#### PEGASUS ODDS-ON FOR SECOND JEWEL

Pimlico oddsmaker Clem Florio has made Kentucky Derby hero Fusaichi Pegasus (Mr. Prospector) a prohibitive 3-5 favorite as he faces just seven would-be upsetters in Saturday's 125th running of the Preakness at Old Hilltop in Baltimore. 'Fu Peg', who will break from the seven hole, arrived at Pimlico by van at 2 p.m yesterday afternoon and was greeted by no fewer than 80 members of the national media. Original plans called for the Neil Drysdale trainee to be unloaded at a chute three barns from his temporary home in Barn 7, but Drysdale called an audible. "I didn't want him getting off at the chute and walking alongside the racetrack," Drysdale commented. As far as the draw is concerned, the conditioner said, "With a quarter-mile run to the first turn, it is really not that important, the draw." Nearly two-thirds of 23 odds-on favorites have gone on to win the Preakness, however the last three have not been able to get the job done. Second choice on the morning line at 9-2 is GIII Gotham winner Red Bullet (Unbridled), runner up to Fusaichi Pegasus in the GII Wood Memorial Apr. 15. With the first pick in the draft lottery, trainer Joe Orseno chose post position number four for the chestnut, who will attempt to become the first horse since Deputed Testamony in 1983 to win the Preakness without having started in the Kentucky Derby. Owner Frank Stronach was represented in the 1997 Preakness by Touch Gold, who finished a troubled fourth, before his narrow Belmont success to deny Real Quiet the Triple Crown. The brothers Asmussen, trainer Steve and jockey Cash, are the first-ever sibling team to send out a Preakness runner. Snuck In (Montbrook), the winner of the GIII Rebel at Oaklawn Park and second in that track's Arkansas Derby, passed on the Kentucky Derby, but has relaxed more in his recent training at Churchill Downs. A horse who will be close to the pace, Snuck In will break from post position two and starts at 12-1. A more intriguing choice was made by trainer D. Wayne Lukas for High Yield (Storm Cat), a well beaten 15th when drawn wide for the Derby. With the third overall pick and with the inside three stalls available, Lukas instead opted for the five for the Blue Grass winner. The chestnut is a 10-1 chance on Florio's morning line. Another likely pacesetter, Hal's Hope (Jolie's Halo) took the worst of the draw and will break from the outside in the field of eight at 20-1.

Sakhee did not look 'a Derby horse' according to trainer John Dunlop at the start of the year, but he has quickly put himself firmly in the picture with successes in two Derby trials. The first came at Sandown, where he had Pawn Broker in second in the G3 Classic Trial Apr. 29, and he followed that up here with a smart performance in conditions that were the opposite to those encountered that day. He broke well, with his jockey content to track Shamrock City (Rock City {Ire}), who blazed a trail in front, going through the first 2 1/2 furlongs in 32.83 seconds. The tempo continued, and it was only with two furlongs remaining that Richard Hills got to the leader, grabbing the front before staying on well. Although he drifted across Pawn Broker, who was chasing him home once again, he was clear at the line. Hills said afterwards, "He's a brave horse, as the ground was on the firm side, for him. He tries and you can't ask any more than that. He's tough and gives you 100 percent, which is the sign of a good horse." John Dunlop added, "I don't think he enjoyed the firm ground at all, and he's a big, heavy horse, so I'd be worried about Epsom if it was too firm. He's lovely-looking and beautifully-bred, and his dam was very strong so there's a lot of stamina in the breeding. He's very brave--very courageous." He is now priced at 8-1 for Epsom by William Hill to follow in the footsteps of his trainer's other two Dante S. winners, Shirley Heights (GB) and Erhaab, who both went on to win the Derby. Best Of The Bests pleased Godolphin, who will now send him to join Sakhee at Epsom, and he is 14-1 for the Classic with the same firm.

