derby at Churchill Downs, the brilliant bay added to his own legend yesterday, turning a perfect trip into an impressive 1 1/2-length victory over 11-1 Aptitude (A.P. Indy). "The racing gods smiled on us," said trainer Neil Drysdale, who was participating in the Derby for the first time in the same week which saw him elected to the Hall of Fame. After being beaten by a neck in his December debut at Hollywood, Fusaichi Pegasus made guick work of maiden and allowance company before stepping into a stakes and besting The Deputy (Ire) (Petardia {GB}) (14th in the Derby) by three-quarters of a length in the Mar. 19 GII San Felipe S. Next it was off to Aqueduct and the GII Wood Memorial where, despite pre-race antics which delayed the start, the talented but temperamental colt cruised to a 4 1/4-length score and firmed as favorite for the Derby. He played the role perfectly. After breaking toward the inside from post 15, the \$4 million Keeneland July yearling saved all the ground around the first turn and rode the rail down the backstretch, had hole after hole open for him as he raced through the final bend, finally swung out as they came into the stretch and sailed home under only the slightest encouragement. "I just gave him a love tap to the tail and a couple of shoulder spanks so he didn't get to gawking and looking and let somebody come and get him," jockey Kent Desormeaux, who rode Real Quiet to win the '98 Derby, said. "When I said go, he took off like you wouldn't believe and the race was over." Spectacular Bid, the last favorite to win, went on to take the Preakness, but could do no better than third in the Belmont. It was the same story for Pleasant Colony, the last Wood winner to taste Derby success. As for Proud Clarion, the 30-1 shot who shocked the crowd in '67, he himself foiled a Triple Crown bid, as Damascus was third in the Derby before victories in the last two jewels. But who needs history lessons when you have a flying horse? (More Derby coverage, p2)

KING'S CORONATION IN 2000 GUINEAS

Bursting from the pack with a furlong to run, King's Best (Kingmambo) thrilled the Newmarket crowd with a brilliant finish to win vesterday's G1 Sagitta 2000 Guineas by a widening 3 1/2 lengths over 7-2 favorite Giant's Causeway (Storm Cat). Giving Sir Michael Stoute his fourth 2000 Guineas winner, the bay rewarded the bettors who had backed him down to 13-2. His clearly delighted trainer said, "This horse has always been very exciting. He is one of those Thoroughbreds with a lot of nervous energy...he's a horse I really, really love, but it was just a question of channeling those nerves." Having impressed when winning his maiden at Newmarket last August, King's Best went on to confirm that promise when successful in the Listed Acomb S. in equally awesome style. That run was followed by a first defeat in the G1 Dewhurst S. at Newmarket in October, but there were valid excuses for the reverse. He went to post far too freely, wouldn't settle in the race and ran with his tongue over the bit. He redeemed his reputation to some degree when second to Umistim (GB) (Inchinor {GB}) in the G3 Craven S. over this course and distance Apr. 20. "He just got a little uptight and upset on Dewhurst day," Stoute said. "We didn't get him to the Craven as cool as we would have liked, but today, although he sweated, it didn't bother me. He never jogged around the ring, he walked all the time." Having raced on unsuitably soft ground in the Craven, King's Best returned to the scene of that test and was a spectacular winner of Britain's first Classic. Likely sprinter Primo Valentino (Ire) (Primo Dominie {GB}) led the way at a good pace in what was a rough race. He was followed by Zoning (GB) (Warning {GB}) and Giant's Causeway, with King's Best and Barathea Guest (GB) (Barathea {Ire}) reserved in the rear. Going into the dip, Giant's Causeway staked his Classic claim to take the lead, but King's Best had made eye-catching progress onto the heels of the leaders and showed awesome acceleration to settle the issue in an instant. Giant's Causeway kept on well, but could not match the winner's kick while holding off a determined Barathea Guest. Although not definite for the race, the winner is quoted as low as 5-1 favorite (with Corals) for the June 10 G1 Vodafone Derby. Distant Music (Distant View), the 11-2 second choice, was rated early, made a bid a quarter mile out, but couldn't sustain it and finished eighth. (Guineas chart, p3)

ON TO THE PREAKNESS FOR THE ALSO-RANS?

