A SPECIAL OCTET

A field of eight older horses, including five of the top six finishers from last year's Breeders' Cup Classic, will face the starter in Saturday's 35th running of the GI Pimlico Special. Highweight Lemon Drop Kid (Kingmambo), most recently disqualified from victory in the GIII Widener H., was up at the crack of dawn yesterday morning to drill four furlongs in :48 1/5 with new rider Edgar Prado in the irons. "Edgar liked the work," commented trainer Scotty Schulhofer. "He said that the colt got hold of the track real good." Madeleine and Allen Paulson's K One King (Apalachee) could go postward as the race favorite off his visually impressive victory in the Apr. 8 Gl Oaklawn H., accounting for 1999 Dubai World Cup champ Almutawakel (Machiavellian), who will be adding blinkers for the first time, and Breeders' Cup Classic hero Cat Thief (Storm Cat). Calbred Budrovale (Cee's Tizzy) looks to regain the form which saw him finish a bang-up second in the Breeders' Cup Classic. The venerable gelding was the winner of the GII San Antonio H. at Santa Anita and runner up to General Challenge in the GI Santa Anita H. before an uncharacteristically dull performance in the Oaklawn H., a performance trainer Ted West attributed to not handling the surface. Alex Solis replaces Garrett Gomez aboard the seven-year-old. The race is part of the "NTRA on FOX Super Series" and will be carried live nationally at 5:00 p.m. EDT. Post time is 5:40 p.m.

I LOVE NEW YORK

C'Est L'Amour (Thunder Gulch) traveled to New York for the first three wins of her career. She broke her maiden at Saratoga last August and won a Sept. 23 Belmont allowance before running fifth in the Oct. 17 GII Alcibiades at Keeneland. Shelved for six months after that effort, the filly returned with a game victory against older fillies in an Aqueduct allowance April 14. She returned to graded stakes company yesterday in the GII Nassau County S. on the opening day card at Belmont Park. Always close to the front, C'Est L'Amour outgamed the speedy Tugger (Twining) in a long stretch drive to remain unbeaten in New York state. "I thought she would run better off her last race," said winning trainer Phil Johnson. "Tugger was laying in on us a bit in the stretch and my horse didn't change leads, possibly because she was in so tight. She was very game and battled her way through it." The Todd Pletcher-trained Tugger, who impressed with an 11 1/2-length debut win at Gulfstream in March, battled Miss Inquistive (Kipper Kelly) in the early going and finished gamely in only the third start of her career. "I think she is better suited not to duel, but to come from a little bit off the pace," Pletcher said of his charge." The top pair will likely meet again in the June 9 Gl Acorn S.

Fusaichi Back on Track:

Derby hero Fusaichi Pegasus (Mr. Prospector) returned to the track for the first time since his stirring victory Saturday for an easy jog around the Churchill Downs oval yesterday morning. Trainer Neil Drysdale, back from California to monitor the colt's progress, has still not committed to a run in the May 20 Preakness, but seemed optimistic yesterday morning. "The horse came out of the race well and looks well," Drysdale said. "At this particular time, there's no reason to say 'no'," he continued, referring to the Preakness, "so we're planning to move forward and making shipping arrangements and that sort of thing." Drysdale indicated that Fusaichi Pegasus would probably work again at the beginning of next week.

Deputy Warlock Gets a Breather:

Deputy Warlock (Silver Deputy), 11th in Saturday's classic, will be sent to Longfield Farm in Goshen, Kentuck, for a bit of rest, according to trainer Kenny McPeek. "We said he could win the Derby, but that Derby will probably come in Ohio or lowa," McPeek said. "For now, he needs a little breather."

MIGLIORE SUSPENDED Jockey Richard Migliore has been suspended five days for his ride aboard Wheelaway in the Kentucky Derby, Churchill Downs stewards announced yesterday. The suspension takes effect tomorrow and will not cover Monday and Tuesdays, dark days in New York, where Migliore normally rides. Migliore said yesterday he is 99 percent sure he will appeal. Wheelaway, who finished fifth, came over in mid-stretch and appeared to impede eighth-place finisher Captain Steve. "I'm a little surprised," Migliore said yesterday. "I know I came in, but I felt like I was going by that horse fast enough that what happened didn't have any bearing on the outcome of the race. I know I didn't exactly tank his head off to get him away from that horse, but it's the Derby and you try to keep going forward while still doing the right thing."

