### WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile and GI Santa Anita Derby victor Brocco hasn't exactly set the world on fire as a stallion. He does, however, have one really good filly from each of his first two crops, in the Australian star Miss Pennymoney (Aus) and Jostle in North America.

Unlike her Australian counterpart, Jostle doesn't yet have a Grade I victory to her credit, although that might come in her next start, the GI Coaching Club American Oaks. Still, she has now won five of nine starts, including the Polly Drummond S., GIII Selima S., GII Demoiselle S. and last Friday's GII Black-Eyed Susan S.

Often, the most notable runners by a disappointing sire will have a "special" pedigree pattern, with some well-structured inbreeding or linebreeding, and Jostle fits that mold. The cross of \*Nasrullah and \*Princequillo is one of the most famous "nicks" in breeding, but the combination of Nasrullah's three-quarters brother \*Royal Charger with Princequillo mares also had its moments. The most notable product of the cross was Sir Gaylord (by Royal Charger's son \*Turn-To out of that most notable of Princeguillo mares, Somethingroyal), but we can also note versions of the cross in the pedigree of the brilliant filly Lakeville Miss, multiple stakes winner Royal Gunner, Sheepshead Bay H. heroine Sydney's Nurse, Fast Turn (dam of Horse of the Year Ack Ack) and Gonfalon (dam of Ogygian and granddam of Honour and Glory).

Kris S., the sire of Brocco, is bred on an extended version of the Royal Charger/Turn-to/Princequillo nick, since he is by Turn-To's grandson Roberto out of a mare by Princequillo. Jostle's dam--stakes-placed Moon Drone--is by Drone, a son of Sir Gaylord, a horse we have already mentioned as a product of a Turn-To/Princequillo cross. Jostle's granddam Cute Little Moon is by Ack Ack, whose dam Fast Turn, is another Turn-To/Princequillo product. Thus Jostle has Turn-To 5x4x5 and Princequillo 4x5x6, each time the pair arriving in tandem (via Kris S., Sir Gaylord and Fast Turn).

As an aside, it is worth noting that Sir Gaylord and Fast Turn, who appear together in Jostle's dam Moon Drone, are actually three-parts related (both by Turn-To out of Princequillo mares). The Sir Gaylord/Fast Turn combination is found in at least 11 unrestricted stakes scorers, including graded stakes winners Grab the Green, Reach the Top, Fast 'n' Gold and Gail's Brush, so it could be one worth bearing in mind.

#### PEDIGREE SHORTS

The Royal Charger/Princequillo and Nasrullah/ Princequillo theme is also a prominent one in the pedigree of Reve d'Oscar (Fr) (f, 3, Highest Honor {Fr}--Numidie {Fr}, by Baillamont), who broke her maiden with a surprise win in the G1 Prix Saint-Alary on Sunday. Reve d'Oscar is inbred 4x4 to Sir Gaylord, and her sire Highest Honor is out of a mare by Riverman (a Nasrullah/Princequillo cross). For good measure, Reve d'Oscar in tail-male line, is great-granddaughter of Kalamoun (GB). His dam is by a son of Prince Rose (sire of Princequillo) out of a daughter of Rivaz--a sister to Nasrullah, and a three-quarters sister to Royal Charger.

Sendawar (Ire) (c, 4, Priolo--Sendana {Fr}, by Darshaan {GB}) continued his elevation to superstar status with a three-length victory in the G1 Prix d'Ispahan on Sunday. Bred by His Highness the Aga Khan, Sendawar owns an interesting pedigree pattern achieved by combining Riverman and Mill Reef, genetically related sons of Never Bend (both Riverman's broodmare sire Prince John and Mill Reef's dam Milan Mill are by Princequillo out of Count Fleet mares). This pair appear together in at least 14 unrestricted stakes winners, others including Group 1 winner Shiva (Jpn), and group/graded stakes winners Limnos (Jpn), Michel Georges (GB), Perugina (Fr), Grand Plaisir (Ire), Irish Wings (Ire) and Martiniquais (Ire). #### TOP EURO ELDERS COME BACK BIG

We're in the midst of the Classic season now: we've seen the first two legs of the Triple Crown in America, the four Guineas races from England and France, with Ireland on tap this weekend, and a raft of Derby and Oaks trials.

