A GIANT RULES THIS PALACE

Giant's Causeway (Storm Cat), sent off the 7-2 favourite, led for most of the way and battled on gamely at the finish to hold off 16-1 Valentino (GB) (Nureyev) in an exciting and well-contested renewal of yesterday's G1 St. James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot. Until now, Giant's Causeway, who captured the G1 Prix de la Salamandre at Longchamp last September, has twice had to settle for second-best at the Group 1 level this year, first behind King's Best in the G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket May 6, and then behind Bachir (Ire) (Desert Style {Ire}) in the Irish 2000 Guineas at The Curragh May 27. Valentino looked almost as if he would overhaul him here in the closing stages, but Giant's Causeway showed his heart to come out on top. Riding Giant's Causeway at The Curragh last month, Mick Kinane allowed Bachir first run in the straight and the colt was never able to make up the ground. Here the jockey set out to make amends, taking to the rail in front as Jerry Bailey sought to get Bachir relaxed on his own wider on the track. Giant's Causeway had things his own way until the straight, while Bachir was delivering his challenge and a string of latecomers was lining up to take the leader's mantle. With a furlong remaining, Shibboleth (Danzig), Valentino and Medicean (GB) (Machiavellian) with Valentino finishing fastest on the outside. In a thrilling final 200 yards, the favourite gave more and more and just held on to claim the prize. A relieved owner, Michael Tabor said afterwards, "I wasn't 100 percent sure he'd won, as it was a bit of a blur. He's a very good horse, and we can't complain, as he's been runner-up in two Classics and won the St. James's Palace, which looked very strong in depth--what more can you ask?" Kinane added, "I gave myself a bit of stick after The Curragh, as he had had a couple of hard races, and I wanted him to travel at The Curragh. I wanted to make up for it, and fair dues to the horse, as he gives everything--he's a good colt. In fairness to him, he needs to step up to a mile and a quarter now. He'll possibly have a break first." John Gosden, trainer of the runner-up, said, "Gerald [Mosse] said that he came to win his race and put his head in front, but then looked about him and the winner had come back at him. He is still very green and inexperienced, as that was only his fourth race, and it was a very good performance."

A ROYAL TREAT

With both Dubai Millennium (GB) (Seeking the Gold) and Sendawar (Ire) (Priolo) in the line-up, this afternoon's Ascot feature, the G1 Prince of Wales's S. figures to be one for the ages. The Dubai World Cup winner has gone from strength to strength since his only defeat in the G1 Epsom Derby last year, collecting the two Group 1 mile events that Sendawar missed, the Prix Jacques le Marois and Queen Elizabeth II S. Those two events took place on heavy going, but connections were always adamant that he would be better on good ground. Although the long drying period that has preceded this meeting caused some concern for connections, the heavy rain yesterday morning at the track seems to have allayed those fears. For Godolphin, it is a time of confidence, as shown in Simon Crisford's ominous words yesterday, "I expect Dubai Millennium to beat Sendawar quite comfortably." For American jockey Jerry Bailey there was only one comparison he could make. "With Cigar, there were only ever two out there in the race and only one would get the blame, so I'm prepared for the pressure. He's a great horse." Sendawar, who finished last year with the same rating in the International Classifications as his favoured rival, looked highly impressive when taking his fourth Group 1 success on his return in the G1 Prix d'Ispahan at Longchamp May 21. He deserves the ultimate respect on all-known form. His Highness The Aga Khan said yesterday, "It's a very exciting race, and I think Sendawar deserves to race against the best. He is there to race, and he could get beaten, but that's the game." The weather is vital here, but hopefully it will ensure a level playing field for this 'match.'

KING'S STAND S.-G2 results cont.

