KAYF SURVIVES FOUL CLAIM

Kayf Tara (GB) (Sadler's Wells), the 11-8 favourite, survived the drama of a steward's inquiry to take his second G1 Ascot Gold Cup by a head over the tough 20-1 shot Far Cry (Ire) (Pharly (Fr)) in a thrilling finish at Royal Ascot yesterday. Kayf Tara, one of the most consistent Group 1 horses in training, has won more individual pattern races than the any other that has run under Godolphin's banner. He looked to have an outstanding chance as favourite for the Melbourne Cup last season before sustaining a serious injury to a suspensory ligament, and the question was whether the team could get him back into top form. He showed all the old sparkle that had seen him win the '98 Gold Cup and two G1 Irish St Leger's when he made his return in the G2 Yorkshire Cup at York May 18, scooting clear of the opposition to show he was back to his best. Racing over ground that is recognized as livelier than he would prefer here, he looked uncomfortable at the finish, but thanks to the nerve and skill of jockey Michael Kinane, and his own courage, he managed to claim his eighth pattern race success. Settling at the rear early as Ashgar (Bien Bien) and Persian Punch (Ire) (Persian Heights {GB}) took them along at a sound pace, Kinane waited until the leaders started to come back to them, then made his move stealthily on the outside. The pair went after Far Cry and San Sebastian (GB) (Niniski), who had gone for home, looming boldly on the outside of the latter, but in the instant Kinane asked him to quicken, Kayf Tara lurched right and took San Sebastian's ground. Kinane got his mount balanced again immediately and gave chase to Far Cry, who looked to have stolen it, but Kayf Tara fought hard and willingly and collared his rival late to win a memorable renewal. Over 20 minutes later, after the stewards had announced the decision to leave the result as it stood, a relieved Simon Crisford said, "That's an incredible relief. He's a superstar--he's so brave and tough and he deserved it. He's got to be the best stayer in many years because he's so consistent. A mile and six furlongs is his best trip, but we'll give him his chance in the G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. July 29, and we think he'll be very effective, especially if it's soft. Then we'll look at the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe [Longchamp, Oct 1], and possibly the Melbourne Cup Nov. 7, but this could be his last year for us."

Explaining the Stewards' Decision

Martin Wallace, the Jockey Club's director of regulation, said of the stewards' inquiry into the Gold Cup, "There were two possible incidents. The first one affected the horse who was fourth (San Sebastien) and they considered that to be accidental--Mick Kinane could do nothing to have avoided that, the horse dived across. They looked at the second incident, against the second beaten a head [Far Cry]. They thought there was virtually no interference and it had not improved his position so [Kayf Tara] kept the race." Jockey Mick Kinane added, "I never felt I would lose it because the other horse came out and my fellow lost balance, and the interference was accidental."

When Miletrian was last in the G1 Epsom Oaks only 13 days ago, connections were wondering whether to try again so close to such a disappointing effort. Prior to the Oaks, she was unplaced in the G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket May 7 and fourth in a falsely run G3 Musidora S. at York May 16, but according to connections she never had the right conditions. Their faith was rewarded here with a brave effort in a thrilling finish to give her her first stakes success. Held up in last place early here as Abscond (Unbridled) cut out the running in front, she relaxed and was traveling well throughout the first half mile, comfortably off the pace. As they neared the turn into the straight, jockey Michael Roberts made a forward move and the filly responded well to his urgings to get herself into a prominent position. Short of room, she was switched to the outside with a furlong and a half remaining, and her strong run proved decisive as she overhauled the joint favourites to win going away. The Queen's Interlude had no room in the straight, and her run appeared too late on the rail. Trainer Mick Channon, celebrating his second winner of the meeting, said, "She's got to have fast ground, and she's been running a little bit in-and-out, but we believed and it worked. She's always been a good filly, but she's been running a little bit too free in amongst horses so we decided to keep her at the back. We've come here and it's worked out right. She's in the G1 Yorkshire Oaks at York Aug. 23, and the G1 Irish Oaks at The Curragh July 16, so we'll go for those type of races." Roberts added, "She's been very unlucky, as she missed the break in the Guineas and there was no pace at York, then the ground came up fast at Epsom and she didn't handle the track. Five furlongs out here I



Superior Premium has been on the upgrade for a long time now, gradually climbing the ladder to this level since his win in the Stewards' Cup at Goodwood in 1998. He then mixed racing in pattern company with the big handicaps, showing adeptness for both arenas, but arguably his finest run since came in this race last year when he was fourth behind Bold Edge (GB) (Beveled). He is a stakes winner already, having taken the Taby Varsprint in Sweden last June, but connections have been looking for the ideal opportunity for him to win at this level, which he did in some style here. Settled on the outside of the group in the centre of the track taken along early by Bold Edge, he travelled well to move closer with two furlongs remaining. Lend A Hand (Great Commotion {USA}) and Sampower Star (Cyrano De Bergerac {Ire}) went for home under American jockeys Jerry Bailey and John Velazguez, but they did not have enough to stop the winning run of Superior Premium, whom Johnny Murtagh had produced expertly to hit the front with 200 yards remaining and win going away. Part-owner J. J. Gill-Martin said, "He loves this track, as he's won here before. He was fourth in this last year and third in the Wokingham H. We were a bit concerned about the ground, but he won on it at Taby last year, so we weren't too worried. He's a tough and consistent sort." Murtagh, enjoying his third success at the meeting, added, "That was great. He felt really good on the way down to the start, and Richard Fahey had told me to try and get him relaxed. In the race I was thinking, don't go too soon, but he quickened up very well."

