NEW DERBY STRATEGY FOR GODOLPHIN

After sixth and seventh-place finishes in Saturday's GI Kentucky Derby with China Visit (Red Ransom) and Curule (Go for Gin), the Godolphin stable told The Racing Post they plan to revise their strategy leading up to next year's Derby, preparing their horses in more official races in lieu of private trials. China Visit came into the Derby with just two lifetime races under his belt and just one this year, a win in the U.A.E. Derby. Curule had run four times, all as a three-year-old; both relied on trials in Dubai as their final Derby preps. "I think the criticism is justified and we will make changes to our program," Godolphin's Racing Manager Simon Crisford told *The Racing Post*. "We'll probably have more official races at Nad Al Sheba. We'll also put more horses into the Kentucky Derby program, rather than starting with a small pool selection. It's an incredibly tough race to win, but it's at the top of our shopping list. We'll throw everything we have at winning it. It's wrong to say it is an obsession--it's just that it's one of the world's greatest races and Sheikh Mohammed wants to win it." Crisford added that the stable was pleased with China Visit's performance. "Our horse didn't lack anything in experience," he said. "We felt China Visit didn't quite get home in Kentucky, and we'll drop him back to a mile, possibly for a race like the St. James's Palace S. He ran a tough, great race and had a fantastic attitude. He's a top-drawer colt and he might be better on grass."

NAME CHANGE FOR GUINEAS WINNER

Kings Best (Kingmambo), winner of Saturday's G1 Sagitta 2000 Guineas at Newmarket, yesterday became the second Classic winner in under a year to undergo a name change, although a miniscule one. The colt's name will, from now on, be spelled without an apostrophe. Last year, Saffron Walden (Fr) had his name changed from Saffron Waldon after taking the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas. Kings Best may also may follow Saffron Walden to the G1 Epsom Derby, and William Hill have him as 5-1 joint favorite to win the race. Joe Mercer, racing manager to owner Saeed Suhail, said of the Guineas' triumph, "I think he put up a fantastic performance, and he found the acceleration which [trainer Michael Stoute] and [jockey Kieren Fallon] thought he would to get out of trouble in the race." He added, "Nothing has been decided yet as to his next target."

The winner of the Feb. 6 G3-Jpn Kyodo News Service Hai Yonsai S., Eagle Café took two months off after the effort and could do no better than seventh in the Apr. 8 G2-Jpn New Zealand Trophy Yonsai S. But trainer Futoshi Kojima was using that race as a prep for this, his main target of the season, and he had the colt primed for the event. The 4-1 shot settled in 12th as Yuma (Soviet Star) set a rapid pace, passing the half in :45 4/5, and 5-2 favorite Machikane Hokushin trailed the field. Toyo Dehere found running room up the rail to gain the lead at midstretch, but Eagle Café came flying on the outside to get up in the final strides for a narrow score. Machikane Hokushin finished well to be third, but was no threat to the top two. "I always felt he had the energy and when I asked him, he delivered impressively," winning jockey Yukio Okabe said. "But I had no idea we had caught Toyo Dehere until the official result came out." The winner goes next in G1-Jpn Yasuda Kinen June 4.

Disqualified after winning the Listed Criterium de l'Ouest at Craon last year, Lord Flasheart gained ample compensation when winning the G3 Prix de Conde at Longchamp on his eighth and final juvenile start. He reappeared in the G2 Prix Noailles at Longchamp Apr. 9 and showed he had progressed over the winter when a gallant runner-up to the highly regarded Kutub (Ire). Starting as the second choice here, he battled gamely throughout the length of the straight to gain the upper hand in the closing stages for a deserved first Group 2 win. Bleu D'Altair (Fr) (Green Tune) set a steady pace on a clear lead, but came under pressure entering the final quarter mile, where he was challenged by Crimson Quest on the outside and Lord Flasheart on the inner. Crimson Quest led at the distance, but Lord Flasheart, under strong driving from Gerald Mosse, stuck his head in front with 75 yards to go and was all out to hold on as Crimson Quest rallied once more close to home. Winning trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre said, "Lord Flasheart should now run in the G1 Emirates Prix du Jockey-Club (French Derby) at Chantilly June 4. He twice worked very well on this course before the race today and seems to love it. He is a light horse and we will now have to keep him fresh and not do too much before the big race."

This is the first of the season's main G1 Epsom Derby trials which will be run over the Classic distance and a competitive field is in attendance. Kingsclere will start as likely favourite off the back of his fine win in the Listed Easter S. at Kempton Apr. 22. He showed consistent form as a juvenile and was placed at the Listed, Group 3 and Group 2 level. Jolly Sharp represents the powerful Henry Cecil stable and his position in the pecking order of the yard's Derby possibles will be clearer after this. He was fourth in his only juvenile start in a maiden at Nottingham last October and posted his first win in good style at Kempton Apr. 24.