Nuclear Debate is a five-furlong specialist, and he has improved with age since joining trainer John Hammond. He was a consistent, quality performer last year, collecting listed events in France and the G3 Premio Omenoni at Milan in October. He returned with a sixth place in the G3 Prix de Saint-Georges at Longchamp May 14, before taking the G2 Prix du Gros Chene at Chantilly June 3 in a very fast time. Here he was held up at the back of the field as Perryston View (GB) (Primo Dominie {GB}) set the pace in the centre of the track. Jockey Gerald Mosse was on the far side of the track and he had plenty in front of him by halfway, but he was starting to pick up and accelerate his way past the horses on that side, and when he hit the front with a furlong remaining his only danger looked to be the Japanese challenger Agnes World, who could not get any closer than the one-and-a-half length distance at the line. Gerald Mosse described the race, "The pace was very fast, and my horse was traveling so easily all the way. I thought if anything he would come too early." The winner provided Hammond with his first Royal Ascot winner, and he commented, "It feels very exciting. I have been trying for a while and wondered if I was ever going to do it. He has been very consistent this year and last year, but my problem is that some of the big sprints, like the G1 Prix de l'Abbaye de Longchamp, are not open to geldings. I do think that should be looked at. I'm surprised he won as easily as that, but he's been improving all the time." The connections of the runner-up were delighted. Teruya Yoshida, who owns half of the horse, stated that Agnes World would stay in Britain at Geoff Wragg's stable to be trained for the G1 July Cup at Newmarket July 13. "He has run very well and will come back here and try another time," Yoshida said.

Kalanisi plied his trade in lesser company last year when trained by Luca Cumani, but he was improving all the time, taking the Heron S. at Kempton on his final start before his season was ended prematurely by injury. He returned at Windsor May 15 and closed late to come up a half-length short of Swallow Flight. He was last early here as Godolphin's Muthathir (GB) (Elmaamul) set a very fast pace and by halfway, as they were quickening up in front, he had a lot of ground to make up and was already being ridden along. He kept responding and he was wearing them down in the final quarter of a mile, as Aljabr (Storm Cat) started to fold and Swallow Flight challenged Dansili. By the furlong pole he had built up his momentum, and as jockey Kieren Fallon asked for more, he responded well to take the battling pair inside the final 100 yards before going away at the line. His Highness The Aga Khan was delighted, "Kieren rode an excellent race, and he timed it wonderfully--he knows the horse very well." Stoute added, "Last time he just ran out of ground, but he's improved since, and he's very effective at a mile, but I think he might be a little more effective at more than a mile." Fallon, odds-on for the jockey's championship at this meeting, said, "He was lazy early on but he picked up good. They went very quick and I couldn't go with them at all. He needs a little further, but he battled on gamely and he's a tough little horse, and he's won cozy in the finish. He's a lovely horse, and he's improved over the winter." The G2 Budweiser International S. at The Curragh July 2, and the G1 Juddmonte International S. at York Aug 22 could be next for Kalanisi.

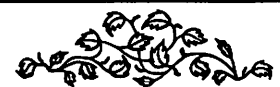

A soft-ground winner at Goodwood May 24, CD Europe came here relatively unexposed, but full of promise. His trainer Mick Channon is enjoying his first season at The Queen's former stables, West Ilsley, and he is becoming notorious as a trainer of precocious two-year-olds, having won here in 1998 with Bint Allayl (GB) in the G3 Queen Mary S. CD Europe's maiden win was a comfortable one, and bode well for the future. He broke well here and settled prominently in fourth behind pace-setting Tara's Emperor (Ire) (Common Grounds {GB}), tracking Bram Stoker. Bram Stoker took over in front, and looked to have stolen it under Richard Hughes, but jockey Steve Drowne asked and CD Europe responded well to go in pursuit. As the leader drove on towards the line, CD Europe was finishing fastest and managed to get in front with 50 yards remaining to win a shade comfortably in the end. Trainer Mick Channon said, "Stephen [Drowne] has always thought he's a decent horse, and he's always had a lot of faith, saying he was a very very good horse, and one of our best. We're obviously thrilled, and it's lucky we keep finding the good horses to come and win these races--it all depends on your ammunition." Drowne was delighted at his first Royal Ascot success, "It's better than winning anywhere else in the country. He was a bit keen early but once he was covered up he fell asleep nicely, and it took 150 yards to get him to pick up again. I didn't think I'd get to Richard [Hughes], but he got him well in the end. West Ilsley is a fantastic yard, when you think of the great horses that have been there. Things are going well."

Dalampour has distinguished relations, being a half brother to G1 Coronation Cup winner Daliapour (Ire), and he is still relatively unexposed, having only recently won his maiden at Newmarket 17 days ago. Sir Michael Stoute brought a similar type to win this race in 1998 with Maridpour (Ire), and that fact did not escape the punters, who made Dalampour the favourite. Kieren Fallon was in supreme form here to give himself and his trainer a Royal Ascot first-day double, while providing the owner with the second part of a treble. Racing prominently in fourth early behind a sedate pace, Fallon had him switched off and traveling well, while a few others were pulling and scrimmaging in behind. The pace did not increase until the final turn, where Fallon asked his mount to quicken, and he did so to pull two lengths clear of the chasing Dutch Harrier, who had weaved his way through horses to challenge, and Samsaam. Eased close to home, Dalampour made winning at this level seem easy. The Aga Khan said, "I'm fortunate to have some decent horses at present. Like Kalanisi, this one is improving well."