Fourth in the G3 Prix Chloe at Chantilly last July on her only previous visit to France, Super Tassa surprised as the outsider of five to set that record straight and took her first group race in cozy fashion. On her previous outing she won the Premio Nogara, a valuable handicap for older fillies, at Milan Apr. 29, her second start of the year. She was settled fourth of the five runners ahead of the odds-on favourite War Game as Sicy du Barail (Fr) (Mister Sicy (Fr)), Cape Grace (Ire) (Priolo) and Turbotiere disputed the pace. Cape Grace was ridden into the lead at the quarter-mile marker as Super Tassa on the outside, and War Game wider still, made their challenge. Super Tassa quickened to the front with a half furlong to run pursued by War Game and the pair went on together, with the former safely holding the favourite's bid. Turbotiere squeezed between Cape Grace and Sicy du Barail to take third.

Kayf Tara enters this race the leading stayer in Europe, having obtained an International Classification rating of 122 pounds for his exploits last year when he took the G1 Irish St Leger and G2 Prix Kergorlay, Goodwood Cup and Prix Vicomtesse Vigier before missing his intended target, the Melbourne Cup, through injury in November. He is sure to be hard to pass if he is at his classy best on his return here. The older character Celeric seems to have retained his ability with some fine performances when winning the G3 Lonsdale S. and finishing third in the G3 Doncaster Cup last year, before shaping well when third on his return in the G3 Sagaro S. Ascot May 3. He loves York and loves firm ground. Kahtan was not far behind Blueprint (Ire) when fourth after a fine display from the front in the G2 Jockey Club S. Newmarket May 5, and a replay of that form will see him go close here.

A select field for a race that may be considered a trial of sorts. Boutron will start as favourite and justifiably so. He was third, promoted to second, behind Aristotle and Rhenium in the G2 Prix Greffulhe at Longchamp Apr. 23. The subsequently disqualified Aristotle hampered his chances in that race and chief benefactor Rhenium ran a solid race when third in the G1 Prix Lupin last weekend. Darjeeling was a deserving winner when collecting the Listed Prix Matchem at Chantilly May 2, and will bid to continue his steady rise through the ranks. Beriskaio is something of a dark horse and, being from the Fabre stable, is certainly one to note. He won his only start to date when successful in a good conditions race at Saint-Cloud Apr. 18 and is not without a legitimate chance.

One of the last traditional trials pointing to the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club in which Bonnet Rouge is likely to start favourite in a small field. He had shown his trainer little over the winter, so much so that a jumps campaign was a consideration. That idea was shelved after he won his first two starts very easily and if successful will need to be supplemented for the French Derby. Holding Court, a half brother to G1 winner Tomba, likes cut in the ground and was an easy winner of a rated handicap in heavy ground at Haydock Apr. 22, and will cross La Manche with high hopes. Fellow British challenger Gargalhada Final also travels with ambition and was a fine second to potential G1 Vodafone Derby candidate Wellbeing at Newmarket May 6, on his latest start. He is another who appreciates cut and hails from a stable currently riding on a high.

As the proprietor of one of the last family-owned public studs in Ireland, Sean Collins found it increasingly difficult to secure highly qualified stallion prospects in the face of competition from the likes of Coolmore and the Irish National Stud. Yet the man who brought Northfields and Persian Bold to Ireland remained a very good judge of a young horse, as he showed by going into partnership with Yarraman Park Stud in Australia to secure Desert Style to stand at his Corbally Stud.

"I think he could be a very decent stallion," Collins told me back in the spring of 1996. Desert Style has wasted little time in justifying this assessment, coming up with a first crop which features Bachir, a decisive winner of the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains last Sunday, and Cape Town, who was one of the leading fancies for the 2,000 Guineas after his impressive win the European Free H.

Unfortunately for Collins, this success came after his decision to retire as a stallion master and Desert Style is now capitalizing on his early successes at a fee of Ir£7,000 at Gay O'Callaghan's Morristown Lattin Stud.

Desert Style started his career at the modest price of Ir£3,000, his fee being a reflection of his failure to win a major event. His three victories in Group 3 contests over six and seven furlongs earned him a rating of 120 on the 1995 International Classifications, which was enough to make him the highest-ranked three-year-old sprinter in Europe. However, he was rated 7lb inferior to Lake Coniston, the top older sprinter.