But in the last week a few of the top older horses in Europe have made their reappearances--with last year's Arc winner, Montjeu, set to run over 10 furlongs in Ireland this weekend--and one comment that will meet with absolutely no dispute among analysts of European racing is that this year's three-year-olds will have to go some to be as impressive as some of these top 'olders.'

Godolphin cut loose a top sprinter (Lend a Hand) and a top stayer (Kayf Tara) for an impressive back-to-back Group race double at York last Thursday. Then on Saturday, their top miler, Aljabr, came back with a convincing win in the G1 Lockinge at Newbury. And, of course, back in the barn is Dubai Millennium, scheduled to make his reappearance in the (now G1) Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot.

A four-year-old colt by Storm Cat out of the dual Group 1 winner Sierra Madre, by Blushing Groom's son Baillamont, Aljabr was three-for-three as a two-year-old (including the G1 Pr de la Salamandre, defeating Stravinsky). After an abortive trip to Kentucky on the Derby Trail, he ran three times in Europe at three, winning the G1 Sussex S. (so he's now a Group 1 winner in three successive seasons) and twice finishing behind the Aga Khan's brilliant Sendawar.

Sendawar himself--a son of Priolo (himself by Sovereign Dancer) out of a Darshaan mare, bred and owned by the Aga Khan--won three Group 1's at a mile as a three-year-old last year: the French 2000 Guineas, the St. James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot, and the Prix du Moulin at Longchamp.

At the beginning of his three-year-old year (1999), Sendawar was campaigned over 10 furlongs, winning once, but then finishing one-length second to Montjeu in the Pr Greffulhe, a French Derby prep. They decided to drop him back to a mile, and Sendawar hasn't been beaten since. There was a possibility he was going to meet Aljabr again in the Lockinge. He needs good ground, which was looking more likely in England. In the end, though, Sendawar stayed in France, and ran in last Sunday's G1 Pr d'Ispahan over 1850m (9 1/4f). He won very impressively, taking the scalp of two-time 2000 Group winner Indian Danehill.

So Godolphin has Aljabr at one mile and Dubai Millenium at 10 furlongs (heading for Royal Ascot). Sendawar is being pointed for Sandown's 10-furlong Eclipse S. at the beginning of July, and Montjeu comes back this weekend. This year's Classic generation, in Europe at least, looks like having a lot to live up to.

#### **SIRE NOTES**

Coolmore's Grand Lodge, whose first crop are four-year-olds of 2000, has a couple of serious Group 1 horses representing him this spring. Indian Lodge, a four-year-old colt from his first crop, won four in a row at 8-9 furlongs--two Listeds last fall, then a Group 3 and a Group 2 this spring--before finishing third (beaten in a photo for second) to Aljabr last weekend. The previous weekend, the Aga Khan's three-year-old Grand Lodge colt, Sinndar, gave seven pounds (having won a Group 1 at two) and defeated the previously unbeaten Bach in Leopardstown's G3 Derby Trial over 10 furlongs in Ireland. Yes, Grand Lodge has plenty of foals to represent him (and Southern Hemisphere crops too) but it doesn't matter how many foals a stallion has if none of them are much good. Plenty of the Grand Lodges have ability, and at least one colt from each of his first two crops is now a proven Group 1 colt. Sinndar, by the way, is quoted at around 12-1 for the Epsom Derby.

Deeply Impressive Start...Halling. Two runners, two winners, the first a few weeks ago in France, the second yesterday, at Goodwood. Yesterday's winner, Baarido, a colt owned by Sheikh Ahmed and out of the speedy Dayjur mare, Millstream, came from off the pace and nailed two colts who had both run well before, over Goodwood's fast five furlongs. It's not yet the end of May, and the horse has had two runners, two winners, and both look like a step up in distance and class will suit. Very much one to watch. Halling. Remember that name. If the result of last Sunday's G1 Pr Saint-Alary, the most important prep for the French Oaks, can be taken at face value, the French fillies' Classic on June 11 will be a formality. The Saint-Alary 1-2--both longshots in what looked a quality field--were Reve d'Oscar (Highest Honor) and Folie Danse (Petit Loup). Both had been trounced by a filly called Volvoreta in the 2100m Pr Penelope (G3) at Saint-Cloud last month. Volvoreta is by Suave Dancer out of a mare by Don Roberto (I think he's a son of Roberto who stood in Spain), and if she's still that much better than the other two, she will win the French Oaks.

