MASSCAP REMATCH AT SUFFOLK

The top two finishers from last year's edition could line up at opposite ends of the starting gate for Saturday's GII Massachusetts H. at Suffolk Downs in East Boston, Behrens (Pleasant Colony), who caught looseon-the lead Running Stag (Cozzene) in the shadow of the wire a year ago, is the highweight and morning-line 8-5 favorite, should he make it to the post. Trainer H. James Bond wanted to work the six-year-old three eighths of a mile yesterday at Saratoga, but was forced to postpone the work when some heat was detected in his left front hoof. He will try to breeze the dark bay this morning, but cautioned that if he is unable to get a work into Behrens, "it's very doubtful he will run," Bond said. The conditioner has also entered stablemate Pleasant Breeze (Pleasant Tap), a solid second to Golden Missile in the GI Pimlico Special May 13. Stable jockey Jorge Chavez is named on both runners. Running Stag is in the midst of a very ambitious and brief stay in the U.S. The easy winner of a Belmont money allowance May 24, trainer Philip Mitchell also wants to run the six-yearold in the GII Brooklyn H. at Belmont a week from Sunday. The globetrotter breaks from the nine hole as the 5-2 second choice. "I can't believe you've got me in the far outside post," mused Mitchell. "That's about 50 yards from first base at Fenway Park." Running Stag will carry 116 pounds with John Velazquez replacing Shane Sellers in the irons. Out Of Mind (Sestero {Brz}) ships in from the left coast for Dick Mandella off a 1/2length victory in the May 13 GII Mervyn LeRoy H. A champion at two in Brazil, the five-year-old is the 9-2 third choice on the morning line and will carry 114 under Eddie Delahoussaye. Vision and Verse (Storm Cat) breezed four furlongs yesterday in :48 2/5 at Belmont Park.

Unshaded Officially Out of Belmont:

GII Peter Pan runner up Unshaded (Unbridled) has been officially removed from consideration for the June 10 Belmont S., according to trainer Carl Nafzger. The winner of the GII Coolmore Lexington two starts back will return to Nafzger's base at Churchill Downs this morning with an eye on the June 10 GIII Round Table S. at Arlington as a steppingstone for his major goal of the summer, the GI Travers at Saratoga Aug. 26. Owner James Tafel would have had to supplement the gelding to the third leg of the Triple Crown for \$100,000, but that was not a factor in the decision, Nafzger said. "It takes a real experienced, focused colt to run in the Belmont and I don't know if he's quite that mature yest. It takes a real focused horse to go a mile and a half."

Wheelaway Works:

Wheelaway (Unbridled), fifth in the Kentucky Derby, worked seven furlongs over Belmont's main track yesterday in 1:24. The colt galloped out the mile in 1:38. "I couldn't ask for him to work any better than that," said trainer John Kimmel. "He's certainly not exhausted, so it looks like his fitness is where it needs to be."

Commendable on the Belmont Fence:

Commendable (Gone West) worked a half mile in :48 1/5 at Churchill Downs yesterday. The D. Wayne Lukas trainee is 50/50 for the June 10 Gl Belmont S. "It was a good maintentance work," Lukas said. "We're still looking at the Belmont."

CORRECTION: Yesterday's Bill Oppenheim column incorrectly identified the stallion Crack Regiment (El Gran Senor) as a freshman sire of 2000. In fact, Crack Regiment had two foals of 1997 as well as three foals of 1998. Of his three-year-olds, the filly Tualyssima has won twice and was second in a one-mile handicap at Chantilly on Tuesday. All three of his two-year-olds have started and both of his two-year-old winners have won two races each.

Considering the relatively small size of Germany's thoroughbred industry, German breeders are to be congratulated on establishing several very successful young stallions, such as Lomitas, Goofalik, Monsun and Sternkonig, over the last few years.

Lomitas made a spectacular start, with last year's winners of the German 2,000 Guineas and Derby in his first crop, and Goofalik came up with an Italian G1 winner in two of his first three crops, including the 1999 Oaks d'Italia winner Nagoya. This year has seen Monsun and Sternkonig waste no time in establishing themselves as classic forces. Monsun, who impressively took the title of Germany's leading first-crop sire last year, did well in the recent Oaks d'Italia, when his daughter Well Minded finished a close third. Now Gestut Rottgen's Sternkonig has come up with the impressive Derby Italiano winner Kallisto, who is one of three stakes winners from Sternkonig's first crop.