Trainer Bobby Frankel, who has yet to win a Breeders' Cup or Triple Crown race, still had to be pleased with the performance of his Kentucky Derby runner-up Aptitude (A.P. Indy). Third in the Apr. 15 GII Wood Memorial last time out, he closed from the back of the pack to get second and Frankel said, "Maybe I'll win one one of these days." But it won't be the Preakness, at least not this year. "I think as the distance goes on, he'll get even better," he said, adding, "We'll skip the Preakness and head for the Belmont. Someone would have to put a gun to my head to go to Pimlico, and nobody's going to do that." Trainer Todd Pletcher, who saddled a quartet, saw Impeachement (Deputy Minister) close from 19th to get third and More Than Ready (Southern Halo), who pressed the suicidal splits of :45 4/5 and 1:09 4/5 set by Hal's Hope (Jolie's Halo) (16th), hold very well for fourth. "I'm proud of all these horses," he said. As for the Preakness, he remarked, "We won't rule anything out, but we won't commit to anything yet, either." Wheelaway (Unbridled) loomed boldly to take the lead between calls in the stretch, but weakened late to be fifth. "It was a good performance," trainer John Kimmel said. "We'll see what happens down the road, how he comes out of it, and see whether or not we're good enough to go into the Preakness or if we'll wait for the (June 10) Belmont. My inclination is probably to wait for the Belmont." The Godolphin entry of China Visit (Red Ransom) and Curule (Go for Gin) ran sixth and seventh, respectively. Jockey Frankie Dettori, aboard China Visit, said, "At the three-eighths pole I really thought we were going to win. He was really in the bridle. He just ran out of steam at the three-sixteenths pole." The Team Lukas entry was nowhere to be found, with Exchange Rate (Danzig) running 12th, High Yield (Storm Cat) finishing 15th and Commendable (Gone West) beating just two in 17th. "They ran flat today for whatever reason," trainer D. Wayne Lukas said. "You know, there is always an explanation of some kind. I was disappointed in all three, because they all trained so well for the race." Lukas has no immediate plans for the trio. Gl Santa Anita Derby winner The Deputy (Ire) (Petardia {GB}), the second choice at 9-2, was never in the hunt and finished 14th. "He just didn't fire," trainer Jenine Sahadi said. "[Jockey Chris McCarron] said that he seemed to be struggling, but we don't know why just yet. He looks like he came out of the race okay." As for the future, she said, "He has been going pretty good the last four months. We'll go home and regroup and get ready for things later in the summer."

JULEP JUBILATION "When I laid eyes on the colt, I knew he was going to be a Derby winner," Fusao Sekiguchi, speaking through an interpreter, insisted after watching his \$4 million baby Fusaichi Pegasus (Mr. Prospector) romp home in the \$1,338,400 Kentucky Derby. "It's very difficult to express my feelings in words," he added. "Right now my mind is just spinning and spinning." The Japanese owner did have the presence of mind to assure Americans that the Derby winner's future lies in his native country. "Mr. Prospector was a treasure for the United States," he said, "so his progeny should remain in the U.S. as well." For the immediate future, the Kentucky bred will remain at Churchill, preparing for the May 20 GI Preakness S. at the Kentucky track before heading to Pimlico.

When Petrushka went to Newmarket for her Guineas trial in what was only her career second outing in the G3 Nell Gwyn S. Apr.18, she carried with her a reputation bolstered by glowing gallops reports and she duly trounced a quality field containing Seazun (2nd) and Aunty Rose (3rd), as well as Halland Park Girl and Princess Ellen. For any of those to turn that form around, the favourite will have to suffer a major reversal, such was her authority that day. However, Seazun was giving away three pounds as a penalty for her G1 Cheveley Park S. success last year and was unlucky in running, so she could be closer. Godolphin, who returned to Newmarket this week, are represented by Bintalreef. A maiden winner on her Ione official start at Deauville last October, the filly won her Dubai trial, imposing a 4 1/2length defeat on the highly regarded Teggiano (Ire), and looks the contender most likely to trouble the top picks.

