KALYPSO KATIÉ CONQUERS YORK

Kalypso Katie (Ire) (Fairy King), who won impressively at Windsor last October in her only previous start, showed she is a quality individual with a game victory in yesterday's G3 Tattersalls Musidora S. at York. She was kept to the outer early to avoid the scrimmaging caused by the very slow pace. That proved a smart move as jockey Mick Kinane had her handy as they entered the straight, tracking the long-time leader Lady Upstage (Ire) (Alzao). As the field turned on the pace from four furlongs out, the leader was holding off all challengers and looked as though she would hold on, but the masterful Kinane managed to coax his filly to the front on the line. "Before the race I felt that everything was against me, as she was in season and the ground was guick enough," said trainer Jeremy Noseda. "There is improvement to come, both experience and fitness wise, and the race will do her the world of good. I hope and believe we can see something better at Epsom, and I can't think that the trip will be a problem." She now heads to the June 9 G1 Epsom Oaks S., for which she is the 3-1 favourite with William Hill.

Green Light for King's Best:

The oft-renamed G1 2000 Guineas winner King's Best (Kingmambo) will take his chance in the G1 Epsom Derby S. June 10, it was announced by his trainer Sir Michael Stoute yesterday. He follows the long-established trend of Guineas winners taking the path to Epsom, with six having tried and failed in the 1990s. The last to complete the double was Major Dick Hern's Nashwan in 1989. The trainer said, "I have chatted with the owner and he is very positive. On breeding, he should certainly stay."

As a trial for the G1 Epsom Derby S., this race has enormous significance, with two winners here having gone on to Epsom glory in the 1990s. Sakhee, trained by John Dunlop who handled one of those winners in Erhaab (1994), comes here off the back of success in the G3 Classic Trial at Sandown Apr. 29. That day, he had Going Global (Ire), who went on to finish a close runner-up in Saturday's G3 Lingfield Derby Trial, back in third. He faces the familiar threat of Godolphin, represented here by Best Of The Bests. That colt won the G3 Solario S. at Sandown last August under the tutelage of Clive Brittain before running today's opponent Royal Kingdom to half a length on heavy ground in the G2 Royal Lodge S. at Ascot a month later. The renewal of their rivalry will prove interesting here, as it will take place on entirely different ground, with the going riding good to firm, and firm in places.

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

Although Fusaichi Pegasus prevented A.P. Indy's son Aptitude from winning the GI Kentucky Derby, the Seattle Slew stallion has been on a real tear this year. Earlier in the year, his four-year-old son Stephen Got Even earned honors in the GI Donn H., and over the Derby weekend his three-year-old daughter Secret Status captured the GI Kentucky Oaks and his five-year-old daughter Lu Ravi won the GIII Sixty Sails H. Now, just one week after the Derby, A.P. Indy's son Golden Missile defeated the strongest field of handicap horses to gather this season to carry off the GI Pimlico Special.

Like another of the current stallion elite, Storm Cat, A.P. Indy is out of a mare by Secretariat. One suspects that this plays a major part in his success, and it certainly appears to be the key to Golden Missile's pedigree. Golden Missile is out of the GIII First Lady H. and GIII Shirley Jones H. winner Santa Catalina, a daughter of Cure the Blues. A brilliant, undefeated two-year-old who became a very smart sire despite a stud career which saw him stand in Ireland, at three different farms in Kentucky, and finally in New York, Cure the Blues has a Secretariat link on both sides of his pedigree. His sire Stop the Music was a member of the same crop as Secretariat, and inherited the 1972 Champagne S. on Secretariat's disqualification. More importantly from a pedigree perspective, Cure the Blues' dam, the Dr. Fager mare Quick Cure, is out of Speedwell, a stakes-placed three-quarters sister to Secretariat.

This means that Golden Missile has Secretariat/Speedwell 3x5 in his pedigree (along with Sir Gaylord, a half brother to Secretariat and therefore a close relative to Speedwell, also in the fifth generation). Golden Missile is the poster boy for this combination, but it has worked before. Cure the Blues has sired Grade II winner Rock and Roll and stakes winner Captain Starbuck out of mares carrying Secretariat. And in addition to Golden Missile, the cross of a sire carrying Secretariat and a Cure the Blues mare has produced the talented Maryland-bred filly Case of the Blues (from the first crop of the Storm Cat horse In Case).

There is no shortage of sires carrying Secretariat, and there are numerous daughters and granddaughters of Cure the Blues, so we can expect the cross to appear in more talented performers in the future.

PEDIGREE SHORTS

Last Wednesday saw the first graded stakes win for a member of the first U.S. crop sired by Thunder Gulch. This was the filly C'est L'Amour (f, 3, Thunder Gulch--L'Amour Toujours, by Blushing Groom {Fr}), who took the GII Nassau County S. at Belmont Park. C'est L'Amour appears to throw to the European distaff side of Thunder Gulch's pedigree as she has the three-parts related High Hat (GB) and Aureole (GB) 5x5 in her pedigree. This is a formula which produced a number of smart runners for High Line (GB) (by High Hat), the sire of Thunder Gulch's second dam, as well as a pair of graded stakes winners out of mares by sons of High Line.