No doubt Collins' decision to buy was based just as much on the colt's good looks and fashionable pedigree. With Danzig's ever-popular son Green Desert as his sire and High Top's daughter Organza as his dam, Desert Style represents the very effective Northern Dancer-High Top cross, which has produced such top-class performers as Opera House, Turtle Island, Classic Cliché, Kayf Tara and In The Groove. More to the point, he was bred to the same pattern as Owington, another champion three-year-old sprinter who made his stud debut at a fee of £7,500 in 1996, and Desert Style also had links with Barathea, another highly-regarded young stallion. This Breeders' Cup Mile winner was sired by another Northern Dancer line stallion from a half-sister to Desert Style's dam.

It is significant that Owington, Barathea and Desert Style have all made their mark as stallions. Owington, who died after only one season at stud, was represented last year by the G2 Lowther S. winner Jemima, the American stakes winner Gateman, the Listed winner Jezebel and the Group-placed winners Winning Venture, Whyome and Flowington. Barathea, for his part, has sired colts good enough to be placed in the 2,000 Guineas in each of his first two crops.

The success of Desert Style and Owington adds to Green Desert's growing reputation as a promising sire of sires. This is based partly on the Australasian exploits of his sons Volksraad and Desert Sun, the latter being the sire of the sensational mare Sunline.

Sunline is inbred 4 x 4 to Northern Dancer and Bachir is inbred 4 x 3, his dam being the Be My Guest mare Morning Welcome, a half-sister to the American Grade III sprint winner Down Again. This successful family has already produced another French classic winner in the shape of Rafha, winner of the Prix de Diane in 1990 and now dam of the Group-winning Sadian. Although Bachir has a predominantly turf pedigree, he showed in Dubai that he handles a sand track well and he could one day become an interesting contender for some of the U.S.'s valuable prizes.

De Kwiatkowski sued the investment banking company in 1996, alleging that the firm, including managing director Albert Sabini, failed to warn of the risks of speculating in foreign currency, causing de Kwiatkowski to lose \$300 million when the dollar fell unexpectedly in 1995. Sabini, also a defendant in the case, was not found personally culpable. A Bear Stearns spokeswoman told Bloomberg News Service that the company will launch an appeal.

Hubie de Burgh, general manager of Derrinstown Stud, said: "This is not only a major disappointment for Derrinstown Stud, but also for the Windsor Park Stud and their clients. The horse had a full book of outstanding mares awaiting his arrival and any horse of this racing calibre and pedigree has to be a loss to breeders in New Zealand."

Among the high-class offerings is seven-year-old Lillian Gold (USA) (Slew O' Gold {USA}), an unraced mare in foal to Marscay (Aus). Her dam is a half sister to Mr. Prospector (USA). Thompson has reportedly already rejected an A\$800,00 offer for a full sister to Golden Slipper runner-up and freshman sire Shovhog (Aus) (Danehill {USA}), and he has a Barathea (Ire) filly from the top broodmare St. Klaire (Star Way {NZ}) that will be sought after as she is a half sister to Group 1 winners Bonanova (Aus), Teleso (Aus) and Fraternity (Aus). A half sister to English 1000 Guineas winner Cape Verdi (Ire), Lovely Actress (Fr) (Kaldoun {Fr}), will also be offered. Covering sires including End Sweep (USA), Fuji Kiseki (Jpn), Gilded Time (USA), Hennessy (USA), Marscay (Aus), Perugino (USA), Red Ransom (USA) and Woodman (USA). Thompson said the impending introduction of GST in Australia was a factor in his decision to part with a thoroughbred investment on which he estimates he's spent A\$40 million. "GST is going to be a big problem; nobody knows what it is about, I don't think even [Prime Minister] John Howard knows what it is about and it is time they spelled out more about it," he said. "I'm not prepared to take the risk, I don't think it is worth it." As for the dispersal itself, Thompson said, "We've had a terrific amount of interest from Hong Kong and even England. It is definitely a dispersal sale, we are not holding anything back and we've had some fantastic offers, but it is not fair on buyers to sell before the auction."
