ANEES UNDERGOES SURGERY

Last year's Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner Anees (Unbridled), a distant 13th in the Kentucky Derby in his most recent start, underwent arthroscopic surgery this past Monday to remove small bone chips discovered in both front ankles. Richard Mulhall, president of Prince Ahmed Salman's The Thoroughbred Corporation, said that the injury was caused early in the running of the Derby. "We had routine radiographs taken right before the race which were obviously clean," Mulhall said. "Anees ran so flat and cooled out with filling in his front ankles. We radiographed him again and that's when the chips were found." Surgery was described as routine and Anees is recovering at the Bradbury, California, headquarters of The Thoroughbred Corporation. A late summer to early fall return to training is anticipated.

'BULLET' STILL ON BELMONT FENCE

Trainer Joe Orseno is denying a published report that he has decided to run Preakness winner Red Bullet (Unbridled) in the June 10 Belmont S. The Associated Press reported late Tuesday that Red Bullet would start in the final leg of the Triple Crown based on an interview with NYRA President Terry Meyocks. Meyocks told the AP that he had met with Orseno on the Belmont backstretch Tuesday morning and that Orseno said "he was planning to run." Meanwhile, Orseno is denying he has made up his mind one way or the other. "There's no way I said that," Orseno said. "I have never confirmed to anybody that this horse is running in the Belmont. I don't want (owner) Frank Stronach thinking that I said we're definitely running when that's not the case. I don't want him thinking we told the press something before even consulting with him." Meyocks returned, "It's their perogative to run the horse or not, but (racing secretary) Mike Lakow told us he told the same thing to (stakes coordinator) Andrew Byrnes, that he was running the horse. I don't want to get anybody into trouble...but we've been told he's running." Orseno and Stronach have said publicly that they will not make a decision concerning the Belmont until they have had proper time to evaluate the horse's condition. Orseno said that he will not run the colt in the Belmont unless he is in "perfect" condition for the race. "I would think we'd have a decision by Sunday," Orseno said. "By then we'll have had the tack back on him and he'll have had a chance to do something with him in the morning."

Unshaded Ready for Peter Pan:

James Tafel's GII Coolmore Lexington S. winner Unshaded (Unbridled) worked five furlongs over a muddy Churchill main track Tuesday morning in 1:00 1/5 to complete his preparations for Saturday's GII Peter Pan at Belmont Park. Supplemented to the Kentucky Derby field for \$150,000, the gelding was excluded from that field, but a strong performance in Saturday's race could entice Tafel to pay the \$100,000 supplement for the Belmont S. June 10. "He's a very talented horse," said trainer Carl Nafzger. "We've just got to find out if he can run with the big fellows. He's beat some nice horses, but he hasn't met the big fellows yet."

ENGLISH BREEDER BUYS FLORIDA FARM

Wycombe House Stud, a 218-acre Thoroughbred facility in Reddick, Florida, owned by the estate of the late Georgia Hoffman, has been purchased by English breeders Sean and Barbara Kelly, according to Thoroughbred Times Online. The purchase price was not disclosed. Kelly, the former owner of Raffin Stud in Berkshire, England, has been a leading consignor of foals in England and will maintain a band of 35 broodmares at the farm while keeping a focus on sales. "We'll prep foals and yearlings with our emphasis on the yearling market," Kelly said. Kelly is also a partner in the stallion Nicolotta (, who will continue to stand in England, but he hopes to develop a stallion operation at the Florida farm. "We initially intend to stand two or three stallions. We'll look for a few prospects, who'll either be racing or standing in Kentucky," Kelly said.

RINGS A CHIME RETIRED Rings A Chime

(Metfield), the winner of this year's GI Ashland S., has been retired due to a tendon injury suffered in her lastof-seven finish in the May 19 GII Black-Eyed Susans S. at Pimlico. Purchased privately by James Kowal's Turf Side Stable and switched to the barn of Northern California trainer Lonnie Arterburn, the dark bay had been very consistent in her 2000 campaign. Second to Surfside in the GIII Santa Ysabel at Santa Anita Jan. 9, Rings A Chime was third to that rival, beaten only 1 1/4 lengths in the GI Las Virgenes S. Feb 12. The \$26,000 yearling purchase, fourth in the GI Santa Anita Oaks prior to her Ashland success, was second by 6 3/4 lengths in the GI Kentucky Oaks in her penultimate start. Rings A Chime retires with four wins from 13 starts and earnings of \$606,315. She will be moved to Taylor Made Farm in Nicholasville, Kentucky, with the intention of breeding to Storm Cat this year.