The success of these stallions provides a warning to breeders elsewhere of the dangers of dismissing high-class racehorses on the grounds of fashion. For example, I suspect that breeders in England and Ireland would have treated Lomitas and Sternkonig with scant respect. For a start, Lomitas was by Niniski, a stallion whose reputation as a sire of sires had been badly dented by the failures of his major winners Petoski and Minster Son, and Sternkonig is by Kalaglow, who was largely disappointing as a stallion in England.

All horses in the International *TDN* were bred in North America unless otherwise indicated.

The fact that Lomitas gained his three G1 wins over 1½ miles would also have done little to endear him to many commercial breeders in Britain and Ireland, and Sternkonig's prospects would have been blighted by his failure to win at two and, paradoxically, by his win in the 1¾-mile Premio Roma Vecchia.

However, breeders in Germany's smaller industry cannot afford the luxury of such prejudices. They knew that Lomitas and Sternkonig had been very successful under German conditions and they also knew that neither of these G1 winners lacked speed. Lomitas had won his first three races at around a mile and later scored over nine furlongs at Saratoga, while Sternkonig set a German record when he covered 2,400 metres in 2:25.38 to win the G1 Grossen Deutschland-Preis in 1994, when his opponents included Monsun and the future Japan Cup winner Lando. Incidentally, the first crop by Lando includes Paolini, who filled third place in the Derby Italiano.

Gestut Rottgen's faith in Sternkonig was no doubt reinforced by the bottom line of his pedigree. His second dam, Sternwacht, was a half-sister to Star Appeal, the exceptional German horse who in 1975 launched successful raids on G1 events in England, Italy and France, where he ran out a three-length winner of the Arc. Sternkonig wasn't quite in that class, but his very progressive son Kallisto appears to have considerable potential. Kallisto must have a good chance now of helping his sire match Lomitas' feat of siring the Deutsches Derby winner in his first crop.

AN UNSUNG PIONEER FINDS A NEW PASSION by Bill Finley

Kathy Kusner is not a crusader, she says, taking a momentary break from her latest crusade.

It was 32 years ago when Kusner fought the system to become the first female to be licensed to ride in recognized flat races. Today, the 60-year-old, still pained by the racial discrimination she saw while growing up in the South, is battling to give inner-city African American kids a better life. Shy and self-effacing, she can say what she wants. She champions good causes, then and now.

Just ask any of the kids who have taken part in her project, Horses in the Hood, a non-profit organization that gives underprivileged kids in the Watts section of Los Angeles a chance to get some fresh air while riding and bonding with horses. Or ask Julie Krone, or any other female jockey aware of the struggles Kusner had to put up with to break into the sport and pave the way for generations of women to come.

"She's a remarkable and accomplished woman with a kind heart," Krone said. "I am so grateful for evervthing she did for me and so many other female riders."

Of course that didn't matter to the stuffed shirts at the Maryland Racing Commission in 1968 when Kusner applied for a jockey's license. She was already an accomplished horsewoman, having just been part of the United States Equestrian Team that finished fourth at the Olympic Games in Mexico City.

But women, supposedly too weak to handle a headstrong, powerful Thoroughbred, were for all practical purposes banned from being jockeys. Some would ride in "Powder Puff Derbies," gimmicky non-betting races held from time to time at tracks or at hunt meets. Years earlier, a woman named Judy Johnson rode in a few steeplechase races at Pimlico during World War II, while so many male jockeys were overseas in combat.

Amazingly, even Johnson wasn't on her side.

"I really believe her best shot is to ride in steeplechase races, like I did," Johnson said. "On the flat, she would find it very tough."

The stewards agreed, twice denying Kusner's application to become a jockey. They ruled: "We find from the evidence that the applicant lacks sufficient strength to control a mount and for this reason would create hazardous racing conditions for other jockeys if application were granted."

To Kusner, the ruling was not just nonsense, it was unacceptable and obvious discrimination. She took her case to the courts, where it was ruled that a racing commission could not deny someone a license based solely on their sex.

"I was already 28 then and past the age when I could get an apprentice weight allowance," she said. "I knew that the chance to be a jockey was going to pass me by if I didn't do something. I knew the whole thing was going to be a pain in the neck, but I decided it was something I really wanted to do."

Typically, she says it was no big deal.

"I don't hear much from other female jockeys but there's no reason to," she said. "It's not necessary and that's not the reason I did it. It's not like it was winning the right to vote or getting civil rights amendments passed. Those are important issues, a lot more important than a girl getting a license to be a jockey. I was just doing something I was interested in doing."

Though the first female to hold a jockey's license, Kusner was not the first to ride in a flat race. That honor goes to Diane Crump, who was able to get her license thanks to Kusner's court victory. Kusner's jockey career was temporarily put on hold when she broke her leg in a spill at the National Horse Show at Madison Square Garden. She was sidelined about eight months before getting a chance to ride in a race.

