DETTORI, COCHRANE SURVIVE PLANE CRASH

Jockeys Frankie Dettori and Ray Cochrane were the survivors of a light airplane crash which yesterday claimed the life of the pilot as it crashed on the Rowley Mile course at Newmarket, England. Although the jockeys were taken to Addenbrookes Hospital in Cambridge, with Dettori suffering from a fractured ankle and injured thumb, and Cochrane from burns to his face and hair, the officer who attended the fire commented that it was a 'miracle' that they had survived the wreckage. The twin-propeller Piper Seneca plane nosedived in Devil's Dyke, the area between the July and Rowley Mile courses, just after taking off on its way to Goodwood racecourse. Five firecrews and 20 firemen engaged to control the fire. Peter Burrell, Dettori's business agent, said, "This is the first accident of this type for a long time--the planes are well-maintained and the pilots are very professional. From what I'm hearing they're both okay, and I'm sure they will bounce back, but all we are thinking about right now is the pilot and his family." Captain Nick Lees, Clerk Of The Course for Newmarket, was at the scene. "I found the jockeys fifty yards from the scene. They were hugging each other, and protecting each other from the smoke. I spoke to them at length and both were conscious. Ray had a burnt face and hair--he was complaining of pain to his head and left hand." Fireman Peter Ludford said, "It's astonishing that anyone has got out of it alive, let alone with apparently fairly minor injuries."

"MILLENNIUM" TOPS ARLINGTON MILLION

Godolphin's Dubai Millennium (GB) (Seeking the Gold), winner of the G1 Dubai World Cup in March, heads a list of 91 international runners nominated to the \$2 million GI Arlington Million, to be run Aug. 19. The powerful Godolphin stable has a total of 11 in the race, including the May 20 G1 Juddmonte Lockinge S. winner Aljabr (Storm Cat) and G3 Dubai Duty Free H. winner Rhythm Band (Cozzene). World traveler Jim and Tonic (Fr) (Double Bed {Fr}), a Group winner in Hong Kong and France and stakes-placed in Canada, England and Singapore; and Japanese stakes winner Matikane Kinnohosi (Seattle Slew) are also on the list. American trainers are represented by turf stars such as Dark Moondancer (GB) (Anshan {GB}), who was a Group 1 winner in France and Italy before shipping to California to win a pair of Grade II races this year; GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic winner Manndar (Ire) (Doyoun {Ire}); Canadian Quiet Resolve (Affirmed), winner of the 1999 GI Atto Mile and 2000 GII Dixie S.; and last Monday's GI Charlie Whittingham H. winner White Heart (GB) (Green Desert).

EXCELLER FARM OPENS

The Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation has opened the TRF Exceller Rehabilitation and Retraining Farm in Poughquag, N.Y., where retired racing Thoroughbreds will be rehabilitated from racetrack injuries and retrained for adoption as pleasure horses by qualifying applicants. The TRF is able to use the farm through the generosity of New York horseman John Hettinger. It comprises 72 acres of picturesque pastures, a farmhouse, and an indoor arena. "This is the first time in 10 years of owning the farm in Poughquag that I feel happy about it," said Hettinger, a New York owner and breeder who operates nearby Akindale Farm. He is the chairman of Grayson-Jockey Club Research Foundation and, with his family, is the principal shareholder of the Fasig-Tipton Corporation. "This is a timely step for TRF, which has begun a concerted effort on track backsides to rescue horses at risk of going to the slaughterhouse," said TRF executive director Diana Pikulski. "At the Exceller Farm, they will be evaluated and treated in preparation for successful second careers." The farm is named for the 1978 Jockey Club Gold Cup winner who was killed in a Swedish slaughterhouse.

BEHRENS OFFICIALLY OUT OF MASSCAP

Trainer H. James Bond confirmed vesterday that handicap star Behrens (Pleasant Colony) will be scratched from Saturday's MassCap due to a stone bruise in his left front foot. "Basically, he galloped a mile and a half and I was just not pleased enough to work him," Bond said. "Unfortunately...there was just too much tenderness there to send him out for his workout. He's just too good, too classy, to take a chance." The bay horse last raced in March, when he finished second in the G1 Dubai World Cup, and may be headed for Saratoga's Whitney (Aug. 6). "We'll regroup and go forward now," Bond added. "The Breeders' Cup is foremost. The Whitnev is also very important. Behrens was beaten a nose twice at Saratoga and we'd very much like to win that race. Races with historic significance are important to me."

