HOT SALSA TAKES NORTHERN EXPRESS

Kingsalsa (Kingmambo) was Group 1-placed as a juvenile, but didn't break his maiden until the start of his sophomore campaign. The colt earned the first graded victory of his career in yesterday's G3 Prix du Chemin de Fer du Nord at Chantilly. Kingsalsa, third in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains at Longchamp last May and fifth in the G1 Grand Prix de Paris in June, reappeared this year with a win at Compiègne Mar. 13 before finishing third in the G3 Dubai Duty Free at Nad Al Sheba Mar. 25. On his latest outing, he finished second to stable companion Dansili (Ire) in the G2 Prix du Muguet at Saint-Cloud May 1, earning himself favored status yesterday. He duly obliged with Olivier Peslier excelling in the saddle as the combination denied **Banyumanik (Ire)** (Perugino) with a perfectly timed run. The German-trained Banyumanik led at a good pace while Olivier Peslier exercised a waiting regime with Kingsalsa, who traveled smoothly throughout. Banyumanik entered the straight with a six-length advantage and was still four lengths clear, although under pressure, entering the final quarter mile. Kingsalsa became the main danger approaching the final furlong and just needed to be pushed out to assert superiority over the valiant Banyumanik. **Le Roi Chic (Fr)** (Balleroy) ran on well to finish third without striking a serious blow.

SHIVA BESTS THE BOYS AT SANDOWN

This time last year **Shiva (Jpn)** (Hector Protector) was giving a beating to subsequent Horse of the Year Daylami (Ire) in the G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup at The Curragh, so it was no surprise to see her the favourite for yesterday's G3 Credit Suisse First Boston Brigadier Gerard S. at Sandown, run on her favoured easy conditions. On her return this year, Shiva had thrown away her chances in the early stages by pulling for her head in the Apr. 19 G3 Earl Of Sefton S., finishing seventh behind Indian Lodge (Ire) after tiring up Newmarket's rising ground. Yesterday, she showed that with the right conditions, she is a racehorse to be reckoned with. Racing in second early behind a true pace set by **Lady In Waiting (GB)** (Kylian), she settled perfectly this time, and was soon traveling easily. Jockey Richard Quinn let Shiva down with three furlongs remaining, and she powered clear in a matter of strides before being eased significantly in the late stages. Trainer Henry Cecil said of her, "She's a cracking mare and if the ground is soft we will go to Royal Ascot [for the June 21 G1 Prince Of Wales' S. or June 23 G2 Hardwicke S]." Her long-term aim is the Oct. 1 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe Longchamp.

Aptitude Fine After Drill:

Aptitude (A.P. Indy), second in the Kentucky Derby, came out of his six-furlong work (1:14 1/5) at Hollywood Park on Sunday, in fine shape, according to trainer Bobby Frankel. "He looks good and everything's on go," Frankel said from Hollywood. "He'll work here on Saturday, then ship to New York on the sixth." Frankel thinks the distance of the June 10 Belmont S. will suit his young charge. "He's a natural mile-and-a-half horse," the trainer commented. "It's not something you can train into a horse. It's in a horse's pedigree and the way he runs." Aptitude ran third behind Derby winner **Fusaichi Pegasus** (Mr. Prospector) and Preakness winner **Red Bullet** (Unbridled) in the Gil Wood Memorial earlier this year.

It has taken a little while, but Postponed has now arrived. The son of Summer Squall has threatened to turn into a serious runner ever since an impressive first time out maiden victory at Belmont Park last September. The promise was finally delivered on Saturday, when Postponed shot through a gap on the rails to defeat a very solid field in the Gil Peter Pan S.

Postponed was the pedigree pick of several shrewd judges at the 1998 Saratoga select yearling sales, and he clearly had the physique to match as he eventually sold for \$835,000, the second highest price for a colt at the sales. The purchase looked even better around 12 months later when Charismatic, a son of Summer Squall with some pedigree similarity to Postponed, captured the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S.

The pedigree parallel with Charismatic comes from Postponed's inbreeding to Secretariat, who appears 3x4 in his pedigree. Charismatic doesn't have a double of Secretariat, but he is out of mare who gives inbreeding to Secretariat's sire, Bold Ruler, and his dam, Somethingroyal. Extra strains of Somethingroyal are particularly interesting for Summer Squall, as his own dam Weekend Surprise has Somethingroyal 2x4 through the half brothers Secretariat (her sire) and Sir Gaylord (sire of her second dam).

Postponed has another noteworthy combination: Summer Squall is by Storm Bird (Northern Dancer) out of Weekend Surprise by Secretariat, and Postponed's second dam Chapel of Dreams is by Northern Dancer out of Terlingua by Secretariat. Not only did Chapel of Dreams win the Gil Palomar H., the Gil Wilshire H. and the GIII Golden Poppy H., but she is also three-quarters sister to "super sire" Storm Cat, a horse bred on the same Storm Bird/Secretariat cross as Summer Squall. Thus, the Storm Cat formula is strongly reinforced in Postponed's pedigree.

