DANEHILL FILLY TOPS WEANLING FINALE

The weanling section of the four-day Inglis Weanling and Broodmare Sale concluded yesterday with a A\$220,000 Danehill filly topping the 19 lots offered. The gray was part of the dispersal of Australian Commercial Industries, and was one of eight purchased by New Zealand Bloodstock. Overall, weanlings averaged A\$23,275 for 252 sold, grossing A\$5,865,300. Top price for yesterday's broodmare section was A\$440,000 for the 12-year-old Zedagal (Aus), a full sister to multiple Group 1 winner and successful sire Zeditave (Aus); the stallion's two-year-old Assertive Lad (Aus) is likely to win juvenile honours this season. Consigned by Newhaven Park Stud Ltd., Zedegal, in foal to Marauding (NZ), was purchased by Magic Millions. A total of 183 broodmares sold for A\$11,006,250, an average of A\$60,143. There were 272 catalogued, 21 withdrawn and 69 passed in. The second broodmare session will be held today. Drama preceded yesterday's bidding when a fatal shooting occurred within metres of the sale complex. One studmaster revealed he had bullet holes in a stable wall after police shot dead a man who had escaped from a nearby hospital into a laundromat around the corner from the Newmarket complex.

Unshaded Bound for Belmont:

Trainer Carl Nafzger said yesterday that Unshaded (Unbridled), third in the GII Peter Pan S. last time out, will now return to New York for Saturday's GI Belmont S. Owner James Tafel will have to pay a \$100,000 supplementary fee to run in the 1 1/2-mile "Test of the Champion." Nafzger made the decision after Kentucky Derby winner Fusaichi Pegasus was declared from the race, but also after his gelding worked a sharp five furlongs in 1:00 at Churchill Downs yesterday morning with jockey Shane Sellers aboard. "I have been skirting the issue of hooking good horses until this horse got his act together," Nafzger said. "The horse responded real good to Shane this morning, mentally and physically, and I said now is the time to go hook 'em. I've been waiting until he told me he was ready to do it, and I feel that he told me this morning that's he's ready. I know it's two plane trips [in a week], but he has never missed an oat and I think it's time to test him." Unshaded will fly back to New York this morning.

Breezing for the Belmont:

Impeachment (Deputy Minister), third in both the Kentucky Derby and the Preakness, worked five furlongs in 1:01 4/5 over the Belmont main track yesterday. "He looked good and he's where I want him for the race," trainer Todd Pletcher said. "He has run hard in the Derby and the Preakness, but he has held his weight well. The way he runs, it seems like a mile and a half would be to his liking." Also having his final Belmont prep yesterday, Wheelaway (Unbridled) went a half mile in :48 4/5 and galloped out five furlongs in 1:01. "That was just what we were looking for," trainer John Kimmel said. Commendable (Gone West), a longshot from the D. Wayne Lukas stable, went six furlongs in 1:13 4/5 at Churchill Downs. He is scheduled to fly to New York this morning.

This performance confirmed Rudi's Pet's status as a true speedster and proved his affinity for the five-furlong dashes. Last year he made the transition from handicap company to pattern company, taking the G3 King George S. at Goodwood in July, before running a creditable sixth in the Listed Hong Kong Sprint at Sha Tin in December. He appears to have trained on every bit as fast as he was, producing a trail-blazing performance to take this in his seasonal return. Quick away from the gate, Rudi's Pet only had Carhue Lass (Ire) (Common Grounds {GB}) for company on the rail after a furlong of racing and he soon swept her aside with his superior speed to take over with three furlongs remaining. As Cassandra Go emerged from the chasing pack, Rudi's Pet looked as if he might be caught, but he kept pulling out more to hold on despite drifting slightly left under strong riding. The winner now heads for the G2 King's Stand S. at Royal Ascot June 20, to be run over the same trip.

With only a quarter to go, the five-year-old found a hole, went to the front around the final turn and went on to an easy four-length victory under jockey Hideaki Miyuki. "All I was concerned about was the start. We were able get a clear run in the stretch," Miyuki said. "I was impressed with his performance."

Not so long ago, the Nijinsky branch of Northern Dancer's male line appeared to be under threat in Europe. Royal Academy had been relocated to Kentucky and his transfer was quickly followed by the death of Caerleon, Nijinsky's most successful stallion son.