In last week's column we noted that Crimplene (f, 3, Lion Cavern--Crimson Conquest, by Diesis {GB}}--heroine of the German 1000 Guineas equivalent, the G2 Henkel-Rennen--had a double of *Mixed Marriage. This notable mare appeared as third dam of Lion Cavern and as dam of Atan (grandsire of Diesis). Remarkably, the same pattern appears in the pedigree of Pacino (GB) (c, 3, Zafonic--June Moon {Ire}, by Sadler's Wells), impressive winner of the G2 Mehl-Mulhens-Rennen (German 2000 Guineas). His sire Zafonic is a son of Gone West (full brother to Lion Cavern) and his dam is out of a mare by Diesis. Pedigree Perspectives cont. p. 5

DO THE KINGMAMBO

Yep, that's this month's headline...Do The Kingmambo. First King's Best scores a big win in the English 2000, confirming Kingmambo a top-class young sire of colts. Then, wham, Bluemamba goes and wins the French 1000. Yes, she was the recipient of a perfect trip (and a great ride by Thierry Jarnet), and at least two of her opponents could maybe have beaten her. Yes, there were seven fillies within two lengths of each other at the finish. But you know what? She's no slouch herself, she got the money, and Kingmambo's got two Guineas winners within a month. Predicted 2001 fee: \$150,000 NG. This is a first-class young sire.

Unforgettable Unfuwain

The Unfuwain train keeps rolling, too. Ten days ago, as you know, '99 Rockfel (a G2 but practically the fillies' Dewhurst) winner Lahan bounced back to win the English 1000 from Nell Gwyn (G3) winner Petrushka, for an Unfuwain fillies' Classic 1-3. But there's more. Last weekend, The Queen's Film Script, by Unfuwain out of a Sharrood (Caro) mare, won the Lingfield Oaks Trial (L). But there's more. It's not just the fillies.

Unfuwain colts from this crop include two who placed in important three-year-old stakes at Chester, Tanatalus (3rd Chester Vase - G3) and Zyz (3rd Dee S. - L). Plus there's Fanaar, winner of the Wood Ditton at Newmarket, surely one of the hottest maidens of the year, which has produced about six winners so far. Fanaar was in the 'Five-days' for the French 2000, so they're entitled to think a little bit of him, too.

I thought Andrew Caulfield made a telling point the other day when he reminded us why Unfuwain could be as good or better a sire than his half brother Nashwan, even though Nashwan was a dual Classic winner and a superstar racehorse, and Unfuwain's best wins were two Group Two's. Unfuwain, of course is by Northern Dancer, the greatest sire of sires of the second half of the 20th century. Nashwan is not. More about that in a minute...

Go For Gin Heating Up

Hot, Hot...well, not as hot, yet, but more and more I like what I'm seeing of the first crop by 1994 Kentucky Derby winner Go for Gin, three-year-olds of 2000. Slashed by Claiborne to \$7,500 after registering only three two-year-old winners last year, I reckon that's looking pretty good value right now. Belmont Park opened a few days ago, and Go For Gin had three-year-old winners at Belmont on May 10 (Hallucinogin, 9f turf Bill Oppenheim cont. p. 4

maiden), May 12 (Albert the Great, 9f dirt allowance, having broken his maiden by 10 lengths in his previous start at Keeneland), and May 13 (Rare Prize, 8 1/2f dirt maiden, first time around two turns). Throw in Curule, third to China Visit and Bachir in the UAE Derby, seventh in the Kentucky Derby, and heading for the Belmont, and the filly Croupier, two-for-two at one mile + this year. Value Alert! Value Alert!

And here's a pretty interesting pedigree wrinkle--four of those five I've just mentioned are out of Mr. Prospector-line mares. This constitutes a Tip.

Unlucky Catrail

Unluckiest Sire Not to Reverse His Downward Spiral last week: Catrail. With little or nothing to show for his progeny's first two years on the track in 1998-99, Catrail three-year-old fillies suffered two narrow high-profile defeats within an hour last Sunday, with only a Listed placing to show for the afternoon. First, Zarkiya was desperately unlucky to finish fourth in the French 1000, denied a run until just too late; then, Storm Dream (in receipt of seven pounds) narrowly failed to upset unbeaten Preseli in the Leopardstown 1000 Guineas Trial in Ireland. Make a note.

The Butler Did It

Also, like Unfuwain, utterly unstoppable: trainer Gerard Butler. Fifth in the 2000 with a 150-1 shot, second in the 1000 with a 66-1 shot, he then sent out unbeaten Saddler's Quest (by Saddler's Hall, sire of Classic-placed Silver Patriarch) to win the Lingfield Derby Trial, and yesterday sent out the Cozzene colt, Kuwait Trooper, to score (as fourth choice in a five-horse field) in a 14-furlong three-year-old conditions race at York.

On the Lookout

Hot, hot, hot...today's Dante S. at York pits Sandown Classic Trial 1-2 Sakhee (the Bahri colt) and Pawn Broker against Godolphin's potentially best distance three-year-old, Best of the Bests. He's by Machiavellian, and I've a sneaking feeling Machiavellian is about to do something to announce his arrival as one of Europe's top five sires.

