KEENELAND CATALOGS 208

Keeneland has cataloged 208 horses for its July selected yearling sale to be held July 17 and 18 in Lexington, Kentucky. The late Mr. Prospector will be represented by five colts and three fillies at the auction. Other sires represented by yearlings in the sale are A.P. Indy, Danzig, Deputy Minister, Nureyev, Sadler's Wells, Seattle Slew and Unbridled. Stallions who will have their first crop of yearlings go through the Keeneland sale's ring are Atticus, Boston Harbor, Pulpit, Siphon (Brz), and Spinning World. Sessions for the two-day sale will begin at 7:30 p.m. on Monday and at 1:30 and 7:30 p.m. ET on Tuesday.

WALDEN DISPERSAL AT TATTERSALLS

The decision to sell colts from the Late Lord Howard de Walden's Plantation Stud will see a Sadler's Wells half brother to leading European sire Grand Lodge at the Tattersalls Houghton Yearling Sale in September. The colt, one of seven to be sold from the Stud, will be consigned by Bloomsbury Stud, and he is sure to attract significant interest after Grand Lodge's son Sinndar (Ire), won Saturday's G1 Epsom Derby. Tattersalls Chairman Edmond Mahony said, "He is a very exciting prospect for all concerned and we are delighted to be handling the sale of not only the Sadler's Wells colt out of La Papagegna, but also the other six quality colts on behalf of the Executors of the Late Lord Howard de Walden." Leslie Harrison, stud and racing manager for Lady Howard de Walden, said, "This will be the first time that we have ever sold yearlings on a commercial basis and in many ways it is sad to do so, but we have seven very smart colts to offer." The Sadler's Wells colt will be the stud's only Houghton offering. The other six colts will sell at the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale. The other six yearlings, by Grand Lodge, Kris, Selkirk, Spectrum (Ire), Baryshnikov (Aus) and Octagonal (NZ), will also be prepared by Bloomsbury Stud.

THREE-PEAT FOR TUMBLEWEED

Leopardstown Racecourse may find that they now want to rename it 'The Tumbleweed Ridge (Indian Ridge {Ire}) Ballycorus S.,' after the seven-year-old took the third consecutive running of the Group 3 race yesterday. He is a seven-furlong specialist, but he is also a Ballycorus S. specialist, having defeated Wizard King (GB) and Dane River (Ire) in 1998 and 1999 respectively. This time he won by more than double the margin of those two successes put together, showing that, if anything, he is progressing at his ripe age. Breaking well from the stalls, jockey Michael Tebbutt took Tumbleweed Ridge to the fore where he dominated the early stages of the race, with Major Force (Woodman) tracking him in second, and Bashkir (Nureyev) following on the rail in behind Poco a Poco (Imperial Frontier). He gradually increased his advantage, so that by the time he had turned for home, he was a good four lengths clear, with nothing looking dangerous. Ridden with confidence up the straight, he stretched out well to maintain daylight between himself and his closest pursuers. Last year he went on to win the G3 Prix de la Porte-Maillot at Longchamp after this, and that is where he heads again (June 25), with the G1 Prix de la Foret at Longchamp Oct. 15 as the ultimate target.

- 1. Unbridled's Song--Classy, athletic yearlings like their sire. A class act.
- 2. Honour and Glory--Well-balanced, quality horses that look like racehorses.
- 3. Smart Strike--Looked like making two-year-olds. BEST VALUE: Forest Wildcat--At his original stud fee!

ROBERT FIERRO, President, EQUIX Biomechanics

- 1. Honour and Glory--Excellent biomechanical profile, covered large books of high quality mares, great sire family.
- 2. Forest Wildcat--Very good biomechanical profile, likely to be limited to sprinter-milers, wildly popular at sales.
- 3. Lord Carson--Excellent biomechanical profile, offers quality speed and a chance at substance.
 BEST VALUE: Golden Gear--Has the best overall biomechanical profile in the crop, great sire family--excellent chance at being the eventual long-term leader of the crop.

BILL OPPENHEIM, Bloodstock Consultant

- 1. Maria's Mon--Best two-year-old of his year.
- 2. Smart Strike--Best of this group's Mr. Prospector sons.
- 3. Fastness (Ire)--U.S. form was top-class.

ALAN PORTER, Pedigree Research/Owner-Breeder International

- 1. Hennessy--Not a very original choice, but was a very fast, precocious two-year-old; sold well (and to the right people) and has a tremendous numerical advantage.
- 2. Smart Strike--More of a long-term pick. A very good Mr. Prospector from a quality family free of Northern Dancer.
- 3. Honour and Glory/Afternoon Deelites--Honour and Glory was very fast and very brave, and is from Fappiano's family. Afternoon Deelites was another very fast horse, and has a pedigree which lends itself to clever matings.

BEST VALUE: I have always liked **Prospect Bay**, a very fast son of useful sire of sires Crafty Prospector, and from the Grey Flight family.

JACK WERK, Werk Thoroughbred Consultants

- 1. Hennessy--In addition to 115 registered 2yo's, his outstanding pedigree and brilliant juvenile race record make him the standout among the freshman sires of 2000.
- 2. Gold Fever--If milers do make the best sires, then his victory against older horses in the GI NYRA Mile bodes well for this son of Forty Niner who descends from the family of blue-hen Good Example. Even though he has just 34 registered 2yo's, he could give the boys a run for freshman sire honors.
- 3. Honour and Glory--Another miler (won the Met Mile), he is by Relaunch and descends from the family of Fappiano. With 84 registered 2yo's, he should be among the leaders by year's end.