BRAVE ACT RETIRED Brave Act (GB) (Persian Bold {Ire}) suffered a cracked sesamoid and has been retired from racing, trainer Ron McAnally said. Purchased as a yearling at Tattersalls December by Sir Mark Prescott for 31,000 guineas (\$48,360), Brave Act was the winner of the G3 Solario S. in his native Britain to close out his two-year-old campaign. Shipped to the U.S., the sixyear-old was victorious in the GIII Will Rogers H. in his second trip to the post in the U.S. and won three of four starts in an abbreviated four-year-old season, including the GII San Gabriel H. The Sid and Jenny Craig colorbearer scored three victories from nine starts in 1999, most importantly the GII Citation H. from last to first, and won both of his starts in the new year, including a 3/4-length success in the GIII Explosive Bid H. at the Fair Grounds Mar. 26. He retires with 13 wins from 27 starts and earnings of \$1,546,323.

TORGAU OFF TO STATES Torgau (Ire) (Zieten), who finished seventh in Sunday's 1000 Guineas at Newmarket, England, will leave later in the month to race for her owner Team Valor in the U.S. She is to run in the \$150,000 GII Honeymoon H. at Hollywood Park May 27, and will leave the Giles Bravery stable approximately a week prior to the race. "It will be sad to lose her as she has been a great servant but this was always the plan," Bravery commented. "She picked up a slight knock on Sunday, but I thought she ran a bonny race as I don't think the undulations suited." Trainer Jenine Sahadi, who trains Santa Anita Deby winner The Deputy (Ire) (Petardia {GB}) for Team Valor, will train Torgau.

Retiring two sons of the same mare to the same stud at the same time is bound to result in comparisons being made. Perhaps inevitably, Northern Dancer's top-class son Unfuwain came off worse in these comparisons when he and his famous half-brother Nashwan retired to the Nunnery Stud at the end of 1989--so much so that Unfuwain's fee was set at £15,000, compared to the £100,000 initially commanded by Nashwan. By 1993, Unfuwain's fee had fallen to £8,000 and his fee was still only £10,000 this year.

Taking into account the marked difference in their fees, it is hardly surprising that Nashwan has proved a more prolific source of Group winners, with a score of 13, compared to Unfuwain's eight. However, it is possible to argue that Unfuwain would have made at least as good use of the opportunities that Nashwan has enjoyed. It is surely significant that seven of Nashwan's Group winners have Group-winning dams (four are out of G1 winners), whereas Unfuwain has sired six of his seven Group winners from mares which failed even to earn black type, the one exception being the Group 1 winner Zahrat Dubai who is out of a Group 2 winner.

While I am writing with the benefit of hindsight, the considerable difference between the original fees for Nashwan and Unfuwain was not a reflection of their respective merits. While Timeform rated Unfuwain 4lb inferior to Nashwan, his rating of 131 is still that of a very, very good performer. The general perception among breeders was that he was a one-paced galloper who lacked the speed that brought Nashwan victory in the 2,000 Guineas. They overlooked the fact that Unfuwain had put up two good performances as a two-year-old. In terms of conformation, Unfuwain--at 16.1 hands--is a more conventional size than his half-brother, who stands 11/2 inches taller. And in terms of pedigree, this son of Northern Dancer had at least as good a chance of making the grade as a stallion as a son of Blushing Groom.

No wonder Unfuwain has now matched Nashwan's total of four G1 winners, thanks to the 1,000 Guineas victory of his daughter Lahan. This race was a complete triumph for Unfuwain, who also sired third-placed Petrushka and the dam of runner-up Princess Ellen.

Lahan's breeder Sheikh Hamdan has enjoyed some excellent bonuses from his purchases of high-priced, in-foal mares, good examples being the Irish 1,000 Guineas winner Mehthaaf and the G2 winner Oumaldaaya, who were acquired in utero. Lahan's dam Amanah was the Mr. Prospector foal being carried by Cheval Volant when Shadwell paid a sale-topping \$1,400,000 for this GI-winning daughter of Kris S. at Keeneland's 1991 November Sales.

Cheval Volant had been a GI winner over a mile both at two, when she was rated 118 on the Experimental Free Handicap, and at three, when the Blood-Horse handicappers rated her 120. I think it is fair to say that she achieved more than could reasonably be expected at the time of a filly of her breeding. She was conceived when Kris S. was a virtual unknown standing at \$5,000, but she was a half-sister to Chaldea, a GIII winner over seven furlongs and a mile as a six-year-old. Although Amanah wasn't in the same league as these two--Timeform rated her 100--she promises to become an important mare for Shadwell, who also have a two-year-old sister to Lahan and a yearling 3/4-sister to her by Unfuwain's champion son Alhaarth.