The way in which **Little Firefly** broke her maiden on her racecourse debut at Leopardstown May 24 immediately marked her down as a likely sort for this fillies only sprint. She looked out of contention at the quarter-mile marker that day but showed tremendous finishing speed to win in comfortable style. With the benefit of that educational performance, she will be the one to beat. **Romantic Myth** is unbeaten in two starts and can be expected to improve further on her win in a conditions event at Chester May 9. **Freefourracing** is an unbeaten winner of one and was a good winner of the Hilary Needler Trophy, a highly respected conditions event, at Beverley June 7.

Ascot News and Notes

Richard Quinn, found by stewards to have used his whip with excessive force on Shibboleth in the St. James's Palace S. has been referred to Jockey Club headquarters in London for a hearing....Ascot reported a first-day record attendance of 50,609, a 10.1-percent increase against last year's opening day crowd of 45,977 and ahead of the previous high of 49,088 in 1997. Douglas Erskine-Crum, Ascot chief executive, said, "This is our biggest-ever opening day crowd for Royal Ascot which, considering this morning's disappointing weather, could provide no greater endorsement of the Royal Meeting's unique and enduring appeal."...Kieren Fallon is a 4-9 chance to take home the London Clubs Trophy for the jockey championship at Royal Ascot. He is followed by Mick Kinane at 11-4; Gerald Mosse at 12-1; and 20-1 Richard Quinn...Tote on-course cash turnover of £1,497,976 represents an increase of three percent on last year's opener and also a record for a first day at Royal Ascot.

Americans Happy...

American jockeys Jerry Bailey and John Velazquez enjoyed the first day at Royal Ascot, despite finishing winless on the day. Bailey had the best luck, taking Bertolini (Danzig) into third place in the G2 King's Stand S. His ride on Bachir (Ire) (Desert Style {Ire}) in the St. James' Palace S. was not made easy by the colt's keenness early, and Velazquez suffered disappointment as China Visit (Red Ransom) finished further behind in the same race, where both were unplaced. Bailey said, "Bertolini ran as good as he could, and he held off the horses around him, whereas Bachir wouldn't settle, so I kept him out and tried to get him relaxed. He fought with Mick (Kinane)'s horse to the final furlong, then he ran out of gas." Velazquez said of China Visit, "The horse didn't handle the ground, and I was trying to encourage him, but he wasn't there for me." Nevertheless, both jockeys seem sold on Royal Ascot. Bailey added, "It's a grand place, and it's wonderful to be here. We came here to do our job, and it's great experience." Velazquez exclaimed, "I'm having a great time, and it's great to be here."

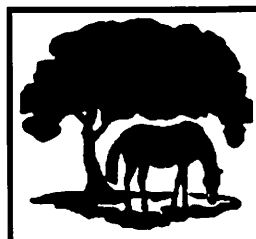

There are few more formidable turf milers in this country than Silic. Off the course since a thrilling victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile, the French-bred returned to the fray on Sunday to capture the GI Shoemaker Breeders' Cup Mile S. in 1:33 1/5.

Silic's pedigree contains a pattern which has become extraordinarily prolific in recent years, and which enjoyed particular success last weekend: that of linebreeding to Lalun through her sons Never Bend and Bold Reason. Fittingly, for such an exceptional influence, Lalun was the product of strains developed by two of the greatest breeders of all time. Her sire *Djeddah was bred in France by Marcel Boussac and was one of the leaders of his generation in Europe at two and three, and even better at four, a season in which he took three stakes events in France as well as capturing the Eclipse S. and Champion S. on trips to England. Lalun's dam Be Faithful was a product of the breeding program of Col E. R. Bradley's Idle Hour Stock Farm. A daughter of Bradley champion Bimelech, Be Faithful was a tough, accomplished mare who won 14 of 59 starts including the Hawthorne Gold Cup, two runnings of the Beverly H. and the Vanity H.

