A SECOND SUBURBAN FOR BEHRENS?

Behrens (Pleasant Colony), who missed the June 3 GII MassCap due to a bruised foot, will be back in action at Belmont Park this afternoon, looking to defend his title in the GII Suburban H. Trainer Jim Bond reports his sixyear-old is ready to run in his first start since finishing a hard-fought second in the G1 Dubai World Cup Mar. 25. "The injury is no concern at all," Bond said. "It was just a stone bruise. The problem was that, for a horse of his caliber, I missed a real key work. And with a horse of his class, why take a chance? Everything wasn't perfect and I didn't think he should run." He added, "I put him right back into training because older horses can need a race off a layoff. I've drilled him harder than ever because at a mile and a quarter, I know he'll have to be totally fit." The bay worked six furlongs on the Saratoga training track June 16, came back with a mile in 1:39 five days later and had his final Suburban prep June 27, going three-quarters in 1:13 2/5. Bound to test Behrens' fitness is four-year-old Lemon Drop Kid (Kingmambo), winner of last year's GI Belmont S. and GI Travers S. Third in the GIII Pimlico Special H. May 13, the colt returned to take the GII Brooklyn H. June 11 in his latest trip to the post, winning by 7 1/4 lengths. "He's coming up to the race great and I wouldn't trade places with anyone," trainer Scotty Schulhofer said. "He's the best horse I've ever trained. I know that says a lot, but I've always said that about him." Lager (Pleasant Tap) was making only his second start in graded-stakes company when he finished second in the Brooklyn. The former claimer hit his stride with a win in the GIII Excelsior H. at Aqueduct Apr. 29, but trainer Jimmy Jerkens admitted, "He'll have to run the race of his life to win. Things are not going to be easy. [The favorites] would have to stub their toes, but maybe the mile and a quarter will help him."

CAREER OVER FOR KING'S BEST?

The future of English 2000 Guineas winner King's Best (Kingmambo) is in doubt after the colt was injured in Sunday's G1 Irish Derby at The Curragh. King's Best, pulled up in the race, underwent surgery yesterday to repair his fractured off-fore cannon bone. Joe Mercer, racing manager to owner Saeed Suhail said, "Regarding his racing future, we don't know anything at the moment. Hopefully it's nothing life-threatening, but the next 48 hours are crucial." Following his Guineas success, King's Best was favored for the Epsom Derby, but was withdrawn from the Classic with a muscle injury. The Kentucky-bred colt has won three of six starts and earned £210,348.

I'M BRASSY MAKES THE GRADE

I'm Brassy (Dixie Brass), making her graded-stakes debut as an 11-1 longshot in yesterday's GII Prioress S. at Belmont Park, led every step and held on gamely to win by a neck over 5-1 Dat You Miz Blue (Cure the Blues). "We had to try stakes company while the weights were to our advantage and while we could run against three-year-old fillies," trainer Kristina Dupps said. Third in her only outing last season, the dark bay came back to break her maiden at Belmont May 14 and added a front-running allowance tally in her latest start June 3. Using her speed to good advantage once again, the Kentucky-bred filly battled Dat You Miz Blue through a half in :45 and still had that one at her throat down the stretch, but refused to relinquish the lead. "It all came out as planned," jockey Mike Luzzi said. "Even though her fractions were fast, she relaxed perfectly and was waiting on horses. She just wouldn't let that other horse get by her." As for what's next, Dupps said. "The Test (GI, July 29 at Saratoga) would be a natural spot for her." The 2-1 favorite, Cover Gal (Falstaff), shipping in from California after finishing second by a nose in the May 20 GII Railbird S., pressed the pace early, but tired to finish last in the nine-horse field. "She never really grabbed hold of the track," jockey John Velazquez said. "She was spinning her wheels. I thought if she could pass horses on the far turn, she would get confidence, but that didn't happen." Prioress chart, p2

The most experienced horse in the compact field of five, City Zip splashed through the Churchill mud to break his maiden by 6 3/4 lengths May 13 and returned 16 days later to miss by a 1/2 length when second in the GIII Kentucky Breeders' Cup. Third to Yonaguska in Belmont Park's June 9 Flash S., the chestnut was surprisingly the second-longest price in the race. He showed good speed to track loose-on-the-lead The Goo, responded when asked to go after that rival and drew clear to his first stakes success. "The last time he ran, he shipped in from Kentucky and had only 11 days between starts," said winning conditioner Linda Rice. "Time between races and getting familiar with his new surroundings was key. I was sure he would run better today."