Incidentally, since Postponed may line up for the Belmont S., we can note that he is also bred on the reverse cross to GI Kentucky Derby and GI Belmont S. winner Thunder Gulch. Postponed is by a son of Storm Bird out of a mare by Gulch, and Thunder Gulch is by Gulch out of a Storm Bird mare. Storm Bird carries a cross of the St. Leger (English equivalent of the Belmont S.) winner Precipitation, and he is a three-parts genetic relative to Jury, the third dam of Gulch's maternal grandsire Rambunctious. Oddly enough, Precipitation and/or his half brother Persian Gulf, turn up in Thunder Gulch, G1 1000 Guineas winner Harayir, and GI Super Derby victor Wallenda--three of Gulch's best runners.

PEDIGREE SHORTS

Few stallions have achieved so much from so little as Saint Ballado. When Yankee Victor (c, 4, Saint Ballado--Highest Carol, by Caro {Ire}) carried off the GI Metropolitan H., he was following Captain Bodgit and Sister Act as the third Grade I winner to appear from Saint Ballado's first three crops. This trio were all sired at an extremely inexpensive stud fee while Saint Ballado was standing in Florida, and in all, from four crops sired in Florida he now has a total of 20 stakes winners. We have mentioned before that we think *Mahmoud, who appears 4x4 in Saint Ballado's pedigree, is important to how the son of Halo works, and this also appears to be the case here. Yankee Victor has a rather outcrossed pedigree, but we can note that in addition to the double of Mahmoud, Saint Ballado also has a strain of *Royal Charger (granddam Mumtaz Begum is a three-quarters sister to Mahmoud), and a strain of Mirza II, a three-quarters brother to Mahmoud. Highest Carol, the dam of Yankee Victor, has *Nasrullah 4x4x4 in her pedigree, and not only is Nasrullah out of Mumtaz Begum, but he is also a three-quarters brother to Royal Charger, so there is a very intense concentration of Mumtaz Begum/Mahmoud/Mirza II.

As a stallion who is out of a Raise a Native mare, one might have thought that Meadowlake would have appreciated mares carrying Raise a Native. That hasn't generally been the case, however, and until recently, only three of his unrestricted stakes winners have owned Raise a Native inbreeding. However, he now has a very smart runner bred on that formula in the shape of Luftikus (c, 3, Meadowlake--Andora, by Conquistador Cielo), who took the GIII Lone Star Park H. Luftikus is out of a mare by Raise a Native's grandson Conquistador Cielo, a formula which gives Raise a Native 3x4.

Initially regarded as a "filly sire," Rahy has been refuting that reputation through such male group/graded stakes winners as Hawksley Hill, Fantastic Light, City on a Hill, Raphane, Tokio Perfect, Hurrahy, Howbaddouwantit, and now Super Red (c, 4, Rahy--Regal Victress, by Diamond Prospect), who earned that status with a win in the GII Connaught Cup. Super Red is one of the slew of Rahy stakes winners inbred to Almahmoud via Rahy's maternal grandsire Halo and Northern Dancer. He also has another interesting twist to his pedigree as he has the brother and sister, Swaps and Track Medal, 6x5.

Cari Jill Haji is not one of the world's better known stallions, but he has a very smart sprinter in Peach Flat (c, 6, Cari Jill Haji--Unsaddled, by Pancho Villa), winner of the GIII American H. A descendent of the *Blenheim II via Wyndham, Windy City II, City Line and Cari County, Cari Jill Hajji did capture the black type John Peri S. at two, an age at which he also finished fourth in the GIII California Juvenile S. Peach Flat, his only unrestricted stakes winner to date, has a rather intriguing pedigree. Cari Jill Hajji's second dam is by Nasco, a stakes-winning three-quarters brother to Bold Ruler, and Peach Flat is out of a mare inbred 3x4 to Bold Ruler.

FROM THE DESK OF...

DESERT STYLE AND OTHER 'F97'

Last weekend's Irish 2000 Guineas told us two things. The first is that Desert Style, who sired the 1-3 in Bachir and Cape Town, looks a whole lot better sire than he was a racehorse (a boost for his own persistently underrated sire--in my opinion--Green Desert). At that job he won three six to seven-furlong Group 3 races in Ireland. The second thing is that China Visit is a 'mortal' in the St. James's Palace S. at Ascot in three weeks' time--or, should I say, Frankie Dettori's Selected is a mortal. China Visit had Bachir's measure a furlong out in the nine furlong UAE Derby back in March. Considering that Bachir is a dual Guineas winner since and the only other three-year-old better than Bachir so far (King's Best) goes for the Derby and that Bachir's greatest virtue is that he is a totally reliable standard. If Frankie rides China Visit, that's my banker for the day.

There were a few other Euro sires whose first three-year-olds are racing this year (I call them 'F97s--first foals 1997--for short) who have had good weeks, as well as Desert Style. The high-class 1994 two-year-old Sri Pekan (by Red Ransom), who was Europe's leading freshman sire of 1999, had two good-class seven-furlong winners: Blu Air Force, who had been trained in Italy last year but was fairly recently bought by Daniel Wildenstein, beat a good group of 'olders' in the G3 Pr du Palais-Royale at Maison-Lafitte; and Camberley, in England, won a £50,000 handicap at Goodwood.