Both Marcel Boussac and E. R. Bradley made frequent use of close inbreeding, and the pedigrees of both of Lalun's parents are typical examples of the work of these two masters. Djeddah's pedigree has the sisters Durban II (Fr) (dam of Tourbillon {Fr}) and Heldifann (Fr) 2x3, and *Teddy 4x3. In the pedigree of Be Faithful we find the Idle Hour foundation sire Black Toney appearing 2x4.

Lalun herself was less closely inbred, although she did have Teddy 5x4x4. It's worth noting, however, that very similar backgrounds are found in Banshee (Fr), the dam of Durban II and Heldifann (out of the American-bred Frizette), and Black Toney. Thus, the closest inbreeding in the pedigrees of Djeddah and Be Faithful shares a common heritage (as a sidenote, it is interesting to recall that Black Toney's grandson Blue Larkspur sired Myrtlewood out of a half sister to Banshee, and that Relic, who was out of a Black Toney mare, did exceptionally well with mares carrying the Banshee strain when sent to France).

The background certainly worked for Lalun, as she captured three stakes including the Beldame H. and Kentucky Oaks, and finished second in the Coaching Club American Oaks. At stud, Never Bend and Bold Reason were her crowning achievement. Never Bend, champion at two, won the Flamingo S. and finished second in the Kentucky Derby at three. Bold Reason took third in the Kentucky Derby and then annexed the American Derby, Hollywood Derby and Travers S. (incidentally, we should note that the pair were more closely related than merely being half brothers, as Never Bend was by *Nasrullah and Bold Reason by Hail to Reason, a grandson of Nasrullah's three-quarters brother *Royal Charger).

Never Bend went on to sire 61 stakes winners, among them the extremely influential sires Mill Reef and Riverman. Bold Reason did sire 21 stakes winners, but he would have become an irrelevancy in modern pedigrees had he not sired Fairy Bridge. A foal of 1975, Fairy Bridge was highweighted filly at two on the Irish Free Handicap, although she never won a black-type event. More importantly, she became dam of champion sires Sadler's Wells and Fairy King as well as their less significant brother Tate Gallery, and of the up-and-coming young stallion Perugino.

Given the success of Sadler's Wells and Fairy King, and the number of European mares carrying Mill Reef and Riverman, it is not surprising that Lalun linebreeding has run wild in Europe. Although new representatives are added by the week, there are at least 33 Sadler's Wells-line stakes winners out of mares carrying Lalun through Mill Reef or Riverman, and another nine by his brother Fairy King.

The happy news for owners of mares by Sadler's Wells, Fairy King and Tate Gallery is that the cross also seems to work in reverse. Silic, who is by Sillery (second dam by Riverman) out of a mare by Sadler's Wells, is one example. The upset winner of Saturday's GIII Golden Gate H., Deploy Venture (GB) (Deploy {GB}--Tasseled by, Tate Gallery), whose sire is a grandson of Mill Reef, is another. And an international three peat for the formula with the brothers as broodmare sires was completed on Sunday, when Karpaasi (GB) (Lahib--Pancasari {Ire}, by Fairy King), whose sire is by Riverman, won the listed Premio d'Estade in Milan.

PEDIGREE SHORTS

Sadler's Wells was also involved in another extremely interesting weekend pedigree, that of **Endless Hall (GB) (c, 4, Saddler's Hall {Ire}--Endless Joy {Ire}, by Law Society)** winner of the G1 Gran Premio di Milano. Sadler's Wells (paternal grandsire of Endless Hall) is by Northern Dancer out of a daughter of Thong. Endless Hall's granddam La Joyeuse is by Northern Dancer out of a daughter of Thong's full sister Lisadell, which gives Endless Hall the three-quarters related Sadler's Wells/La Joyeuse 2x2.

Unaccounted For has made a very promising start with his first crop, which are now three-year-olds. He was represented by a new stakes winner this weekend when his son **Grundlefoot (c, 3, Unaccounted For--Melancholy Blues, by Cure the Blues)** took the \$200,000 Leonard Richards S. at Delaware Park. Grundlefoot has an unusual twist to his pedigree pattern. His sire is by Private Account, whose granddam Intriguing is by Swaps out of a mare by Nasrullah. If we look in Grundlefoot's female line, we find that his fourth dam Cindabelle is also by Swaps out of a Nasrullah mare, making her a three-parts relative to Intriguing.

