#### MAGNITUDE COMES HOME FIRST

First Magnitude (Ire) (Arazi), winner of last season's G2 Prix du Conseil de Paris at Longchamp and the Apr. 27 G3 Prix d'Hedouville, justified favouritism in yesterday's G2 Prix Jean de Chaudenay at Saint-Cloud with a cozy, albeit small, winning margin. The Irish-bred colt was settled in third ahead of Spendent (GB) (Generous {Ire}) and Aubergade (Fr) (Kaldoun {Fr}) as Russian Hope (Ire) (Rock Hopper {GB}) led the field from Crillon (Fr) (Saumarez {GB}) in single file. The pace quickened on the run to the home straight and First Magnitude was niggled along to keep his place rounding the final turn. First Magnitude and Crillon made their challenge in tandem approaching the final furlong and the pair went on inside the final 150 yards, with the winner pushed out to assert his superiority and comfortably hold on for the score. Crillon looked dangerous from the quartermile marker, but lacked the necessary ammunition to get to the front. Spendent ran on in the closing stages and grabbed third in the dying strides.

#### ZOFTIG STORMS TO SELENE SUCCESS

Content to trail the field early, even-money favorite Zoftig (Cozzene) saved all the ground and slipped past 2-1 North Lake Jane (Meadowlake) in the lane to win vesterday's GI Selene S. at Woodbine by a length. "I was very happy with the way she finished," jockey Marlon St. Julien said. "The rail opened, so I took the opportunity...saving the ground and the kick she had left allowed us to prevail." Beaten a nose in the GI Ashland S. at Keeneland Apr. 8, the gray was 8-1 in the May 5 GI Kentucky Oaks and finished a non-threatening fifth behind runaway winner Secret Status. Finding a softer spot this time, she settled near the back of the pack while riding the rail early, moved up on the far turn and drove past the runner-up in the final furlong. As for what's next, trainer Mike Doyle said he would give his charge a two-month break and then try her on the turf, where she started her career with a maiden victory. "She's still learning and maturing, and still has a little growing to do," he said. Inspired Kiss (Inspired Prospect), who rallied to be third, will make her next start in the June 10 Canadian Oaks. "She'll be tough," her jockey, Neil Poznansky, said of the Canadian-bred miss.

After opening her career with two straight wins, Silk Prima Donna ran second in the Mar. 12 G2 Yonsai Himba Tokubetsu and third in the Apr. 19 G1 Oka Sho (Japanese 1000 Guineas). While Olive Crown and Oka Sho winner Cheers Grace stalked the slow pace of Lady Muse (Jpn) (Timber Country), Silk Prima Donna settled in sixth. She moved up along the rail as the field approached the stretch and outlasted Cheers Grace in the final furlong, giving trainer Kenji Yamauchi a one-two finish in the race. "She was relaxed in the paddock and warmed up nicely," said winning rider Shinji Fujita. "We were in a favorable position on the rail and I tried to move as soon as possible because the pace was slow."

# PEDIGREE INSIGHTS BY ANDREW CAULFIELD

Breeders are always quick to clutch at any straw which might help them make the best use of their stallion seasons and Frank Stronach took the hint when Unbridled sired his first major winner, Unbridled's Song, from a daughter of Caro. Stronach promptly sent his Caro mare Cargo to visit Unbridled in 1996, soon after Unbridled's Song's Grade I victories in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile and the Florida Derby.

We now know that lightning can indeed strike twice in the same place, because Cargo has produced a colt every bit as good as Unbridled's Song in the shape of the Preakness hero Red Bullet. For good measure, Unbridled has also done very well with Red Chili Pepper, a leading distaff performer in Japan whom he sired from a mare by Caro's son Dr. Carter.

Clearly this type of mating has a great deal to offer, but I must admit that the idea of sending daughters of Caro to the 16.3-hands Unbridled probably would not have occurred to me, on the score of size. Caro also stood 16.3 hands and his progeny--which have been described as gangling--tended to be big and rangy. A perfect example was his Kentucky Derby-winning daughter Winning Colors, who fortunately had the athleticism to match her big, impressive frame.