Kusner accepted her first mount in 1969, winning one race that year from 13 tries. Though she had broken down the doors, women riders never quite gained acceptance in that era. Kusner retired in the mid-1970's after winning only a handful of races.

Her off-racetrack career has been filled with still more highlights and firsts. With the U.S. Equestrian Team, she won a silver medal in the 1972 Olympics at Munich. A year later, she got her license to fly Learjets and was reportedly the only women to hold such a license at the time. In the ensuing years, she's run in several marathons and ultra marathons, given riding clinics and has been used in court cases as an expert witness in matters involving equine issues.

But it is Horses in the Hood that puts the spring in her step these days. She founded the program after an African American friend questioned her as to why there were so few blacks in the horse show world. The question brought back some unpleasant memories.

"I grew up in Virginia in the 1950s and I saw segregation firsthand," Kusner said. "The grooms with the show horses or race horses were all black and they couldn't even go into restaurants with the rest of us. In the show world, they couldn't show a horse with the rest of us. It was something that was so seriously unfair. These were realities that made quite a powerful impression on me."

Back then, she wanted to tell her black friends how sorry she was. But she's done something better by devoting a large part of her life to doing something positive for African American children.

Children involved with the program go to a horsey day camp for a five-day stretch. Their tuition is paid by "Horses in the Hood," which also buys them a pair of paddock boots. They ride, they learn to brush a horse, put on tack and are responsible for cleaning out the stalls. The idea is to show them there is something else out there besides the mean streets of Watts.

"The kids seem to love it," Kusner said. "All the reactions I have gotten have been very positive."

Yet the day camp is not enough for Kusner. Her dream is to build an equestrian center smack in the middle of Watts, so that the kids don't have to be shuttled out of their own neighborhood to ride and can do more than go five days to a day camp. She has her sights set on five acres in Watts, but needs funding to raise the \$2 million it will take to buy it.

Knowing Kusner, it will be done. Though still a bit shy, she faces each task with dogged perseverance and gets what she wants. Don't all crusaders?

BROOKSIDE SALE FINALIZED The sale of Brookside Farms to Gerald A. Ford has been completed and the farm will now be known as Diamond A Farm. Ford, who operates Diamond A Stables, announced in April that he was purchasing an 815-acre tract of the Brookside property which includes the stallion barn, main residence and guest houses as well as a training barn. The stallions Jade Hunter and Theatrical (Ire), who stood at Brookside for Allen and Madeleine Paulson, were not included in the transaction, but will remain at the farm. Mrs. Paulson told *Thoroughbred Times Online* that in addition to the stallions, 70 broodmares, 70 yearlings and 30 broodmares will remain at the farm.

CECIL DUO WORKS FOR DERBY

Henry Cecil's G1 Epsom Derby hopes Beat Hollow (GB) (Sadler's Wells {USA}) and Wellbeing (GB) (Sadler's Wells {USA}) worked as planned yesterday at Yarmouth racecourse between races, and reactions differed over the impressions they left. Galloped over 11 furlongs, they were led by Sandmason (GB) (Grand Lodge {USA}) until Wellbeing took over as the pace increased with three furlongs remaining. Beat Hollow, sitting in last early, had all the answers as he breezed upsides a furlong later under Richard Quinn, before easing into a comfortable lead at the end of the work. Cecil was pleased with what he saw: "They are still green, but they behaved well and this will bring them on--hopefully we can now get them both to Epsom. I think the gallop suited Beat Hollow more than Wellbeing as he does have a better turn of foot--Wellbeing needs a strong gallop to be seen at his best. It is a relief to have worked them. I loved the way they behaved in the paddock. They have been silly and colty before, but that was because they hadn't had the experience." Richard Quinn added: "I was very pleased with Beat Hollow and he was in good order. They are nice types and the gun wasn't put to their heads." Bookmaker reaction was mixed, with the workmanlike Wellbeing being eased to 14-1 from 10-1 with William Hill, who also shortened Beat Hollow to 5-1 from 6-1. Ladbrokes were unmoved by the show, leaving Beat Hollow at 6-1, second favourite behind the G1 2000 Guineas S. winner King's Best (USA) (Kingmambo {USA}), who was cut into 10-3 by William Hill. The 2000 Guineas winner impressed in his work on Newmarket Heath yesterday morning, showing zest by pulling clear of his companion.