For future discussion...thinking about Unfuwain and Nashwan--will the Blushing Groom line survive as a sire line? What have we got? The two big guns in Europe are Rainbow Quest (sire sons Quest for Fame, Saumarez, champion Chilean freshman sire Wagon Master, now in France, Spectrum, and Croco Rouge) and Nashwan (Swain). In America there is Mt. Livermore

(Housebuster, now in Japan, and three young mid-dle-distance sons--Peaks and Valleys, Subordination, and Pyramid Peak) and Rahy (Fantastic Light, down the road). Europe also has Groom Dancer (repatriated from Japan, and sire of Pursuit of Love, a former European champion freshman sire who is starting to look respectable again) and Sillery (sire of '99 Breeders' Cup Mile winner, Silic). The ace up the sleeve could be the shock 1982 Travers winner, Runaway Groom, sire of the really promising Cherokee Run, and maybe another little sleeper in Wekiva Springs...

One of the most successful nicks around is the combination of Woodman with Nijinsky II-line mares, which has produced nine stakes winners (plus Group 1 winner Teggiano (Ire), who is by Woodman's son Mujtahid out of a Nijinsky II mare). One of the most talented examples of the cross is Ciro (c, 3, Woodman--Gioconda, by Nijinsky II), who was awarded last year's G1 Grand Criterium on the disqualification of Barathea Guest. On Sunday, Ciro gained a Group 1 win without any help from the stewards, scoring a game victory in the G1 Prix Lupin. It's no surprise that the Woodman/Nijinsky II cross has worked so well. In addition to bringing together Mr. Prospector and Nijinsky II, Woodman is out of a mare by Buckpasser, a horse whose sire Tom Fool combines Menow and Bull Dog, as does Nijinsky II's dam Flaming Page. It's worth noting that two other sons of Mr. Prospector out of Buckpasser mares, Seeking the Gold and Miswaki, have also done extremely well when combined with Nijinsky II. In the case of Ciro, there is another reason for the mating to have been regarded as an auspicious one. Ciro's dam Gioconda is a half sister to champions Hector Protector and Bosra Sham, two of the best horses ever sired by Woodman.

A somewhat related cross is found in the pedigree of the GII Illinois Derby winner Performing Magic (c, 3, Gone West--Performing Arts {Ire}, by The Minstrel). Performing Magic is the seventh individual stakes winner by Gone West out of a mare by The Minstrel (and there are also three stakes winners by Gone West's son West by West out of The Minstrel-line mares). Gone West is another Mr. Prospector son, and instead of Buckpasser, he carries Tom Fool through Tim Tam. Since The Minstrel is a three-quarters brother to Nijinsky II, this also gives Tom Fool/Flaming Page. In fact, Tim Tam and Flaming Page are even more closely connected, since Tim Tam is by a son of Tom Fool out of a Bull Lea mare, and Flaming Page is by a son of Bull Lea out of a Tom Fool mare.



ADELAIDE CUP POSTPONED

The \$300,000 G1 Adelaide Cup was called off just three minutes before the race at Morphettville in Adelaide vesterday when jockeys including Damien Oliver, Danny Nikolic and Shane Dye insisted the track was unsafe and said they would not ride in the feature race, the eighth on a 10-card program run on a heavy track. Although it was initially announced the race was abandoned, it was later decided to run the Cup on Saturday at Victoria Park and the South Australian Jockey Club won't charge admittance as some patrons complained they'd paid to see the cup. The track had received constant rain over three days. SAJC chief excutive Matt Benson said the cancellation was "devastating" for the SAJC and for the people of Adelaide. "There is only one Adelaide Cup day and we have worked towards this race since last October," Benson said. "But we put the health and safety of horses and jockeys first." Added Oliver, "It was very heavy and horses just weren't stretching out. There were holes about 10 inches deep around the back and they were full of water. There is no way the meeting should have gone ahead."

NEW ZEALAND SALE CONCLUDES

Off the back of a record breaking National Yearling Sales Series in February, New Zealand Bloodstock's National Weanling, Broodmare and Mixed Bloodstock Sale has also scaled new heights. A record aggregate across the entire sale of \$6,104,800 was achieved for 730 lots catalogued, a 114 percent increase over last year's aggregate. The record for the highest priced mare sold at auction in New Zealand tumbled late in the afternoon and not surprisingly for Love Connection (Jpn) (Sunday Silence {USA}--Pleasureconnection {USA}, by Danzig Connection {USA}), in foal to champion sire Zabeel. She brought a final bid of \$350,000 from New Zealand Bloodstock as agent for the company's owner and chairman, Mr. Peter Vela. Consigned by Sir Patrick Hogan's Cambridge Stud, Love Connection will join Peter and Philip Vela's select broodmare band at their Pencarrow Stud. Commenting on the overall quality of the sale, Vela said, "We couldn't be happier with the sale. Demand for horses in all sessions over the three days remained very strong. The record results are indicative of the healthy and positive state of our industry at present."