What could possibly take their place? The main candidates appeared to be Nijinsky's classic-winning grandsons Kahyasi, Suave Dancer, Green Tune and Hernando, but Kahyasi has rarely enjoyed the support he deserves and Suave Dancer's popularity had plummeted by the time of his premature death. So could Green Dancer's son Green Tune and Niniski's son Hernando reverse the trend with their first three-year-olds this year?

Hernando certainly had plenty to recommend him. Sound enough to race 20 times, he ran out a smooth winner of the Prix du Jockey-Club in 1993, when he also started favorite for the Arc--a race he very nearly won the following year.

His other attractions included an impressive turn of foot and an interesting pedigree. Not only is he inbred 3x4 to Northern Dancer, but he is out of Whakilyric, a Grade I performer inbred 3x3 to Buckpasser.

The main worry about using the untried Hernando was the failure as stallions of Petoski and Minster Son, two other major winners by Niniski. Admittedly the St. Leger winner Minster Son did not receive much help from mare owners, but Petoski's failure was pretty comprehensive. These fears were partly dispelled by the tremendous success enjoyed by the first crop by another of Niniski's best sons, the German-based Lomitas, and now Hernando's own first crop has removed any lingering doubts.

Bien Entendu, a colt who briefly headed the betting for the Epsom Derby, is by the Lanwades Stud stallion and so is Holding Court, who followed his sire's example by turning the Prix du Jockey-Club into a one-horse race.

Perhaps the most interesting aspect of Holding Court's pedigree is that he is inbred 4x5x3 to Northern Dancer, the extra line coming through Be My Guest, the sire of Holding Court's dam Indian Love Song.

This mare should provide inspiration and hope to small breeders everywhere. Her record of 33 starts and no wins during four years in training gives some idea of her mediocrity, but I should point out in Indian Love Song's defense that she found only one too good for her on seven occasions and was beaten only a half length three times.

Despite her luckless record on the track, Indian Love Song now has the proud record of having produced two Group 1 winners to stallions standing at less than £10,000, the first being Efisio's fast son Tomba, winner of the seven-furlong Prix de la Foret in 1998.

While success on this scale is a surprise in light of her performances, Indian Love Song's pedigree gave her every right to succeed as a broodmare.

She was born in 1983, a year when Be My Guest commanded a fee of IR75,000gns. This fee reflected Be My Guest's achievement of becoming champion sire in 1982, when the Classic winners Assert and On The House emerged from his first crop of three-year-olds. Coincidentally, Assert recorded the first of his four stunning Group 1 victories in the Prix du Jockey-Club and he possessed the same ability to gallop his rivals into submission that Holding Court displayed two days ago.

Holding Court's third dam, Maina, was another relentless galloper. She led throughout to win the Lingfield Oaks Trial and Lancashire Oaks and only her stablemate Altesse Royale managed to catch her in the 1971 Epsom Oaks. Maina's prospects as a broodmare looked rosy as her second dam, Iroquoise, was a half sister to Imprudence, winner of the 1000 Guineas and Oaks in England and of the 1000 Guineas in France.

Sadly, Maina produced only three foals, but both her daughters were winners, including Holding Court's second dam Indian Bird, who stayed at least two miles.

TRAINER EDWIN GREGSON DEAD Eddie Gregson, the trainer who saddled longshot Gato Del Sol to win the Kentucky Derby in 1982, died of an apparent self-inflicted gunshot wound Sunday night at his office in South Pasedena, California. Police are treating Gregson's death as a suicide, pending an investigation, and a spokesman for the South Pasadena police said that no foul play is suspected. The spokesman said that Gregson left several farewell notes to family members. "I'm totally shocked," said horse owner Trudy McCaffery, one of the last people to see Gregson alive. McCaffery accompanied the trainer and his wife Gail back to the barn after Gregson's filly Street Cat finished seventh in Sunday's sixth race at Hollywood Park. "After we checked the horse out, Eddie drove Gail and me to their home in South Pasadena," McCaffery said. "I had left my car there before going to the races. After a while--it must have been between 5 and 6 o'clock-- Eddie excused himself and said he was going to his office, which is only about a mile away. It's not unusual for him to do that." A little later, McCaffery left Gail Gregson and drove home. Sometime after 9 p.m., John Toffan, McCaffery's partner, received word by phone that Eddie Gregson was dead. "When he told me, I couldn't believe it," McCaffery said. "Gail will need us and every friend she has to get through this." Gregson, whose family developed Westwood Village, the upscale area where UCLA is located, was said to be wealthy and occasionally remarked that he didn't need to train horses to support his family. He had a barn of 17 horses at Santa Anita at the time of his death. Once an actor who appeared briefly in one film, The Naked and the Dead, Gregson sought a life at the track and one of his early jobs was working as a groom for trainer Woody Stephens at Saratoga. Gregson took out his trainer's license in 1969. The highlight of his 30-year career was his '82 Derby win. Gato Del Sol had won the Del Mar Futurity in 1981, but he went into the Kentucky Derby on a seven-race losing streak and went off at 21-1. Breaking from post No. 18 in the 19-horse field, the son of Cougar II came from last place under Eddie Delahoussaye to win by 2 1/2 lengths. Gregson's other important horses included Super Diamond, who was the third-leading California-bred earner when he retired in 1987, Tsunami Slew and Royal Chariot, who won the Hollywood Turf Cup in 1995. Gregson is survived by his wife and twin adult daughters, Brooke and Esme. Funeral arrangements are incomplete.