One of the best crosses for Bold Ruler mares was Damascus, and that successful nick is duplicated in the pedigree of new stakes winner Saratoga Summer (c, 4, Time For A Change-- Shivering Six, by Saratoga Six), winner of the Buckeye H. at Thistledown. Saratoga Summer's sire Time For A Change is by Damascus out of a mare by a son of Bold Ruler, and his third dam is by Accipiter (by Damascus out of a Bold Ruler mare).

The pattern of inbreeding to the broodmare sire of the sire strikes again! Dr. Max (c, 4, Dover Ridge-lambiambi, by Son Excellence), who came out on top in a desperate finish to the GIII Maryland Breeders' Cup H. at the weekend, is the only graded stakes winner (and one of only two unrestricted stakes winners) for his sire Dover Ridge. A minor stakes winner by Riva Ridge, Dover Ridge is out of a Bold Ruler mare, and Dr. Max's second dam is by Bold Ruler's son Bold Ambition.

Golden Ballet (f, 2, Moscow Ballet--Golden Jewel Box, by Slew o' Gold), who broke her maiden by taking the Nursery S., is another good winner with the combination of the relatives Nijinsky II/Storm Bird. Her sire is a son of Nijinsky II and her second dam is by Storm Bird.

Alydar hasn't exactly been the most outstanding sire of sires, but a pair of his sons had stakes winners with clever pedigrees at the weekend. Lady Cherie (f, 3, Al Sabin--Cherie's Companion, by Highland Blade) took the Tomboy S. and Noble Affair (f, 4, Melodisk--Lady Bluemont, by Noble Title) landed the My Juliet S. Lady Cherie has an exceptionally clever pedigree as her second dam is by Alydar's extremely close genetic relative Raise a Cup. In addition, Lady Cherie's third dam is by Tim Tam, a half brother to On-and-On, the broodmare sire of Alydar. Noble Affair's sire Melodisk is out of a mare by One For All, whose dam is Quill (by Princequillo out of a Count Fleet mare). Noble Affair's broodmare sire Noble Title is by Prince John, who is also by Princeguillo out of a Count Fleet mare, so Noble Affair has Quill/Prince John 4x3.

Fred Hooper has enjoyed great success over the years with matings which multiply strains of his great speedster Olympia. Another to benefit from this kind of pedigree is the Miss Preakness S. winner Lucky Livi (f, 3, Mr. Greeley--Easy to Cope, by Copeland). Out of a Hooper-bred mare with Olympia 4x5x5x4, Lucky Livi has an extra strain of Olympia through Mr. Greeley. In fact both Leven Ones, third dam of Mr. Greeley, and Jester, who is in the male line of Lucky Livi's dam, are similarly bred, combining Olympia and Eight Thirty. The pedigree also has linebreeding to Tom Fool and Bold Ruler. This is significant, since Tom Fool's third dam Laughing Queen is a full sister to champion two-year-old Pompey, the sire of Bold Ruler's second dam. Laughing Queen and Pompey are linebred to the sisters Violet and Feronia, and Olympia is strongly linebred to the same family.

#### Changes Ahead for Gulfstream:

Less than 48 hours after his horse won the Preakness, Gulfstream owner Frank Stronach was in South Florida planning the next phase of the track's metamorphosis. Gulfstream president David Romanik said, "Mr. Stronach was in to look at property for a training track. That will be the next stage in converting Gulfstream. We need a training track so we can move horses there and then knock down the barns on the east side (down the backstretch) of the track. Mr. Stronach wants to build another turf course. He also wants to knock down the grandstand and clubhouse, probably in phases. We'll either have a main track (1 1/8 miles) and two turf courses inside, or it will be like Woodbine with a turf course outside and the main track and the turf courses where they are now. He likes a piece of property off the turnpike near Boynton Beach (about 40 miles north of Gulfstream) and I like Pompano Harness Track (about 30 miles north on I-95), but they're asking too much money right now." There has been speculation that Gulfstream might have to run their meeting at Hialeah next year so all the construction work can be completed. "I think there's a better chance Hialeah will run here next year than that we'll run there," said

George Margarson's Barathea Guest, who was yesterday supplemented at a cost of £25,000, will appreciate the soft going. He worked yesterday morning on Long Hill gallop in Newmarket, and came through it well, finishing a length clear of his lead horse. "Saturday is not an easy race, and although some people might think he has a better chance because of the soft ground, I don't look at it that way," Margarson said.

