RICHEST ROYAL ASCOT UNDERWAY TODAY

With record prize money on offer over the next four days, Royal Ascot is set for its best meeting yet. The increase of £145,000 (six percent) takes the purse total to £2,578,500. The meet offers a Group 1 race each day, including Wednesday's upgraded Prince Of Wales S. There will be public presentations for the first time for all Group 1 races, five Group 2 races, the Royal Hunt Cup and the G3 Queen's Vase. The Queen herself has strong claims to crown the event with Friday's G2 Hardwicke S. challenger Blueprint (Ire) (Generous {Ire}), while Fairy Godmother (GB) (Fairy King) in the same race, and Interlude (GB) (Sadler's Wells), Request (GB) (Rainbow Quest) and Spinning Top (GB) (Alzao), all in the G2 Ribblesdale S. on Thursday, provide more than adequate back-up. The race of the meeting is tomorrow's G1 Prince Of Wales S. which will pit G1 Dubai World Cup winner Dubai Millennium (GB) (Seeking The Gold) against four-time Group 1 winning champion Sendawar (Ire) (Priolo). Japan will be represented for the first time at the Royal meeting by G1 Prix de l'Abbaye de Longchamp winner Agnes World (Danzig) and stablemate Dojima Muteki (Jpn) (Tudenham King {Jpn}), who will line up in today's G2 King's Stand S. Further international flavor will be added by the presence of American jockeys Jerry Bailey and John Velazquez, who will be riding for Godolphin. Other races to divert eyes from the high fashion on show include today's G1 St James' Palace S., where Godolphin offer the first two favorites in UAE Derby winner China Visit (Red Ransom) and dual Guineas winner Bachir (Ire) (Desert Style {Ire}). In a bid to monopolize the G2 Queen Anne S., Godolphin put forward Aliabr (Storm Cat) to give them their fifth consecutive renewal, while they also have outstanding chances in Thursday's G1 Ascot Gold Cup with previous winner Kayf Tara (GB) (Sadler's Wells), and in Thursday's G2 Cork and Orrery S. with Lend A Hand (GB) (Great Commotion). The two-year-olds also have their chance, with today's G3 Coventry S. and tomorrow's G3 Queen Mary S .-- for the precocious fillies -- the centerpieces. It's a long way since 1711, the first time racing took place here, but tradition is the bedrock of the meeting, no better evidenced than by the Royal Procession before racing each day. At two o'clock today, as the crowds watch the procession roll by, the waiting will be nearly over.

As ever, this is the highlight of the first day of the Royal Ascot meeting and, with 11 quality runners, it will be a contest to savor. Dual 2000 Guineas winner Bachir will bid to gain revenge over GI Kentucky Derby sixth China Visit, who was victorious when the pair met in the UAE Derby at Nad Al Sheba Mar. 25. Bachir was an impressive winner of the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains at Longchamp May 14, with Valentino third, and confirmed that win was no fluke when taking the Irish equivalent at The Curragh May 27. Giant's Causeway was second to the mightily impressive King's Best in the G1 Sagitta 2000 Guineas at Newmarket May 6 and filled the same berth behind Bachir at The Curragh with Cape Town third. The latest betting would suggest that Giant's Causeway will reverse the form of the Irish Guineas with Bachir, and that China Visit will rebound from his Kentucky Derby effort over this shorter trip. Shibboleth, another prominent in the betting, is unbeaten in two starts and was a comfortable winner of the Listed King Charles II S. at Newmarket June 3. Fanaar is an interesting outsider and was an impressive winner of his only start to date at Newmarket Apr. 19.

In what promises to be the usual cavalry charge, Agnes World is looking to become the first Japanesetrained winner in Britain. He was impressive enough when beating the cream of European sprinters in the G1 Prix de l'Abbave de Longchamp last October and can add another list of sprinting scalps to his resume. He has been boarded at Geoff Wragg's Newmarket stables along with stablemate Dojima Muteki, unplaced in the Prix de l'Abbaye, and brothers Yutaka and Koshira Take take the respective mounts. Imperial Beauty was second in last year's Prix de l'Abbaye and started 2000 with a fourth behind Perryston View, Proud Native and Rambling Bear in the G2 Temple S. at Sandown May 29. With that run under her belt she can gain revenge on those three, but may find the likely firm ground a hindrance. Rudi's Pet has taken the step from handicap to stakes company in his stride. He won last season's G3 King George S. at Goodwood in September, beating Imperial Beauty, and continued in that form when taking the June 5 G3 Ballyogan S. on his seasonal bow.

The traditional meeting opener sees Aljabr and Dansili likely to dispute favoritism. Aljabr showed he had retained his ability when making all to score in the G1 Juddmonte Lockinge S. and can go one better than when second to Sendawar (Ire) in the G1 St James's Palace S. on this day last year. He will not find it plain sailing as the French-trained Dansili is sure to put up a good fight. Second in last season's G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains (French 2000 Guineas), and ahead of Aliabr in the G1 Prix du Moulin, Dansili remains unbeaten this term with wins in the G3 Prix Edmond Blanc at Saint-Cloud Apr. 5, and the G2 Prix du Muguet at Saint-Cloud May 1. Indian Lodge has enjoyed a good start to the season with fine wins in the G3 Earl Of Sefton S. at Newmarket Apr. 19 and the G2 KLM UK Mile at Sandown Apr. 28. In his latest start he finished third to Aliabr in the Lockinge S., but should give a good account of himself nonetheless.

HONG KONG PURSE INCREASE

Purses have been increased 14 percent across the board for the 2000-2001 racing season as the Hong Kong Jockey Club seeks to improve the quality of racing and stem falling turnover and attendance. "The number of applications for permits to own horses has also been on the decrease, and the attractiveness in prize money may help to reverse the trend," said Hong Kong Jockey Club's Executive Director of Racing, Winfried Engelbrecht-Bresges. "Furthermore, the better the races, the more interest they will generate among racegoers, which will also help to increase the turnover. In that sense, we all benefit." Prize money for the Hong Kong Cup, the Hong Kong Mile, the Hong Kong Vase and the Hong Kong Sprint next January have been increased to HK\$14 million, \$8 million, \$8 million and \$5.5 million, respectively. The purse for the Hong Kong Derby has been raised to \$10 million. A 50-percent bonus was introduced for Hong Kong-trained horses.