The week before last Holding Court, from the first crop by Hernando and trained in England by Michael Jarvis, shipped to France and won a G3 Derby prep. I haven't seen yet which Derby he goes for. Unfortunately, Henry Cecil's charge, Bien Entendu, one-for-one lifetime, now misses the Epsom Derby, but he, too, looks a high-quality colt from Hernando's first crop. So that makes two, which makes us analysts sit up and take notice.

Song Song Green...

Green Tune was the 1994 French 2000 winner, and is by Green Dancer--therefore from the Nijinsky branch of the Northern Dancer line, like Hernando and Lammtarra (has Godolphin's Oaks hope, Melikah, in his only British crop). Green Tune had a good week in France, including 2100m Listed SW Bleu d'Altair, one-mile Listed SP Russian Tune, and another one-mile conditions race winner in the filly Vencora.

Fraam: The Big Sleeper...

But the real sleeper of the bunch is Fraam. A tough miler who was basically a high-class handicapper, he won one Listed race, and placed in five other stakes, racing through the age of six. He's by Lead On Time, a son of Nureyev who started in France and has ended up in Germany, but is a full brother to Great Commotion, who would be one of the best sires in Europe if his fertility was better. Anyway, Fraam has understandably been out in the stallion wilderness, but he's about to get a little better known. His first three crops had 23-14-9 foals; but 18 of the 23 in his first crop have already started, and at least eight have won, including three or four who are trying to be useful. OK, he's not a commercial proposition--yet--but for a small breeder with limited resources, he looks good value.

The Freshman Class...

We're starting to see the first signs of freshman sires (first crop 1998, or F98) rising to the surface. The 1996 Breeders' Cup Sprint winner Lit de Justice has three winners, including Our Magistrate, second in a stakes at Hollywood Park Monday; and Certain Justice, currently Britain's highest-rated two-year-old and sure to be among the favorites for the prestigious Coventry S. at Royal Ascot later this month. 1996 Met Mile winner Honour and Glory notched up his fourth winner last weekend (Ashford stablemate Hennessy had his second); and 1996 NYRA Mile winner Gold Fever had a right result. Gold Mover, the only filly in the field, scored a big win in the GIII Kentucky Breeders' Cup over 5 1/2f, defeating the 1-2 favorite Unbridled Time, from Unbridled's Song first crop and already a stakes winner, who was six lengths back in third. I'd call this a big result, too, for Gold Fever's sire, Forty Niner, who had started promisingly as a sire of sires with End Sweep.

From the French Front...

Two French stallions from opposite ends of the commercial spectrum have had their first winners. Anabaa, an absolutely top-class sprinter and by Danzig out of the top-class Balbonella, had an impressive winner yesterday under the tutelage of Freddy Head. And if you thought Fraam was obscure, how about Crack Regiment? Now appearing on your screens, possibly for the first time, Crack Regiment won only three of his 44 career starts, and is the sire of three foals in his first crop. Two have already started, and one is a dual winner. This is the filly Crackchope, who won a hot 1100m 'winners' (condition) race at Chantilly last Saturday, leaving impressive previous winners by Kingmambo and Halling, among others, in her wake. Crack Regiment, by the way, is by El Gran Senor out of the speedball Ancient Regime, a full sister to speedball and speedball sire Cricket Ball, they by Olden Times out of a mare by Palestine. Crack Regiment won the G3 Prix Eclipse as a two-year-old, and placed in eight other stakes (four graded) in France...see, this is why we rightly say, It Takes All Kinds, and If Only We Knew Beforehand.

Winners also for Irish freshman sires Charnwood Forest (his second, both looking pretty decent) and General Monash (his seventh, putting him in the Mind Games bracket); and the top 1996 three-year-old miler Ashkalani had a stakes-placed filly in Italy. Yes, that does count.

As a broodmare, Kittiwake's most important offspring included six-time Grade I winner and millionaire Miss Oceana (Alydar) and MGSW Larida (Northern Dancer), herself the dam of European Group 1 winner Magic of Life. Purchased for \$3.8 million at the Newgate dispersal in 1985, Kittiwake dropped five foals for Lazy Lane, including G1 Prix Jean Prat hero Kitwood (Nureyev), who now stands at stud in Argentina. The Virginia broodmare of the year in 1983 and 1984, she produced her last foal in 1992. The mare was pensioned at Lazy Lane Farm at the time of her death.

"Freddie Head worked him this morning and was very happy with him. The British Horseracing Board, who in league with racecourses has been expanding the number of divided races over the recent past, yesterday announced the granting of an annual sum of £650,000 from the Levy Board to help fund these races. Surcharges on entry fees, the old method of raising money to fund these races, is to cease on June 15. Paul Greeves, BHB's Racing Director, said: "Levy Board funding for divided races is good news for owners. These extra races do generate levy income, so there has always been a case for central funding. We will of course continue to be as flexible as possible when deciding how many races which attract large fields can reasonably be divided as we know how frustrating it is to be denied a run. However, funding, as ever, is limited and ground must be protected."