IN MY OPINION...

NTRA...You're learning! In a tone of refreshing candor and honesty Tim Smith, the National Throughbred Racing Association commissioner, took full responsibility for last year's 1-percent buyer surcharge fiasco, admitting, "we messed up, we need to listen more and communicate better."

He is right, of course. The NTRA, especially in the early years, must earn respect. The revolt that ensued after the attempted 1-percent buyers surcharge changed the NTRA momentum. The honeymoon was over, the reality of funding threw a cold chill on the warm and fuzzy that initially surrounded the NTRA. The compromise position, a measly one-tenth of one percent on a voluntary basis, saved a little face for the NTRA, but generated nominal monies. The compromise contributed to a budget shortfall, and an inevitable scale back of programs and positions in the NTRA.

Since then, Tim Smith has undertaken serious damage control and, because of NTRA accomplishments on other fronts, has recaptured some of that lost momentum.

The lingering question of funding still needs to be addressed. There are many parts to that question, one of which is the surcharge. Fortunately for all concerned, it is clear the NTRA learned from their experience and is approaching this issue in an open, all-inclusive, forthright manner.

The NTRA is now approaching the traditional 'heavy hitters' in advance, soliciting their advice on matters of fairness and equity. The NTRA also pulled together a large, broad-based, regionally diverse Advisory Committee, whose primary purpose is to generate reasonable and fair funding mechanisms. This group made some key and creative suggestions. For example: 1) Tie the money to specific projects where need is obvious from any point of view; 2) Spread the burden to more segments of the sales process (seller/buyer/sales co.); 3) Keep the burden manageable (i.e. a quarter of one percent); 4) Keep it voluntary.

Last week the NTRA board accepted the Advisory Committee's funding recommendations in full, and the NTRA is now engaged in smoothing out the mechanics of implementation. Whether this time-consuming conscientious process results in a funding program that is accepted and supported by a sufficient number of participants to make a big difference remains to be seen.

It's understandable that everyone thinks the other guy should pay, yet most recognize that NTRA funding has to come from somewhere. Indeed, the NTRA made it perfectly clear at the outset that, at least in these initial years, the funding needs to come from the industry. To that initial representation the NTRA has wisely added--on a fair and equitable basis, as best determined by the industry.

Not everybody will be happy. The cynics will surely get in their two cents and probably disproportionately so, but no one can fairly charge the NTRA for being autocratic or capricious this time around. They have made a good faith effort to listen, engage and act fairly.

The NTRA is a work in progress. We all need to recognize this, and at least this time, on this issue, we should give credit where it belongs. Tim Smith learned from a mistake. The NTRA is back on track.

20 LEFT IN DERBY

20 horses stood their ground for the G1 Epsom Derby S. at yesterday's five-day stage. The only notable absentee is Gerard Butler's Saddler's Quest (GB) (Saddler's Hall {Ire}). The colt has suffered a recurrence of an old injury, leaving his trainer hugely disappointed. "It is not too serious but it is very frustrating, especially for the colt's owners. Ever since we've had him we've been thinking of the Epsom Derby," Butler said. The dream is still alive for favourite King's Best (USA) (Kingmambo {USA}), who hardened yesterday to 11-4 from 3-1, and Beat Hollow (GB) (Sadler's Wells {USA}), close behind in the betting at 10-3 with William Hill.