BUDDY RAINES DIES Virgil "Buddy" Raines, best known as the trainer of 1962 Preakness winner Greek Money, passed away yesterday morning at the age of 89. Mr. Raines, who rode horses in New York for a short time in the late 1920s and early 1930s, remained in the Empire State as the assistant trainer to "Whistlin Bob" Smith and was the regular exercise rider of Brookmeade Stable's 1934 Kentucky Derby winner Cavalcade. Raines later became the head trainer for Brookmeade, but as the conditioner for Donald P. Ross' Brandywine Stable, began to make a name for himself. Among the stars that Raines developed were Arlington Classic winner Greek Son and Open Fire, the co-champion handicap mare of 1966. The grandfather of New York jockey Mike Luzzi, Raines suffered a stroke three years ago and had been in a nursing home in Aiken, South Carolina. Funeral arrangements are pending.

CAMEO APPEARANCE FOR STEVE CAUTHEN

Hall of Famer jockey Steve Cauthen, who retired in 1993, will make a one-time return to the saddle, the *Daily Racing Form* reports. Cauthen hung up his helmet after tiring of the struggle to make weight, but he will be able to ride at 160 to 165 pounds in the two-mile Blood-Horse Sportsman's Challenge, an amateur race to be held at the Kentucky Horse Park's High Hope meeting May 21. Cauthen said that he wanted to make the comeback so that his daughter, seven-year-old Katelyn Rose, could see him ride. "She's keen to see me ride...she's seen a lot of films, but this is different," he told the *Form*, adding, "I'm trying to get myself in pretty decent shape. It's my wind and legs that I know I need to get in shape. I hope I don't come up empty in the final furlong."

BEVO IS BACK Multiple graded stakes winner Bevo (Prospectors Gamble) returns to action in Friday's eighth race at Belmont Park. The three-year-old colt captured last year's GII Saratoga Special and defeated Greenwood Lake and More Than Ready to take the Sept. 19 GI Futurity. Days after that victory, after a bone chip was discovered in his left knee. In Friday's eighth race, the Billy Badgett trainee will face six three-year-olds and up in a 6 1/2-furlong allowance contest. Among his rivals will be graded stakes winner Intidab (Phone Trick) He will be ridden by Richard Migliore. Bevo has won four of five starts and has earned \$238,228.

AMERICAN-BREDS DOMINATE JAPANESE

SALE A colt by Dehere out of Mary's Spirit (Mr. Prospector) brought a final bid of ¥68,000,000 (\$557,397) to top the Premier Sale held at Sapporo Race Course in Hokkaido, Japan May 8. The bay, consigned by Hayata Farms, had also clocked the fastest workout. The next two highest-priced offerings were consigned by Florida-based Nick de Meric as agent. A Silver Hawk full brother to MGISW Hawkster and French GSW Silver Lane realized ¥51,000,000 (\$466,060) while a colt by Diesis (GB) out of GSP Stately Bride (Tom Rolfe) was hammered down for ¥50,500,000 (\$461,481). The bay is a 1/2 to MSW Dancewiththebride (Belong To Me).

Affirmed Success Bound for Met:

Albert Fried Jr.'s Affirmed Success (Affirmed), a troubled third in last Sunday's GI Carter H., has emerged from his effort in good health and will make his next start in the May 29 GI Met Mile at Belmont, according to trainer Richard Schosberg. "Physically he's fine," the conditioner said. "He's a free-running horse and he never had any room. Horses have attitudes too and he's disappointed he didn't get to run his race."

MORE ILL FORTUNE FOR CECIL

After an early season scare with coughing in the yard at Warren Place, things had looked on the up for trainer Henry Cecil until it was announced yesterday that his main Epsom Derby hopes Beat Hollow (GB) (Sadler's Wells {USA}), a TDN dark horse, and Bien Entendu (GB) (Hernando {Fr}) will miss their engagements at York next week due to mucus in the lungs. "Beat Hollow and Bien Entendu were found to have mucus in the lungs when they were scoped," Cecil said yesterday. "The problem will be cleared up in a few days with treatment, but neither will be either to run in the [Listed] Glasgow S. or the [G2] Dante S., unfortunately." Beat Hollow has been pushed out to 7-1 with Ladbrokes for the Classic, while the impressive Newmarket maiden winner Bien Entendu has been removed from the betting by the firm. Teddy Beckett, Racing Manager for Prince Khalid Abdullah, said of Beat Hollow: "We are hopeful of still getting to the Derby, but we would still like to have another race. He has only had two races and you want to go to the Derby as well prepared mentally and physically as he can be."