Odden Phipps homebred Country Hideaway looks to increase her winning streak after taking her last two starts. The four-year-old filly won a Belmont allowance May 17 and returned as the victor of the GIII Vagrancy H. June 17, both at 6 1/2 furlongs. Looking to give trainer Shug McGaughey a fifth Molly Pitcher trophy, she will try to stretch out successfullly for the first time while facing two-time champion Silverbulletday. Eight for 11 last season, Silverbulletday was sixth in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff to end her 1999 campaign, but returned to the winner's circle Apr. 19 after taking the Doubledogdare S. at Keeneland. The four-year-old filly was off the board in her next start, but held on for second behind Heritage Of Gold in the June 3 GIII Fleur De Lis H. last time out. Up from Kentucky to challenge will be the five-year-old mare Lu Ravi. Second three back in the GIII Oaklawn Breeders' Cup H. Mar. 19, the Carl Bowman trainee attempted the GI Apple Blossom H. in her next outing and closed well to be second, missing by a length in that Apr. 9 test. The bay bounced back to win her latest, capturing the May 7 GIII Sixty Sails H. for her first tally since April of 1999.

Storm Cat has a battle on his hands if he is to hang on to his title of champion sire by North American earnings. Lane's End's A.P. Indy has established a well-deserved advantage on the domestic sires' list, thanks principally to his Grade I winners Stephen Got Even, Golden Missile and Secret Status, who have received strong support from such as Aptitude (runner-up in the Kentucky Derby and Belmont) and Lu Ravi (a fine second in the GI Apple Blossom H.).

The 1992 Horse Of The Year must have reasonable prospects of maintaining his lead as the season progresses, as he can look forward to receiving plenty of help from his juveniles, which averaged more than \$400,000 at last year's sales. With at least 71 named foals, A.P. Indy's 1998 collection is by far his biggest crop so far, as none of the previous four contained more than 52 named foals.

This crop has already made a bright start thanks to his daughter With Ability, who maintained her unbeaten record in the Fashion S, June 8, three days before the \$525,000 yearling Master Planner made a winning debut at Belmont.

Master Planner has a South American background on his dam's side, and so does Secret Status. Her second dam, the Con Brio mare Miss Eva, was bred in Argentina and raced in Chile, where she won two of her six starts.

Will Farish, who bred A.P. Indy with his friend W.S. Kilroy, first became involved with Secret Status's family when Miss Eva's daughter Miss Brio was imported to the U.S. after her Group 1 victories in Chile's Premio Arturo Lvon Pena and Polla de Potrancas (1000 Guineas). Miss Brio justified her purchase by carrying Farish's colors to success in the GI Maskette S. over a mile in 1989, when she also scored GII victories over seven furlongs and 1 1/16 miles. Miss Brio clearly possessed plenty of speed, but she should have stayed quite well. Her sire Semenenko and her broodmare sire Con Brio were both smart winners at around 1 1/2 miles in Europe, and her half-sister Maria Candela won Las Oaks and El Derby over that distance in Chile. This should help Secret Status in her bid to add the CCA Oaks over 1 1/2 miles to her wins in the Florida Oaks, Kentucky Oaks and the Mother Goose S.

Miss Brio's achievements for Farish prompted the importation of her dam Miss Eva to Kentucky. Miss Eva's first foal in the U.S. was her Alydar filly Private Status, a stakes winner over a mile who has now produced Secret Status as her first foal.