Manndar showed he belonged with top company when he finished a strong third to Dubai Millenium (GB) in the G2 Prix Eugene Adam at Maisons-Laffitte July 18 and was third in the G3 Prix du Prince d'Orange Sept. 18. He shipped to California and ran fourth in the G2 Oak Tree Derby, then ran a huge race to finish second in the GI Hollywood Derby. His hard luck continued when he ran third by 1 1/2 lengths to top California turf star Brave Act (GB) in the GII San Gabriel H. Jan 1. Given a three-month break after that effort, he came back to be fourth in the GII El Rincon H. Apr. 8. Sent off the 5-1 fourth choice here, Manndar sat just two lengths off a slow pace, split horses going into the far turn to take the lead, accelerated into the stretch and had plenty left to hold off the late run of Falcon Flight (Fr). "He's the kind of horse that you just let do his running and go on about his business," winning jockey Corey Nakatani said. "He was in a little tight into the first turn, but got into his stride about the half-mile pole and then marched on." Looking ahead, trainer Beau Greely said, "We'll consider the Arlington Million (GI, Aug. 19) now...it's awfully tempting at \$2 million. There's also the Charles Whittingham Classic (GI, May 29 at Hollywood Park) that we'll think about. I don't want to run him a ton...I'm thinking about five quality races for the rest of the year." The runner-up outdueled veteran Yagli for the place.

Tie The Knot's (Nassipour {Ire}) bid to notch a third consecutive Sydney Cup came to an agonizing end as the combination of 60 kilograms and a soft track took its toll. The gallant stayer finished nine lengths from runaway Melbourne invader Streak, who came off a fourth in Tie The Knot's St. Leger last week to power from the rear for a determined win here. Dual Group 1 winner Sharscay, written off by many, flashed home late to just miss. Winning jockey Steve King conceded he had major doubts leading into this race, but trainer Robert Smerdon was always confident. "[Streak] did a few things wrong last time and I thought 'if he does that again he won't win,' but Robert assured me he would improve and he was spot on. It is a real training feat," King said. "He stretched out well. He is a funny horse--he can pull a bit, and usually horses who pull don't finish off two miles." Tie The Knot's jockey Shane Dye said, "He tried his heart out, but the combination of the big weight and the wet track told. He's done a fantastic job, he's a fantastic racehorse. On that [ground], it is not 3200 metres, it is more like 3600 metres, and he had nothing left at the furlong."

"He has always had a a lot of ability, but he couldn't get enough weight to run in the good races and he missed a run in the Doncaster," said Size. "But I thought his last run in the All-Aged S., hanging on for second to Sunline (NZ), was tremendous, as did everyone else, and as the week went by and the track got a little wetter things looked better and better." An historic tilt at three Queen Elizabeth trophies came unstuck for Intergaze (Integra {Aus}), who struggled from the 200-metre mark after racing on the pace and found it impossible to match Georgie Boy's sprint home, finishing seven lengths away in sixth. Hire (Aus) (Canny Lad), sensationally backed from 7-2 to 9-4 favourite, struggled on slow going to finish more than 10 lengths from the winner.

The filly Sweet Orchid, 6-1, has never finished off the board and captured the G3-Jpn Crystal Cup last time out Mar. 12. "We'll have to see if she can get the mile," trainer Kazuo Fujisawa said. "She needs to be rated."

BRAHMS BOUND FOR U.S. Brahms (Danzig), who was purchased for \$1 million at the 1998 Keeneland July Sale, has been sold again and will head to America to continue his racing career, according to the Daily Racing Form. The dark bay started his juvenile campaign in Britain for owners Michael Tabor and John Magnier, breaking his maiden at Fairyhouse in Ireland before running second in the G3 EBF Futurity at The Curragh, third in the G1 Middle Park S. at Newmarket and second again in the G1 Dewhurst S., also at Newmarket.