Seeking the Gold is currently enjoying a very good year, and his daughter **Country Hideaway (f, 4, Seeking the Gold--Our Country Place, by Pleasant Colony)** became his seventh stakes winner of the season with a win in the GIII Vagrancy H. Country Hideaway is one of three stakes winners by Seeking the Gold out of mares by Pleasant Colony, and she has something in common with another of that trio, Cash Run. Winner of last year's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, Cash Run is inbred 4x4 to Mr. Prospector's granddam Sequence. Country Hideaway takes the pattern a couple of steps closer, since she is inbred 2x4 to Mr. Prospector, who appears not only as the sire of Seeking the Gold, but also of Country Hideaway's third dam Gold Beauty.

ASCOT TUESDAY: YOU WERE HOT, OR NOT

There must have been an interesting configuration of the stars above Ascot yesterday. That makes sense, actually, because we are just about at the summer solstice. Whatever the reason, Ascot Tuesday was hot, and it was a day of extremes in the collective results--you were either hot, or very much not. On the not-hot side were: England--which got knocked out of the Euro 2000 'football' (soccer) tournament by Romania--and English-based trainers at Ascot, except for Sir Michael Stoute. He had a double--for the Aga Khan, who had a treble--but otherwise Mick Channon was the only English trainer to saddle a winner on the opening day of the best week of racing on the planet. That was in the Coventry, the top two-year-old race of the year so far, and the winner was an Irish-bred, by a sire formerly based in Ireland; the second is by Irish freshman sire General Monash; and the third was Coolmore's.

Incidentally, General Monash, himself a sprinter by Lyphard's three-quarter brother Thorn Dance, and a half brother to King of Kings, is looking a pretty good success story thus far: Bram Stoker very nearly won the top two-year-old race at Ascot, and is one of seven winners for his sire. Just before Ascot got underway, by the way, Rathbarry's Charnwood Forest (Warning/Sadler's Wells), another Irish freshman sire, notched up his sixth winner--four in the last week.

Irish trainers won two of the six yesterday. Giant's Causeway earned his spot on the Coolmore roster with a gutsy win over the improving French 2000 Guineas third Valentino in the St. James's Palace S., a race which in the 'nineties was won by Kingmambo, Grand Lodge, and Bahri in successive years, and which may be an even better pointer to future sire success now than the 2000 Guineas. Also, Derby-winning trainer John Oxx, racing's latest overnight sensation 30 years in the crafting, won the last, completing the third leg of the Aga Khan's treble.

Now, that must be about a perfect day for an opera-

tion like the Aga Khan's. Less than two weeks ago he won the Derby for the fourth time with a homebred, Sinnadar. Then on the opening day of what is without any doubt the most prestigious race meeting in the European calendar, he has three wins from three runners. It's a tribute to his operation, of course, and he and his team are to be congratulated for these inspiring performances--inspiring because it does give hope to all operations which breed to race, however modest the level of their aspirations. It proves that operations which control the horse at all stages of its development, sometimes for generations, can still compete with sales horses.

Godolphin has been a different brand of overnight success story (in their case, 20 years in the making), combining the best homebreds from the Maktoum family's far-flung breeding operations with acquisitions both at the sales and on the racetrack. Their impact on the international racing scene has been dramatic and successful, but, boy, were they cold yesterday...six runners, for one third and five unplaced. Oops.

Today is another day, and the most titanic clash of the meeting is on the cards when Dubai Millennium meets Sendawar in the newly promoted G1 Prince of Wales's S. Horse of the World Dubai Millennium, from 0-for-6 Godolphin, makes his first start since his devastating win in the Dubai World Cup, against Sendawar, the top miler in Europe in 1999, and the best horse in the stable of His Highness, the Aga Khan (3-for-3). Ten furlongs, and may the best horse win. They're both superstars.

So that's how it played out at Ascot Day One. Whether winners or losers, whether hot or cold (Your Correspondent temporarily numbered among the latter group, sorry to report), I can also report the 'craich' level is up to standard, from what I could discern. There's some debate among the Celtic tribes about that spelling, by the way: I've used the Scottish spelling, whereas the Irish spell it 'craic', with that backward accent mark you sometimes see, over the 'i'. Either way, Americans spell it 'crack', which is forgivable, but not quite right. Yes, we all look like extras for My Fair Lady, and, yes, the traffic, is DIABOLICAL. But it's always a memorable week.