Hal's Hope, Snuck In to Preakness:

GI Florida Derby winner Hal's Hope (Jolie's Halo), who tired to be 16th after setting a sizzling pace in Saturday's GI Kentucky Derby, will head to Pimlico for the May 20 GI Preakness. "I don't think that he's going to meet as many tough horses [in the Preakness]," the colt's 88-year-old owner/breeder/trainer Harold Rose said. "I think the field will be smaller and if we can catch a racetrack that is best suited for speed rather than a come-from-behind horse, we'll be all right. I figure that if we can make the pace without being bothered too much, we may go all the way."

Trainer Steve Asmussen has also confirmed that **Snuck In** (Montbrook), runner-up in the GII Arkansas Derby last time out, will point for the Preakness. "I think it's his best possible fit [in the Triple Crown]," Asmussen said. Asmussen's brother Cash will have the mount in the second leg of the Triple Crown.

So Mr. Prospector has now sired individual winners of each of America's Triple Crown events, a feat achieved by only a handful of other stallions since the end of World War II--and you won't find the names of such as Storm Cat, Danzig, Seattle Slew, Northern Dancer, Nijinsky II, Bold Ruler, Ribot or Nasrullah among them.

It is going to be fascinating to see which (if any) of Mr. Prospector's stallion sons ultimately inherits his crown. Several have strong claims as rightful heir, the latest claimant being Kingmambo.

Although Kingmambo has yet to get anywhere near Mr. Prospector's figure of 16 percent stakes winners, he has highlighted his potential by siring an extremely talented son in each of his first three crops. El Condor Pasa's 1999 French exploits earned him the very high Timeform rating of 136; Lemon Drop Kid's wins in last year's Belmont and Travers S. showed that he has few equals once stamina comes into play; and now Kings Best has disposed of his 2000 Guineas opponents in a performance every bit as impressive as Fusaichi Pegasus' at Churchill Downs.

The burning question now is whether Kings Best is going to stay 1 1/2 miles. Although Kingmambo was never asked to tackle more than a mile during his 13-race career, it is surely relevant that his great-grand-sires are Nashua and Prove Out, both winners of the two-mile Jockey Club Gold Cup; Native Dancer, winner of the Belmont S.; and Northern Dancer, a Kentucky Derby hero who sired three Epsom Derby winners.

With this background, it is hardly surprising that Kingmambo can get graded-stakes winners at around 1 1/2 miles, such as El Condor Pasa and Lemon Drop Kid, when given mares with a degree of stamina. Kings Best's dam, Allegretta, is such a mare. Listed-placed over 1 1/4 miles at two and second over 1 1/2 miles in the G3 Oaks Trial at Lingfield, she has already shown she can produce a top-class 1 1/2-mile winner to a son of Mr. Prospector, getting the 1993 Arc winner Urban Sea to the speedy Miswaki.

Urban Sea is shaping up as a promising broodmare, her first two foals being the 1999 Group 3 winner Urban Ocean (by Bering) and Sunday's Pretty Polly S. winner Melikah (by Lammtarra). Both stay at least 1 1/4 miles, but speed was the main asset of Tertullian, another good recent winner from the family. A Group winner at around seven furlongs in Germany and Italy in 1999, Tertullian was sired by Miswaki from Turbaine, a half sister by Trempolino to Urban Sea and Kings Best.

But Tertullian is bit of an exception for this classic family, which was developed by Gestut Schlenderhan in Germany, where Kings Best's fifth dam, Asterblute, won the 1000 Guineas, Oaks and Derby in 1949. Allegretta is by Lombard, a dual Horse of the Year in Germany whose victories included the German St Leger over 1 3/4 miles. The German St. Leger was also won by Allegretta's brother Anno, while her three-parts brother Apollonios was runner-up in the German Derby.

Kings Best's second dam, Anatevka, shared the same sire, Espresso, as the triple Ascot Gold Cup winner Sagaro, so there is plenty of stamina here. The question about Kings Best as a potential Derby winner lies not so much with his pedigree as with his excitable temperament. Sir Michael Stoute will have to harness his nervous energy if Kings Best is to try to become only the second 2000 Guineas winner to win the Derby since Nijinsky's Triple Crown in 1970.

ANGUILLA RETIRED Hill 'n' Dale Farms in Lexington announced yesterday that their MGSW Anguilla (Seattle Slew) has been retired and will be bred to Storm Cat. The five-year-old mare made her final start in Sunday's GIII Beaugay H. at Aqueduct, finishing sixth. Overall, she had seven wins--including the GII Black Helen H., GIII Canadian H. and GIII Nassau S. at four and the GII Mrs. Revere S. at three--two seconds and three thirds from 16 starts for earnings of \$541,564. "Anguilla has been a great race mare, but her commercial value and the opportunity to breed her this year to Storm Cat were the deciding factors," Hill 'n' Dale owner John Sikura said.