Sunday's Irish 1000 Guineas sees the English Guineas first, second, and fourth re-oppose in Lahan (GB) (Unfuwain {USA}), Princess Ellen (GB) (Tirol {Ire}), and Seazun (Ire) (Zieten {USA}) respectively. They will come up against a strong home defence headed by Preseli (Ire) (Caerleon {USA}), the joint top-rated juvenile filly in Europe last year, and Aidan O'Brien's Chiang Mai (Ire) (Sadler's Wells {USA}), as well as Godolphin entrant Meiosis (USA) (Danzig {USA}), who was supplemented to the race yesterday.

#### BECKETT OPTMISTIC OVER BEAT HOLLOW

Fears that G1 Epsom Derby S. ante-post second favourite Beat Hollow (GB) (Sadler's Wells {USA}) would miss the race were eased slightly by owner Khalid Abdullah's Racing Manager Teddy Beckett yesterday. Speaking at Goodwood, he said, "He's well, and he's come on and progressed. Luckily for him, the mucus in his lungs was spotted early, and he is clear now. He was actually pretty clear from the start, but the worry is how to get him ready for a race like the Derby. He won't go there if he is not one hundred percent." Trainer Henry Cecil plans to work Beat Hollow, who is currently 5-1 for the Classic with William Hill, this morning, and a racecourse gallop is yet to be arranged.

Simon Crisford compared the two. "He [Roscius] is a very nice horse, and he tries very hard, but Best Of The Bests is of superior quality. We're absolutely delighted with the way he's run, and he'll stay forever, and get a mile-and-a-half, no problem." Dettori added, "He's gutsy and he battled nicely for me, and if he carries on like this he'll turn out a nice horse." Bookmakers were generally unimpressed, with William Hill leaving him unchanged at 40-1 for the Epsom Classic, while the Tote rated the performance higher by cutting him to 25-1. Hills cut Best Of The Bests to 12-1, however.

#### **BHB RESTRUCTURES EXECUTIVE**

In anticipation of the changes which will result from the Government's planned abolition of the Horserace Betting Levy Board and the statutory levy mechanism, as well as the sale of the Tote to Racing, the British Horseracing Board vesterday announced a restructuring of its Executive, a move intended to provide an increased commercial focus. Chris Reynolds will join in July as Marketing Manager with responsibility for strategy and all commercial matters, as well as for Racing, Marketing, Communications, Finance and Personnel departments. Chief Executive Tristam Ricketts will become Secretary-General with responsibility for Board administration and legislative issues, including the sale of the Tote, the abolition of the Levy Board and the Gambling Review. He will continue to report directly to the Chairman and the Board, and will also work with the Chairman and Managing Director on the Future Funding Plan for Racing and all international matters. Peter Savill, Chairman of the BHB, said, "The racing environment has changed significantly since BHB was established seven years ago and even bigger changes are now in prospect. The BHB Board believes that the new structure will better enable Racing's Governing Authority to meet the challenges ahead. An increasingly commercial and marketing-orinted approach is now more vital than ever." Tristam Ricketts added, "The Board has recognised that, in this rapidly changing environment, BHB is under-resourced and, in particular, needs a significant strengthening of commercial capabilities."

#### QUALITY VODAFONE CORONATION CUP IN PROSPECT

#### SPORTWELT TO GET NEW LOOK

Germany's traditional racing paper, Sport Welt, has undergone a major change and will have a new layout for its 62nd issue of the year. The front page, in colour with pictures and larger print, will be similar in appearance to Britain's Racing Post. Sport Welt has been in operation for 114 years, and for most of that time was Germany's only racing paper, until a new television betting service came along. A smaller paper entitled Top Tip was introduced with no editorial comment and only racing form as the sole aid for punters. With competing papers in a relatively small market, both found themselves in deep financial trouble by the end of last year, particularly Sport Welt, when its printing company Deutscher Sportverlag went bankrupt. The two papers have now joined forces and the old Sport Welt's serious, objective and elaborate editorial have been altered in favour of a quicker, clear-cut form of report and analysis. Josef Kammerinke, who served the German racing and breeding enthusiasts in as chief editor of the old Sport Welt, has been succeeded by Daniel Delius who will look to emphasize the modern, boulevard style layout.