LOVE WORKS DIVINELY

The G1 Epsom Derby S. was not the only Classic to see significant moves in the betting market today, as the Oaks saw an ante-post plunge carry Henry Cecil's Listed Lupe S. winner Love Divine (GB) (Diesis {GB}) to 2-1 favouritism from 7-2 with Coral. Her work yesterday morning was of the highest order, as she pulled clear of Corinium (Ire) (Turtle Island {Ire}) and High Walden (USA) (El Gran Senor {USA}). It now looks likely that she will be supplemented for the Classic on Friday. Cecil said yesterday: "Let's hope Love Divine stays right and she should run very well. I am not saying we are going to win, but I think she will run well."

ARENA UNVEILS BONUS SCHEMES

Arena Leisure, owner of Folkestone, Lingfield, Windsor, Southwell and Wolverhampton racecourses, yesterday announced two new bonus schemes which could net winners of designated races £100,000. The Five Star Handicap Bonus will see £100,000 paid to the connections of any three-year-old and upward which wins a handicap, rated 0-70 or higher, at each of Arena's five Flat courses in the six-month period from July 1 to Dec. 31 this year. The Winter Ten Furlong Bonus will be awarded to any horse winning the G3 Winter Hill Stakes at Windsor Aug. 26, the Listed Churchill Stakes at Lingfield Nov. 18, and the Listed Winter Derby again at Lingfield next March, over a 12-month period from this year. These new bonuses are in addition to a bonus scheme already in operation at Windsor, which offers a £50,000 bonus to any two-year-old that wins one of six specified races and follows up by winning a juvenile group race at Royal Ascot.



British Report cont. APPEARANCE MONEY BOOST

The Horserace Betting Levy Board has approved the level and scope of appearance money payments to take effect from July 1 this year, with major increases for an expanded scheme. Thanks to the Levy Board contributing a total of £2,100,000 to the Appearance Money Scheme in 2000, individual payments will rise for runners in Sunday races and three other identified categories of race. Payments in the past have been confined to Sunday racing, but the Levy Board, following recommendations from the British Horseracing Board, is extending them to three types of race which have traditionally attracted smaller fields: Classified Stakes, Conditions Stakes (Class A and B) and Novice Chases (Class A, B and C). The level of payments for runners at Sunday meetings will increase from £160 to £300 per runner, and will come into operation after July 1. The other race types will benefit from £500 per runner, also from July 1. The Levy Board initially allocated £600,000 to the 2000 Appearance Money Scheme and decided to allocate another 1.5 million as a one-off payment at the Annual Strategy Review meeting in March. The Racecourse Association has contributed £42,000 to the Scheme. "The Levy Board is delighted to be able to give the Appearance Money Scheme such a boost in 2000," said Robert Hughes, Levy Board chairman. "The impact of the scheme on the number of runners in the races concerned be will carefully monitored to make sure it is having an effect."

HBLB INITIATE MOVE ON 40TH LEVY

The Horserace Betting Levy Board has requested the Bookmakers' Committee to make recommendations to the Board with respect to the Fortieth Levy Scheme, 2001/02, by early September. This is in order to provide adequate time for detailed discussions prior to the statutory deadline of Oct. 31. The following is contained in the Levy Board's 2000 Policy Statement: "It is the Board's intention to work with the Bookmakers' Committee to secure a levy agreement covering 2001/02 and the period through to the end of the Board's life."

SUNLINE TO STAY HOME

Australian Horse of the Year-elect Sunline (NZ) (Desert Sun {GB}) will target back to back Cox Plate wins in favour of campaigning abroad this spring. Co-trainer Steve McKee says Sunline may still race in the US early next year, but he's ruled out a tilt at the Hong Kong Cup or a trip for the Dubai World Cup. "Sunline is unbeaten in two outings at Moonee Valley and \$2 million in prize money is hard to pass by," he said. The Cox Plate (2040m), with prize money increased from A\$1.8 million last year to A\$2 million this vear, will be held on October 28 as the seventh leg of the world series. News that Sunline, who beat Tie The Knot and Sky Heights when she led throughout to win the Cox Plate last year, is returning had Melbourne racing officials rejoicing. "Sunline is one of the few horses to achieve the rare feat of appealing to people away from racing, and her style of racing--she makes the race herself--and her charisma and looks contribute to that," said racing manager Terry Clifton. "She's great. Not too many horses hold their form from Melbourne spring to Sydney autumn and she's proven herself on the two biggest stages in Australia." Sunline, who has 17 wins from 24 starts for more than A\$4.7 million in earnings, won the G2 Apollo S. before the G1 Coolmore Classic and G1 All Aged S. in Sydney in autumn. But carrying 57.5kg, she was beaten a neck by Over (51.5kg) in her bid for successive Doncaster H. wins.