DERBY RATINGS HOLD STEADY The 2000 Kentucky Derby, televised on ABC, drew an overnight rating of 6.6, representing 6.6 million viewers, with an audience share of 17 percent, mirroring the results of the 1999 Derby. The 90-minute broadcast, which ran from 4:30 to 6 p.m., attracted a 5.1 rating during its first half hour and a 7.4 rating for the final hour. ABC has televised the Derby annually since 1975, but will turn the reins over to NBC beginning in 2001 after being outbid for the rights to the Triple Crown races.

FLORIDA LEGISLATION BENEFITS LOCALS

The Florida legislative session ended May 5 after passing a bill which will return \$20 million in tax money to the state's pari-mutuel industry. More than \$10 million will go to greyhound racing, but the Thoroughbred industry walks away with \$4.5 million in savings. The biggest Thoroughbred cut came in the wagering tax. Calder and Gulfstream, which currently pay 1.25 and 2.25 percent, respectively, now will pay 0.5 percent on every dollar wagered. Hialeah will continue to pay 0.2 percent. Calder and Gulfstream will realize a savings of \$2 million each, of which \$1.3 million will go towards overnight purses, breeders' awards and stakes purses. Another \$650,000 will go to the race tracks. Included in the bill was a forgiveness clause which excused Hialeah from paying a penalty of \$2.6 million for conducting its meeting at Gulfstream Park. The news wasn't all positive for Hialeah, as both the Senate and House refused to allow an amendment to the bill which would extend the racing dates agreement through 2005. The current dates agreement ends on July 1, 2001.

RECORD HANDLE AT DERBY 2000 This year's Kentucky Derby set a new record for on-track handle. A total of \$9,726,912 was wagered at Churchill Downs on the race, eclipsing the mark of \$8,937,171 bet on last year's "Run for the Roses," the *Blood-Horse* reports. The early totals for the Derby handle from all sources was a record \$65,333,000, \$8 million more than the previous milestone. The combined total handle on the Derby Day program also reached new heights, with more than \$101 million bet. The 2000 attendance was 153,204, second only to the 163,628 who came through the gates for the 100th Derby in 1974.

TYSON GILPIN DEAD Internationally known horseman McGhee Tyson Gilpin died Sunday in Virginia after a short illness. He was 80. A graduate of Princeton, Gilpin served in the intelligence branch of the U.S. Army, earning the Purple Heart and France's Croix de Guerre, His father, Major Kenneth Gilpin, imported the French stallion Teddy to America and purchased Fasig-Tipton when it was a struggling New York auction company in 1945. When the Major died in 1947, his son took over as president, a position he held until 1952. The Gilpin family has retained a shareholding in the company and Gilpin himself served as a director until his death. The native Virginian raised Thoroughbreds on his family's Kentmere Farm. He also formed and ran the Stallion Service Bureau, the first U.S. brokerage agency for stallion seasons and shares, which continues to operate under the direction of Patrick Lawley-Wakelin. Gilpin was also the president of the Virginia Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association at the time of his death. A funeral service will be held at Christ Church, Millward, Virginia, at 2 p.m. Friday, May 12. In lieu of flowers, donations to Historic Long Branch or the Cunningham Chapel Parish, both in Millward, or to other charities are suggested.

Tampa Bay Meet Ends on High Note:

The 1999-2000 season at Tampa Bay Downs in Florida ended Sunday with a record total handle of \$164,563,471. Wagering bested the old mark of \$143,306,998 by 14.8 percent. It was the sixth straight year the handle has risen at the track. Total ontrack handle was up 12.11 percent despite the fact that attendance dropped 2.9 percent and wagering on-track on the live product decreased 2.8 percent. "The prestige of Tampa Bay Downs in the racing world has greatly increased in the last seven days," Vice President and General Manager John Grady, Jr. said. "Early in the week, Julie Krone, who won her first race at Tampa Bay Downs, became the first woman jockey elected to the National Racing Hall of Fame. On Friday, our Florida Oaks winner Secret Status won the Kentucky Oaks... and on Saturday, Impeachment, who finished second in our Tampa Bay Derby, came in third in the Kentucky Derby..." Daily purse distribution reached a new high during the 91-day meet, up 13.57 percent to \$98,100. There were also a record number of claims at the meeting, with 213 horses changing barns. Don Rice led all trainers with 33 winners for his fourth Tampa title, while T.D. Houghton picked up his second straight riding title, and eighth overall, with 80 victories. D & H Stable led all owners for the second consecutive season, boasting 18 wins.