Rested two months since his seventh-place finish in the Dubai World Cup, the well-traveled Running Stag was looking for his first win since last summer's Aug. 29 GII Saratoga Breeders' Cup H. Sent away the favorite at a generous 8-5, he sat just off the pace, responded when asked and came home an easy winner. "He'll head now to Boston (for the June 3 GII Massachusetts H. at Suffolk Downs) and then come back here for the (June 11 GII) Brooklyn H.," said trainer Philip Mitchell. "He's only allowed to remain in the U.S. for 30 days before shipping back to Europe, so he'll head home and then be back for the (Aug. 6) Whitney H. and the (Aug. 19) Arlington Million. Our ultimate goal, however, is the Breeders' Cup [Classic]."

7th-BEL, \$43,000, Alw, 3yo/up, 6f, 1:10 4/5, gd. ISTINTAJ (c, 4, Nureyev--Mathkurh, by Riverman) made his first four starts in Great Britain, winning just his final one, a maiden race at Redcar last October. Fourth at 11-1 in his U.S. debut May 10 at Belmont, he was accorded a bit more respect here, where he was sent away the 9-5 second choice. Sent to the front along the inside, he opened a comfortable lead on the stretch and came home on cruise control under jockey Jerry Bailey, winning by 4 1/4 lengths. Chavez Receives Venezia Award:

Jorge Chavez, the regular rider of 1999 Eclipse Award winners Beautiful Pleasure and Artax and himself the Eclipse-winning jockey of 1999, was selected by turf writers, jockeys from around the country and New York racing fans as the recipient of the Mike Venezia Memorial Award. Given annually to riders who "exemplify extraordinary sportsmanship and citizenship," Chavez, 38, rode his first winner in his native Peru in 1981 before moving to Florida to ride in 1988. "Chop Chop" shifted his tack to the New York circuit in the early 1990s and arguably celebrated his best year in 1999, when his mounts won a combined \$9.1 million.

Pleasant Colony Moved from Horse Park:

The 1981 Kentucky Derby and Preakness winner Pleasant Colony, moved this past April from Lane's End Farm to the Kentucky Horse Park, has not adapted to his new surroundings and will be moved to Blue Ridge Farm in Virginia, according to a story in the Lexington Herald-Leader. The 22-year-old stallion is reported to be about 300 pounds underweight, a condition exacerbated because he walks a lot along the perimeter of his paddock. "We thought once we retired him that he'd put weight on and relax at the Horse Park. It hasn't worked out," Lane's End owner William Farish told the Herald-Leader. "It hasn't been easier there for him, so we've found a wonderful place for him."

Team Midwest Takes Prairie Challenge:

A team of midwestern jockeys including Pat Day, Shane Sellers and Terry Thompson won the third annual Riding Cup at Prairie Meadows Tuesday evening, scoring a total of 30 points in a format where the lowest score won. Team West, consisting of Alex Solis, Kent Desormeaux and Laffit Pincay, was second with 34 points and Team East, represented by Jerry Bailey, Jorge Chavez and Mike Smith, was third with a total of 47 points. Each of the nine jockeys rode the fourth, sixth and eighth races, with the winner scoring one point, the second-place rider two points, and so on.

LEVY BOARD APPROVE BOARDS ON RAILS

The Horserace Betting Levy Board agreed Wednesday that rails bookmakers should be allowed to display their prices on boards, but with the condition that the boards are only allowed to face into members' enclosures. The Levy Board feels this is a fair balance between improving service to racegoers while limiting any disadvantage to Tattersalls boards bookmakers. The Levy Board also decided to ask the National Joint Pitch Council (NJPC) to try and achieve an agreement between rails and Tattersalls bookmakers on the basis by which they may be integrated into one bookmakers' list per course for pitch allocation purposes. The NJPC will be asked to report on the outcome of its efforts in time for the Levy Board's meeting in September.

We would have been happy to finish in the first three so the way she won was a real bonus. She is almost certain to run (in the Oaks) and we're happy to have the chance."