Secret Status is the first major winner from the handful of racing-age progeny that A.P. Indy has sired from daughters of Alydar. However, he has already done very well with mares by another of Raise A Native's sons, Mr. Prospector. Tomisue's Delight (GI Personal Ensign H. and GI Ruffian H.), Pulpit (GII Fountain of Youth S. and GII Blue Grass S.) and Accelerator (GIII Pilgrim S.) all figure among the first 19 foals out of Mr. Prospector mares. The promising With Ability is another with a Mr. Prospector mare as her dam, while Lu Ravi's broodmare sire is Mr. Prospector's son Seeking The Gold.

Incidentally, we are still waiting for A.P. Indy to be represented by his first stakes winner on Europe's turf tracks, but there is no logical reason why he shouldn't do well there. He has already enjoyed group success on turf in Japan with such as Symboli Indy, Sayaka and Hishi Nile and his American progeny include several stakes winners on grass, including the Grade III winners Parade Queen and Crowd Pleaser.

IMPRESSIVE SINNDAR AT 128

The G1 Budweiser Irish Derby success of John Oxx's Sinndar (Ire) (Grand Lodge {USA}) has seen him assessed on 128 pounds by the British Horseracina Board's senior handicapper Nigel Gray. Holding Court, a disappointing sixth on Sunday, will now be rested, with a view to an autumn campaign. Trainer Michael Jarvis commented on his performance yesterday, "He wasn't distressed after the race--he just seemed a bit flat. These things happen with horses."

WRITERS UP

ECLIPSED? By Tom Frary

There was a time when the Eclipse S. at Sandown sent people into flurries of excitement, casting superlatives here, there and everywhere to set the scene for the clash of the younger generation, recently dipped in the glory of the Classics, with the older established generals of the turf. The formula was simple--you get the Guineas', Derbies and Oaks out of the way, while the older brigade built up in their own way in the Coronation Cup and Prince Of Wales' S. Then they met, for the first time, over the 10 furlongs that is conceivably within the compass of the sharp milers, and enough of a test for the mile-and-a-half horses stepping back down. The ideal halfway-house.

Glimpsing at the names that make up the history of the race gives a real sense of achievement, too. An achievement in getting all these horses together and producing champions. Sadler's Wells sits with Pebbles and Dancing Brave, Mtoto and Nashwan in the 80s. The 90s offer Halling, Pilsudski and Daylami.

There seems to be a problem this year, however. The five-day entries offer no Dubai Millennium or Montjeu. Not even a Sendawar. Sure enough, there's the perhaps still untapped talent of Sakhee, so bold as runner-up in the G1 Epsom Derby, and the Godolphin presence in Fantastic Light. And Shiva, who just may fill that hole left by the retirement of Bosra Sham three years ago. But the superstars have gone elsewhere.

Sandown's Clerk Of The Course Andrew Cooper explains the position, "It looks like a good strong and quality field that's being assembled, with the second and third in the Derby against good older horses in the clash of the generations. But we always say every year; first, will the Derby winner run, and then we look at the top older horses."

Sinndar, arguably, is not and never was an Eclipse sort. He needs that full Derby distance. But Sendawar, Dubai Millennium and Montjeu all had this as a target once, until the upgraded Prince Of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot stole some thunder, and the French option was chosen at Saint-Cloud. So what does this mean? Cooper explains, "Personally, I don't think the upgrading of the Prince Of Wales's S. can ever do any favours for the Eclipse. It's a slightly curious decision to have okayed two Group Ones in such a short space of time, as no horse is going to run twice at this time of year."

The Eclipse even courted controversy last year, with the jockey Darryl Holland mistaking the winning post for the chase one yard before the line. Luckily he survived the scare, as Compton Admiral held on. Yet the furor which greeted the course afterwards questioned the need for two winning posts. Cooper has a view on this, "We are looking at a number of ways to reduce confusion, but it's quite hard to see how any confusion arises, especially in a flat race."

Despite the new competition from fixtures and the criticism of the course, we're still in love with this race, offering it's unique arena for the generations to come face to face for the first time. The next few years will tell the story of whether it remains the special event is was (and is).