Record Handle at Turf Paradise:

Arizona's Turf Paradise concluded its 1999-2000 live meet Sunday with a record handle of more than \$300 million, up 15 percent from last year. On-track wagering increased 9 percent. The final total is not yet available, as the track will count the handle from simulcasting during the dark days through May 26 toward the figure. Randy Fozzard, vice president and general manager, said, "Prior to offering commingled pools on November 23, our handle was down 8 percent on-track. I would like to claim that we began a new marketing campaign. However, with the commingled pools, we simply gave our patrons what they wanted." Chance Rollins led all jockeys with 179 wins over the 159-day meet, while Jeff Mullins took the trainer's title with 63 wins. Jim Hill, the runner-up in the trainer standings, led all owners with 47 victories.

LAHAN UNLIKELY FOR EPSOM OAKS

The G1 Sagitta 1000 Guineas heroine Lahan (GB) (Unfuwain {USA}) delighted trainer John Gosden with her effort Sunday, but does not look bound for the June 9 G1 Epsom Oaks at present. "I think she's a miler, and although she might get a mile and a quarter in the future, I'd like to go for the G1 Coronation S. (Ascot, June 23), or the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas S. (The Curragh, May 28)," Gosden said. "We'll play it by ear." Handicapper Dominic Gardiner-Hill said of the 1000 Guineas winner, "It is possible that Petrushka (Ire) and Seazun (Ire) were below their best, so I hope Lahan can run in the Coronation S. and we can get a clearer picture."

EXCUSE FOR PETRUSHKA?

The feeling is that Petrushka (Ire) (Unfuwain {USA}) did not run her race, finishing third as the favorite in Sunday's G1 Sagitta 1000 Guineas. The suggestion is that she may have been in season. Harry Herbert, spokesman for Highclere Thoroughbred Racing, remarked, "Sir Michael [Stoute] said that it was like saddling a rocking horse, she was that quiet." Highclere's Tim Jones added, "It is a feeling of extreme pleasure that we have had a filly placed in a Classic, but overall a mixed feeling as the impression is that she's probably a little better than that. While taking nothing away from the first two, she has indicated on every occasion that she has a little more sparkle, and she looked ever-so slightly flat. We need to take stock, as if she was below par and still ran as well as she did, it might have taken something out of her. The G1 Epsom Oaks (June 9) seems to be the obvious route for her. We'll give her time to recover, and bring her back to herself." The filly is still the 4-1 favourite for the Epsom Classic with William Hill.

BINTALREEF INJURED

Bintalreef (USA) (Diesis {GB}), last of 18 in the 1000 Guineas, was found to have pulled a muscle in her right hip during the race. The winner of her Dubai trial, the Godolphin runner was sent off the 5-2 second favourite in the 1000 Guineas, but jockey Frankie Dettori reported that he believed the filly injured herself leaving the stalls.

"I am a little bit disappointed, but also very happy with her run," he said. "She goes for the Irish 1000 Guineas." Mick Channon will also send his 1000 Guineas fourth **Seazun (Ire)** (Zieten {USA}) to Ireland. "She ran a cracker [in the 1000 Guineas], and she had a lot of daylight which certainly wouldn't have helped her, but there are no excuses. She goes to Ireland."

MIXED FEELINGS FOR MARGARSON

Trainer George Margarson yesterday offered mixed feelings when looking back on the third-place finish of his Barathea Guest (GB) (Barathea {Ire}) in Saturday's G1 Sagitta 2000 Guineas. "He's come out of it all right and, although he didn't have his ground, it was perfect ground and the best horse won on the day. I'd love to make him a Classic winner, so I might supplement him for the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas S. (The Curragh, May 27), or he might go for the G1 St James' Palace S. As for the G1 Epsom Derby S. (June 10), the ground could be totally against him in June and I wouldn't expect him to get the trip. We might try a mile and a quarter first, but the G2 Dante S. (York May 17) comes too quick."

A REST FOR DISTANT MUSIC

Distant Music (USA) (Distant View {USA}), eighth in Saturday's G1 Sagitta 2000 Guineas, will get a break now and be pointed for a fall campaign, according to Sporting Life. "The horse is fine, he'll come back," trainer Barry Hills was reported as saying. "He ran a good race and battled well when beaten, he was running on empty in the closing stages. We won't be rushed--we'll give him a rest and campaign him in the second half of the year."

KUTUB TO RUN IN LUPIN

Kutub (Ire) (In The Wings {GB}), winner of the G2 Prix Noailles, beating Lord Flasheart at Longchamp Apr. 9, is set to run in the G1 Prix Lupin over 10½ furlongs at Longchamp this Sunday May 14. The form of his Prix Noailles win was franked in good style yesterday when Lord Flasheart won the G2 Prix Hocquart at Chantilly. Kutub still has the option of running in either the French or Epsom Derbies and he is currently quoted at odds from 14-1 to 16-1 in ante-post lists for the latter event.