MARIANA MAKAROVA FUND Exercise rider Mariana Makarova, who suffered a severe spinal injury during a spill at Belmont Park while working for trainer John Kimmel this spring, was released from the hospital Wednesday. Matt Muzikar, who booked mounts for Eddie King before King was injured in a car accident last fall and was agent for Canadian champion Patrick Husbands at Aqueduct this winter, will handle Bravo's book. "He'll be back Friday evening and start riding Saturday," Muzikar, said. Bravo was the top jock on the Jersey Shore from 1991-1996, and after a New York sojourn led the standings at Monmouth once again last summer. "I guess he's homesick," Muzikar said. The Deputy's Comeback Plans:

Unraced since his 14th-place finish in the Kentucky Derby, The Deputy (Ire) (Petardia {GB}) is being pointed toward the July 23 GI Swaps S. at Hollywood Park and will likely remain on the dirt, reports Barry Irwin, the president of the Team Valor syndicate which owns the horse along with Gary Garber. After the Derby, trainer Jenine Sahadi said The Deputy might come back later this year in grass races. "He went back into training May 24," Irwin said. "We were going to wait a few more days, but he was so full of himself that he got loose one morning. We figured it was time to get back into the swing of things. He's at Santa Anita now, but we'll take him over to Hollywood to see how he handles that surface. If he handles it okay, we'll run him in the Swaps. From there, we'll look at the (Aug. 26) Pacific Classic. We're more inclined to stay on the dirt because that's where the money is." Irwin added that The Deputy was dehydrated a few days before the Kentucky Derby. "We loaded him up on electrolytes, but it didn't do him enough good," he said."The weather did him in. Then the morning after the Derby he had pretty bad skin disease. It's a race we're just going to have to throw out."

The ground may even have been on the fast side of good last time, but he's fairly adaptable, and he can go on soft ground, so if it wasn't any faster than it is now it wouldn't be a concern." Paul Cole has confirmed Glasgow S. fourth-place finisher Mastermind (Ire) (Dolphin Street (Fr)) as a definite runner. Tim Jones, spokesman for Highclere Thoroughbred Racing, said yesterday, "He has improved quite dramatically, physically, since York. He's harder, fitter and his coat has come. Strictly on form its a big ask, but we hope he shows enough improvement to get competitive."

PETRUSHKA BACK IN OAKS PICTURE

Petrushka (Ire) (Unfuwain {USA}), third in the G1 1000 Guineas S. at Newmarket May 7, heads for the G1 Epsom Oaks S. June 9 after pleasing connections in her homework since. She is currently 5-1 with William Hill for the mile-and-a-half Classic behind market leader Love Divine (GB) (Diesis {GB}) and Kalypso Katie (Ire) (Fairy King {USA}). Tim Jones, spokesman for owning syndicate Highclere Thoroughbred Racing, spoke of her yesterday, "She did a very nice piece of work on Wednesday, and has done very well in the last fortnight since Sir Stoute started stepping her up again. All the tests are well and we can't ask for more, but we feel she could do with a week's sunshine, which just might help her blossom further. She is totally relaxed at the moment, and is taking everything in her stride. She is progressing nicely and will just have routine work next week, as her serious work is done. From a blood point of view she looks like a mile-and-a-half filly, but it would be foolhardy not to be concerned about the trip at Epsom."

FAVOURITES HARDEN FOR CLASSICS

Both King's Best (USA) (Kingmambo {USA}) and Love Divine (GB) (Diesis {GB}), favourites for the G1 Epsom Derby and Oaks June 9 and 10, yesterday hardened in the betting for their respective Classics. While Sir Michael Stoute's G1 2000 Guineas S. winner was shortened to 11-4 from 10-3, Henry Cecil's filly was trimmed to 2-1 from 9-4 with William Hill. Cecil's Derby hope Beat Hollow (GB) (Sadler's Wells {USA}), who worked well at Yarmouth racecourse Wednesday, was also cut into 4-1 clear second favouritism, from 5-1, by the same firm.

CRACOW CONFIRMED

There are just nine days to go until the 2000 renewal of the G1 Epsom Derby S., and running plans are now being finalised. An outsider who has been confirmed to take his chance is Cracow (Ire) (Polish Precedent {USA}), who won a maiden at Brighton last Friday. Cracow hails from the Lambourn stable of John Hills, who feels that the Polish Precedent colt will run better than his three-figure odds suggest. "He won very easily the other day at Brighton on terrible ground," said Hills. "He's in good form, will get the trip and will handle the track."

Andrew Cooper, Clerk of the Course at Epsom Race-course, reports the course to be in good shape despite the recent heavy rainfall. He said on Wednesday, "The ground is no worse than good to soft at the moment and not far from good. We have had a lot of rain, but the course has taken it very well. The next 48 hours are forecast to be potentially showery but after that we are due to have a warmer, drier period and some sunshine. Our intention remains to produce ground no faster than good for the meeting."