Red Bullet's dam, Cargo, will be remembered as a talented and versatile performer in California. Although a stakes victory eluded her, she was good enough as a five-year-old to finish runner-up to Golden Klair in the GII A Gleam H. over seven furlongs and to Corrazona in the GIII Santa Anita Budweiser Breeders' Cup H. over a mile. She appeared to be at home on both dirt and turf.

The longest distance over which Cargo was stakes-placed was 8 1/2 furlongs, which is pretty much what one would expect of a filly of her pedigree. Cargo has a largely European background and all four of her grandparents did their racing in Europe. Her dam Aerturas was imported to the U.S. as a two-year-old in 1983. She justified the move as a five-year-old, when her stakes success over six furlongs at Bay Meadows was sandwiched between third places in the GIII Las Flores H. and the GIII Barbabra Fritchie H. Speed again seemed to be her main asset.

Aerturas was by Manado, a very good performer whose stallion career was a sad anti-climax. He secured the title of champion two-year-old in France in 1975 by taking the Prix de la Salamandre and Grand Criterium, but failed to win again at three, when a mile proved to be his limit. Red Bullet's third dam, Amiel, was a minor winner in Italy, where her dam Alea was a leading juvenile and winner of the Italian 1000 Guineas. Alea is best known as the dam of Noalcoholic, a brother to Amiel who developed into one of Europe's top milers at the ages of five and six. His finest moment came when he won the G1 Sussex S.

Red Bullet's connections have already made one decision--to miss the Kentucky Derby--in the colt's best interests and they must now decide whether to try to add the Belmont S. to his Preakness success. The desire to establish Red Bullet as a champion may well persuade them to let him take his chance. While Caro may help him, Red Bullet is by no means sure to be as effective over 1 1/2 miles as he is over shorter distances. Unbridled could only plod on into fourth place, well behind Go And Go, in the 1990 Belmont and his only major success over 1 1/2 miles as a stallion is the CCA Oaks victory of his daughter Banshee Breeze. Remember too that Unbridled's Song led the Kentucky Derby field into the stretch, only to fade quickly in the closing stages, and never won beyond nine furlongs.

PREAKNESS RATINGS RISE The ABC telecast of Saturday's GI Preakness at Pimlico earned an overnight rating of 4.6 and an 11 share, up 21 percent from the 1999 figures. It was the first time since 1997 that the ratings had shown an increase. The second leg in last year's Triple Crown drew a 3.8 overnight rating and a 10 share. One rating point is equivalent to approximately 1 million viewers. The share represents the percentage of televisions tuned to any given program. The Preakness broadcast aired from 4:30-6 p.m.; the final hour attracted a 5.3 rating and a 12 share, up 26 percent from a year ago. POSITIVE NUMBERS FOR HIALEAH MEET The 58-day Hialeah-at-Gulfstream season closed Monday after showing an increase of 40 percent in live and full-card handle over last year's 60-day stand. Wagering on the live racing was up more than \$4 million, while handle on the track's full-card simulcasting menu increased more than \$12 million. Attendance showed a gain of 62,000 over the course of the season. "Hialeah would like to thank all the horsemen who contributed to the overall success of the meet where purses were at an all-time high. This was an experiment that proved profitable and successful for all parties concerned," Hialeah General Manager Richard W. Sacco said.

#### TESTA ROSSA TAKES TRIAL

Jockey Shane Dye rode Testa Rossa (Aus) (Perugino {Ire}) for the first time in a barrier trial at Cranbourne yesterday and declared the colt will take beating in Saturday's G1 Treasury Casino 10,000 at Doomben. "He'll win on Saturday," the ever-confident Dye told trainer Dean Lawson as he dismounted. Testa Rossa won the trial by about 2 1/2 lengths, but it could have been more. Dye was content to let the colt, usually a notoriously poor track worker, cruise to the line. "I wouldn't have minded if he'd put six lengths on them, but Shane didn't really let him have his head," Lawson said, adding the colt "wouldn't have blown a candle out" after the gallop. The winner of 10 of his 17 starts and more than A\$2.3 million in prizemoney, Testa Rossa has not raced since his disappointing effort in the G1 Ryder S. at Rosehill Apr. 8.