BEST VALUE: Ide--Winner of seven consecutive races, five of them in graded company, in nine lifetime stars, he is a son of Forty Niner out of the multiple stakes-producing Naskra mare Maytide. He is represented by 50 registered 2yo's and, at \$5,000 live foal, is not only a sleeper among the freshman sires of 2000, but also offers great value. *Cont. p. 3*

RECORD PRICE AT OBS JUNE Hip 261, a gray or roan colt by freshman sire Unbridled's Song, brought a sale record price of \$200,000 to top the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's June Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training and Horses of Racing Age, held Tuesday night. Consigned by Murray Smith, the youngster breezed a quarter in :22 and was purchased by Tom McCrocklin on behalf of Bill and Marge Peters' Thunderhead Farms of Des Moines, Iowa. "Overall, it was a good day and a good way to end our two-year-old season," said OBS general manger Tom Ventura. "Now we'll turn our full attention to the yearling sale and get ready for August." The sale also auctioned off five older horses at an average price of \$11,500 and totaling \$57,500.

BHB FOCUS ON FUNDING THE FUTURE

Today will see the Plan for the Future Funding of Racing at the forefront of the presentation made by Peter Savill, chairman of the British Horseracing Board at their Annual General Meeting. Tristam Ricketts, chief executive of the BHB, will start proceedings with a review of the Board's activities since the last AGM, which forms the main part of the Annual Report, published that day. Savill will then deliver his speech, which will provide the answers that the Government requested as a result of the announcement by the Home Secretary, in March 2000, of the abolition of the Levy Board. The AGM will be attended by senior BHB personnel, and representatives of other organisations, including the Jockey Club. The Levy Board, and the Industry Committee (Horseracing) Limited, along with bookmaking and political interests.

ROYAL ASCOT COUNTDOWN BEGINS

Saeed bin Suroor issued a wellbeing note on Wednesday's G1 Prince of Wales S. challenger Dubai Millennium (GB) (Seeking The Gold {USA}) yesterday as the countdown to Royal Ascot began. "He is very well and has improved since last year. Everything is well, he is sound and healthy and in good condition. Godolphin will also provide Michael Kinane with the ride on Kayf Tara (GB) (Sadler's Wells {USA}) in the G1 Gold Cup next Thursday in a bid to repeat the successful partnership in the year that Classic Cliche (Ire) took the prize in 1996. Kinane's agent John Hanmer said today, "Michael has got the ride on Kayf Tara, he was booked yesterday. He's delighted, he has won the Gold Cup before for Godolphin and he has ridden Kayf Tara in the past." William Hill opened betting on the race yesterday, installing Kayf Tara as the 7-4 favourite, with last year's winner Enzeli (GB) (Kahyasi {GB}) next best at 11-2. In other news, John Dunlop's Listed Heron S. winner Inglenook (Ire) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) has been supplemented at a cost of £20,000 for Tuesday's G1 St James's Palace S., where he looks likely to take on Godolphin's French and Irish 2000 Guineas winner Bachir (Ire) (Desert Style {Ire}), and China Visit (USA) (Red Ransom {USA}), who defeated that horse in the UAE Derby at Nad al Sheba Mar. 25. Henry Cecil will have to wait until Friday for owner Khalid Abdullah to make a decision about whether his unbeaten colt Shibboleth (USA) (Danzig {USA}) also lines up in the field.

KORNADO OFF TO GOOD START

Stall Granum's young stallion Kornado (GB) (Superlative {Ire}) got well off the mark last weekend. A contemporary of leading young German sires Monsun and Sternkonig, Kornado had his first runner at Cologne last Sunday. The two-year-old colt Pryor (Ger), out of the Listed placed Peninsula (GB) (Elegant Air {GB}), comfortably took the traditional Versuchsrennen der Zweijahrigen on his lifetime debut. Kornado was a leading juvenile in 1992 and went on to take the G2 Preis der Privatbankiers Merck, Finck & Co. as well as the Classic G2 Mehl-Mulhens-Rennen at three.

MONSUN HOLDING HIS OWN

Gestut Schlenderhan's leading young sire Monsun (Ger) (Konigsstuhl {Ger}) ranks on fifth place on the list of leading European-based second crop sires by earnings worldwide, which marks a unique achievement of a German sire in thoroughbred history. Network (Ger) scored in the G2 Oppenheim Colonia Union-Rennen at Cologne, while King's Best's close relative Adronikus (Ire) took the Grosser Radeberger Pilsener-Preis on their way to the German Derby on July 2 at Hamburg. This means that Monsun will have at least three fancied runners in the Derby, the other being the unbeaten dual Pattern winner Samum (Ger).

The final session of the Magic Millions Winter Carnival Sale was held vesterday with a session of horses of racing age, broodmares and a smattering of stallion shares and nominations. Wednesday's session saw 170 horses pass through the ring for gross receipts of \$984,900 and and an average of \$5,794. Overall, the sale grossed \$2,585,550 for 354 lots sold and an average price of \$7,304.