Superstar Leo took two races at Catterick previous to this, but connections believed it was not just a leap of faith to come here and take on Aidan O'Brien and Mick Channon, famed for their ability to come and win these races. From there she lengthened well when given the office and soon had the measure of Keats, who seemed to hang at the finish, and Bouncing Bowdler, stretching clear of them inside the final furlong to win a shade comfortably in the end. The filly is half owned by Lester Piggott, and the legend was on hand to lead her in the gates to the winner's enclosure he knows so well. Speaking afterwards, he said, "It's terrific--a dream come true. I thought this was the only chance we could be placed in a group race, and she's a very game little filly." Trainer William Haggas added, "She won two little races at Catterick and they did her the power of good. Full marks to Lester and my wife, as I really wanted to wait for the Weatherbys Super Sprint at Newbury (July 22), but they convinced me to come here. She won nicely, I thought." Winning jockey Richard Quinn said, "She's progressive, and she's still a little bit green. She picked up nice and it was just a case of keeping her going there."

A vintage renewal of this fillies-only mile event, with eight of the nine runners well placed in various versions of European 1000 Guineas and winners of three of those races in attendance. Crimplene is responsible for two Classic victories, with success in both the G2 Henkel-Rennen (German 1000 Guineas) at Dusseldorf May 2 and the G1 Entenmann's Irish 1000 Guineas at The Curragh May 28, where she beat Amethyst into second. She is in the best possible form. Bluemamba was ahead of Zarkiva and Iftiraas when victorious in the G1 Dubai Poule d'Essai des Pouliches (French 1000 Guineas) at Longchamp May 14, and is also worthy of consideration. Zarkiya was a most unlucky fourth in that Longchamp race, encountering traffic problems at critical moments in the race. She fairly flew in the closing stages, once getting a clear run, and actually hit the front a few yards after the line. She gained some measure of compensation by taking the G3 Prix de Sandringham at Chantilly June 4 and will be strongly favoured to take a deserved first Group 1 win. The confirmed closer will appreciate the prevalent track condition and can gain revenge on Bluemamba with a trouble-free run. The G1 Sagitta 1000 Guineas form is represented by Princess Ellen (second), Seazun (fourth) and Decision Maid (seventh). The first two were undone when finishing fifth and fourth, respectively, to Crimplene in the Irish equivalent, but hold place claims nonetheless.

Traditionally known as the consolation Derby, the form of Epsom's Classic is represented by Godolphin's Hatha Anna (6th) and Going Global (13th). Hatha Anna belied his inexperience to finish a highly creditable sixth to Sinndar (Ire) on only his second lifetime start and has the potential to improve further on that run. He should confirm placings with Going Global, who previously finished second in the G3 Lingfield Derby Trial May 13. Henry Cecil is represented by Subtle Power, who boasts a win and a second from two racecourse appearances. Following a good score in a maiden at Newbury May 20, he finished second to Shamrock City (Ire) in the Listed Charles Heidsieck Champagne Fairway S. at Newmarket June 11. Roscius, another from the Godolphin camp, won the Listed Compass UK Leisure Predominate S. at Goodwood May 23 and finished seventh to Holding Court (GB) in the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club (French Derby) at Chantilly June 4. That was in very soft conditions and he can be afforded another chance on better going here. TDN "Dark Horse" Zafonium makes his long-awaited seasonal debut. This good-looking well-bred sort finished third to Scarteen Fox (Ire) on his debut at Newbury last September, then broke his maiden in impressive style at York the following month. He is certainly bred to stay and can be considered a lively outsider.

ban Ocean. Both Shiva and Commander Collins will run only if there is significant overnight rain, according to their trainers. Even with the possibilty of the two significant scratches, the race still has the look of high quality. Greek Dance, who would prefer more cut than is available at present, ran creditably in defeat when second to Montjeu (Ire) in the G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup at The Curragh May 28. He finished one place ahead of G1 St Leger winner Mutafaweq (with Urban Ocean fifth) on that occasion and the pair are sure to be thereabouts at the finish. Mutafaweg has the potential to reverse Curragh placings and was successful at this meeting last year when garnering the G2 King Edward VII S. The globetrotting Fruits Of Love won this a year ago, beating the meeting banker Royal Anthem, and although only ninth in his latest run in the G1 Japan Cup in November he had previously performed with credit to finish second in the G1 Canadian International at Woodbine and third to Daylami (Ire) in the G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot. State Shinto was a model of consistency last season with three wins, including the G2 Prix Dollar on Arc weekend, and three seconds when under the care of Andre Fabre. He now comes under the Godolphin banner and merits the highest respect. Blueprint will seek to provide The Queen with a Royal meeting winner for the second successive year. He showed his well-being when winning the G2 Jockey Club S. at Newmarket May 5 on his only start this year.

The former raced prominently early that day, but still had enough left at the finish to hold Caustic Wit, who was keen early. If the latter settles better here, he could reverse the form.

He may be given most to do by Mark Johnston's Spirit Of Love (USA) (Trempolino {USA}), who relished the extreme distance of the Cesarewitch H. at Newmarket in 1998. Although he was last on his return in the G2 Bonusprint S. at Sandown May 29, that was over an extended two miles and he will be more at home here.

4.20 WOKINGHAM H. (Class B), £100,000, 3yo/up, 6fT

Doctor Spin (Ire) (Namaqualand {USA}) showed his class when fifth in the G3 Duke Of York S. York May 18 last time, beaten about three lengths by Lend A Hand (GB). That form, and the manner in which he took a Newmarket handicap May 7, suggest he may be a cut above his rivals here, and he escapes the burden of top weight. The way that rival Delegate (GB) (Polish Precedent {USA}) finished when fourth in an Epsom handicap June 10 gave notice that he may be coming into form at the right time, and although he was beaten at Yarmouth since, that was a small field and he raced almost on his own. He will appreciate this cavalry charge.
